Sniper Attacker

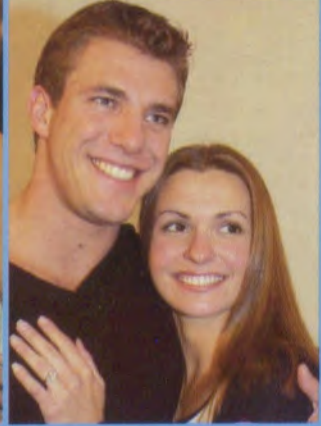

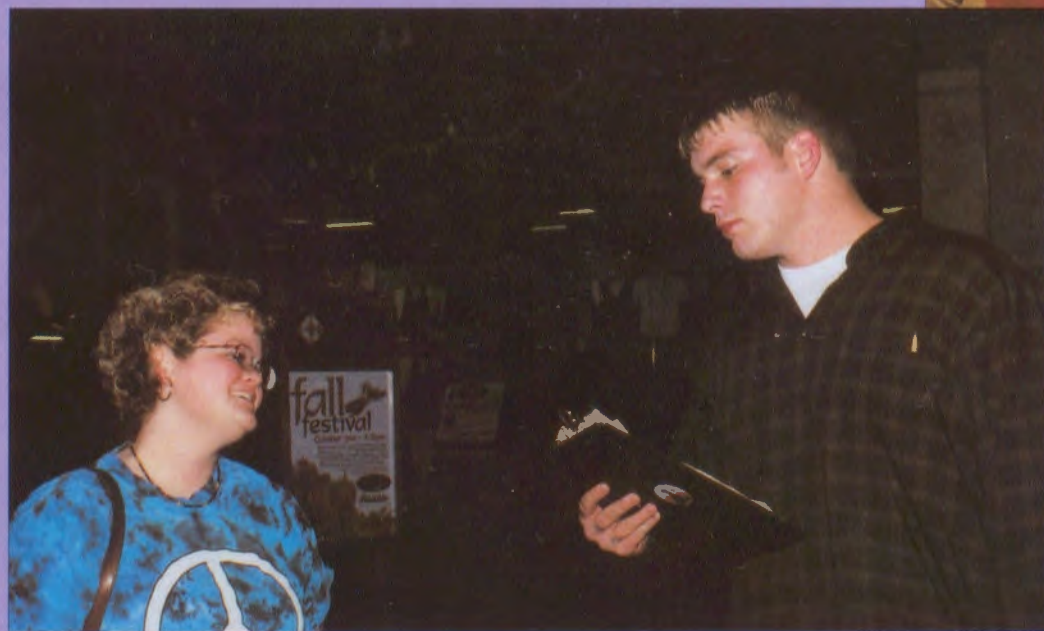

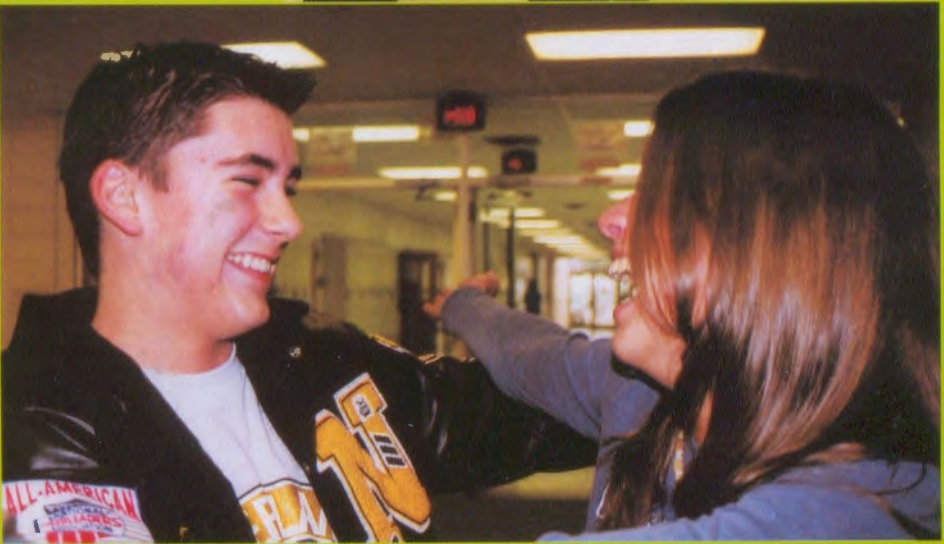

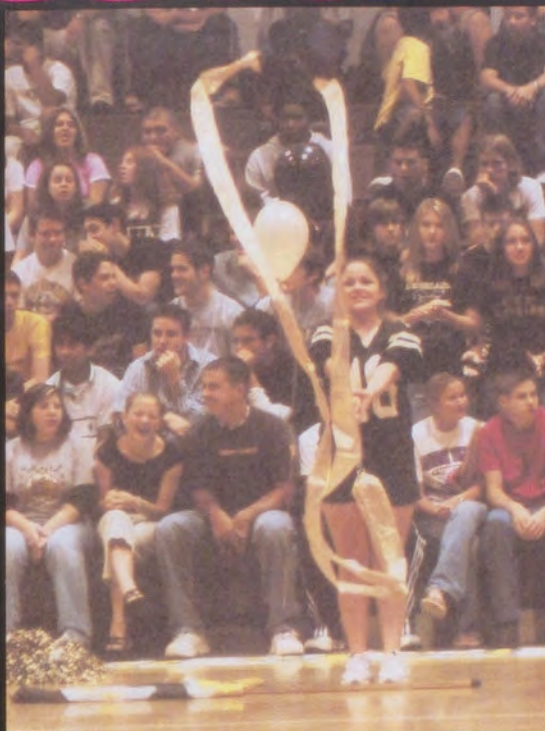

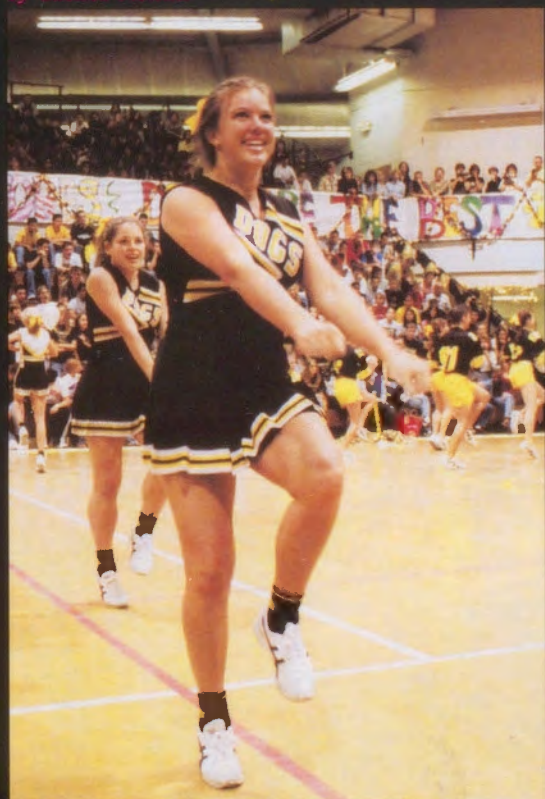

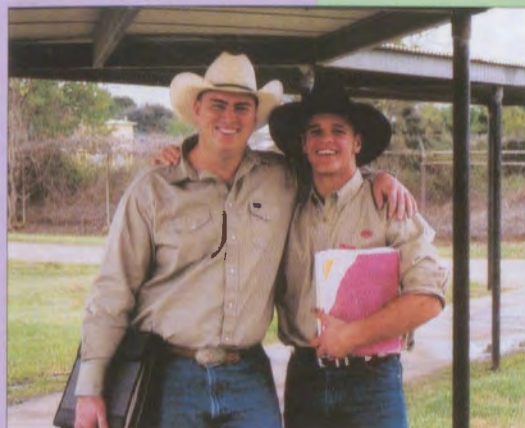

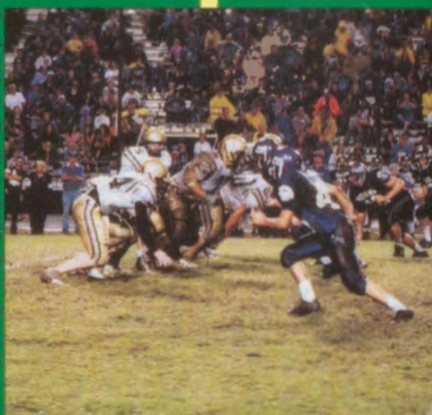

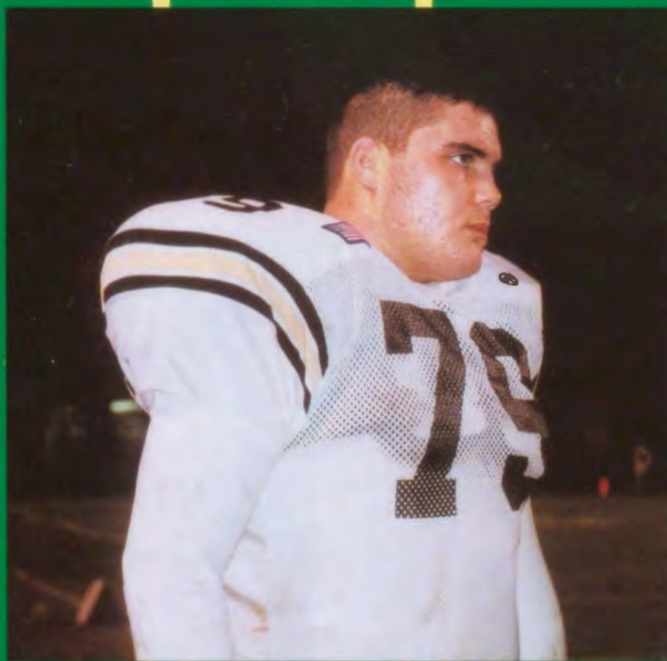

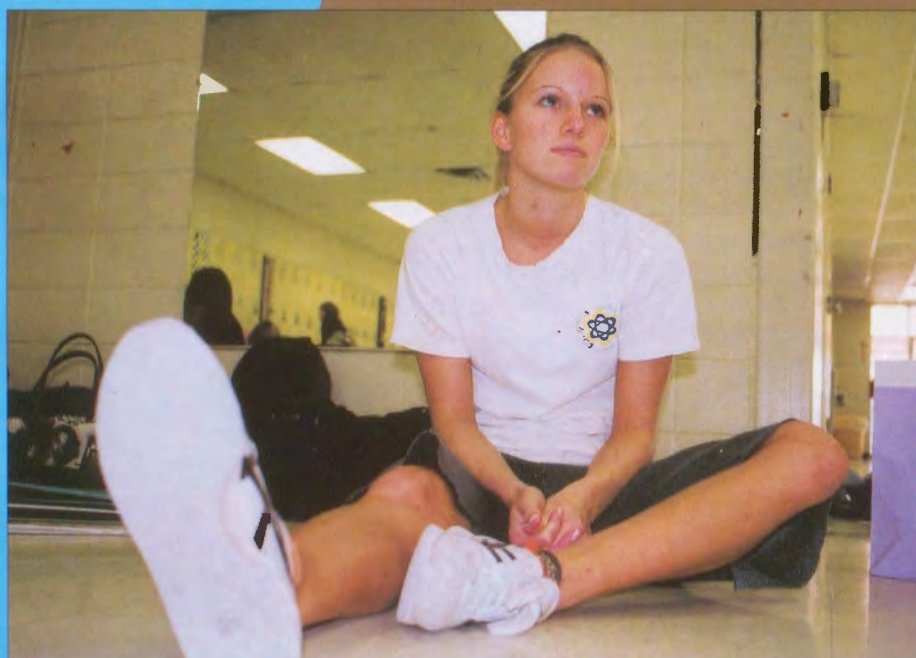

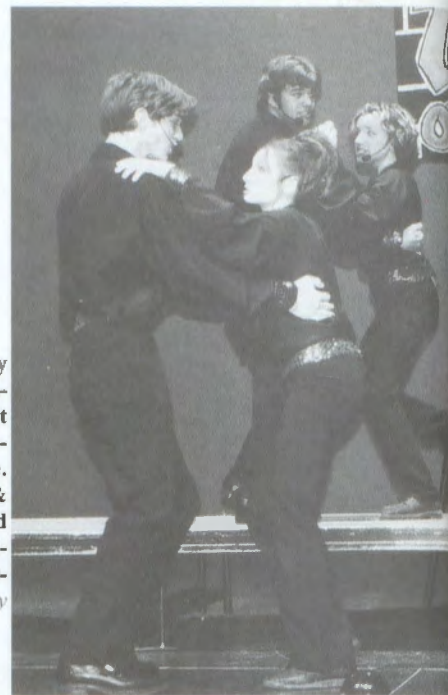

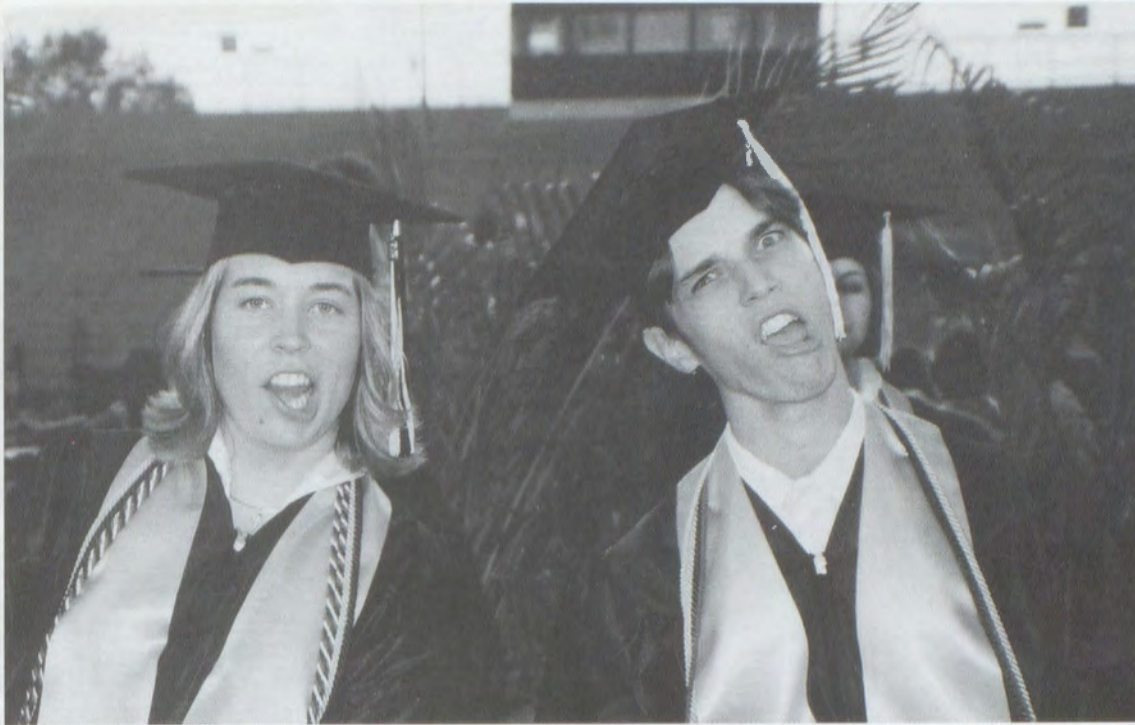

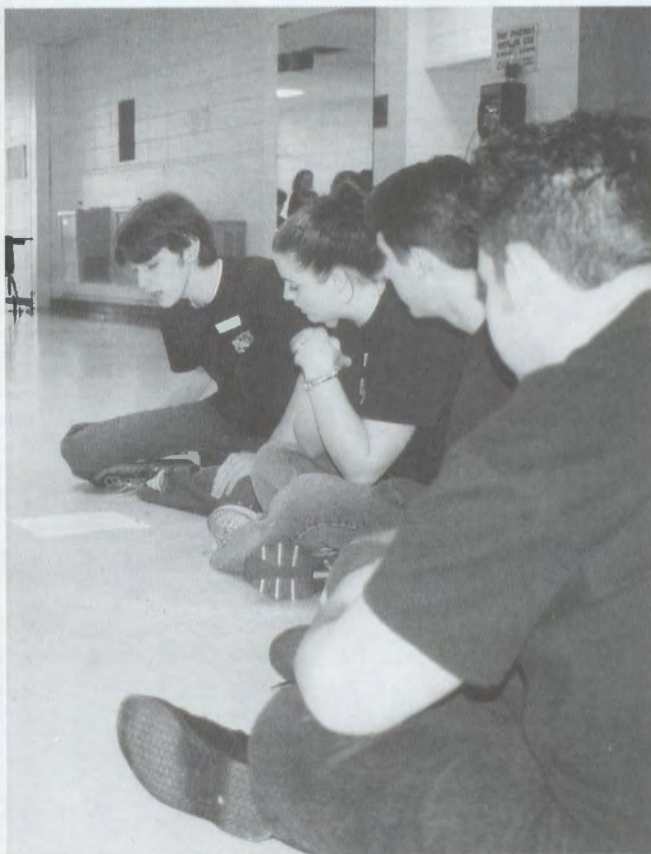

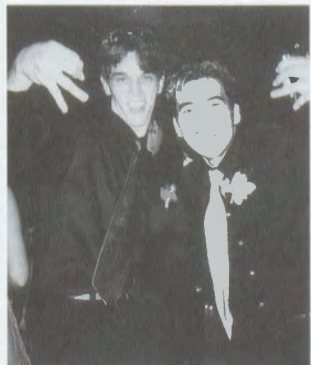

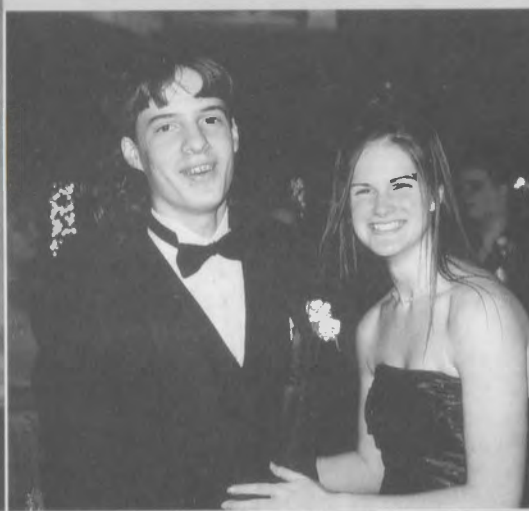

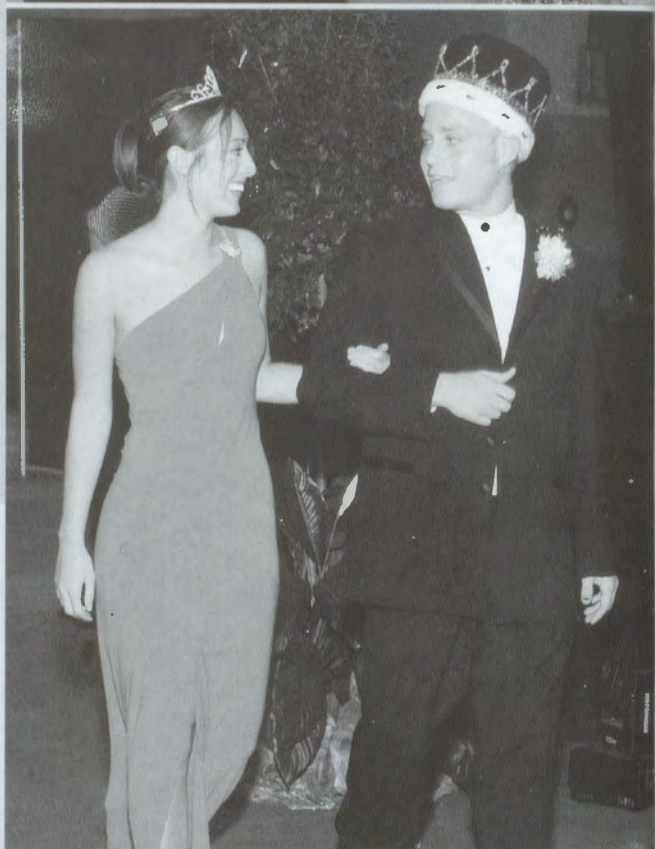

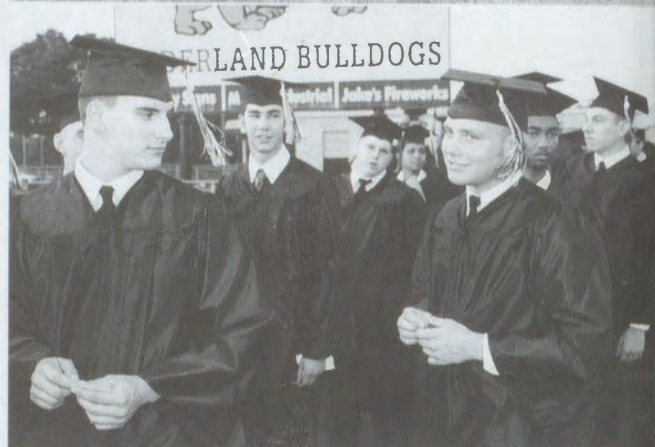

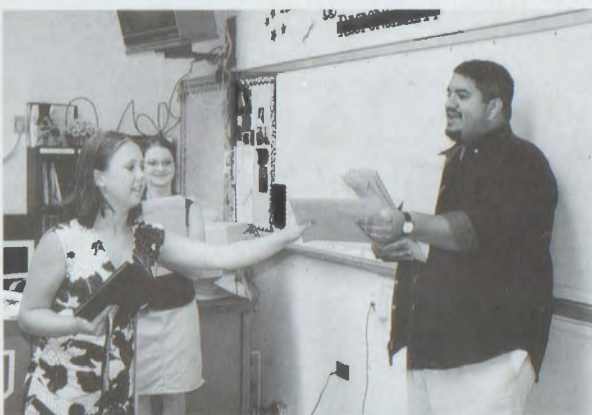

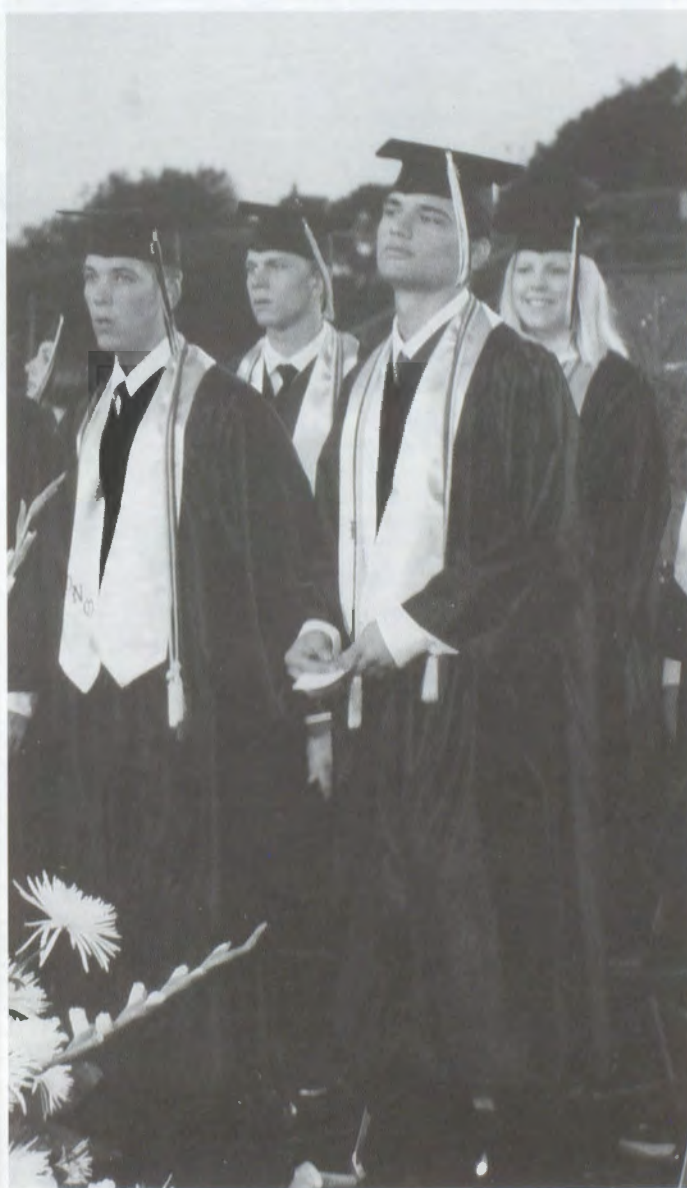

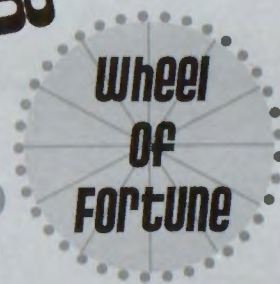

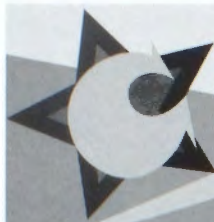

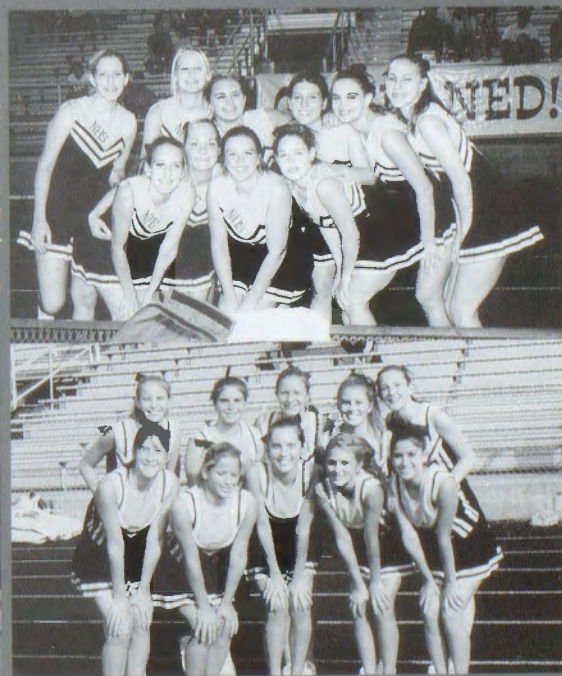

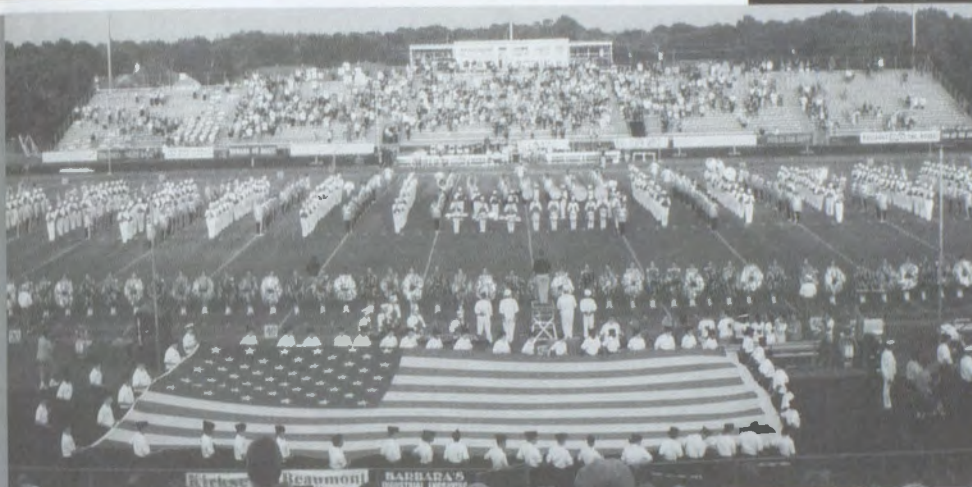

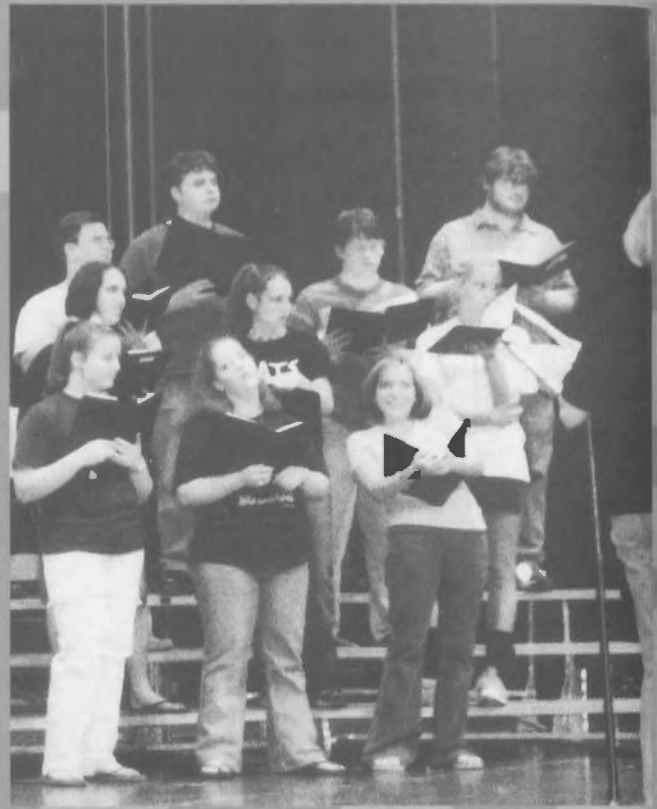

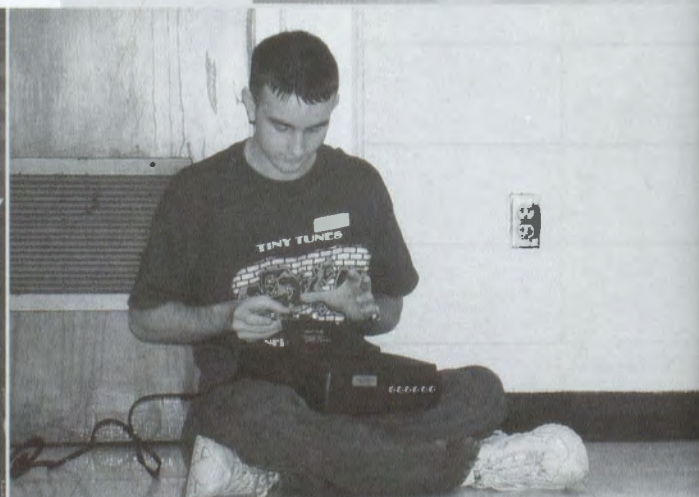

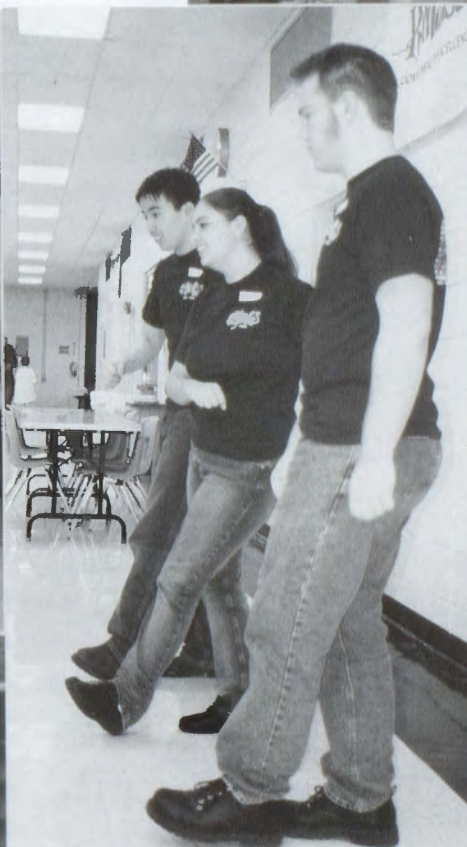

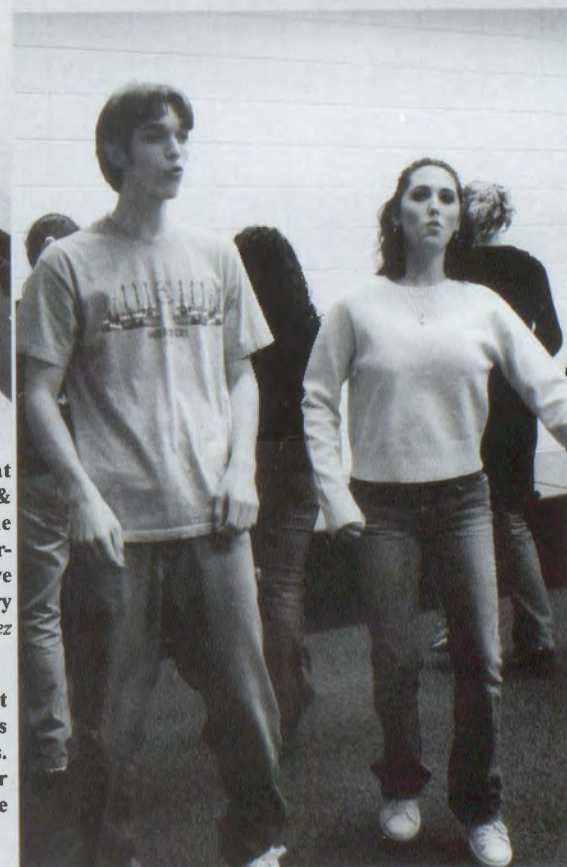

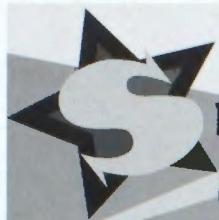

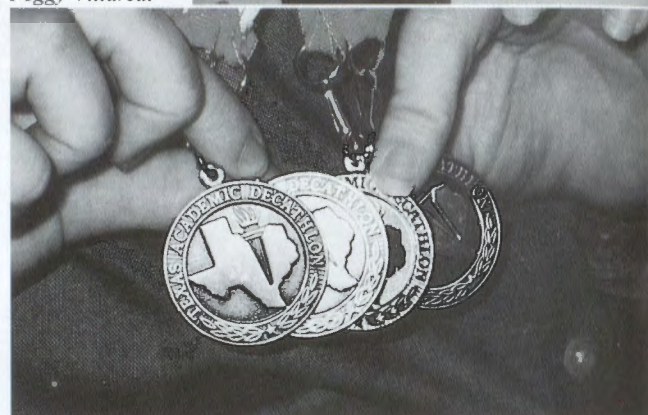

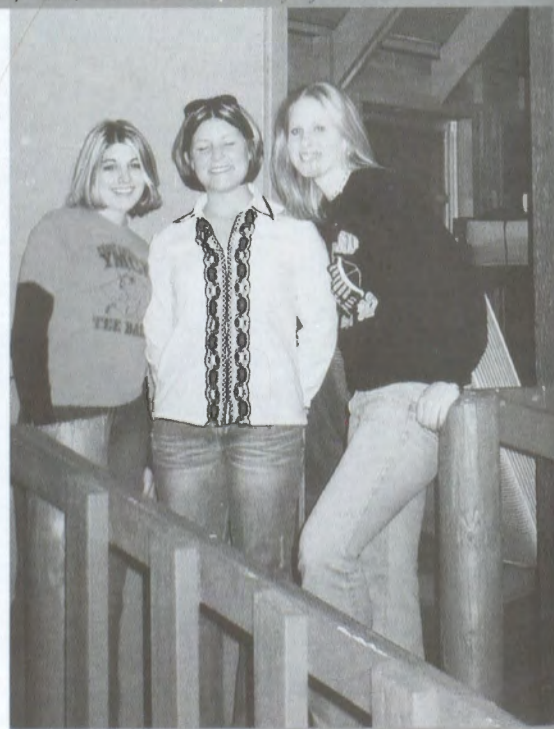

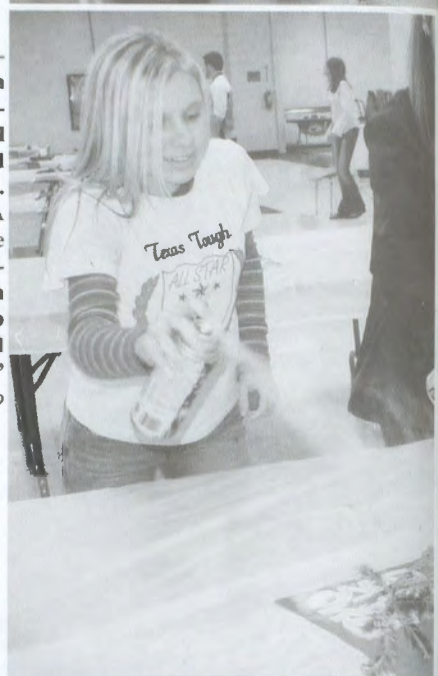
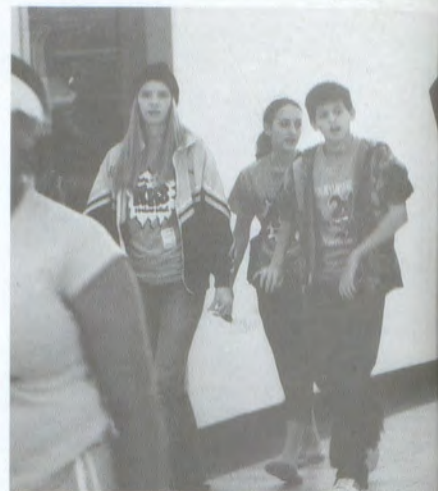

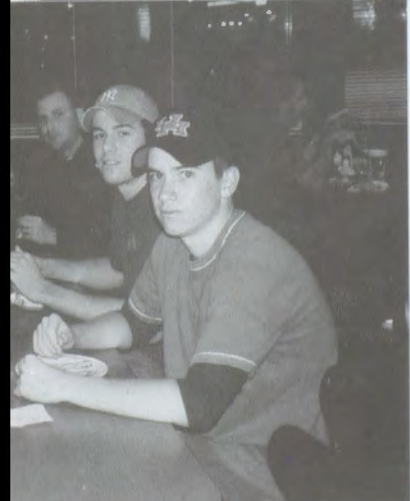

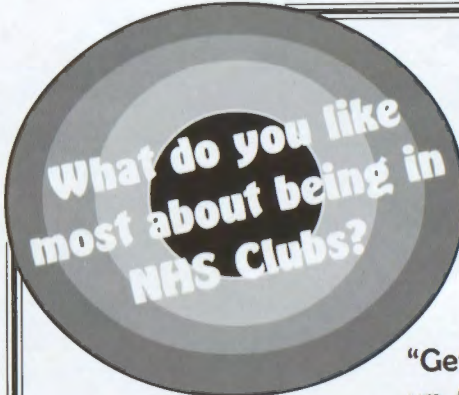

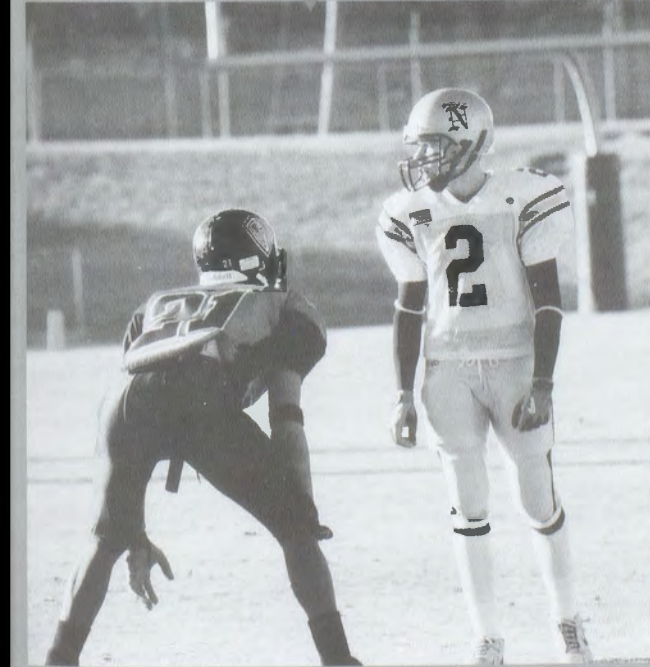

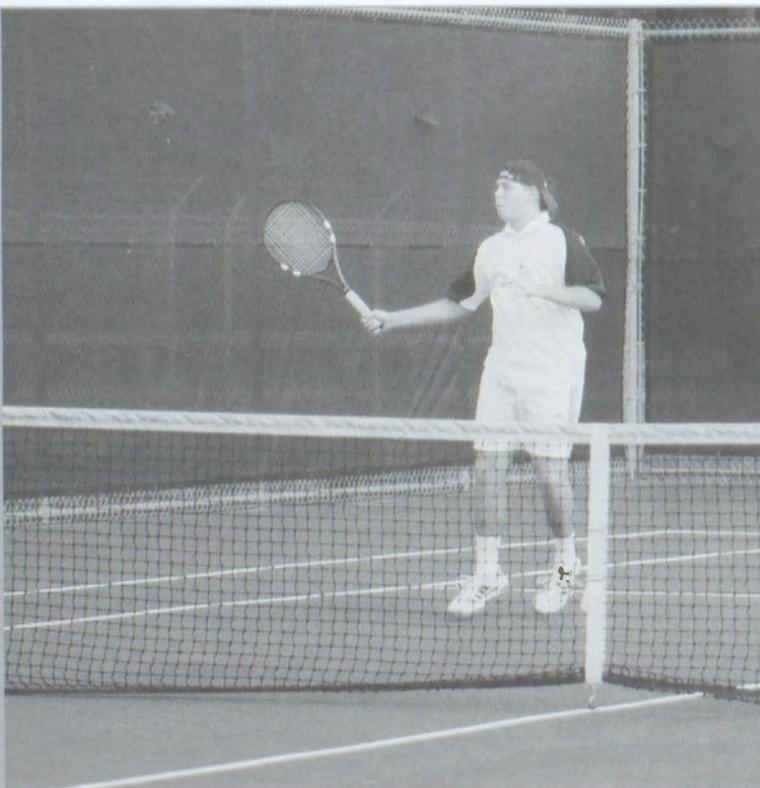

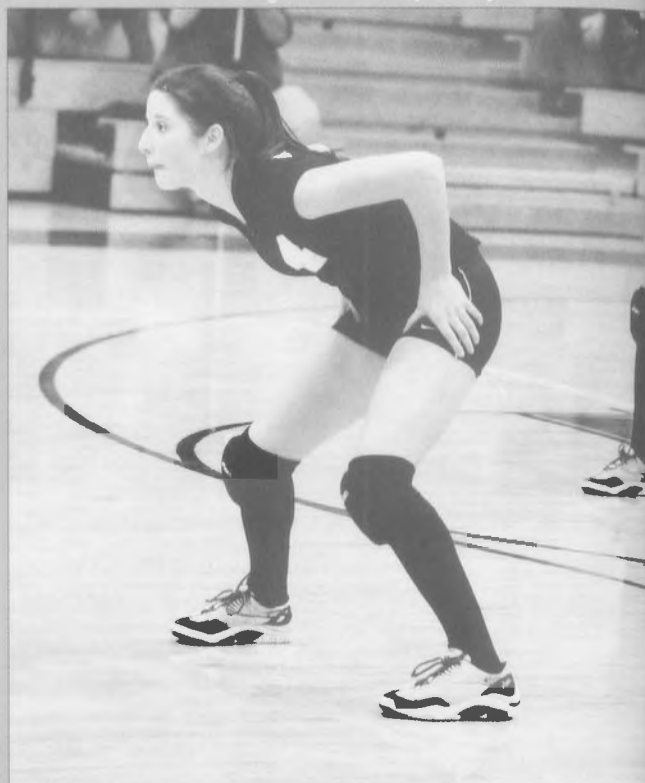

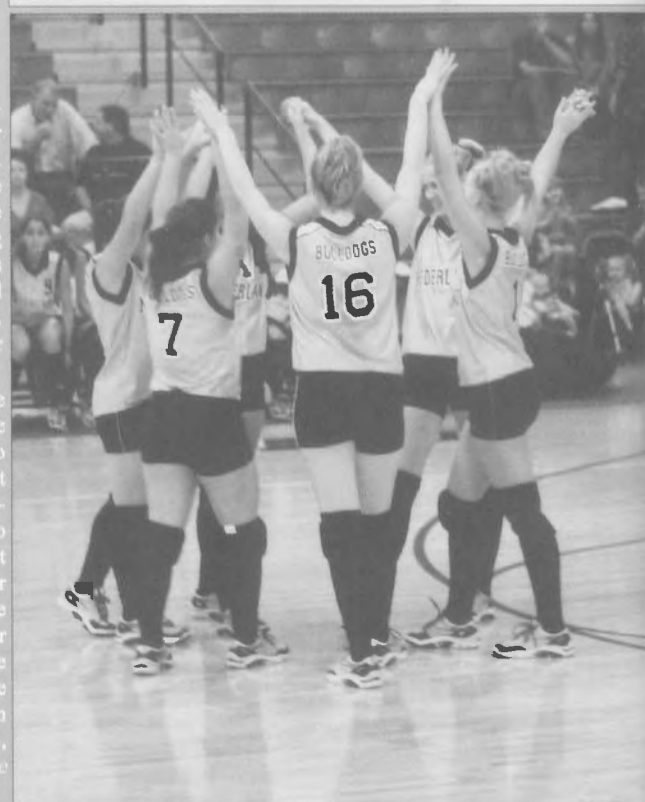

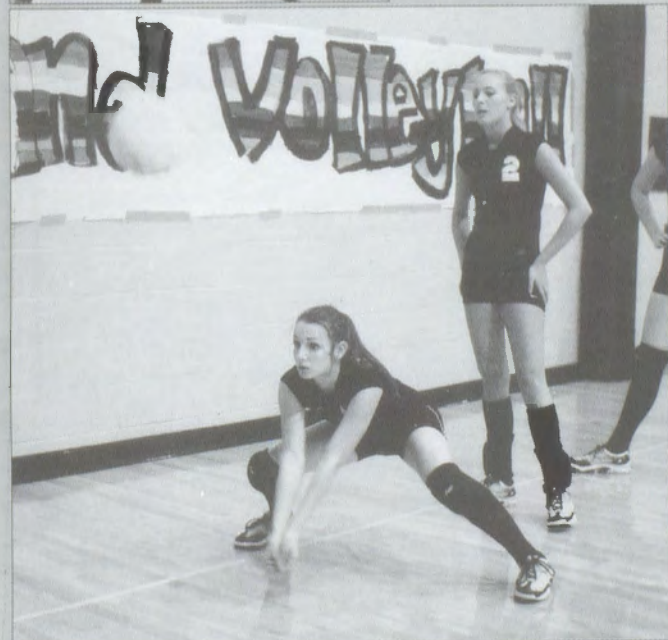

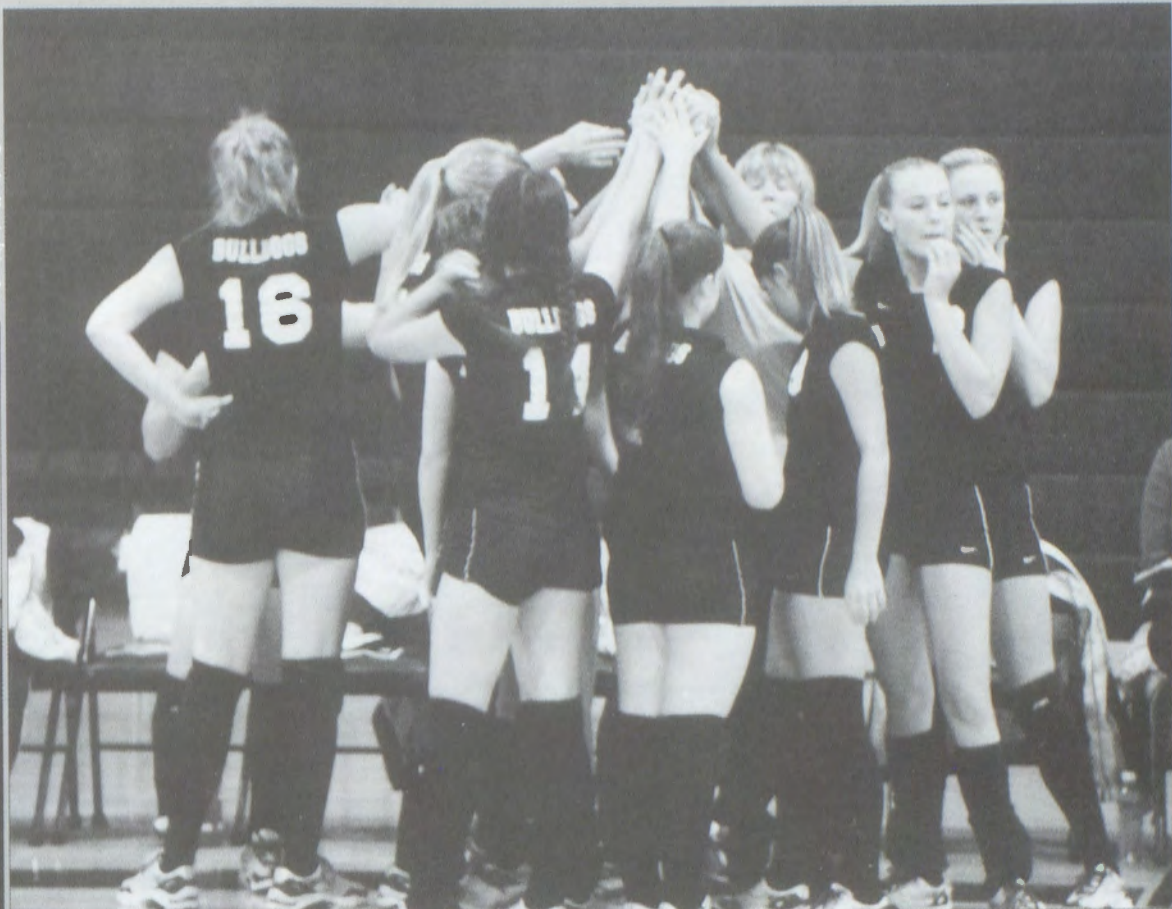

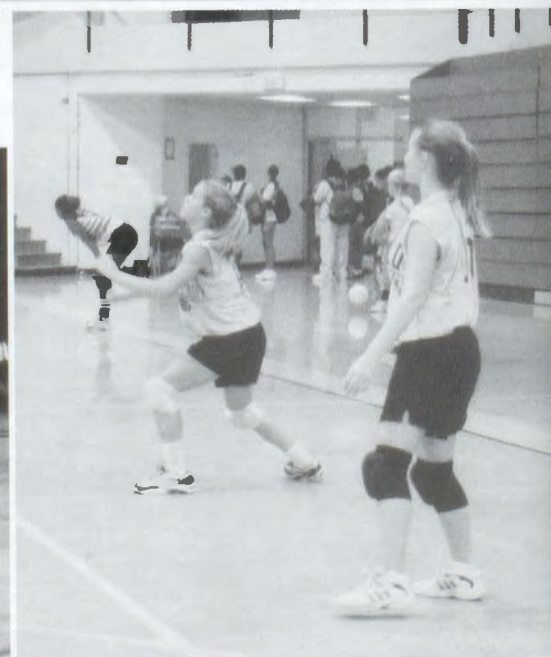

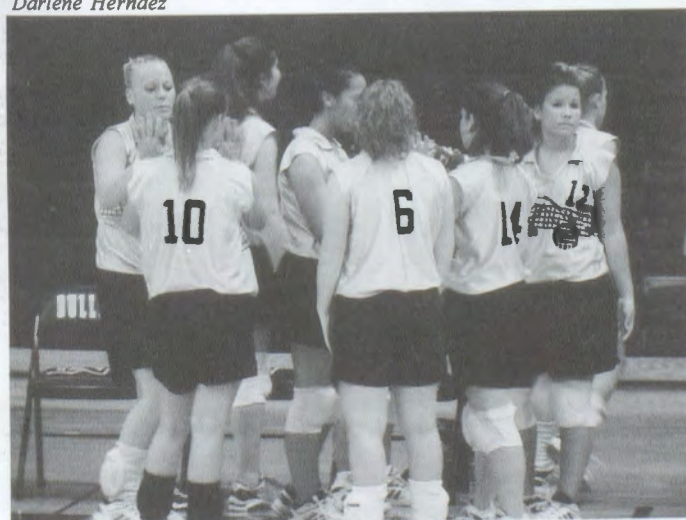

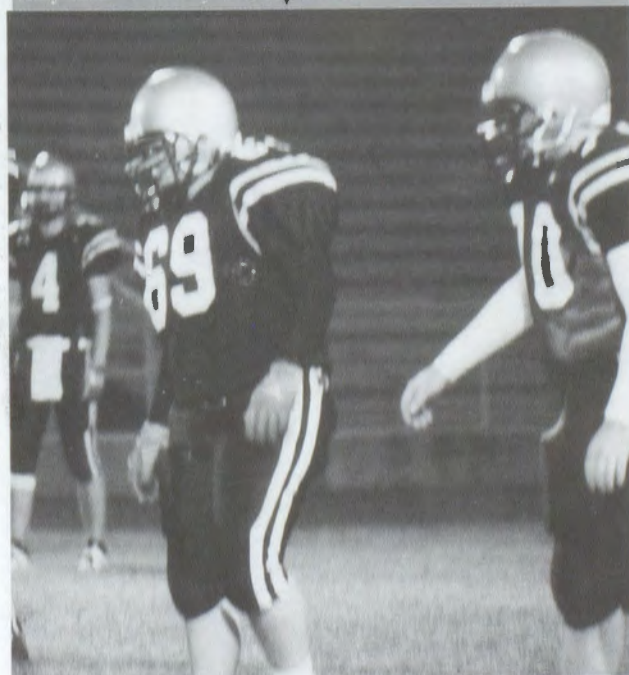

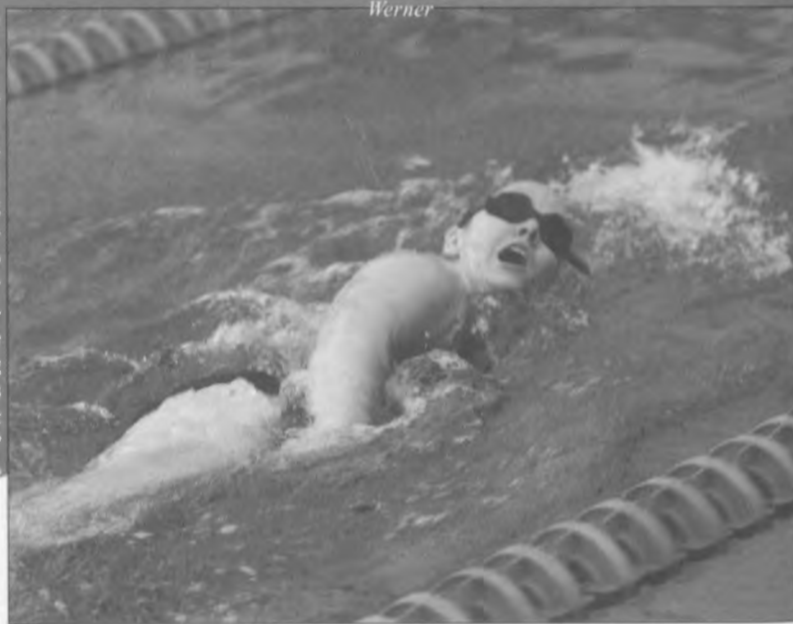

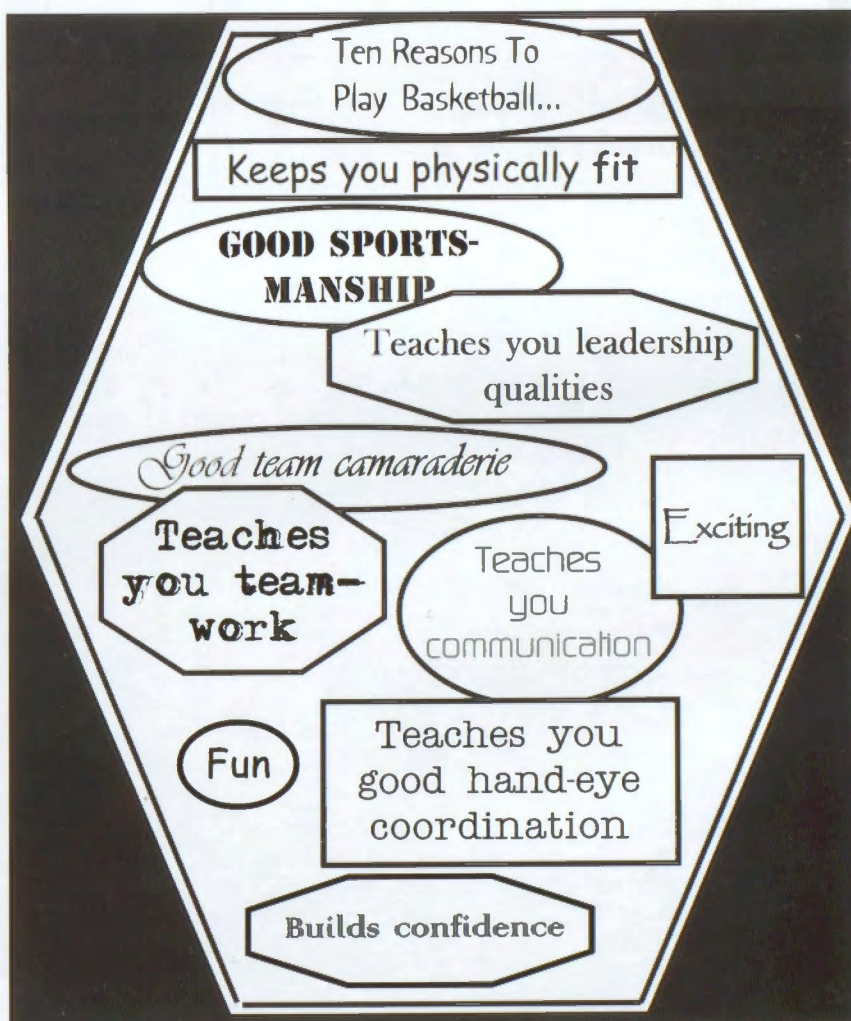

"For anyone interested in playing basketball, my advice is to just do something everyday and to stay active."

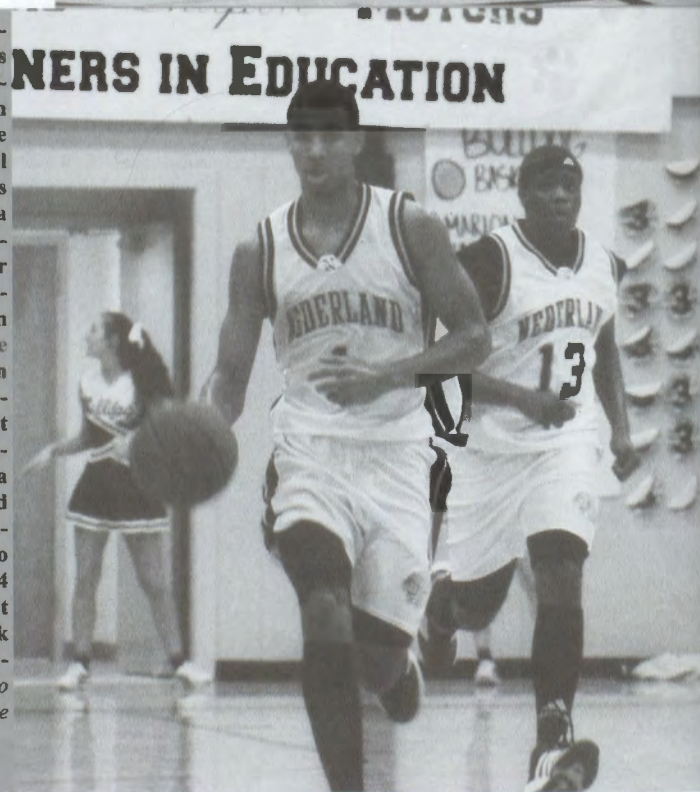

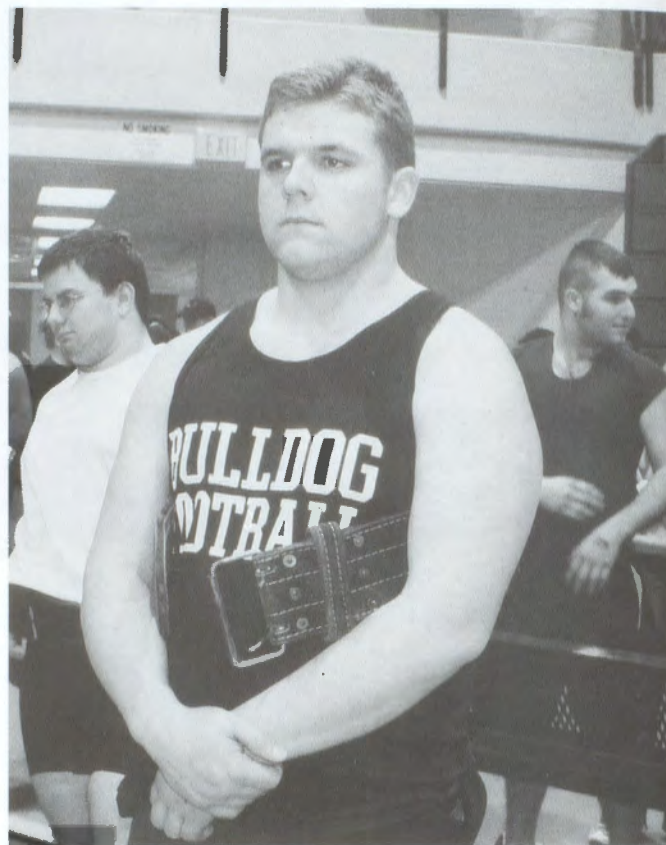

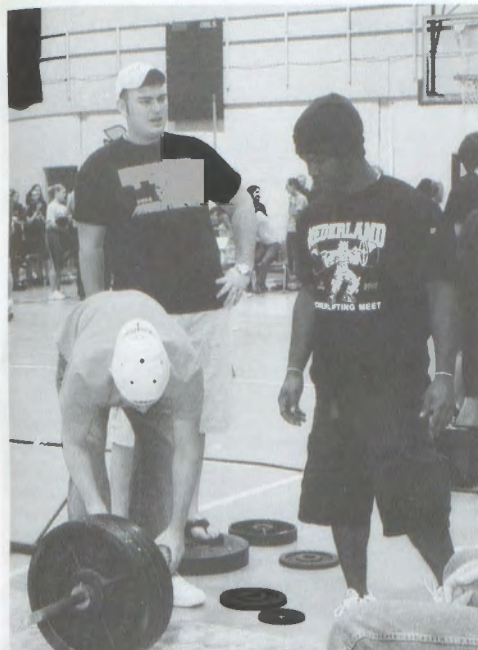

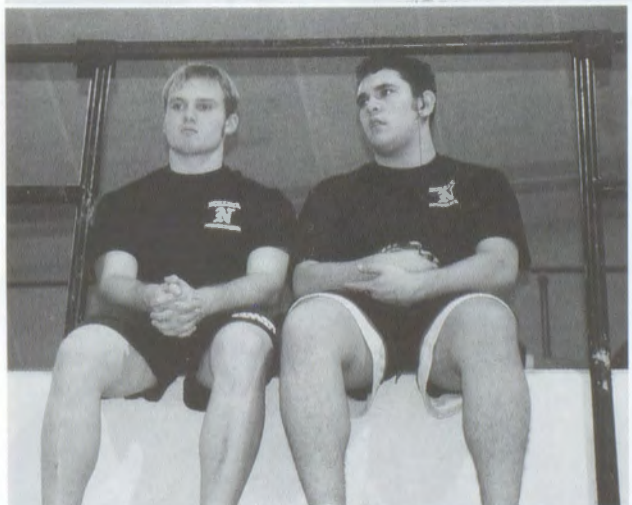

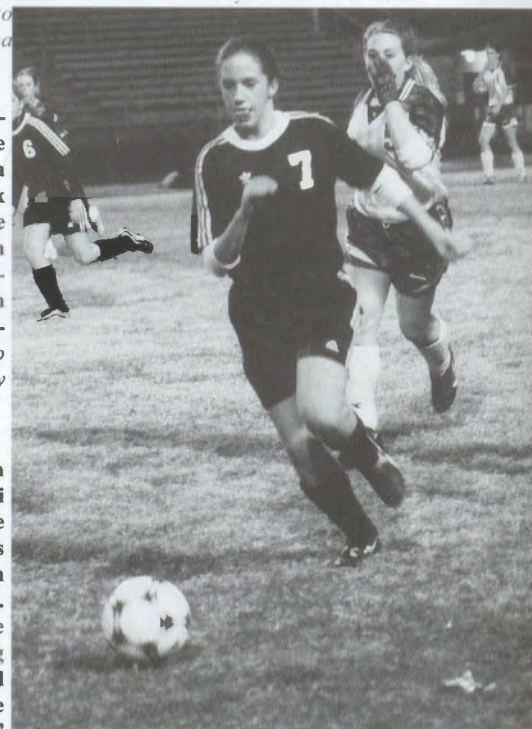

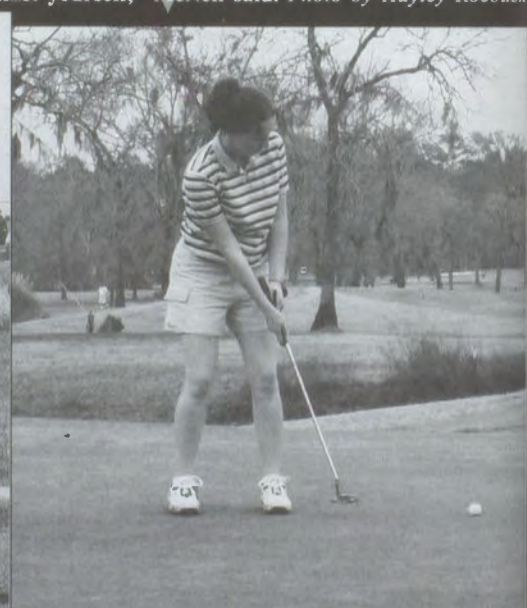

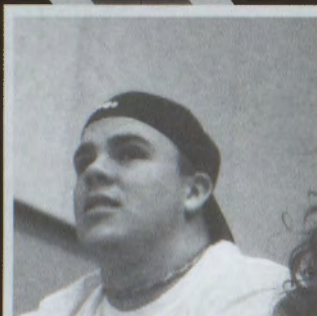

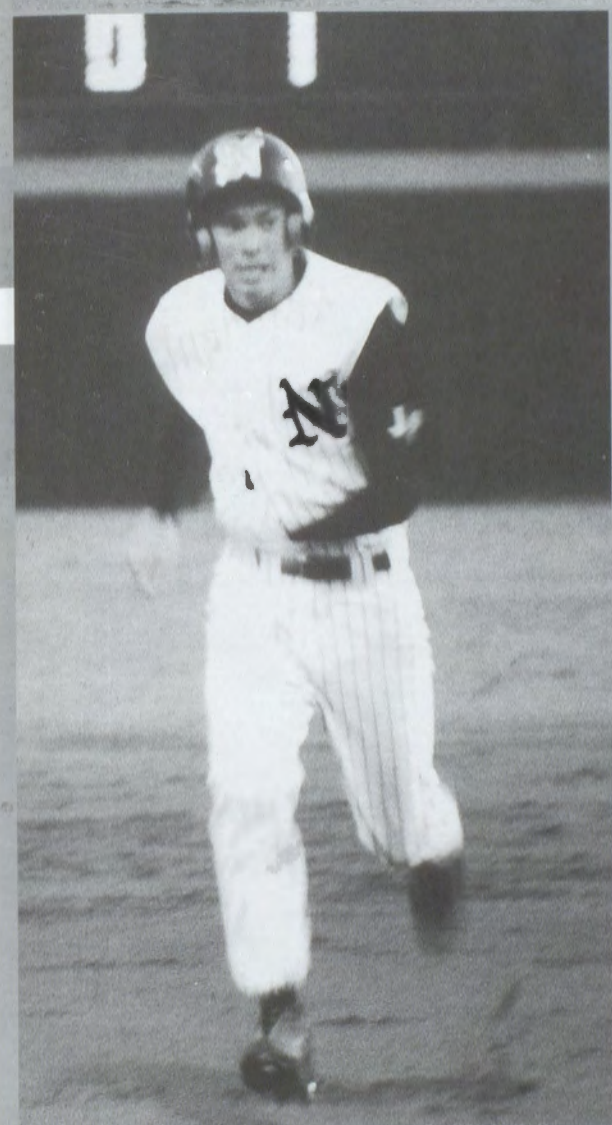

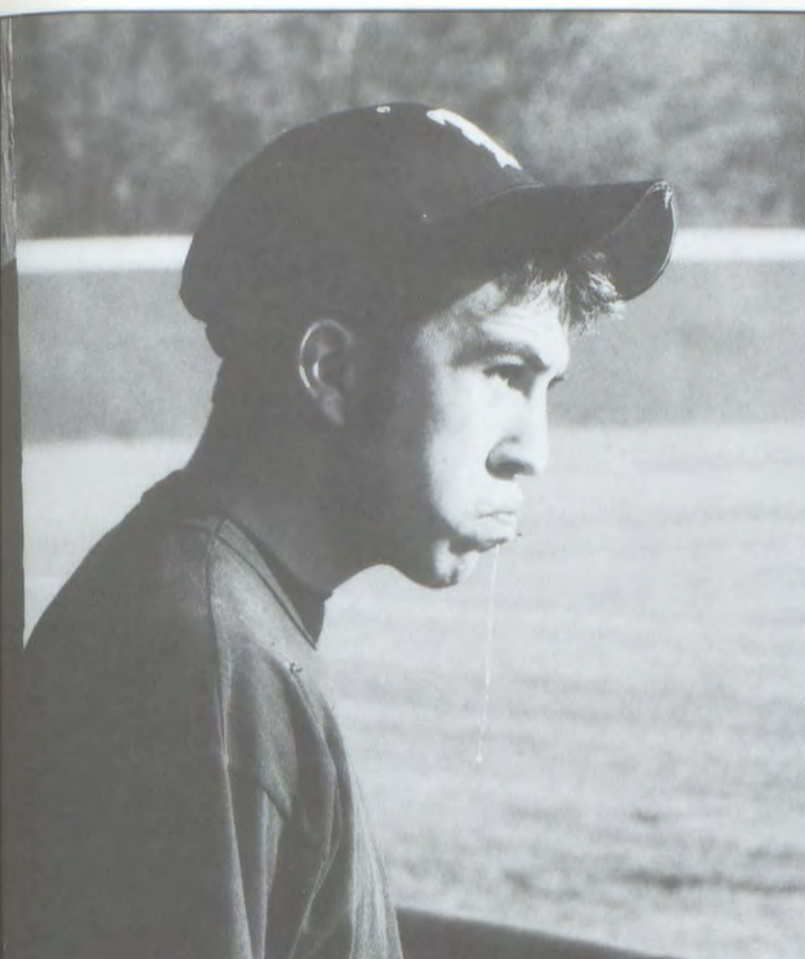

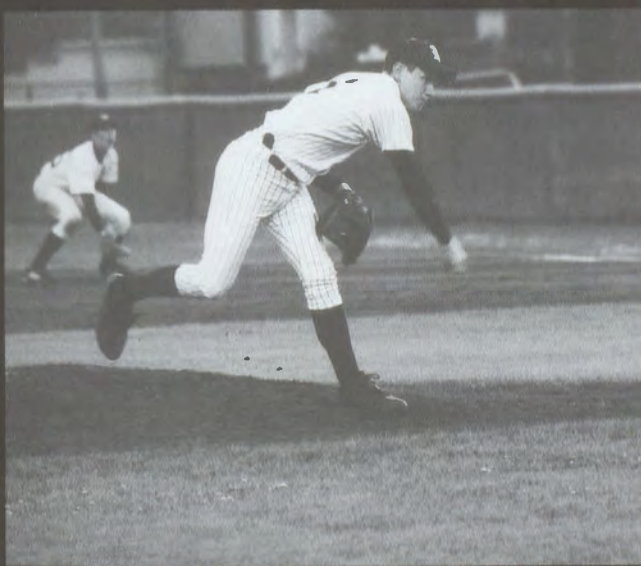

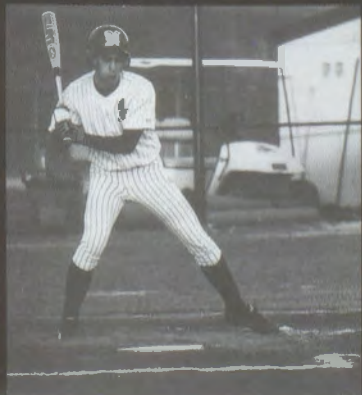

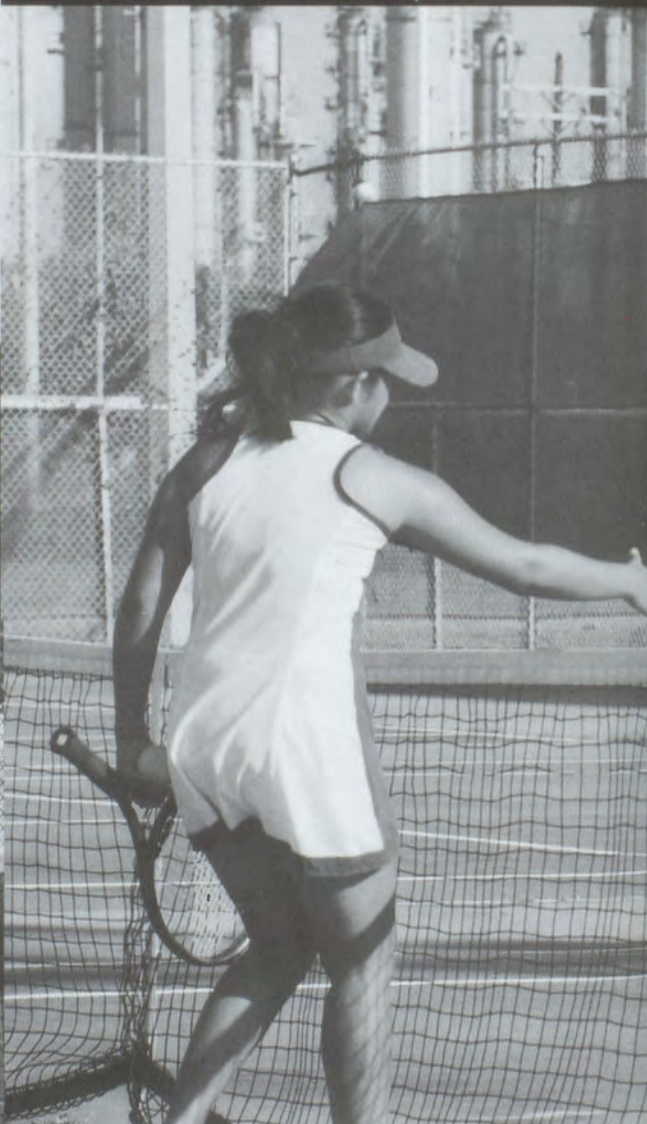

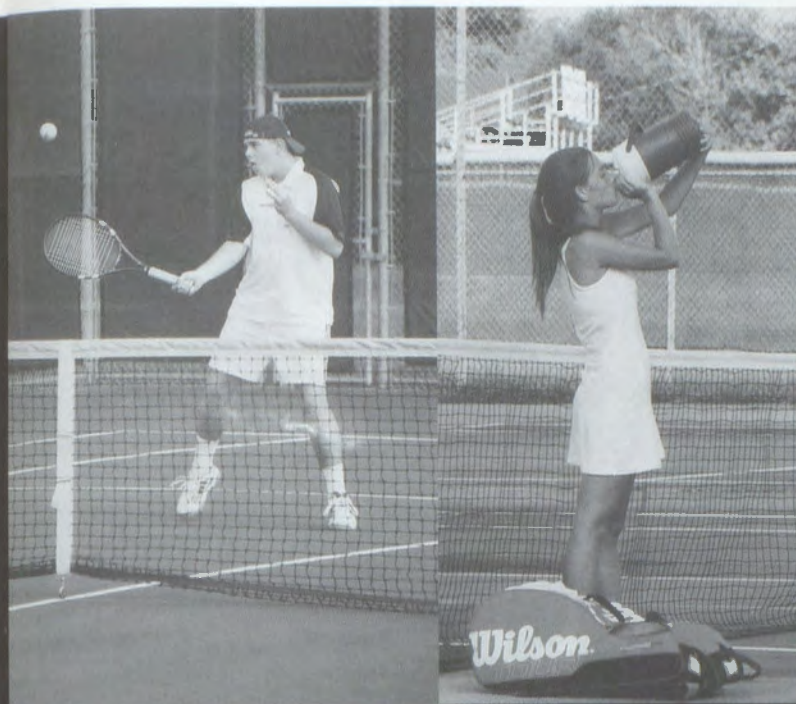

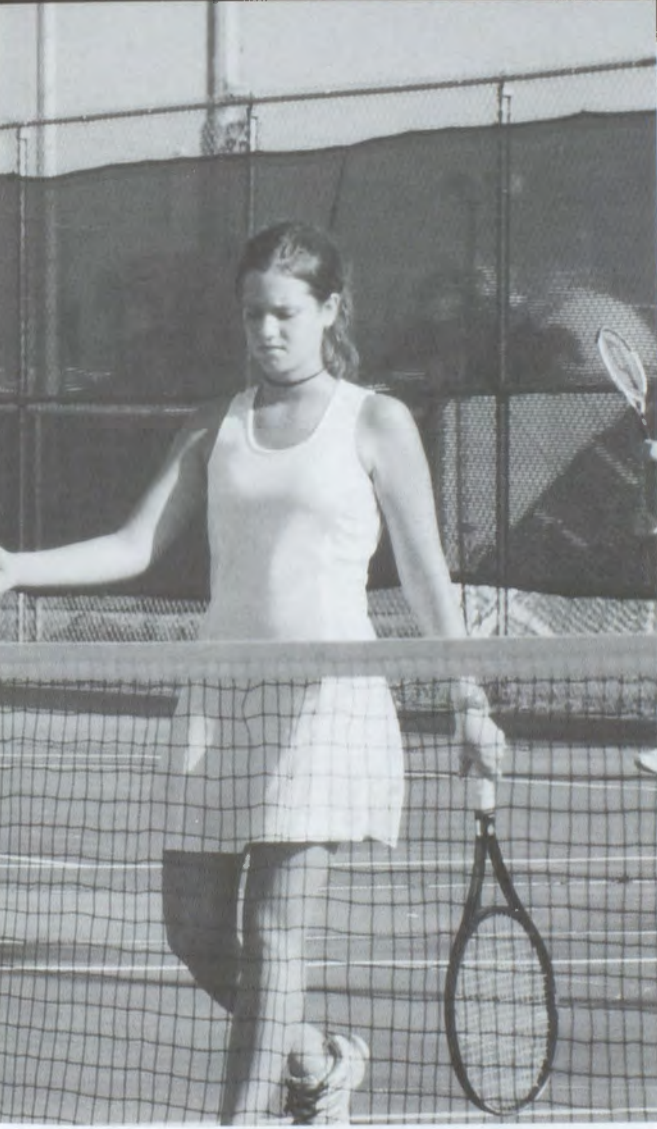

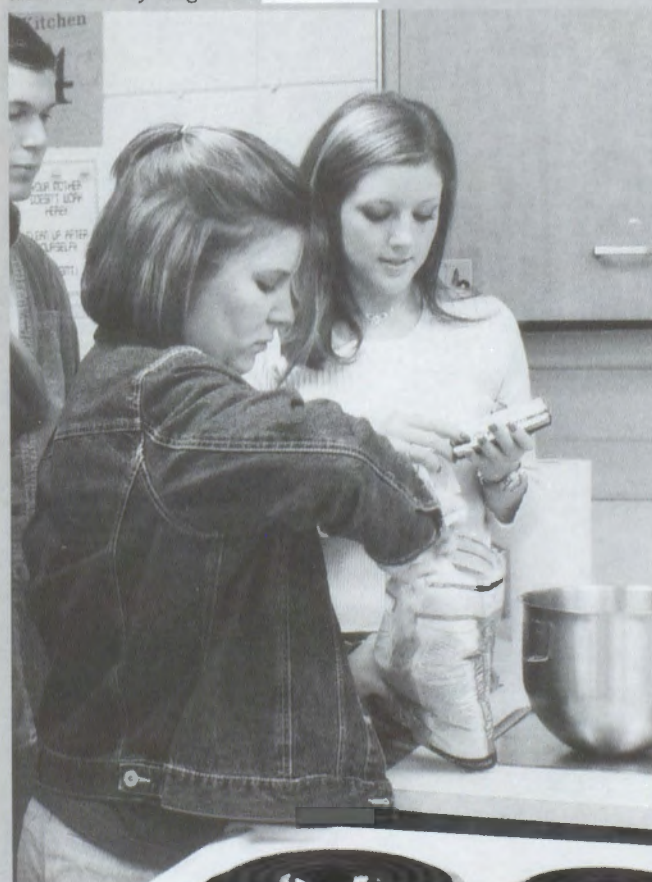

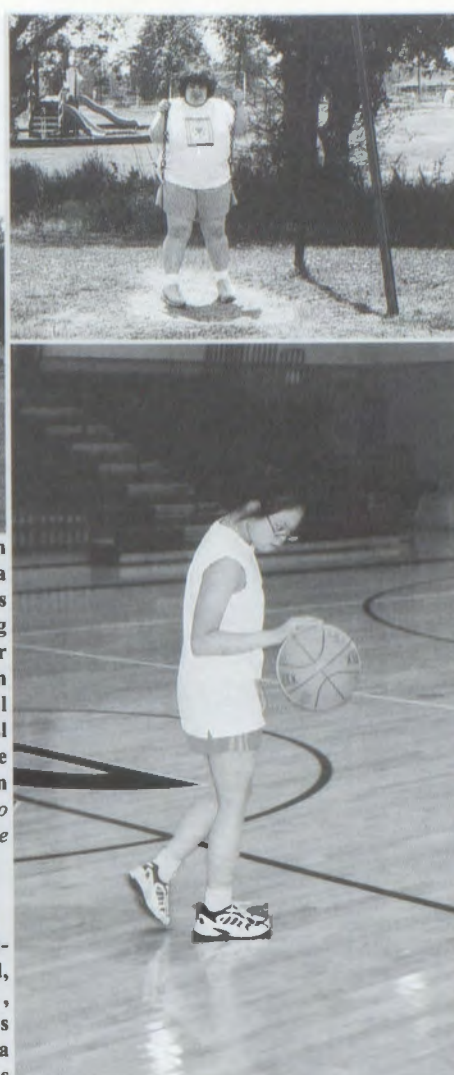

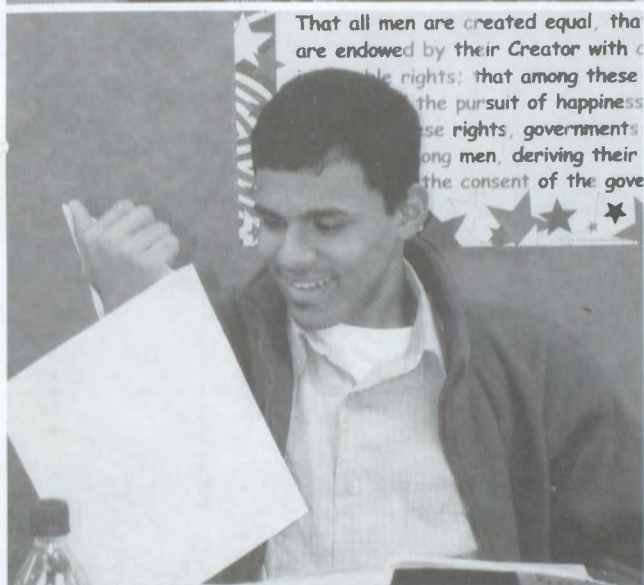
“My favorite thing to do in Criminal Justice is doing community service. Especially going to provide security at the Garth House,” Jamie Cureton, sophomore, said.

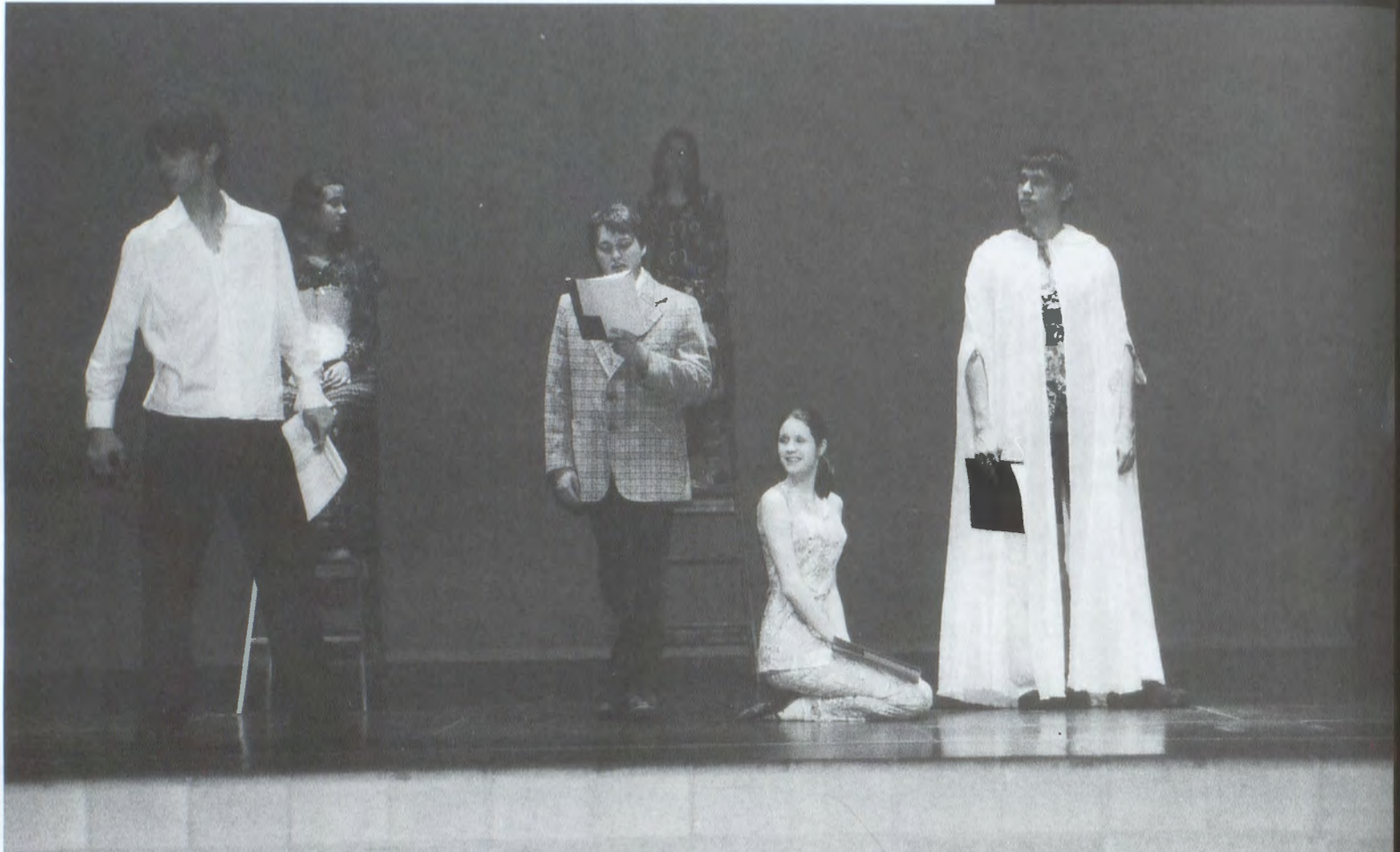

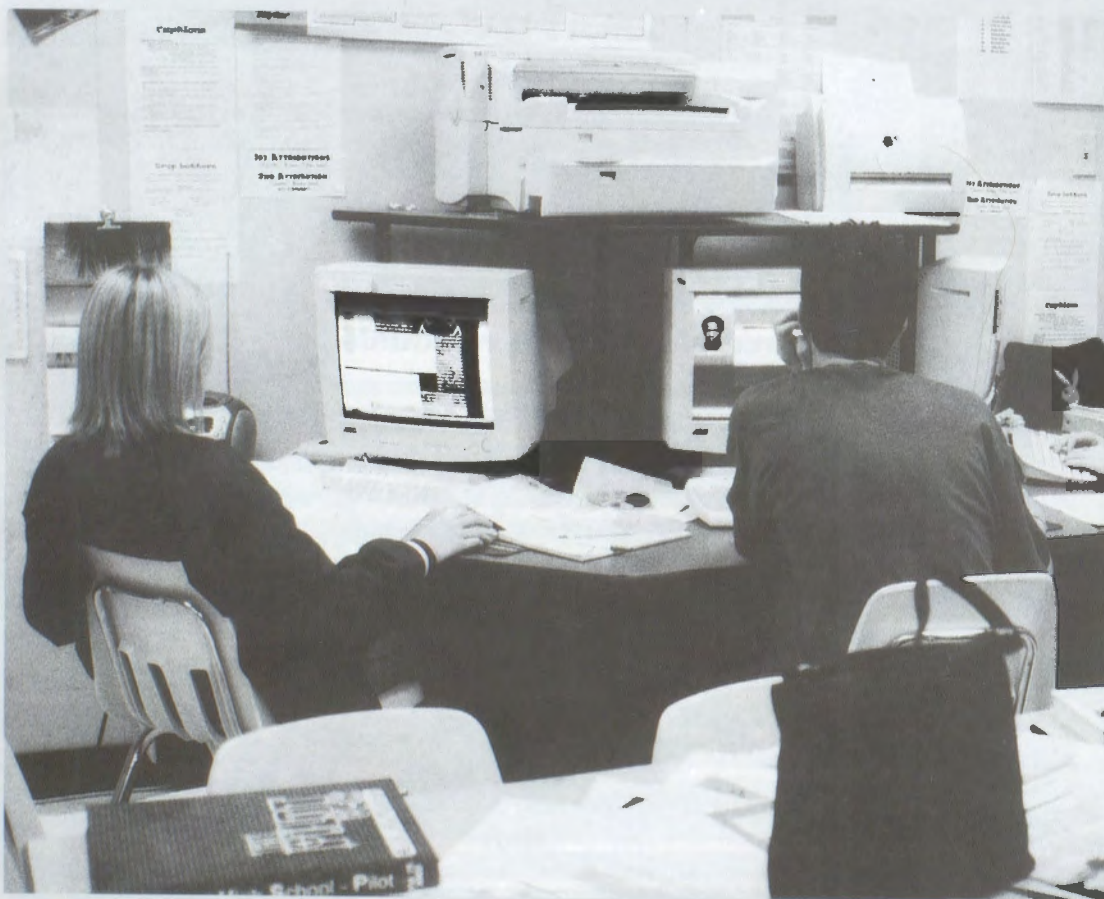

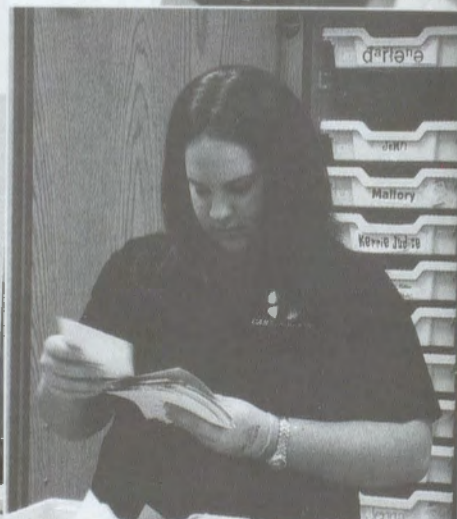

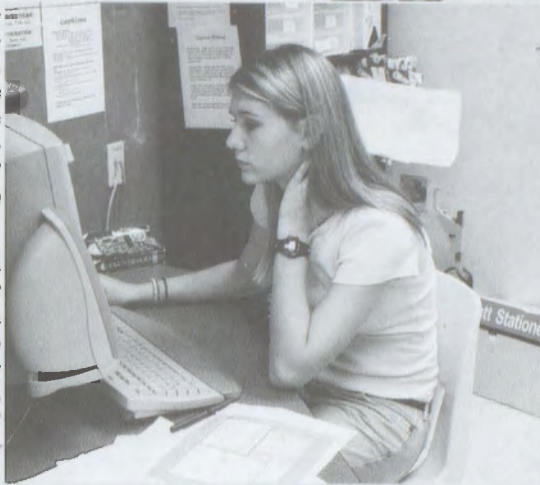

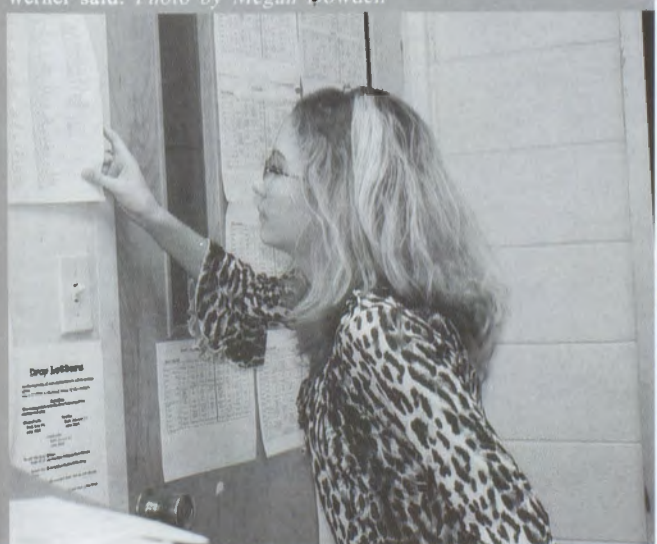

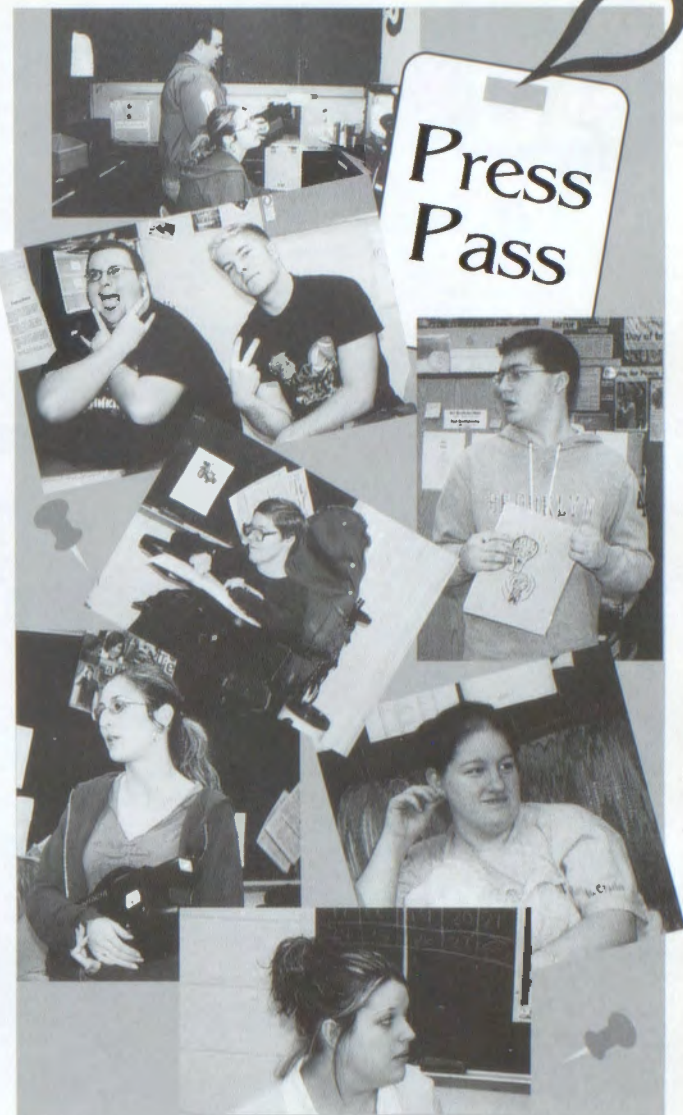

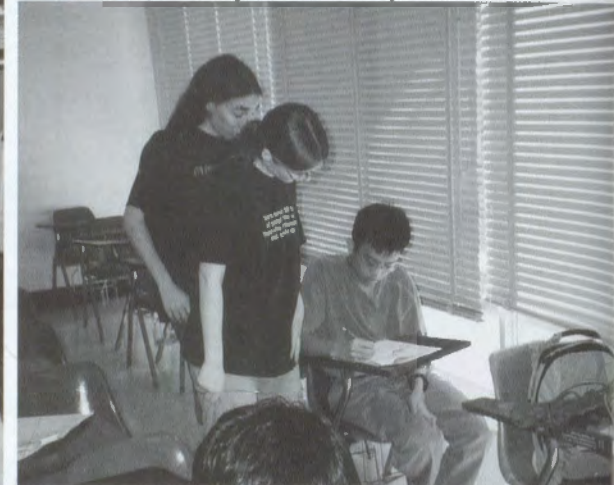

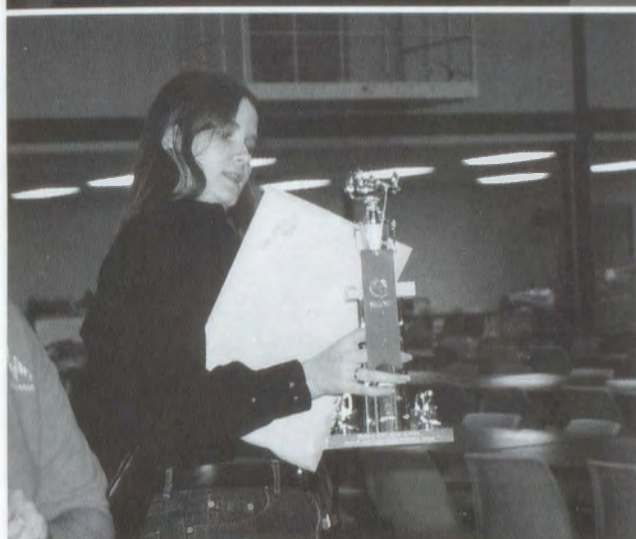

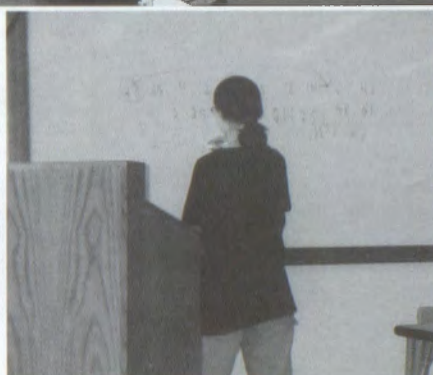

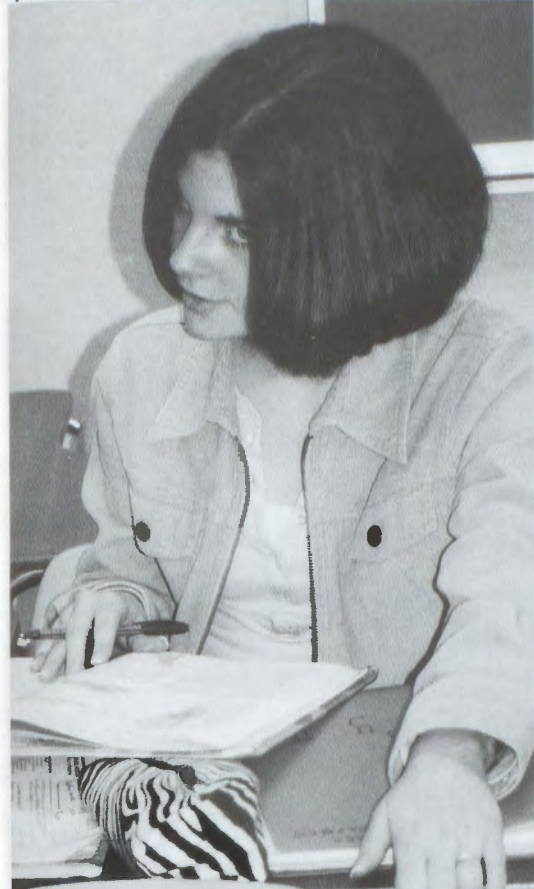

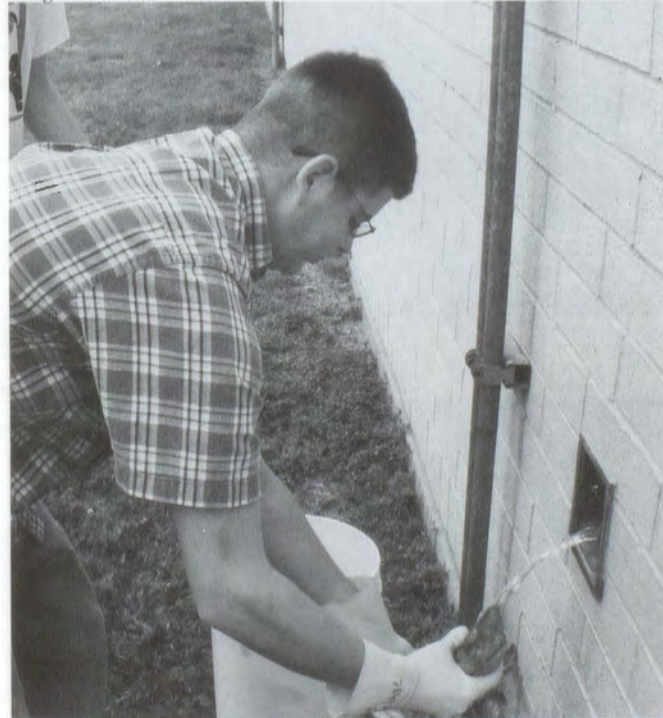

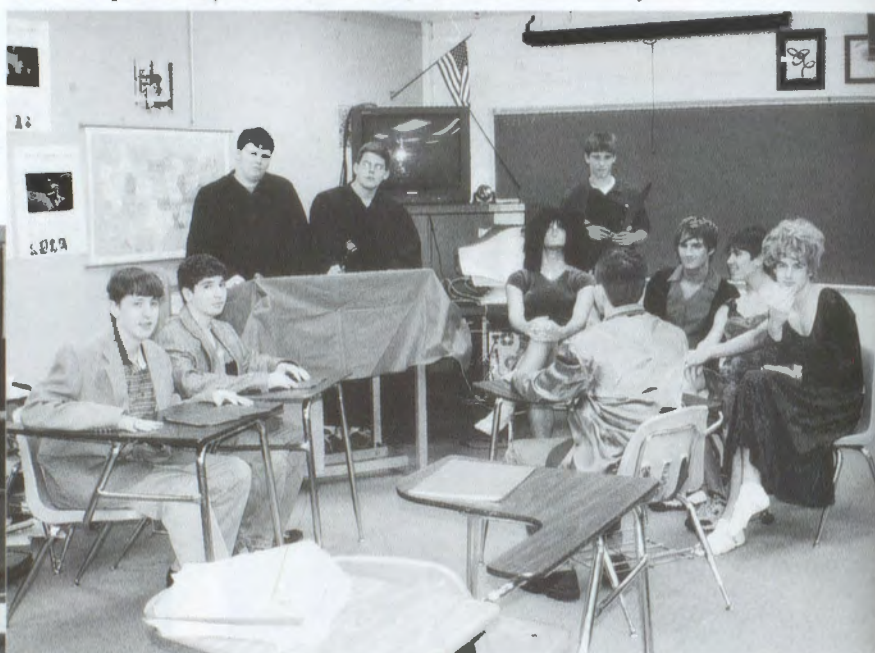

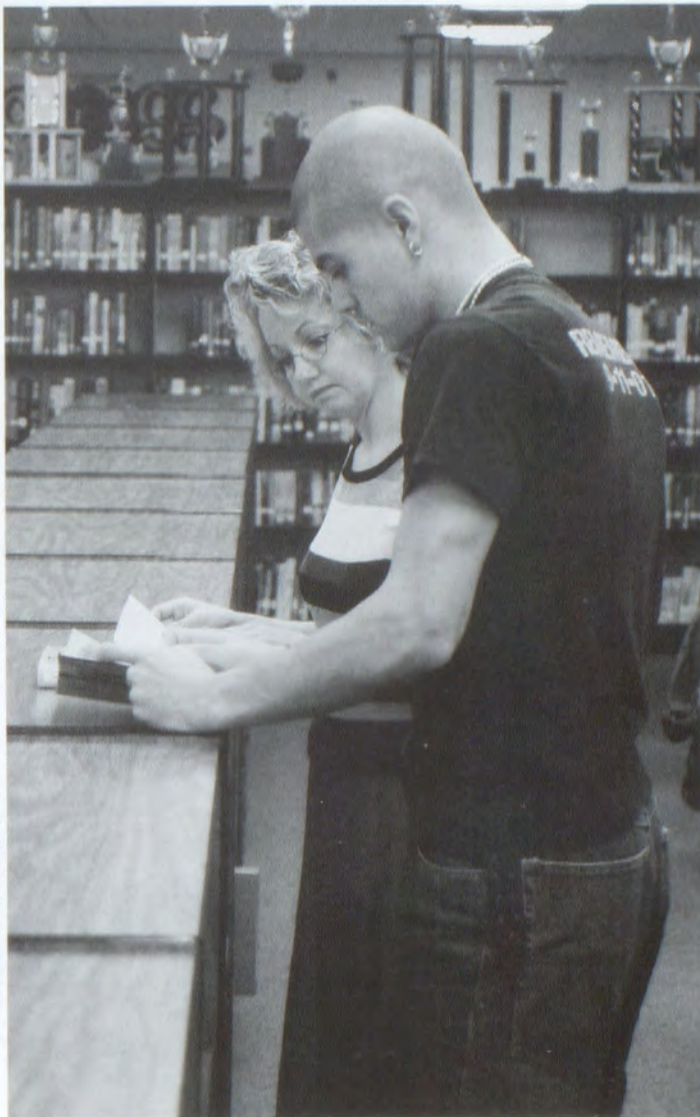

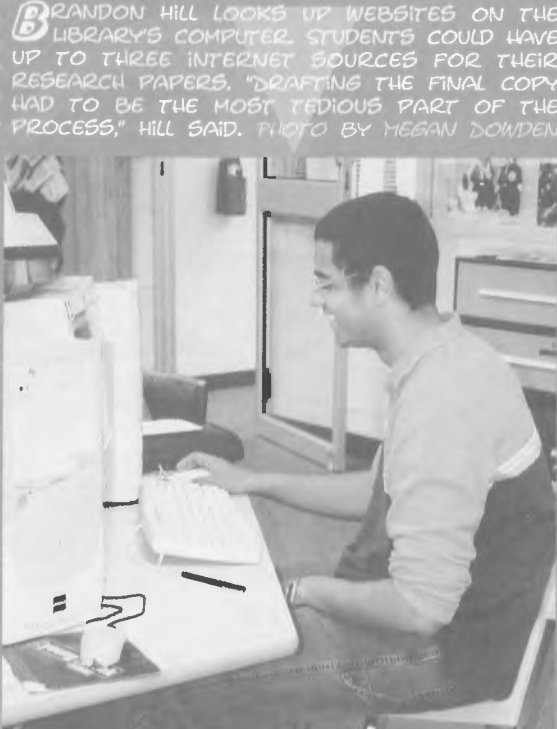

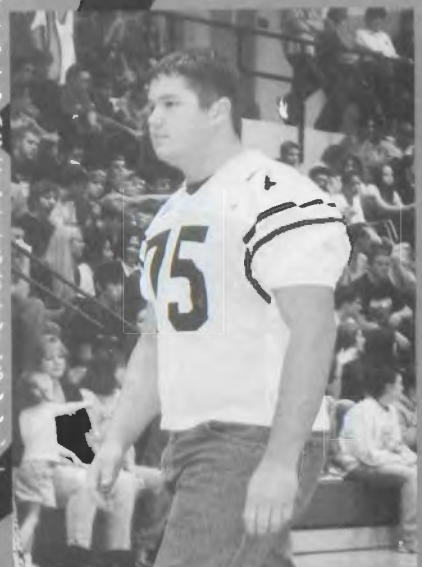

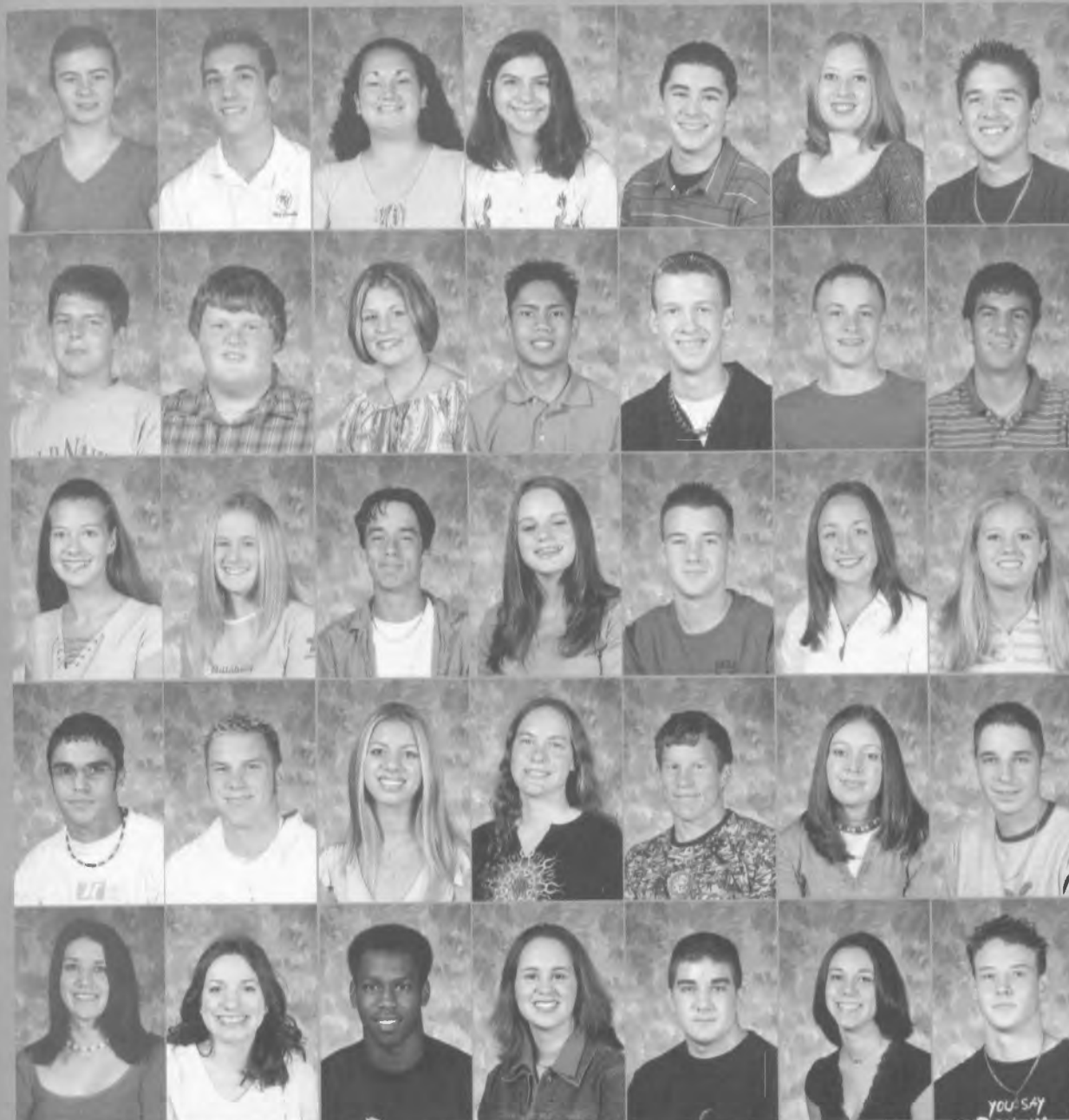

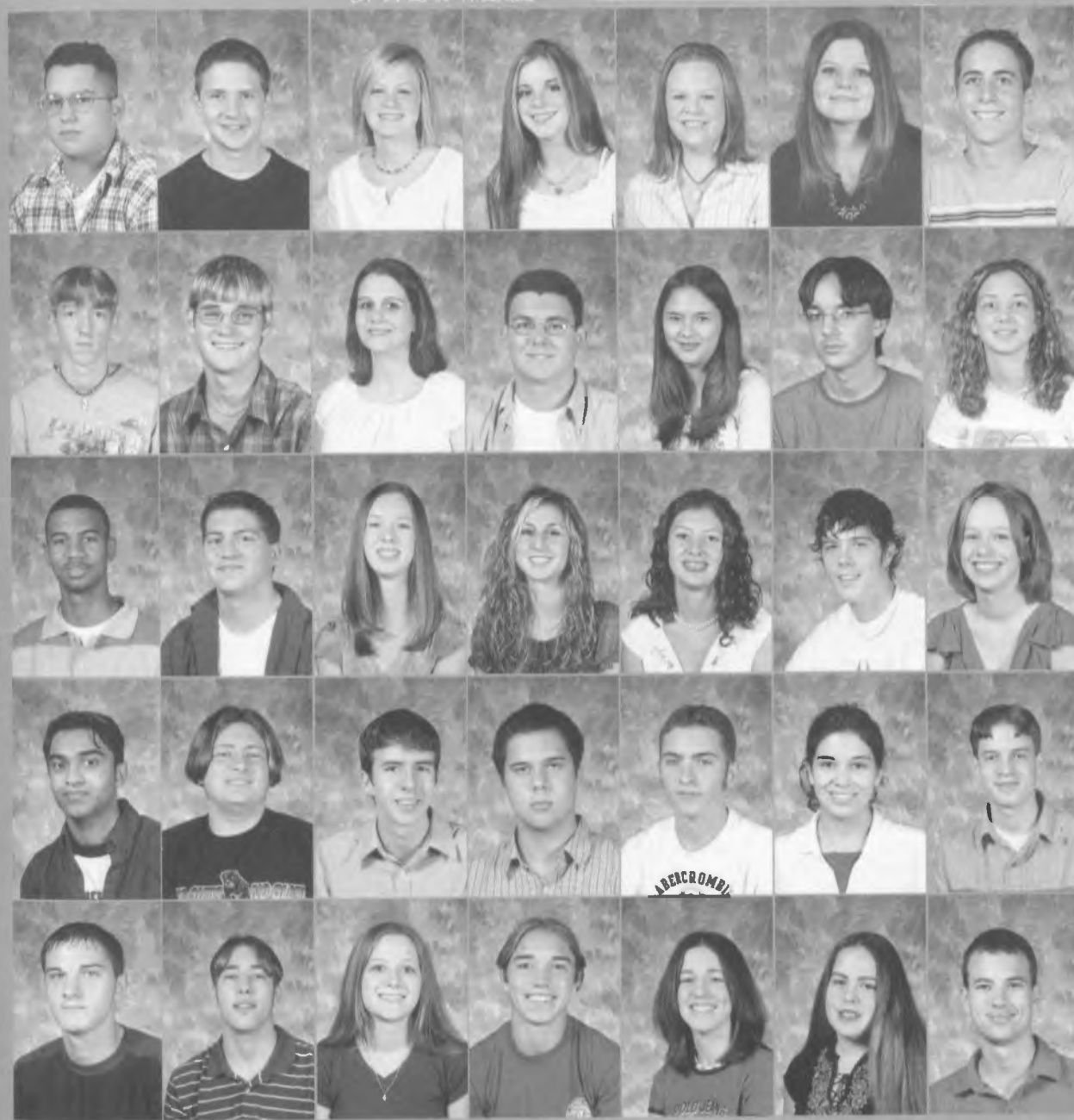

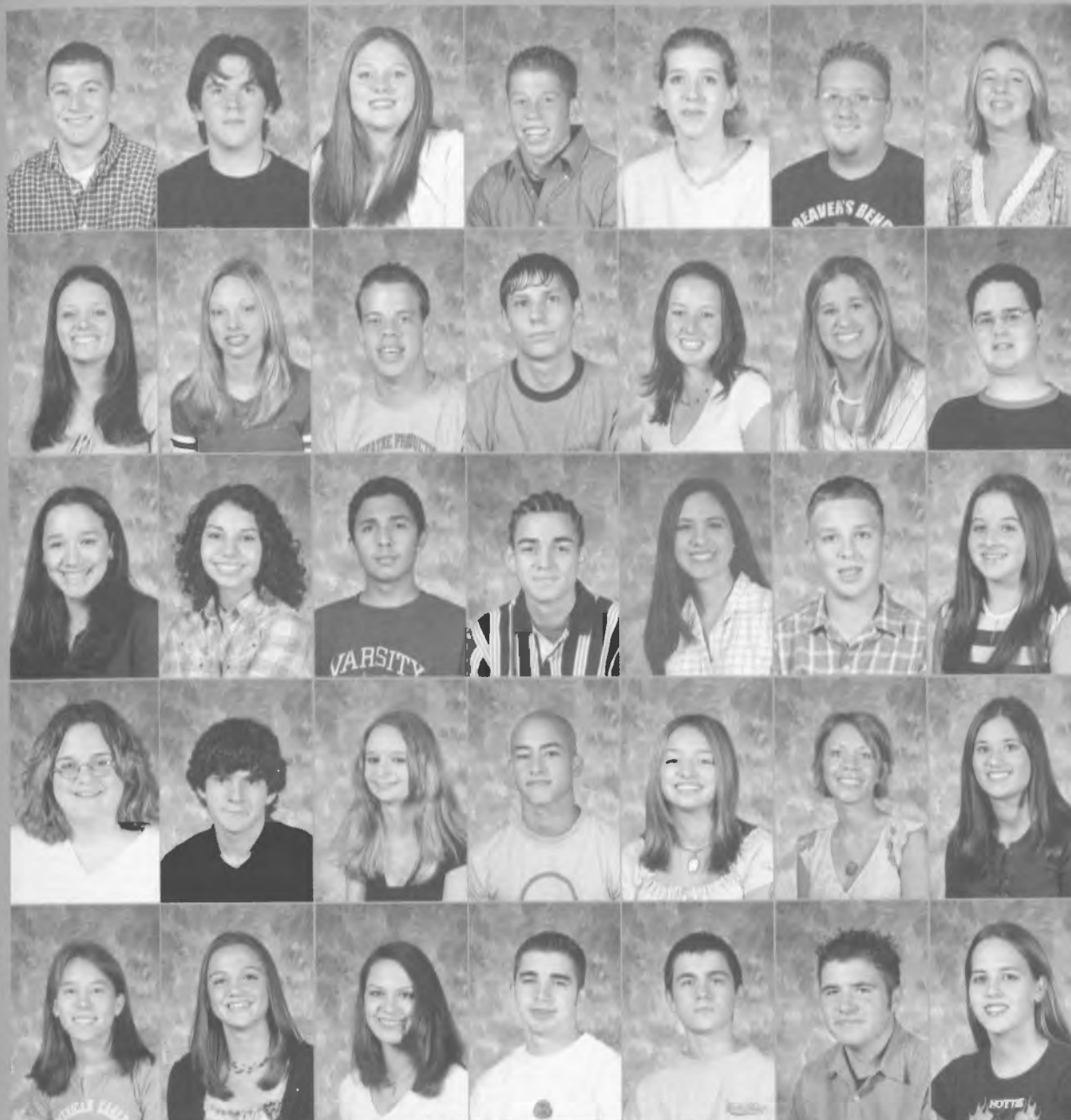

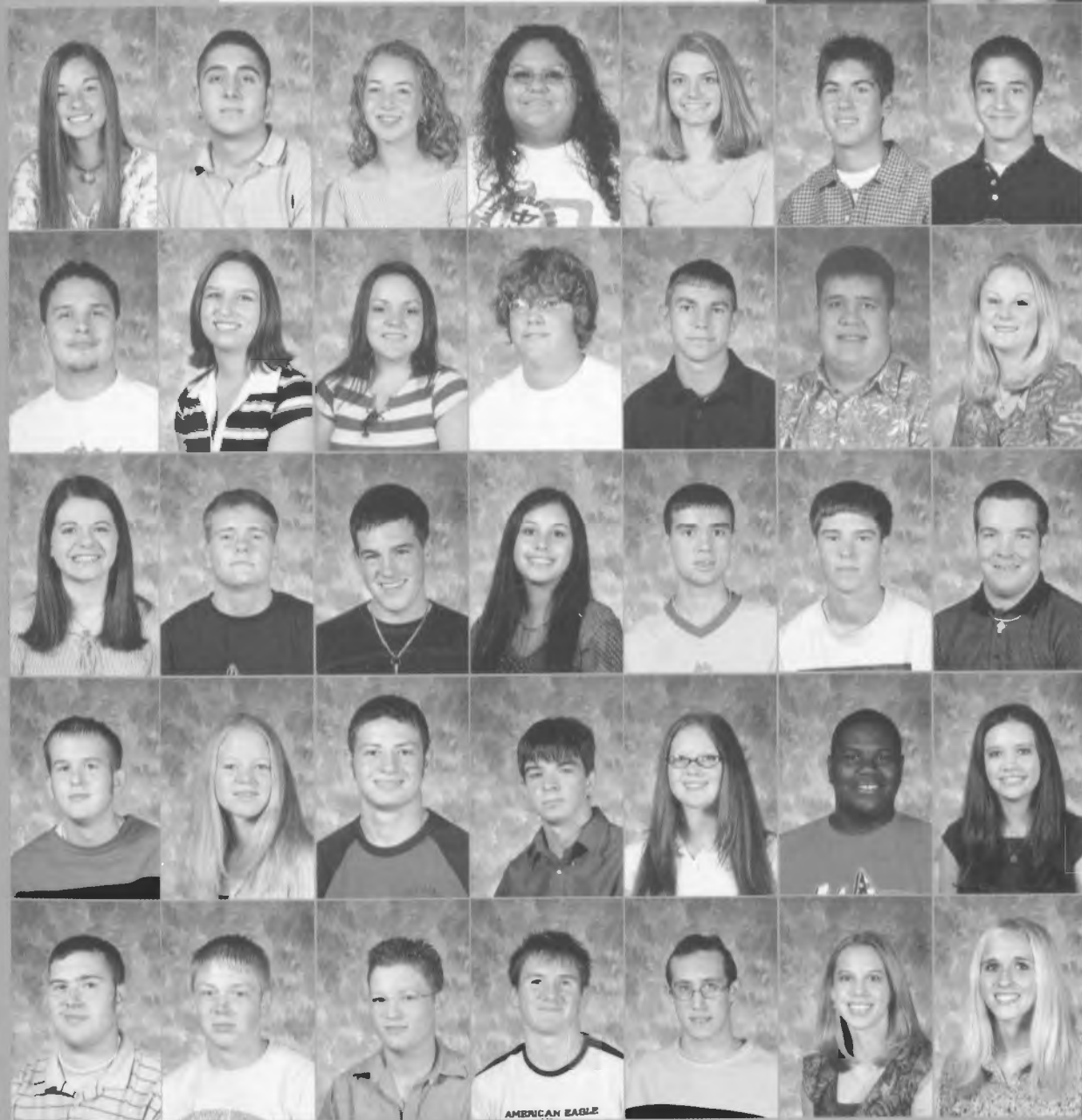

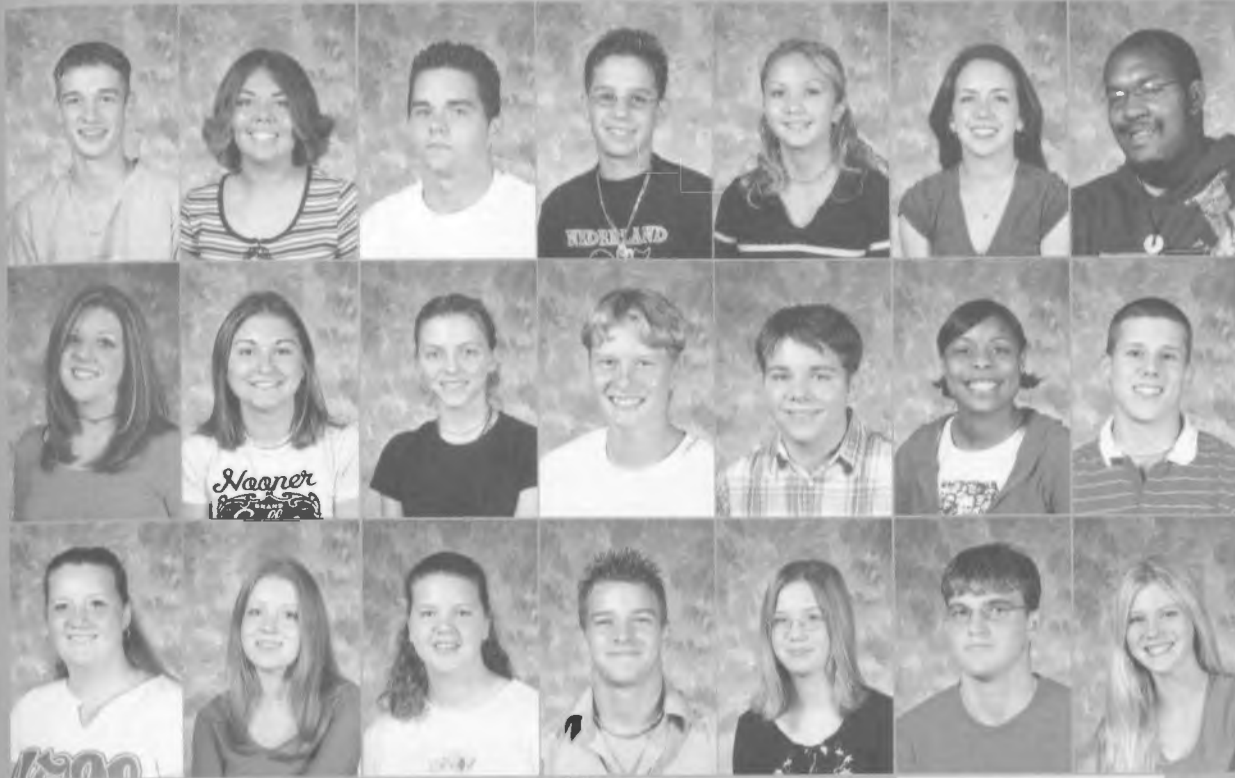

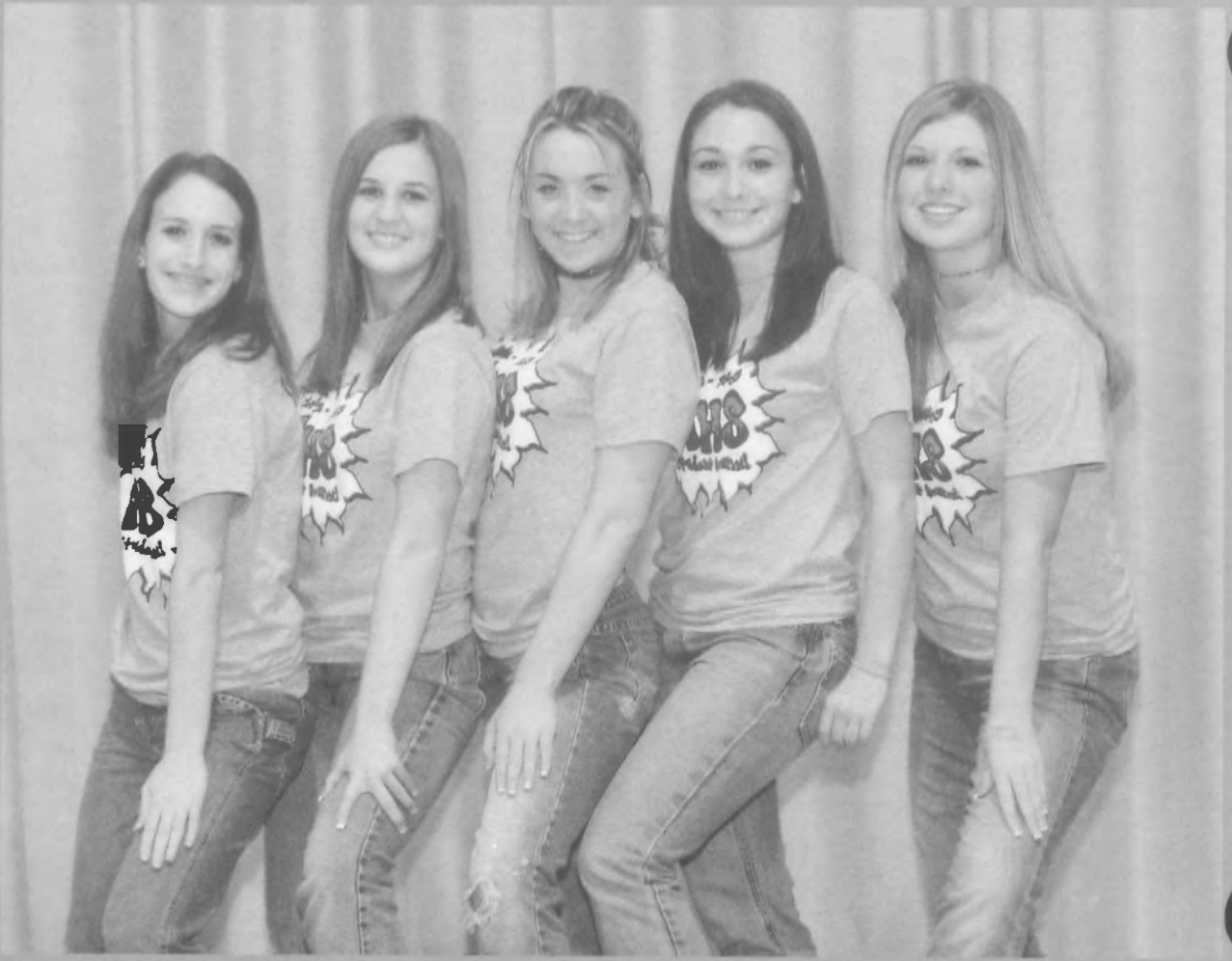

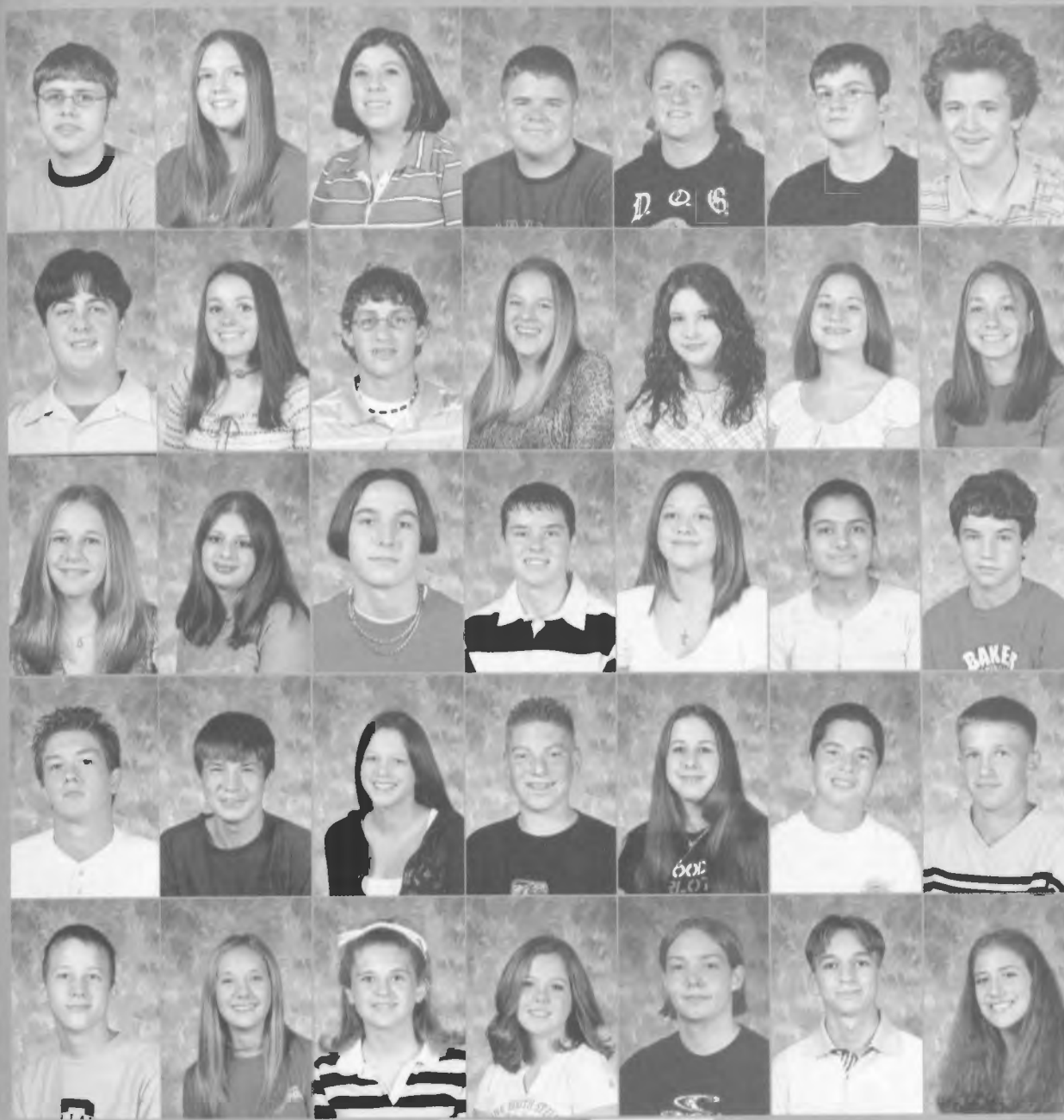

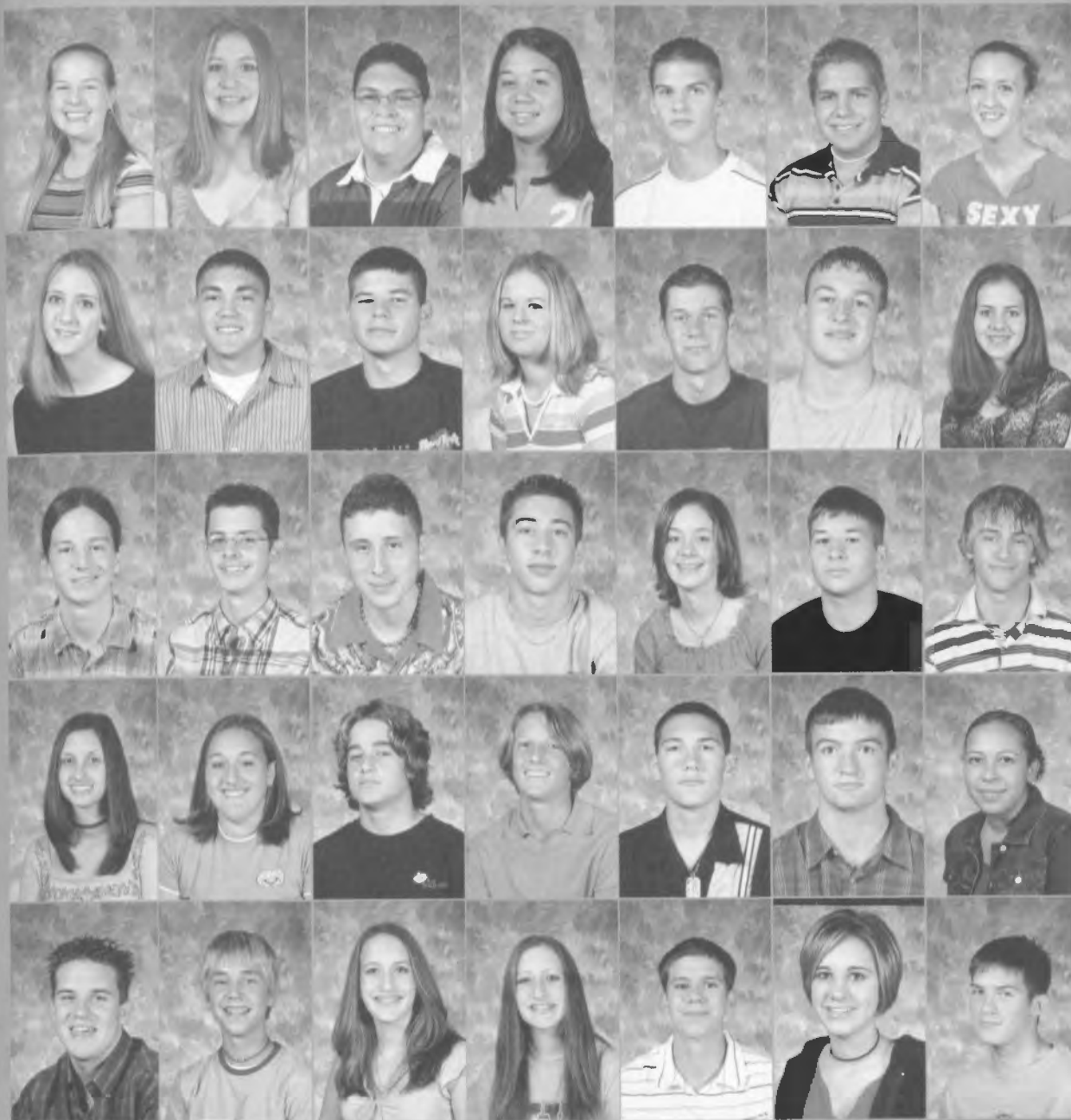

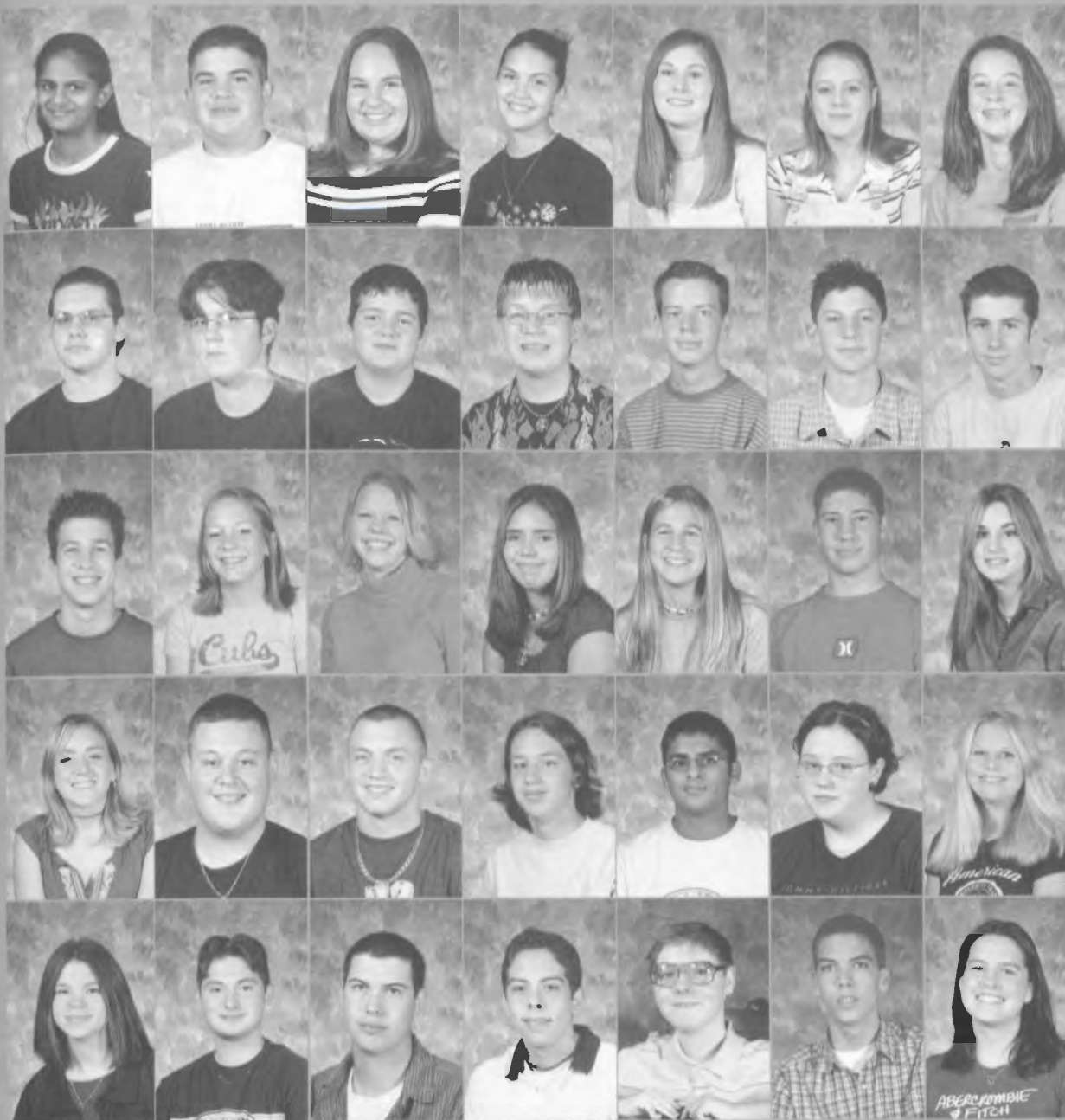

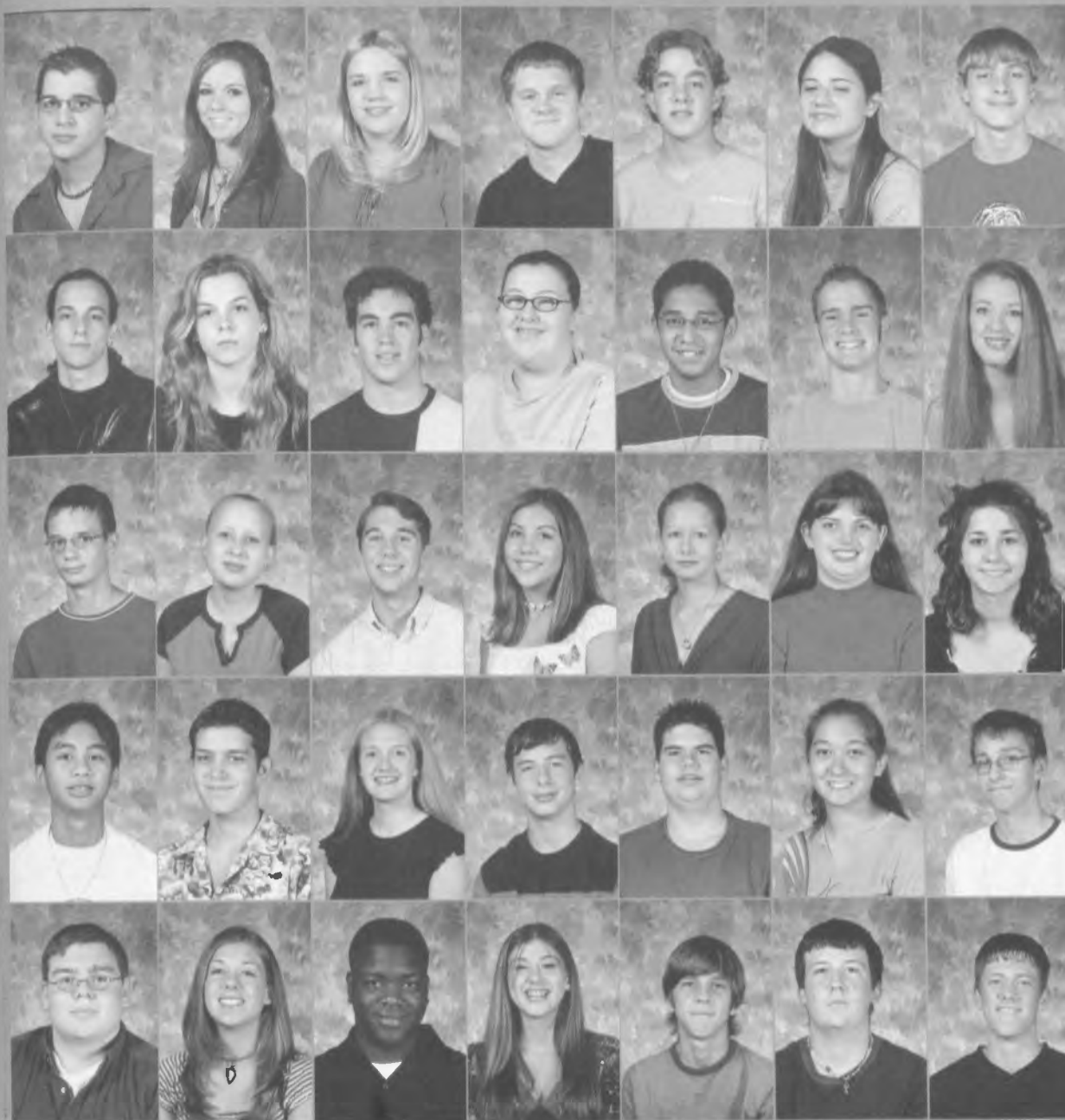

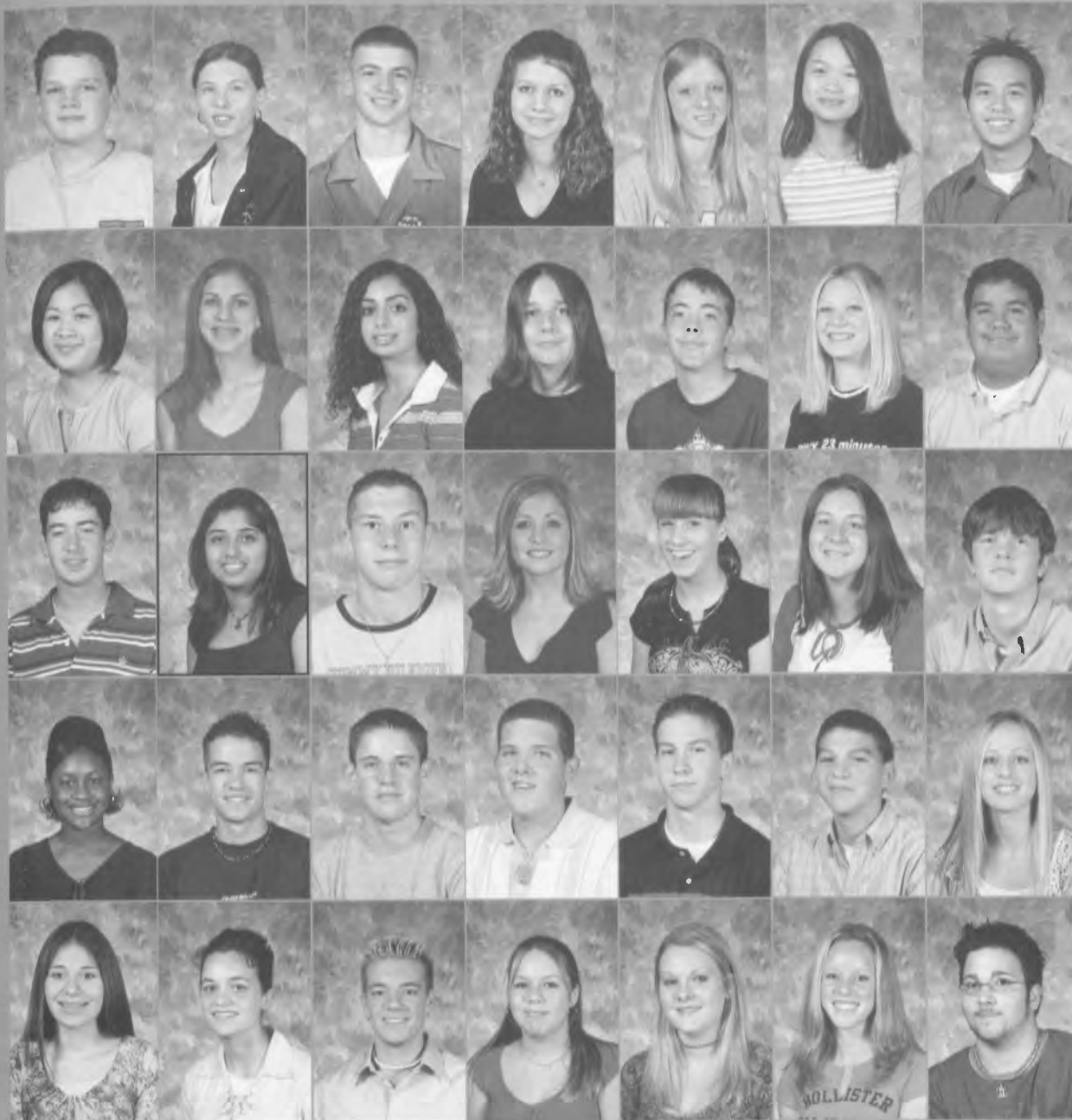

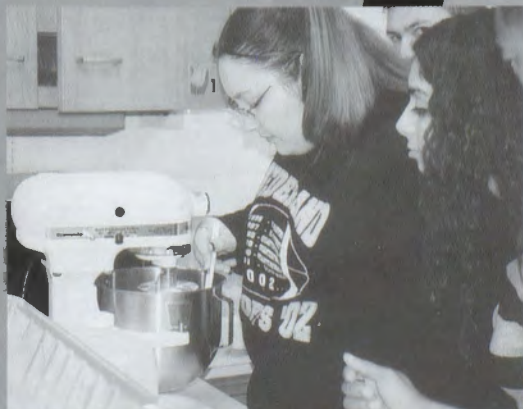

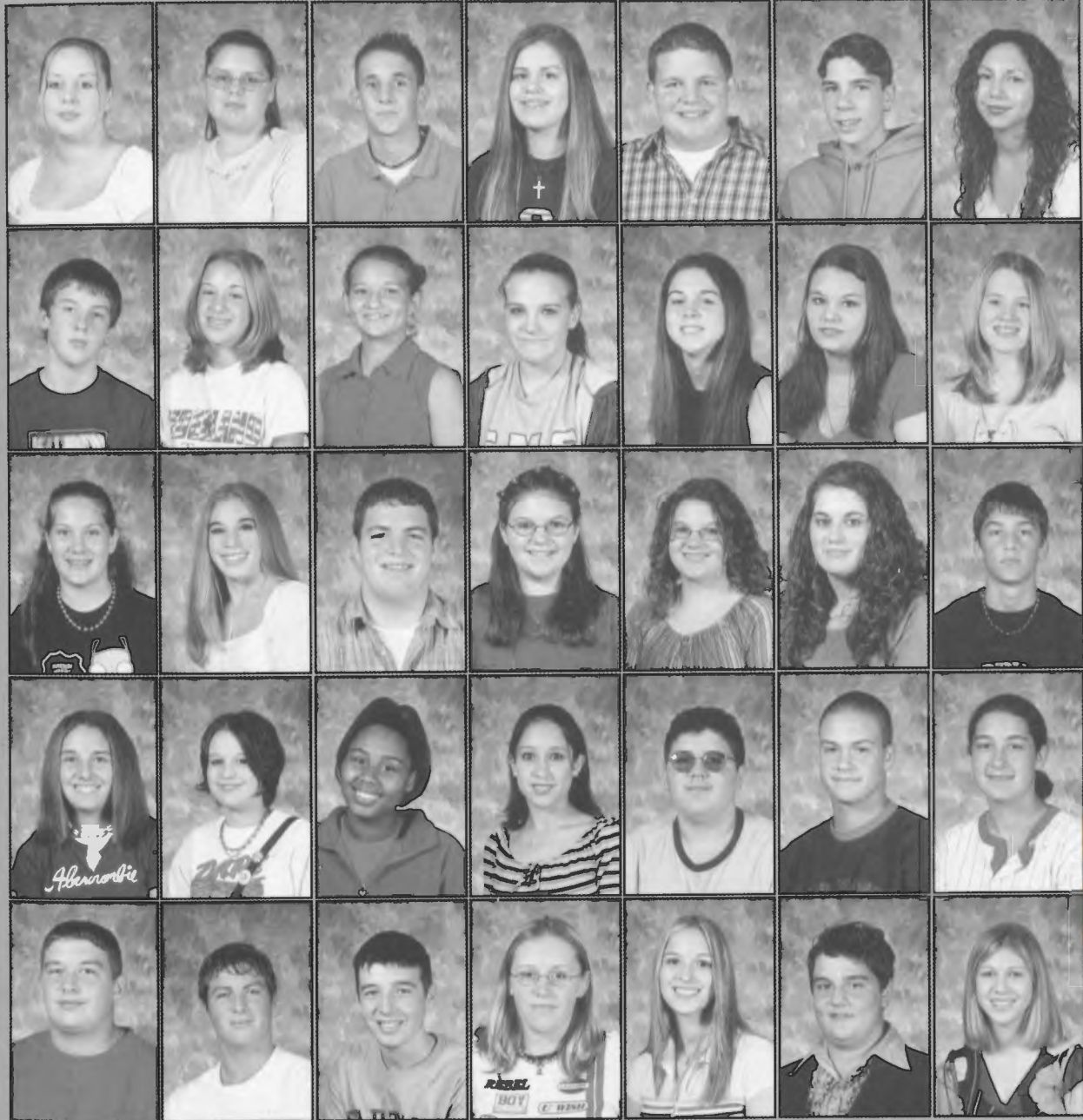

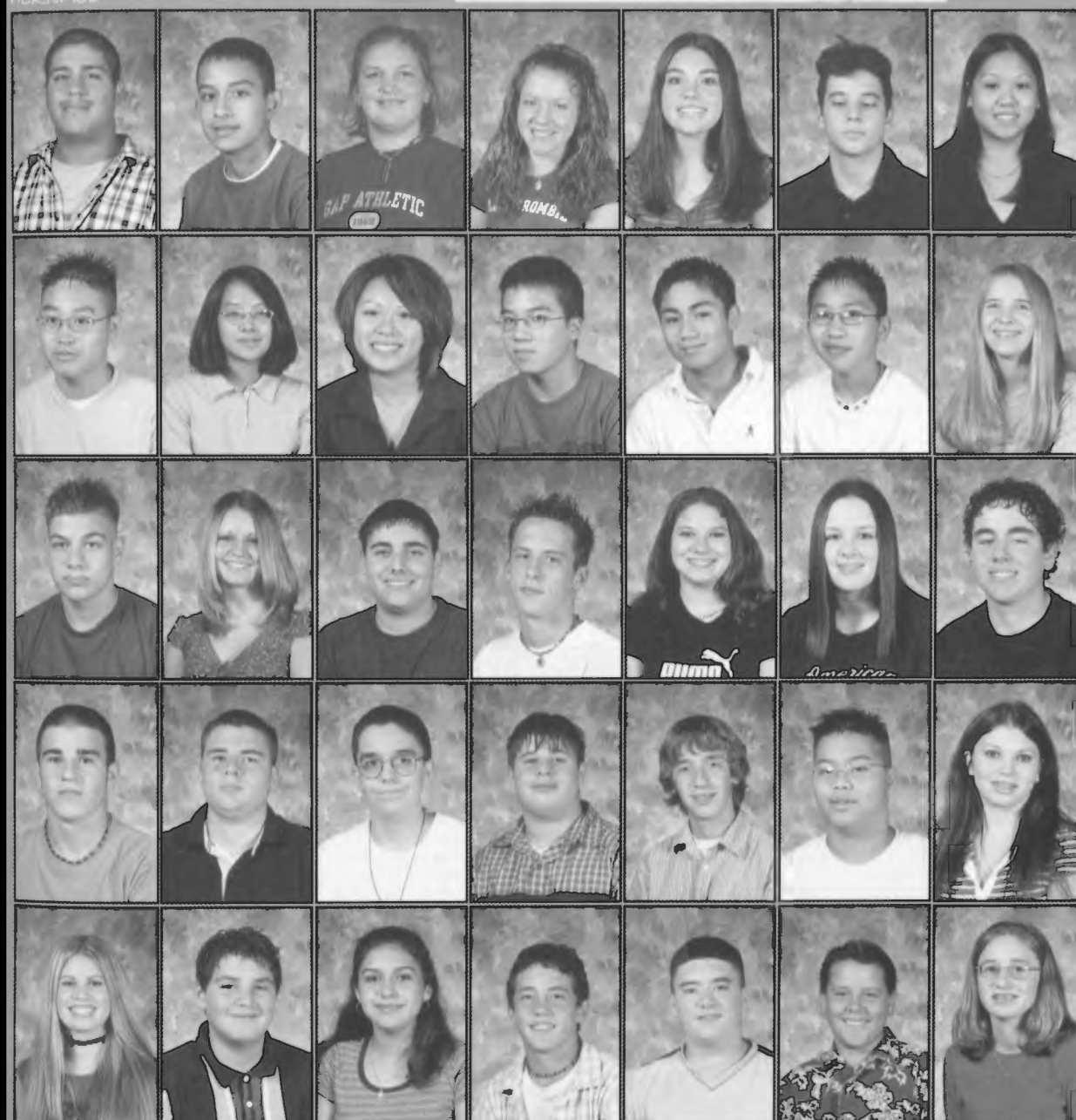

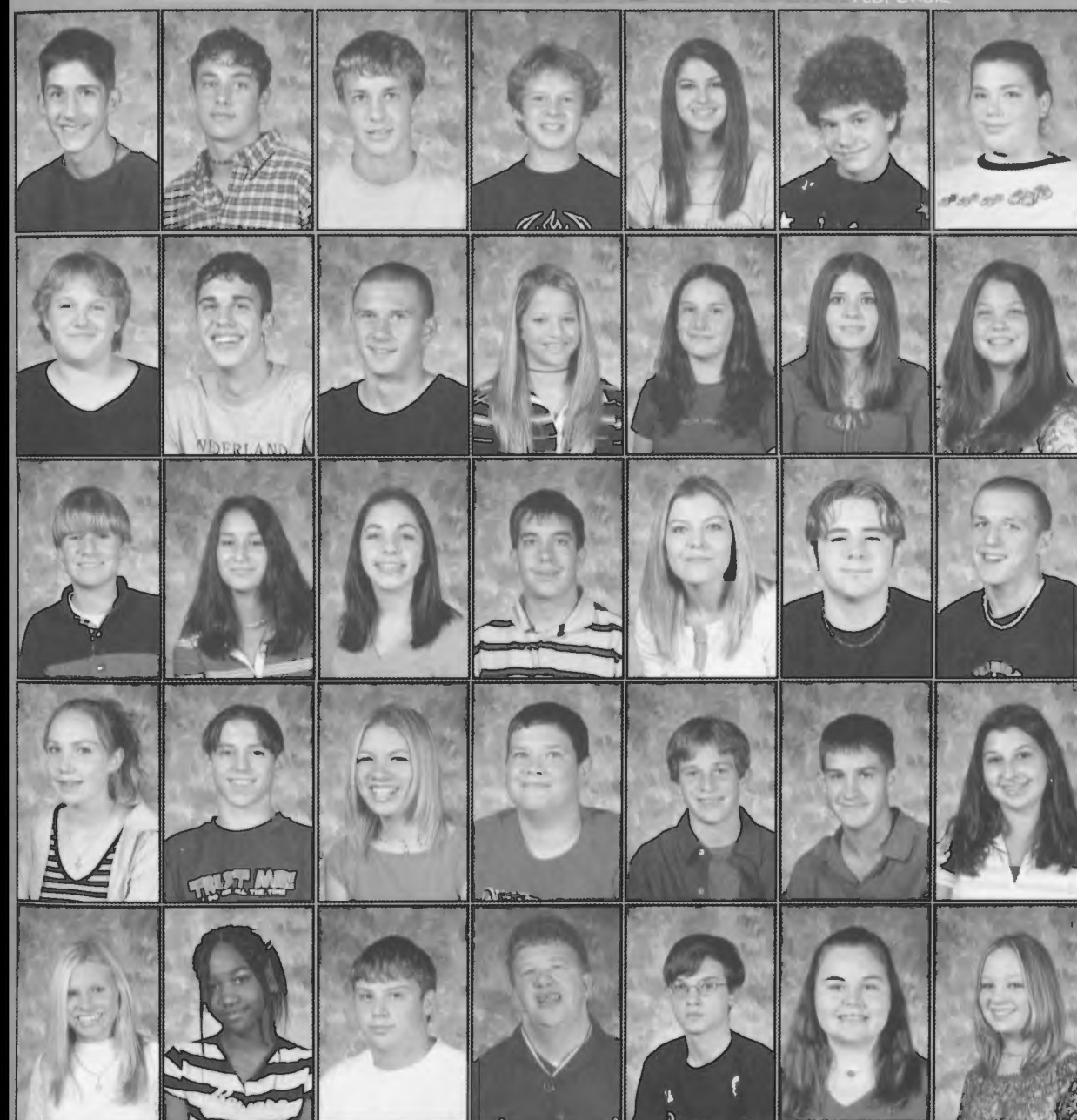
