concern. Having said that, I lament that we cannot gather together in a way that we are used to. It grieves me that I cannot see all of you face to face as we once did. I am reminded that scripture is full of passages of lament and ultimate trust in God. See for example Psalm 137:1 "By the rivers of Babylon—there we sat down and there we wept when we remembered Zion." It is appropriate to grieve and just as importantly, to know that Jesus is with us through it all.

# REFLECTIONS FROM THE PEW BY DAN SITZMAN

May 10, Mother's Day

On Mother's Day when I was in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, the priest ventured out into the congregation during his sermon, asking kids to help him describe why mothers are so

special. As a prompt, he asked for words that started with the letters that spell mother.

M "Makes me happy"
O "Outgoing"
T "Terrific"
H "Hero"
E "Everything about her"
R

A 1<sup>st</sup> grader had eagerly raised her hand for every letter, but had yet to be called on. Finally, the priest approached her, held the microphone to her mouth, and waited for her response as she leaned forward and, after a long pause, enthusiastically announced "Rug!" Even though there were giggles throughout the church, the priest confirmed, "Yes, rug starts with R!"

In this Sunday's gospel from John, the disciples are looking for guidance. Thomas admits they don't understand where Jesus is going. Phillip asks Jesus to "show us the Father," to which Jesus kindly reminds him that he has been showing him all of this time.

Sometimes, what seems to oneself like a good question or response, is a reminder that we are not perfect as we look forward to what is ahead.
