W. Margon of New Orleans. I think I shull be alle to establish her identity by the exidence of white persons, and processe her return .-There very particularly to thank you, and Mr. Quitman (and I pray you to convey my respects to him ! for your attention to M. Ganiques, and for joining with

him in the Bond to Refs. I hold myself personally bound to exometer your, if any us possibility shall be haid on the parties thereto. I note well the conditions of the Bond, and God willing, shall make them good . I shall immediately commence preparations for the journey of the white witheps to your bountry, to testify before your bourts, on to the identity of these people .- I trust the Bill you speak of may be maited into a bur, - it will be a rightions provision? ----Scurful of avoidents, I will ask you in reply to state at what time the Mitnefors should reach Matchez to attend the trial in Pike County in October. The bays there I um desstand to be William Miller John Jacobs, James Bayard and leter Hook, - and whither in this case or in the cases fany these, if white witneffer reach the respective bounties, before the regular period of the fourts, their widence could be taken by consent of parties, and the object thus effected, without detaining the witnesses at great upinses to us, und nick of health to them? Can you Juggest anything in this matter, that will aid an views and lepen the expenses I anticipate . -The Black man herr, the Kidnapper, against whom Ephraim Lawrence was testify, died in Prison before the boys return. We of the kitneppers have thus died in Prison before trial . I informed you that inother of them had been convicted for 42 years. " occasionally hear of fac Johnson - I hold him in personal remembrance . If he should wer make his appearance ingour Country I pray you to use every extion to cause his anest. I am bound to pury \$ 500 on his unvition

which would be absolutely certain, if I could bet buy my finger on him , - this reward perhaps in the views of your Constables or Officers, may keep the matter alive -Shave senson to believe that he has within the last two years been in the States of Alabama, North Carolina, and Milisipippi ._ your Obed!
