Gave a bill of sale to Genl
Robert W Williams of Talia-
hasssee for the following
negroes (viz) Luke, his
wife Delia & her children
Meley, Eliza Nelly Mary
and Vance; Ben, his wife
Laura her daughter Daphne
Roland, his wife Binah her
children Lewis & Aleck -
Daniel, his wife Judy, her
child Cherry; Harry; boy
Richard; girl little Delia
girl Betsey; for all of
which he has paid me
Thirteen thousand four
hundred (13.400) & fifty
dollars -

also on the 18th Inst. Sold by
Frank to Gen A Croome for
the sum of \$1,300 -

January 30th 1859.

Paid Rev. W. E. Epkes
Sixty dollars. fifty of
which is for my part of his
salary for the last year &
ten for a part of his salary
for the year before which he
did not pay up. I still owe
him five dollars on his
salary for the year before last -
having paid him heretofore all
but fifteen dollars on it.

Paid at the last convention
into the hands of the Treasurer
of the Diocese Ten Dollars
for the Bishops salary and
five dollars tax for the Man-
sion Church. for which the
vestry owe me.

February 1st 1859

Mr. Ephraim Saunders
and myself had a full
settlement to day and I
fill in his debt \$284.24
for which I gave him my
due bill taking all the
notes & accounts which he
held against me up to
this date -

February 2nd 1859

Dr. Gorman & myself had
a settlement of accts to
day & I gave him my note
for the balance I owed him
being \$49.05 -

February 15th. Paid Cook
Smith \$8.00 for the school-
ing of Pinkney Nartsfeld's
children for 1 quarter. Paid
him also \$6.00 for wheat

Feb'y 15th. Paid Davis Johnson \$10.00 in full for oats had of him last year -

15th. Paid Bill at City Hotel Two Dollars -

March 3rd. Paid Joseph Jay for \$53.50 being the balance due on a Note which I gave to Guilford Houston for \$100.00 on 27th Feb'y 1857.

March 4th. Received of Willam De Witt \$16.20 in full for 90 yards of bagging furnished him last year -

March 9th. Erected a lightning rod on the dwelling house - extended it about 12 feet above the top of the house by the chimney to which it was attached by staples of iron

from ^{one of} which it was separated by the neck of a bottle; from the other by a bit of horn. On the roof it was supported by wood on cleets through which it passed and from which it was separated by ~~the~~ bits of horn. It was ~~made~~ made of 4 rods of iron $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch in diameter hooked together with the end inserted 4 feet in the ground terminating in a bed of charcoal.

May 13th 1859. I send to Jas Morris Tax a paper \$100 - to be paid to Mess^{rs} Durkane & Palmer on my acct. for 1858. Also

\$1.87 to be handed to Mr. Edwards Sheriff to pay for books bought at the sale of John & Taylor Estate -

May 14th Enclosed a check (on Bank at N Orleans) to Wm. A Stieney at Marion Ala for \$2.25 to be placed to my credit on my sons acct.

May 16th 1859 Enclosed two twenty Dollar Bills to them at Montgomery to be handed to my son William to bear his expenses to Chapel Hill -

May 23rd Paid a draft of Mr. Donnell \$60 to W. M. G Davis for \$29.65 in full of all demands by said Donnell on

wrote to Messrs Moore
Wood Earle & Co apprising
them of my order to the
Editors of Journal of Com-
merce for \$5.00 and also
to request them to pay
for a month to be
purchased in New York
by Mrs Sally Cole for
my daughter Louisa

also wrote to John B
Ketchum Esq in relation
to the Ericsson Caloric
Engine

October 31st, 1859

Recd a letter from H^r
& Co of Tallahassee in-
closing Acct of Sales of
12 bales of my Cotton

showing the nett proceeds
to be \$609 40 which has
been deposited to my credit
in the State Bank of
Florida - Cotton sold at 10^{cts}
weight of cotton 6172 - 24

October 29th Paid to W.
Denham Ag^t for the Fac-
tory \$65.29 for manufac-
turing 435 ¹/₄ yards of
kerseys - Also \$56.76 for one
bale of 62 natures of 5 ¹/₆
yds at 11^{cts}

Nov 3rd Sold & delivered
to Thomas Woodruff 18
bales of cotton weighing
8736 pounds at 10 ¹/₄ cents
which netted \$894.00 -
Took his check for that
amount on the Agency
of Bank of Columbus Ga.

Nov. 4th Received \$ 894. -
from the Agency of the
Bank of Columbia at Tal
lahassee on the check of
Thomas Woodruff. and de-
-posited the same in the
State Bank of Florida
which added to the sum
already in Bank to my
Credit made a total of
\$ 1503.40 - Gave check
for \$ 1230 - to M D Papy
to be credited in the notes
he holds against me as
Agent for the Union Bank
and took receipt for the
same - Bought a check
~~on New York for \$ 150.60~~
~~with the balance with the~~
balance on the Importers
& Traders Bank of New York
payable to Geo W. Mordcaii.
