ABSTRACT: Digital archiving, undergraduate teaching and learning, scholarly communication, and social media tools are only a few of many skills an academic librarian can bring to digital humanities (DH) projects. Core LIS skills are being applied to a unique DH project at Elon University focusing on Korean popular culture.
