This Policy of Insurance Witnesseth, That the "SOUTHERN MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY," in consideration of Seventeen <sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> Dollars to them in hand paid by A. M. Lewis do insure the lives of the within named slave or slaves, belonging to A. M. Lewis of Augusta in the State of Georgia in the amount set opposite his, her or their names, as below, viz:

Amounting to the total sum of Seven Hundred Dollars, for the term of Seven months from the date of this policy.

And the said Company do hereby promise to pay to the said assured within sixty days after due proof of the death of any of the above named slaves, (if the death shall occur within the time for which this insurance is effected,) the amount insured in this policy, set opposite the name or names of the deceased;

Provided always, (And it is hereby declared to be the true intent and meaning of this policy,) That if the application signed by the said A. M. Lewis and dated 4<sup>th</sup> March 1858 shall be in any respect fraudulent or untrue; or if the said slave or slaves, or any of them, shall die by his, her or their own hands, or by intemperance, or by the hands of justice, or in the violation of law, or by or in consequence of a mob, a riot, a foreign invasion, a civil war, or an insurrection, or any military or usurped power, or by the mal-treatment or neglect of the owner, or of any person to whom he, she or they may be entrusted; or if the said slaves or slaves, or any of them, are now, or shall be hereafter insured in any other Company, or shall abscond or be kidnapped, or shall, without the written consent of the said Company, either be sold or given to a new owner, or be removed fifty miles from their present residence, or be employed in a more hazardous occupation than their present one, the degree of hazard to be estimated by the said application and the scale endorsed on this policy whenever it is applicable, or if, in case of the sickness of the said slave or slaves, or any of them, he, she or they shall fail to receive all due and proper care, promptly and without delay, or if this policy shall be assigned, without the written consent of the said Company; then, and in all such cases, the said Company shall not be liable to pay the sum insured and set opposite the name or names of the said slave or slaves, deceased, or any part thereof, and this policy, so far as relates to such payment, shall be utterly void. And it is further agreed, That the said Company shall not be bound to pay more than two-thirds of the value of such of the said slaves as may die during the continuance of this policy, the said value to be estimated as at the beginning of the last illness.
