DH is... "an umbrella term for a number of different activities that surround technology and humanities scholarship...includ[ing] topics like open access to materials, intellectual property rights,...digital libraries, data mining, born-digital preservation, ...study of the impact of technology on numerous fields... technology for teaching and learning...and many others" (Gavin, Smith & Bobley 2012).


