A loofa is a body scrub available at the Tazewell Club Fitness Center. The treatment consists of a whirlpool followed by a steam or sauna. Next, a massage therapist applies a cleansing gel to the skin with a natural sponge mit. The procedure ends with a Swiss Needle shower, which is a multihead shower of varying water temperature.
