# Here's the scoop on Grand Illumination!

The Grand Illumination is on Sunday, December 3. The rain date is Monday, December 4.

The Palace, Brush Everard House and Capitol will close at 4 p.m.

The Magazine will be closed the entire day.

The Palace/Brush restrooms will close at 3 p.m. and reopen after the fireworks.

The fireworks will be at the Capitol, Magazine and Palace at 5:30 p.m.

The Grand Tatoo will be at the Capitol, Magazine and Playbooth Theatre from 5:15 to 5:30 p.m.

Entertainment will be on stage at the Capitol, Magazine, Tarpley's Store and Playbooth Theatre and will begin at 4:30 p.m. and continue until 5:15 p.m. Entertainment will resume at the above sites following the fireworks (approximately 5:50 p.m.) and continue until 7:30 p.m.

Buses will cease operation at 5 p.m. Limited service including stops #1, #2 and #6 (turnaround, Campbell's and Lodge) will resume at 6 p.m. Complete service will resume, as traffic allows, between 7 and 7:30 p.m. and will continue until 10 p.m.

First aid stations will be at the Windmill and in the Up and Down building, near the Magazine and guardhouse.

# Inter-divisional effort results in big savings for CW

During the review of the 1988 real estate tax assessments, Carol Robertson in Accounting noted that James City County had been assessing taxes on the Carter's Grove property. Actually, Carter's Grove is a historic property and under state law is exempted from real estate taxes.

Carol called Peg Waite in Property Management to bring the situation to her attention. Peg then successfully petitioned the county to exempt the Carter's Grove property from this tax.

As a result of Carol's and Peg's effort, CW will save \$11,000 in taxes per year, beginning in 1989.

# You must file a new W-4 form for IRS withholding exemptions

Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations require that any employee who wishes to claim exemption from Federal Income Tax withholding must file a new Form W-4 by February 15 each year.

Colonial Williamsburg is required to begin Federal Income Tax withholding for each employee who has previously claimed exemption from withholding but who has not submitted a new Form W-4 for the current year. Taxes will be withheld as if the employee is single, with zero withholding allowances.

Employees who can be claimed as a dependent on someone else's tax return may not be exempt from

Federal Income Tax withholding. If any non-wage income (such as interest on savings) and your wages is expected to total more than \$500, you usually cannot claim exemption from Federal Income Tax withholding.
