You will be contacted by your supervisor about the survey location and time. At the survey site you will be given a group number, which you'll write upon your survey form. This number will be used only for reporting the combined results for your group during employee feedback meetings in the fall.

The survey will be anonymous. No one from Colonial Williamsburg will see the completed survey forms.

A survey captain will be at each site to introduce and explain the program. Survey assistants will be on hand during the survey to help you and to answer any questions.

Volunteers from the Adult Skills Program will be available to give the survey orally at some sessions. If you'd like to sign up for one of these sessions call Freddie Dooley at ext.

The survey will take about one hour to complete. You will be paid for your time away from the job. Please, be on time for the survey. Employees who arrive late will be asked to re-schedule and take the survey later.
