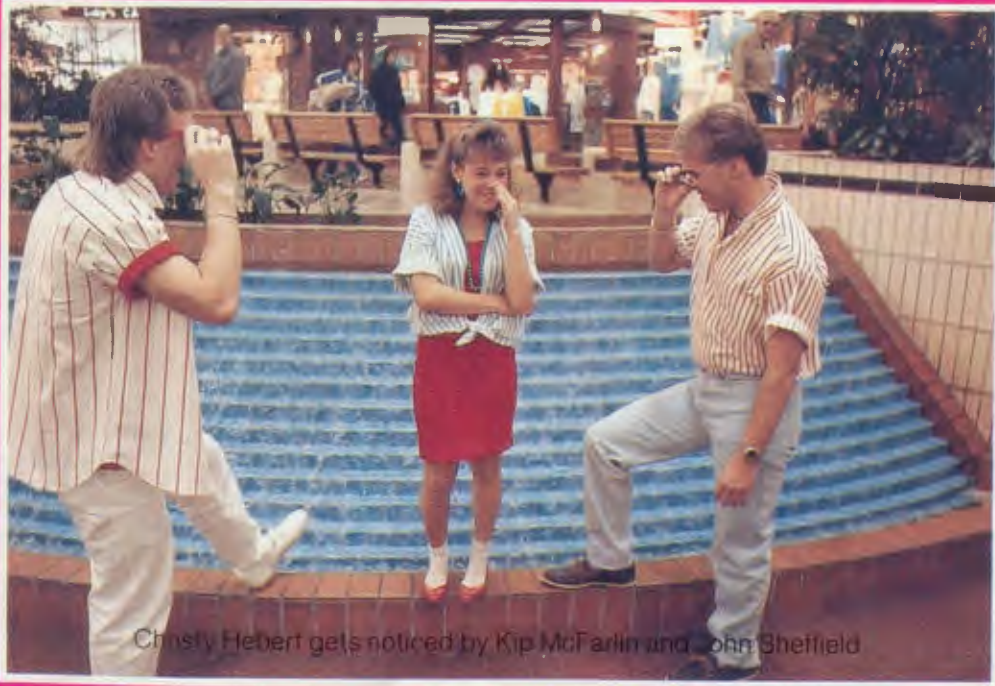

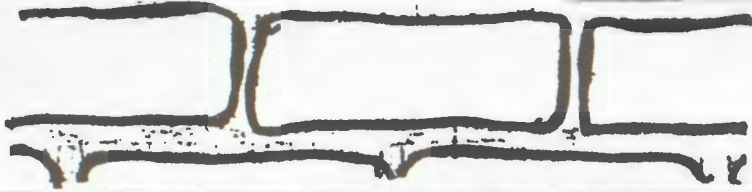
Senior Jana Quebedeaux was crowned Tulip Queen at the Tulip Pageant which started off the festival events.

The carnival was wrapped up Sunday afternoon ending the annual Heritage Festival.



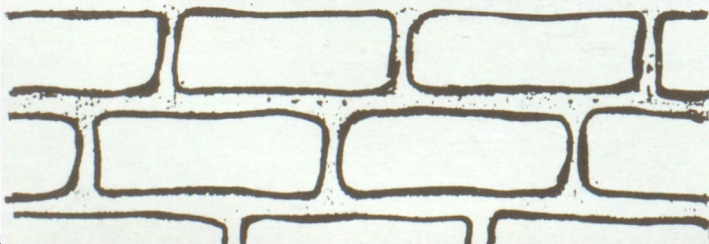

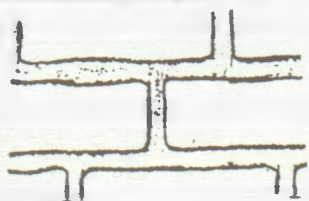

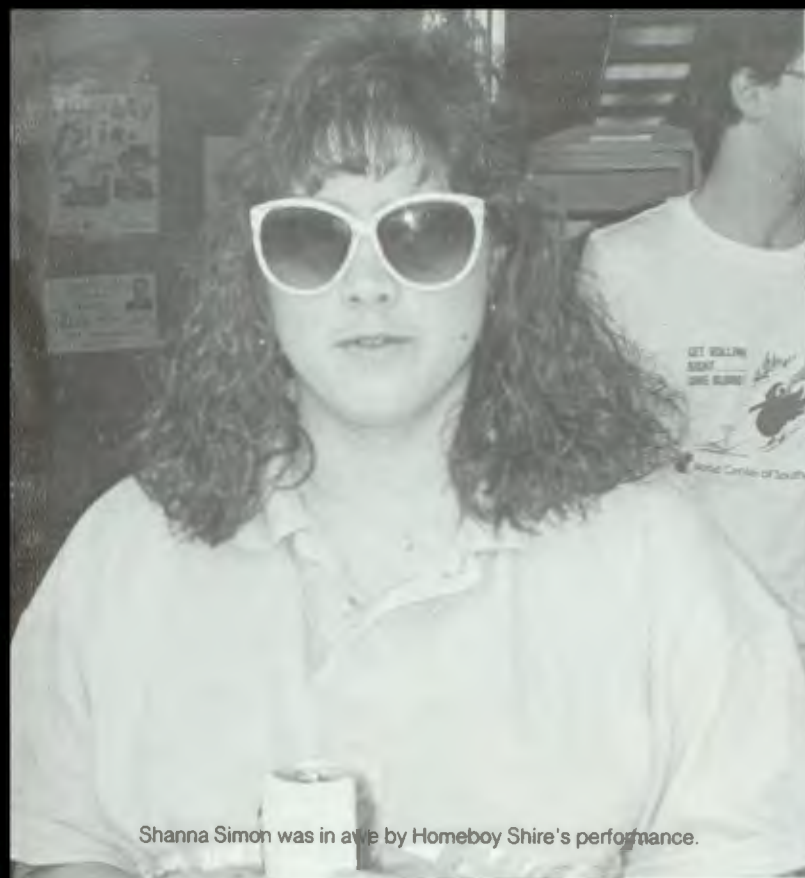

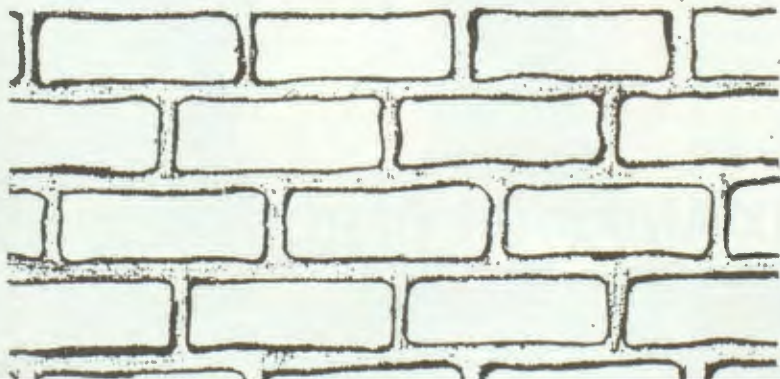

WEAVER FEVER !!!

Pep rallies during basketball season?? Sold out crowds?? A play-off position?? Yes, the 86-87 Bulldog basketball team not only left their mark on Nederland High School but also on the entire community. For the first time in 30 years, the Nederland round-ballers advanced beyond district play. Fans were devoted and came in their black and gold to cheer the 'Dogs to a victorious 22-10 record season.

Coach Jim Weaver, in his fifth year at Bulldog Country, combined with the incredible spirit and talent of the varsity basketball team to make basketball **THE** sport of 1987 in Nederland.

Much success was attributed to two senior ball club members, Brian English and Brian Hefner. English, a point guard, not only stood out on the court by leading the team with over 169 assists

and 401 total points for the season, but also in team spirit. As a gesture for team unity, English had a "N" and a "10", his jersey number, shaved on his head while getting his fashionable flat top haircut. Coach Weaver said that, "Brian wanted everybody together and encouraged them to get their hair cut like him for us to have a good season. Brian was a leader and inspired the team with words and actions."

English summed it up when he said, "I get fired up. That's what I like about basketball. It's emotional. Coach Weaver also has done a pretty good job of getting us fired up."

Much credit to success was also due to Brian Hefner. Hefner, a 6'1" off guard returning All-District letterman, led the team in total points with 487 averaging 16 points/game. "I think it's very

obvious how very important Brian was to my basketball team," said Coach Weaver. "He got the job done, not only scoring but also as a team leader."

Hefner was selected to the 22-5A coaches' All-District team for the second year in a row while English was named to the All-District 2nd team. In addition, Hefner was cited by Texas sportswriters as Honorable Mention on the state basketball team. In the Port Arthur News sportwriters' poll, both English and Hefner received 1st team honors with Mark Stoeckel on 2nd team and Bruce Pool as Honorable Mention. They also recognized Coach Weaver as Coach of the Year in 22-5A. "It was just a thrill for me. But to me, it was just another accolade for the kids. They were the ones that made me look good," said Coach Weaver.

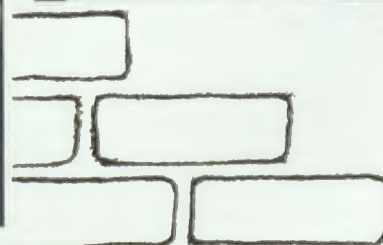

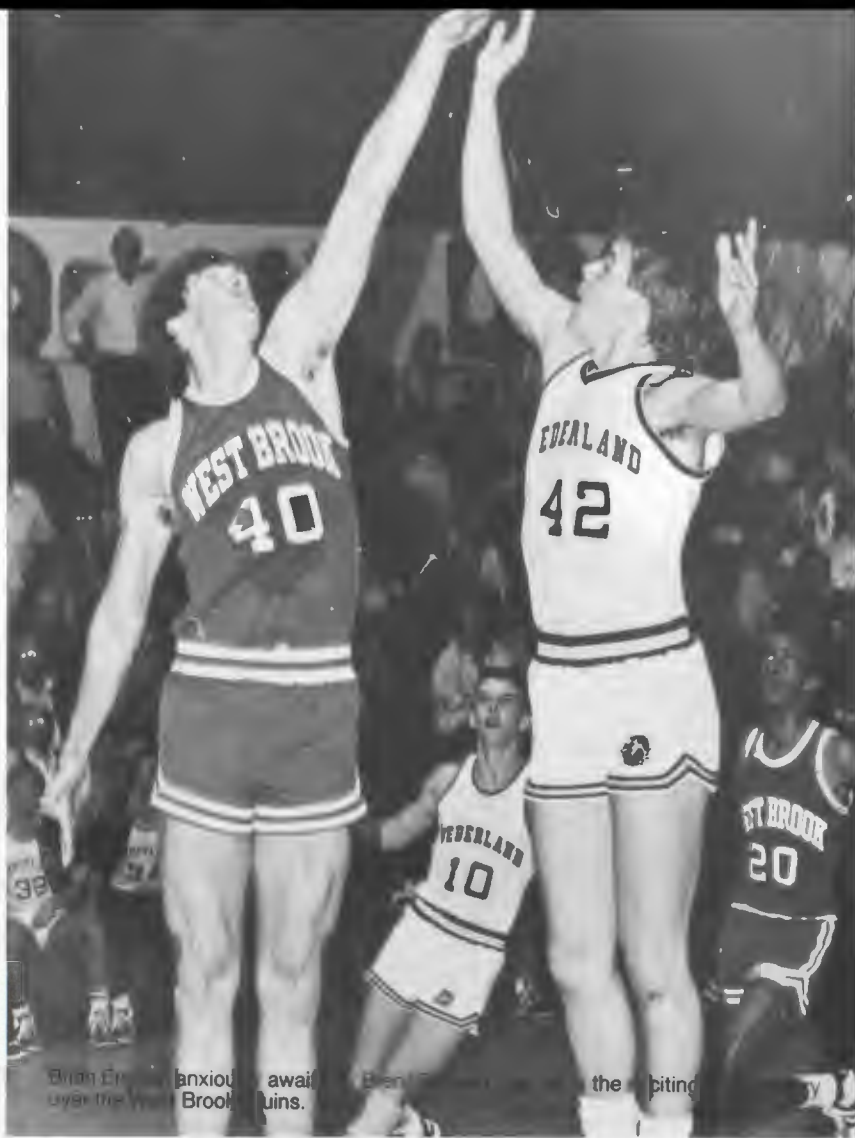

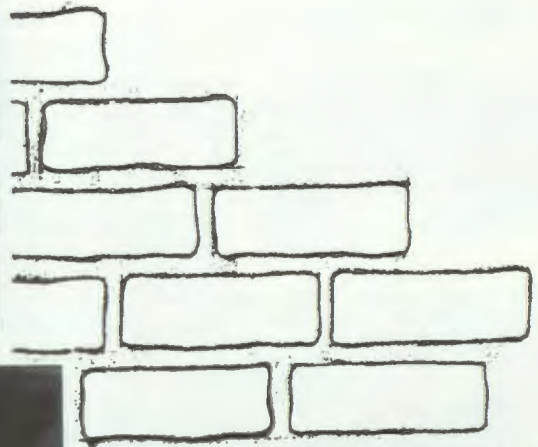

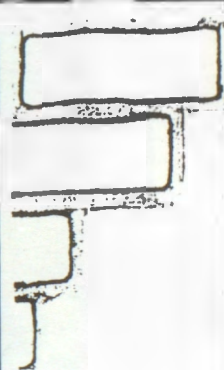

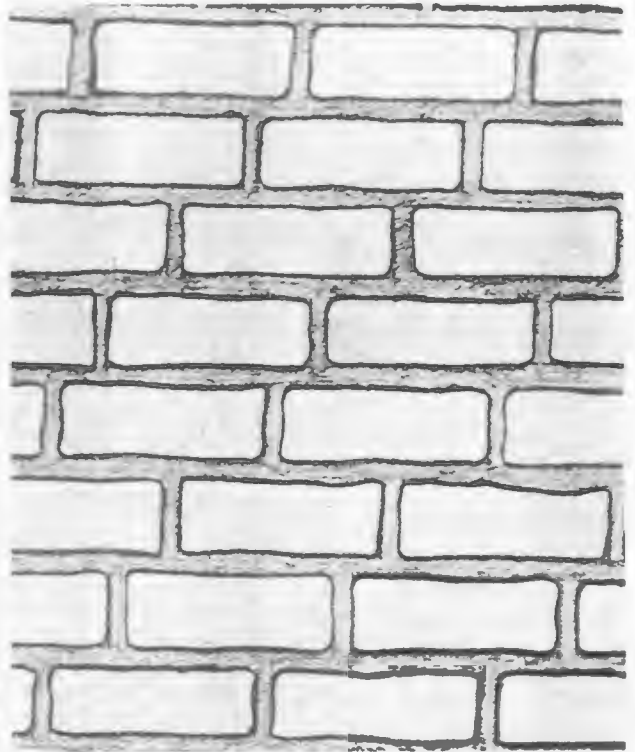

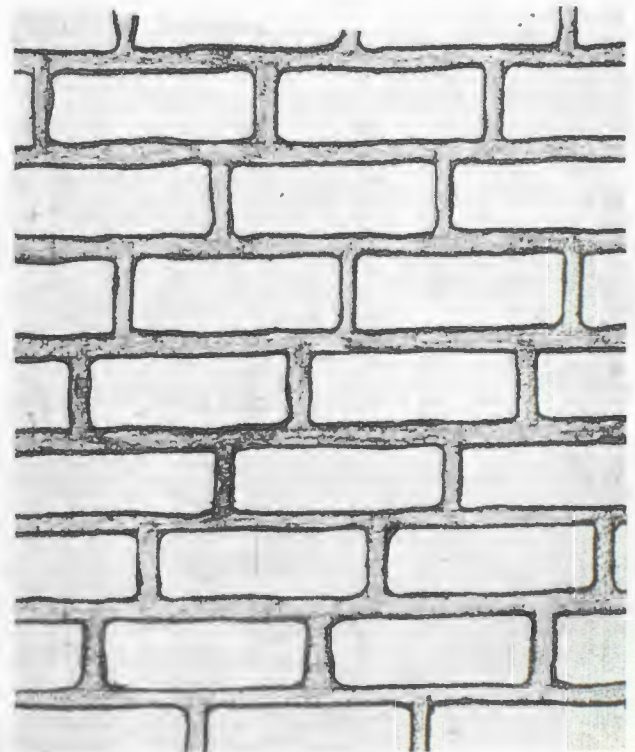

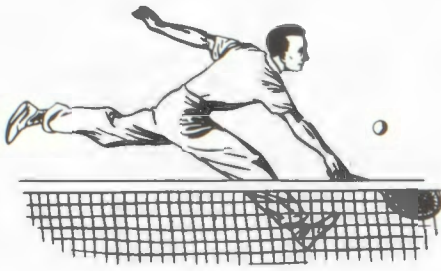

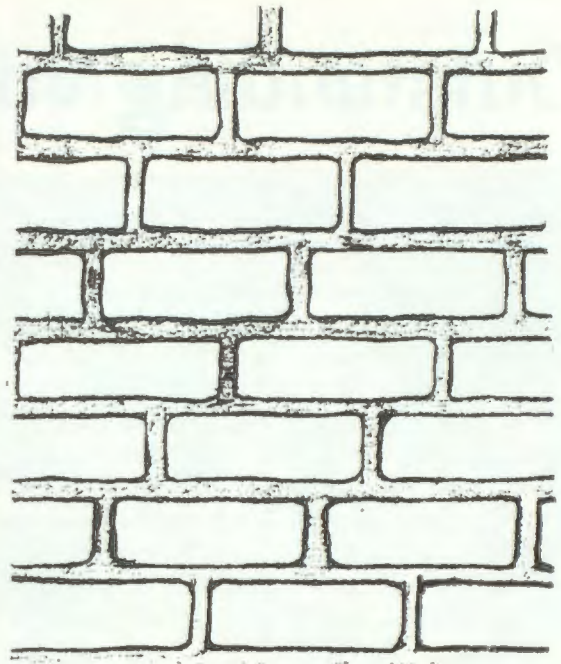

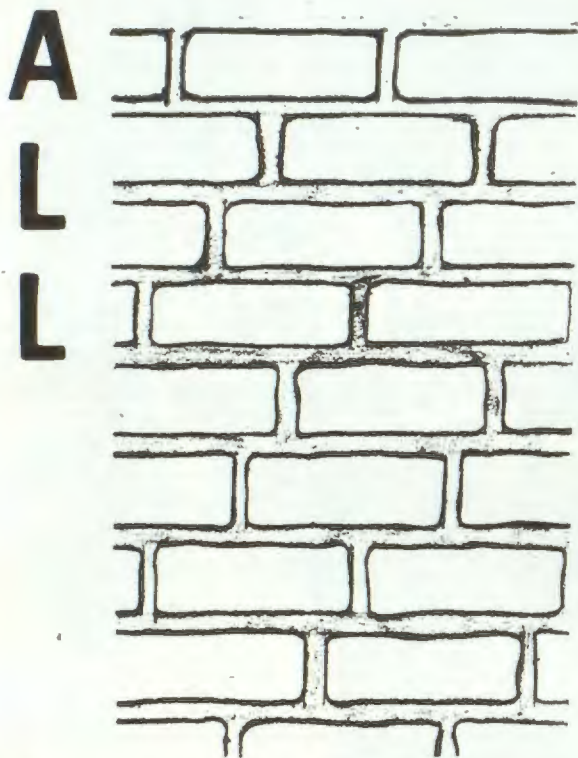
Julia Massey was the first volleyball coach Nederland High School ever knew. She began the volleyball program at Nederland in 1969 at the request of a group of students who wanted a team.

That first year was only the beginning of her long and successful career. During her seventeen years of coaching, she compiled an outstanding record of 333 wins — 122 losses, and she never coached a single losing season. In 1971, 1975, 1975-'77, and in 1982, her teams advanced to District playoffs and won District Championships. In 1975-'76, with a season record of 29-4, and again in 1976-'77, with a season record of 33-1, she led her teams to the State Volleyball playoffs in Austin.

Within her coaching career she had 27 players named to the All-District team, 9 players named to the All-Star team, and 3 players named All-State.

In addition to their many honors and successes, her players received values which were far more important. She instilled, within her young ladies, leadership, honor, and integrity, building their characters through her own example. 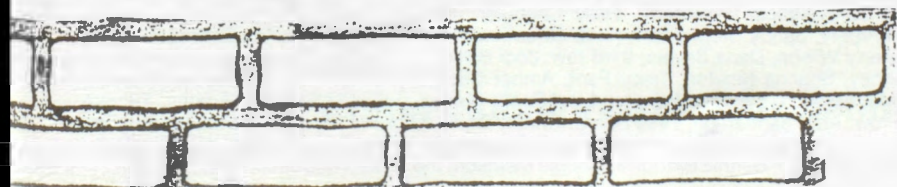

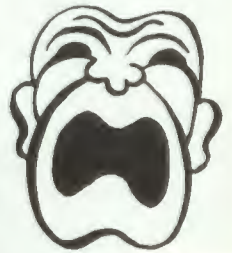

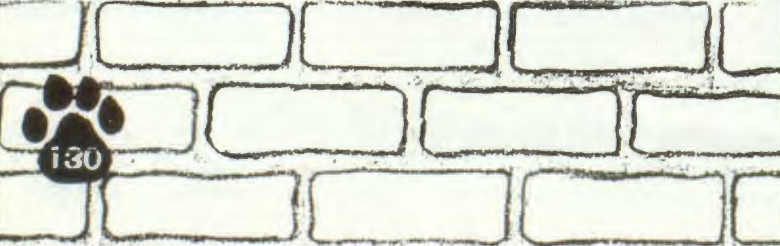

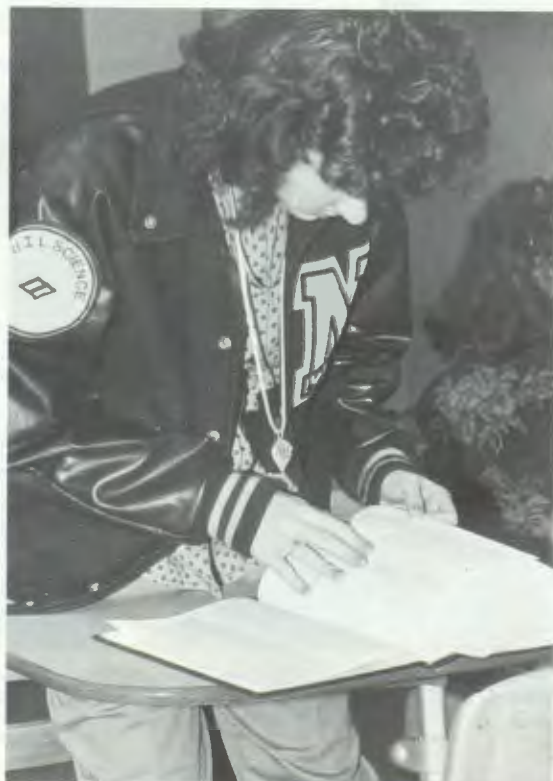

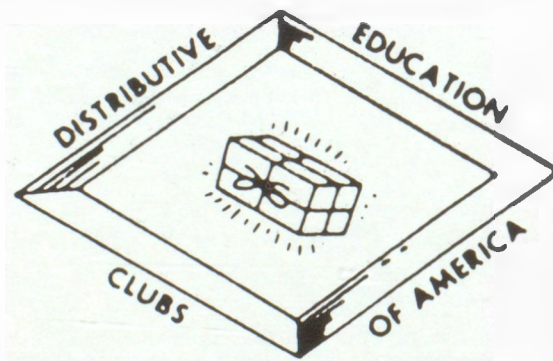

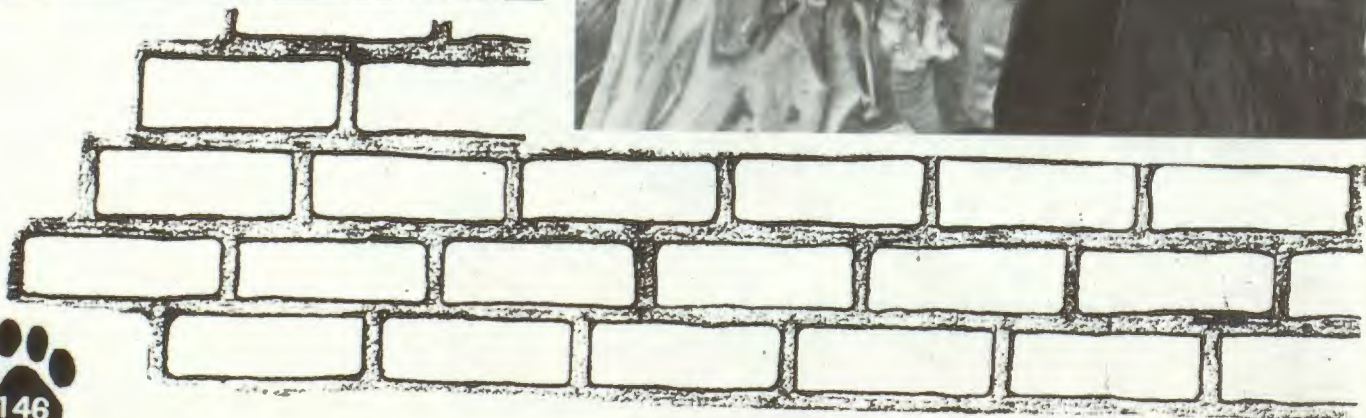

A Few Good Men

and NHS gets the Sempre Fidelis Award

Nederland High School has produced a few good men. That is the opinion of the United States Marine Corps, which presented the N.H.S. with the 86-87 Sempre Fidelis Award.

The award is given to schools for "superior performance and outstanding support of Marine Corps recruiting," according to a proclamation given to the school.

Only one school in the nation is awarded the honor each year and this is the first time in the 180 year history of the award that a school west of the Mississippi River has received the honor.

"This confirms our beliefs about the abilities of our students and the quality of our educational program in Nederland," said Mike Guidry, principal of NHS.

NHS students stationed at various Marine Corps commands

across the United States were appraised of their performance as a group. This was compared with the performance ratings of recruits of all other high schools in the country.

The composite score of NHS graduates in the corps placed them first in the nation. NHS was cited for "exemplary performance and outstanding support of USMC recruiting efforts and for providing the corps with young men and women of the highest caliber."

"This is a token of the Marine Corps appreciation to the school," said Sgt. Eddie Kuykendall, the local Marine recruiter.

"It speaks a lot about the educational system at Nederland and the people coming out of there."

According to Kuykendall, 83

percent of the enlistees from NHS fit the "quality" category, which means they can apply for any training the corps has to offer.

"The people coming from Nederland can write his or her own meal ticket," Kuykendall said. "The school is the only school in the Golden Triangle that has not only supported the Marine Corps but all of the armed services."

"We are grateful to the Marine Corps for the recognition they have given Nederland High School and its students," said Guidry.

This year 17 NHS graduates will enter the Marine Corps — 17 Marines that hope they can live up to the reputation forged by their predecessors.
