The first quarter was scoreless and looked to be a very close game. With 8:05 left in the second quarter, Nederland answered first when junior quarterback Bryan Spell handed the ball over to senior tailback Ryan Menchaca who then trampled his way to the endzone to start the scoring attack. Just as the Bulldog fans sat back down, junior linebacker Chris Cadena intercepted a pass and ran in for another touchdown. By halttime, the score was 20-0, and many of the Indian fans were leaving town.

The varsity Bulldogs would eventually earn the title of 24-4A bidistrict champs and would advance to the 4A playoffs to once again face the Silsbee Tigers.

Sheik Omar Abdel-Rahman was charged on August 25, 1993 with being the mastermind in the plot to blow up the World Trade Center, whith was bombed on February 26.


Because of the two-year Civil War in Bosnia, as many as 200,000 people are dead or missing. A north Bosnian town was described as "a shattered town of battered people," by a U.N. observer.


Pictures of starving children and a captured American serviceman along with many others symbolizes the difficulty that the United Nations has had with coping with Somalia which has descended into feudalism.


An Amtrack train hurted off a bridge into a bayou in Alabama after a barge had previously struck and weakened the bridge. The incident caused the death of 47 people, but there were 159 survivors.

The boy laid down on the bed of nails, carefully, carefully. Slowly, he relaxed. There was no mysticism involved, no fakers, no incense, no chants. "I think that the hands-on approach to learning is better because the students remember more. They learn better by doing," Dwana VanMarion said.
Other classes also took the hands-on approach. Biology II students undertook the annual cat dissection. The smell permeated the entire science wing.
The geology class took chicken wire and paper mache, added assorted chemicals, and created volcanos that actually exploded. The volcanos were models of the different types which the class was studying.
"Building projects stimulates the kids to want to better understand the subject matter, Cindy Bordelon said.
