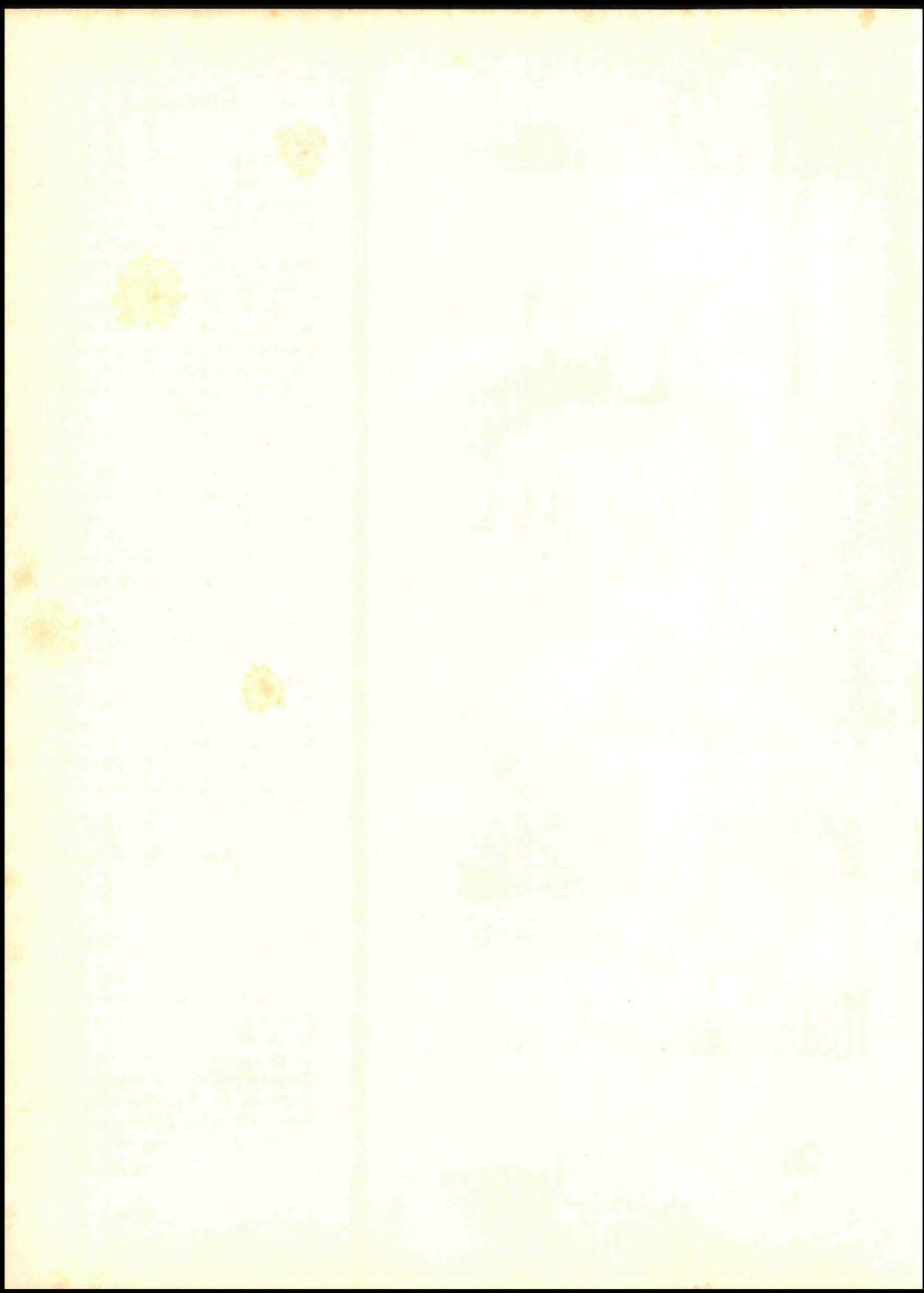

This is N.H.S. in the 60's and the people who go here.

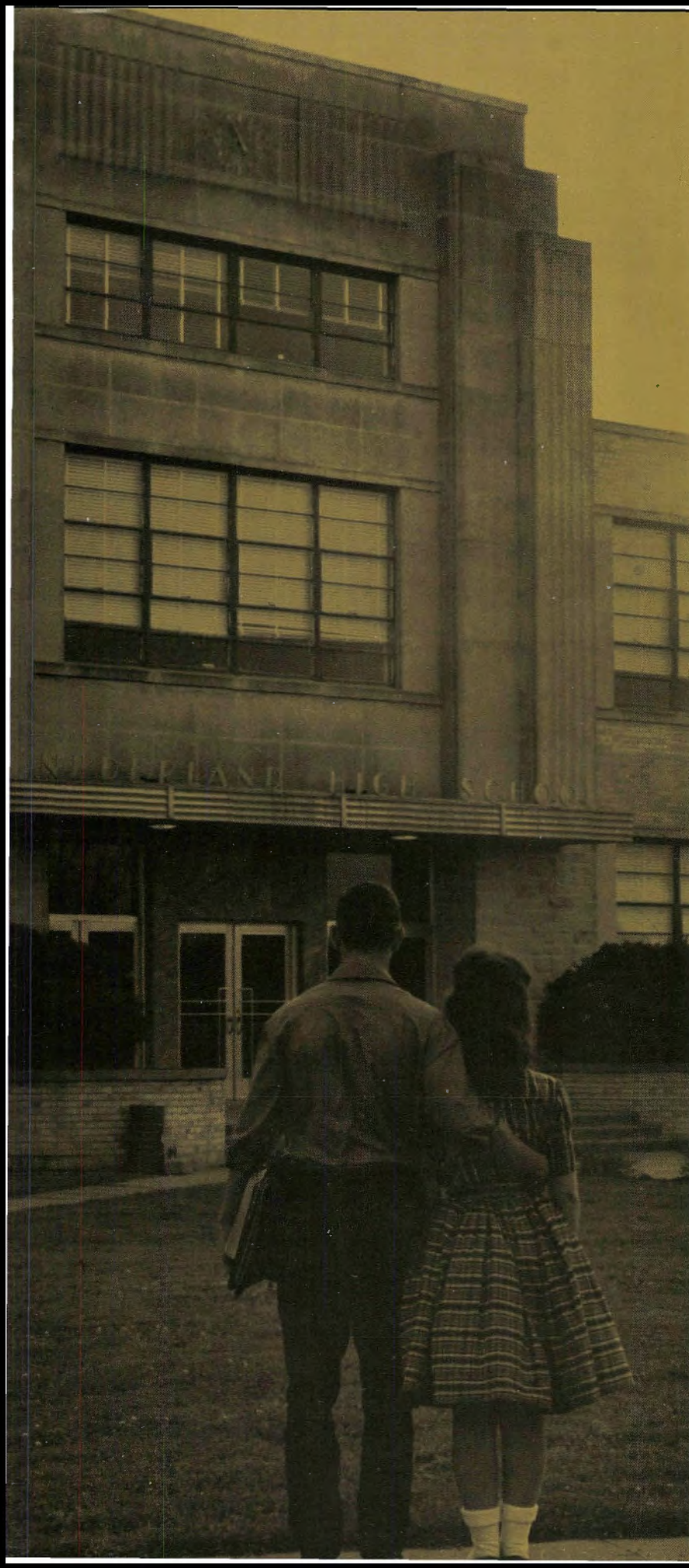

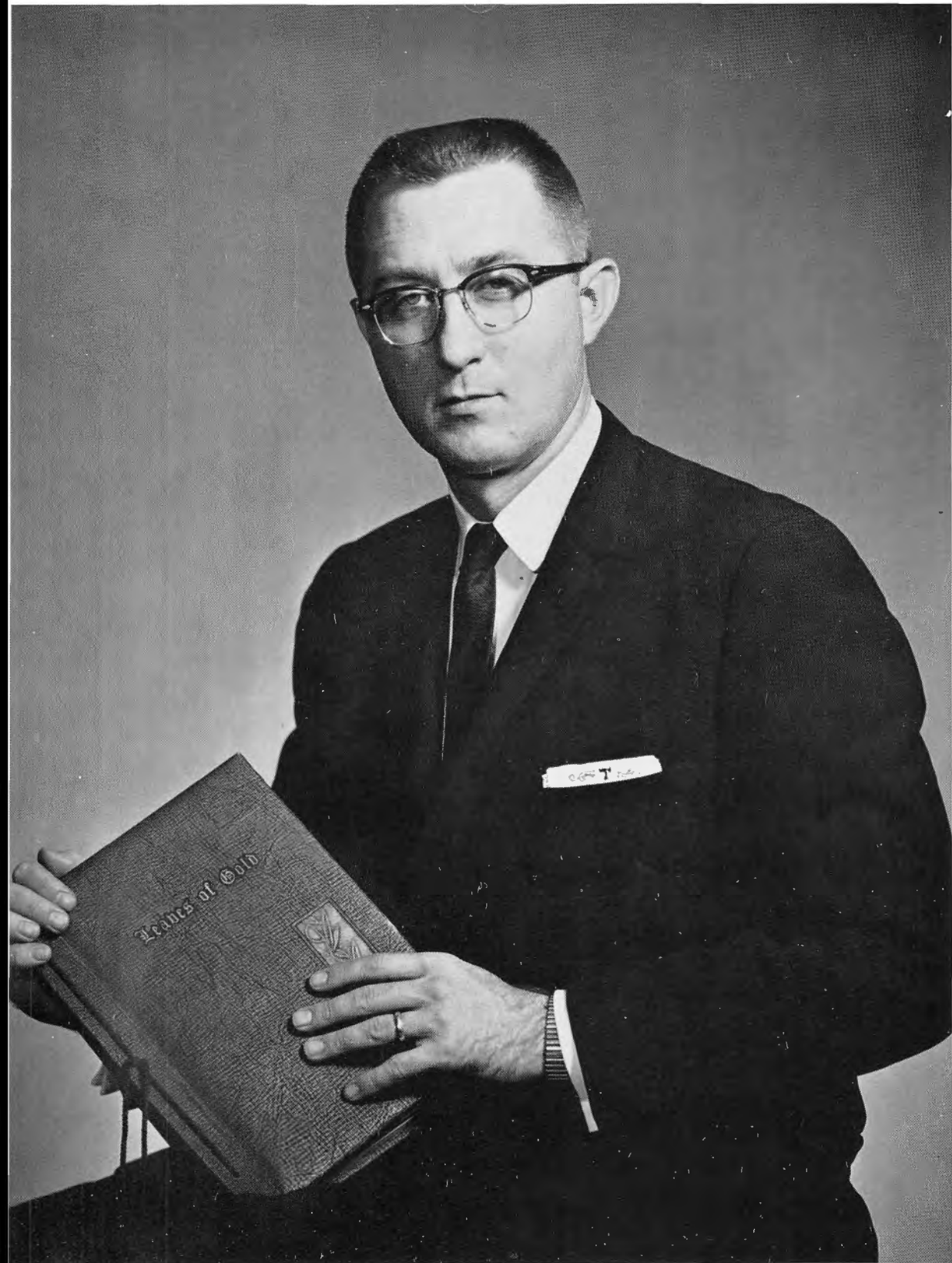
