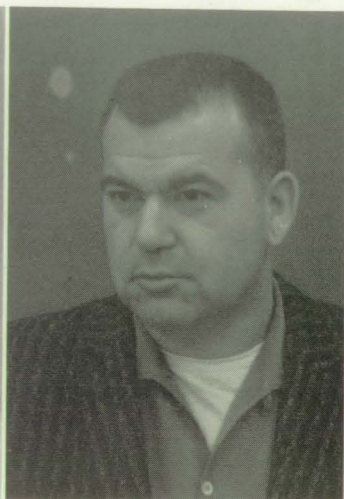


Mathematics . . .

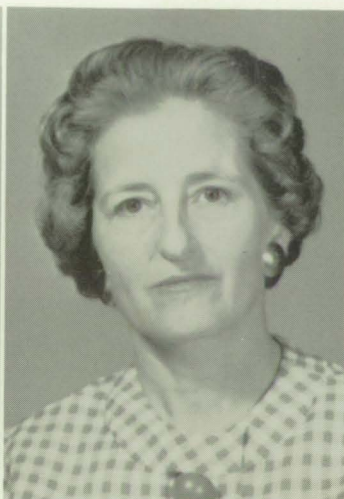
An understanding of the

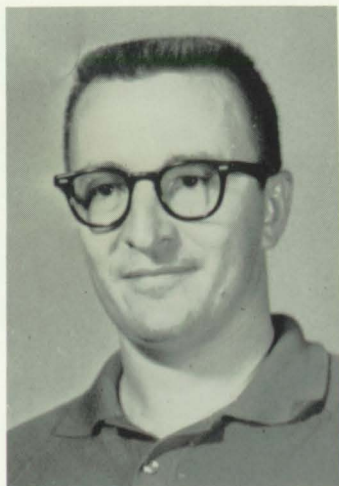
American history, world history, civics, and economics are the courses taught under

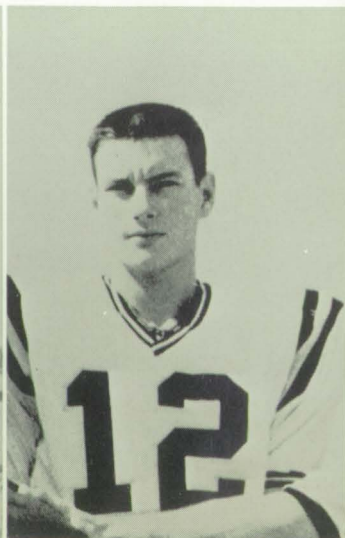

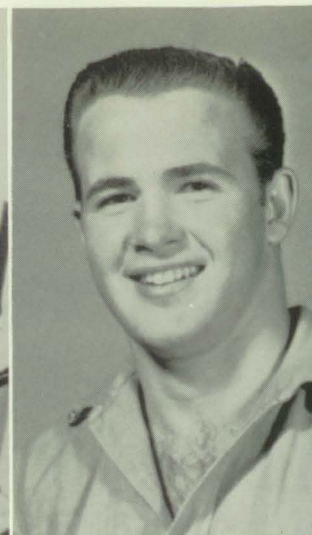
