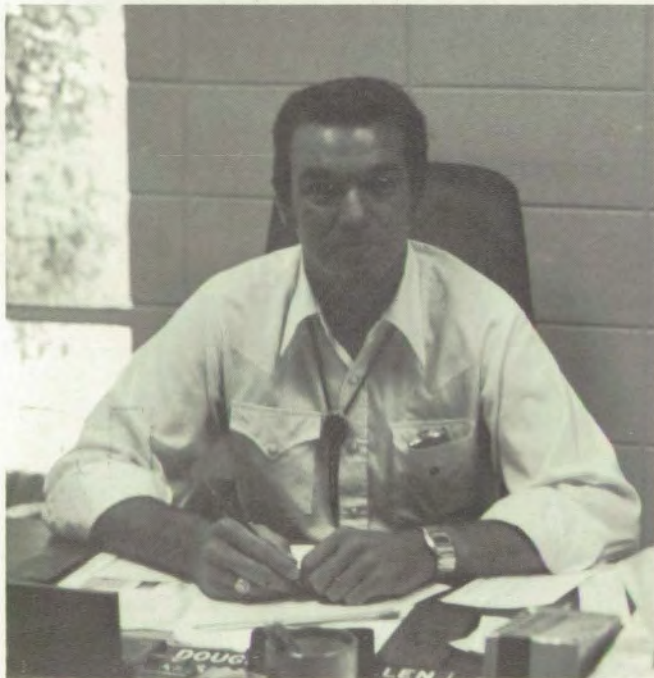


**Dr. L. J. (Pop) Broussard**

The Junior Varsity team, also a young team, won consolation in our NHS Tournament. Sue Barker coached the J.V. team. This is her second year at NHS.

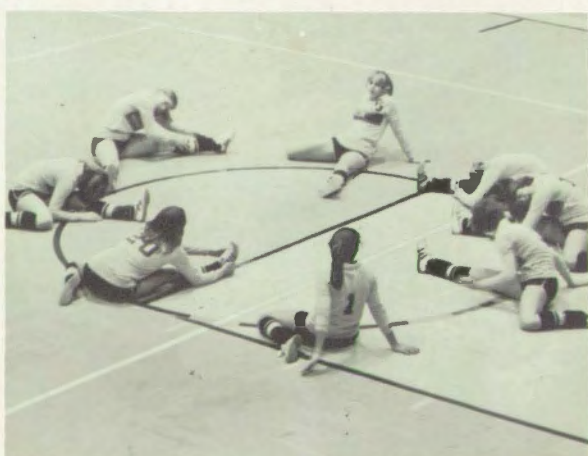

## Bulldog Baseball Coaches Have Fantastic Second Year

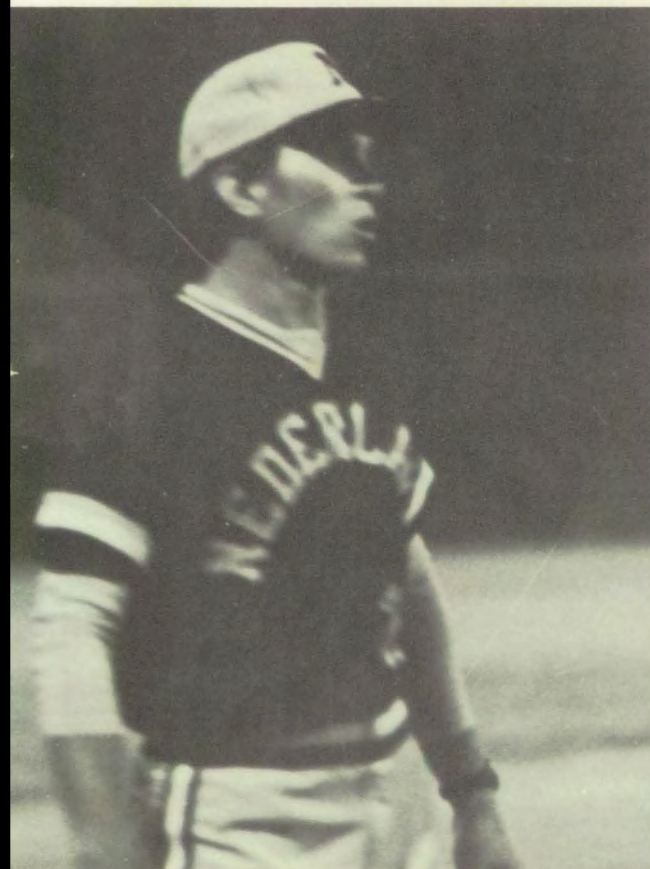

## PLAY BALL

Our 1980 baseball season started with many question marks. Perhaps the biggest question was could the 1980 bunch replace 8 starters from a 22-10 1979 season. There was little doubt from the beginning as during the first week of play the Bulldogs went 4-1. The Bulldogs won the Huntsville tournament bringing home a championship trophy, the first in many years for Nederland.

The second week found cold weather and tough opponents facing the Bulldogs. After a split of a double header with tough Lufkin, Nederland placed third in the John Certa Memorial Tournament. Victories in the tournament over state power Stratford, Nacogdoches, and Vidor began to draw attention to the Bulldogs.

The third week marked the opening of district. Local press and opposing coaches predicted Thomas Jefferson, Forest Park and Vidor to finish ahead of the Bulldogs. It appeared to be an uphill battle, but a successful non-district campaign had proven us to be a contender.

The first round of district found the Bulldogs winning 6 in a row and setting all kinds of offensive records. But a fatal final week found us in second place with one-run losses to French and Forest Park. Mixed emotions filled our minds, but our opponents had not seen the Bulldogs at their best.

The second round ended in a three-way tie with Forest Park, French, and Nederland. To get in the tie, we avenged losses to French and Forest Park. But more than gain revenge, we had discovered how to win the big one, something we had not done earlier.

This momentum we had obtained carried us with two victories over Forest Park and the district championship. This was the first district championship in baseball for Nederland in 20 years, but the Bulldogs were not finished. Playoffs loomed ahead.











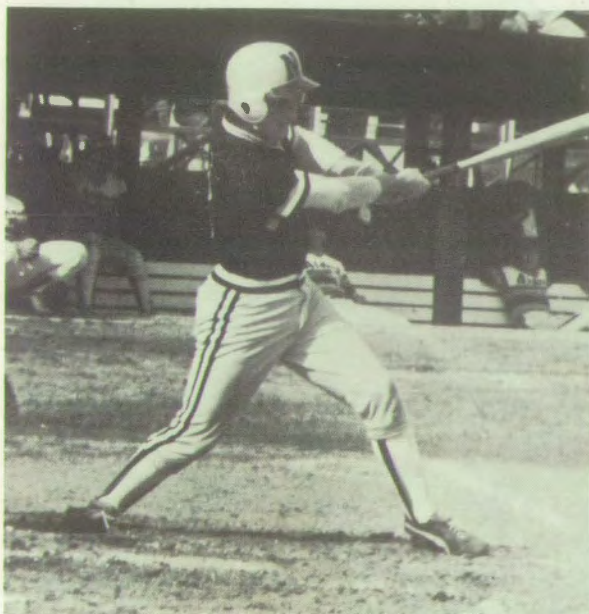


# Upon Winning District Crown Bulldogs Advance to the Playoffs

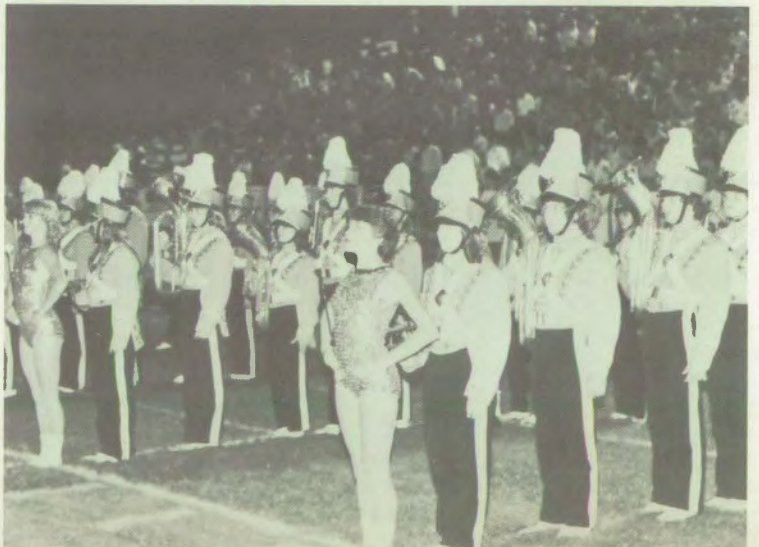
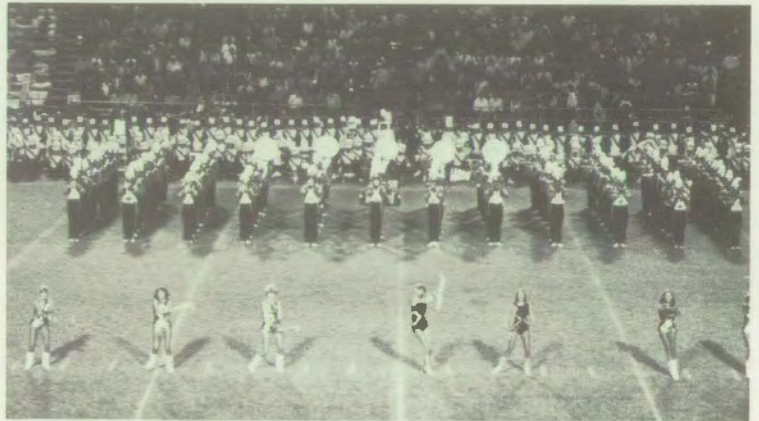




## The “Golden Pride” of the Golden Triangle

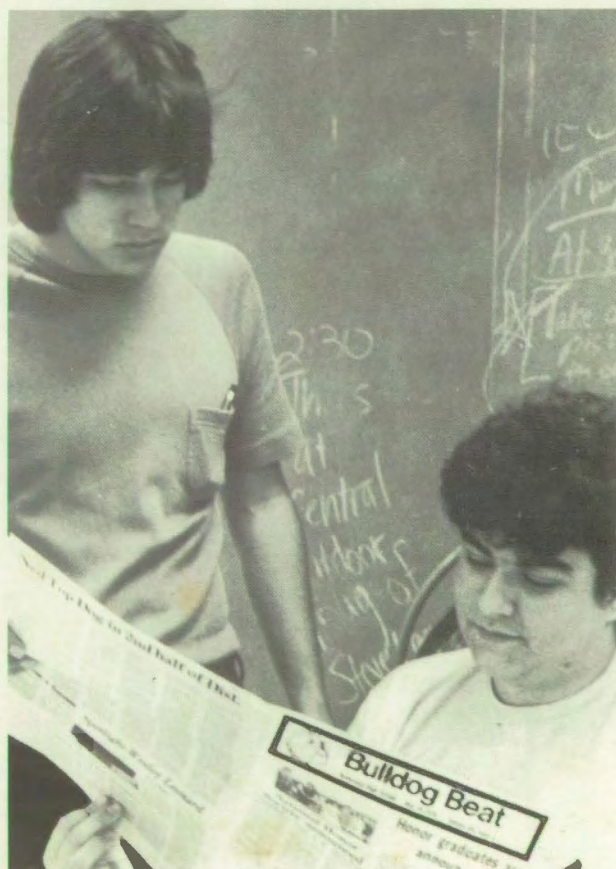


# BULLDOG BEAT
