degrees. Some of you are native Nebraskans. Some of you came to UNO from across our country and some of your from around the world. This class represents 28 states and 39 countries — with 83 international students graduating today. Now, for our International candidates we are proud to have you join our Mayerick family.

One reason | that we are so proud | to lead this institution | is UNO's commitment to our military, | veteran, | and dependent students, | on-campus, | online, and overseas. | For 9 consecutive years in a

row, | The Military Times | has named UNO one of the top 10 universities in the nation | for military-affiliated students. | We want to recognize all of the veterans and service members | among the graduating class | today | and recognize your commitment to our freedom. |

Thank you for your service.

At UNO, we embrace our role as an anchor institution in our community, and we welcome you—all alumni, future Mavericks, and visitors alike—to campus for athletic events, concerts, lectures,

and community meetings. I also hope that you will return as lifelong learners, exploring the rich educational opportunities that our university has to offer. We are your University of Nebraska here in Omaha, and we look forward to being part of your lives for years to come.

HONORARY DEGREE:

CHANCELLOR:

The Honorary Degree | is the most prestigious honor that is bestowed by the University of Nebraska at Omaha. This honor is reserved for those who have rendered extraordinary service to the university as well as the regional and global community. Our recipient today, Mr. Samuel Bak is being honored with a Doctorate of Humane Letters | for his innovative contributions | to the field of higher education.

Mr. Bak is a world-renowned artist and Holocaust survivor. His works depict his personal story as well as history, telling vivid stories like no one else.

His story begins in 1933 at Vilna, Poland. Shortly thereafter, Vilna was under Soviet and then German occupation from 1940 to 1944. Only he and his mother survived, his father and grandparents; all perished at the hands of the Nazis. After World War II, Mr. Bak and his mother fled to the Landsberg Displaced Persons Camp. It was here that he was able to take his first painting lessons at the Blocherer School in Munich.

Mr. Bak's artistic talent started was recognized at a very young age, during an exhibition in the Ghetto of Vilna when he was just nine years-old. After studying in Munich, he was able to attend prestigious art schools in Jerusalem and Paris. While in Paris, he received a grant from the America-Israel Cultural Foundation to pursue his artistic studies. He had his first exhibition in 1959 in Rome of abstract paintings, and in 1961 he was invited to show at an exhibit at the "Carnegie International," following that, he had a solo exhibition at the Tel Aviv Museum in 1963.

During the time of these exhibitions, there was a change in his artistic preferences. The shift led Mr. Bak to paint in the style called expressionism. In his work, Mr. Bak paints a vivid story of his personal life, Jewish history, and Holocaust Experiences. He has completed over 8,000 pieces and continues his work today.

This last September, Mr. Bak spent a week on our campus where he visited several different classes to talk about his experiences, displayed 70 pieces of art in our Weber Fine Arts Building Art Gallery. Hundreds of people from Omaha and surrounding communities, as well as more than 1,500 middle and high school students saw his works. He also gave several radio interviews, and public talks while on campus. During an event at the Strauss Performing Arts Center on September 25, Mr. Bak generously donated three of his original pieces to the University of Nebraska at Omaha. These works were donated in honor of three donor families, the Fried, Schwalb, and Goldstein families. We encourage you to all come back to campus in the fall to see these displayed in the Criss Library.

For his devotion to telling the story of people who can't... for his dedication to using his platform to educate new generations... and for his embodiment of what we like to call the Maverick spirit... the University of Nebraska at Omaha | bestows upon Samuel Bak, the degree Doctor of Humane Letter, honoris causa, this eighth day of May, two thousand and twenty, with all rights and privileges thereto.

The Goldsteins include Mr. Don Goldstein from Omaha, NE, Gail Raznick from Boulder, Co, and Kathy Goldstein from Pacific Grove, CA. They were raised in Omaha, NE by Leonard and Shirley Goldstein. Their parents established a Lectureship on Human Rights with the UNO Religious Studies Department. After the passing of Mr. Leonard Goldstein, the siblings carried on his spirit and work

of furthering the education, community engagement, and research of Human Rights at UNO.

Together, the creation of the Goldstein Family Community Chair in Human Rights and the Leonard and Shirley Goldstein Center for Human Rights was established in January on 2018 in the College of Arts and Sciences. This center is uniquely composed of over thirty affiliated faculty from five colleges at UNO. The Goldstein Center for Human Rights is a faculty-governed, nonpartisan nonsectarian organization that promotes the understanding of issues through teaching, research, and creative activity, and community engagement both locally and globally.

The Goldstein Center for Human Rights provides access to exceptional teaching, through several different conferences and talks where our faculty share their expertise with our students. It provides access to exceptional community engagement through archives and exhibits, such as Shirley Goldstein's Immigration Right Legacy, the freedom of movement and religion for Soviet Jews, which was shown in the Criss Library. This center also was a major contributor to Samuel Bak's visit to our campus, leading to his inclusion in their annual lecture series, Symposium on Art and Human Rights, which featured scholars across the US, Europe, and South Africa. These experiences promote cultured discussion and panels for our students.

The Goldstein children, Don, Gail, and Kathy tirelessly work to continue the support of Human Rights in honor of their parents. In addition to their contributions at UNO, they have also supported the University of Nebraska Medical Center, Beth El Synagogue, the Jewish Federation, and many more efforts throughout the Omaha community.

For this commitment | and for their generous contributions to the education of Human Rights, | and the Omaha community, | the University of Nebraska at Omaha | bestows upon Mr. Don Goldstein, Mrs. Gail Raznick, and Ms. Kathy Ann Goldstein | the Order of the Tower award, | this

CHANCELLOR:

The Chancellor's Medal is awarded to individuals whose outstanding service to the University of Nebraska at Omaha has shaped the institution's course. Their dedication, commitment,

and exemplary performance | fuels UNO's incredible momentum.

Today, we are able to recognize two such individuals, Assistant Vice Chancellor of Student Success and Dean of Students, Cathy Pettid, and Former Dean of the College of Business Administration, Dr. Louis Pol.

Ms. Cathy Pettid has been with the University of Nebraska at Omaha for 15 years. She has fully supported students, and has led multiple units and initiatives across campus that continues to have a transformative impact on the campus community. You will see her work in the Service Learning Academy, Counseling and Psychological Services Department,

Wellness Center, Academic and Career Development Center, and most recently, organizing and developing the new UNO Success Academies initiatives.

Ms. Pettid also works with students on an individual level, ranging in situations from mental health, classroom disruptions, family concerns, homelessness, and other extremely trying situations. She does this with professionalism, kindness, sensitivity, and laughter, when appropriate. This kind of care requires her to be available outside of typical business hours, which means she often puts in long hours during the week and even on weekends.

During the Scott Campus fire, she worked tirelessly to assist the students who were affected by this event. She helped to find them new

accommodations and provided counseling during that stressful time. Ms. Pettid showed compassion for each student and was a positive influence in a very difficult situation. That situation, as well as many others, shows that Ms. Pettid is deserving of the 2020 UNO Chancellor's Medal.

Dr. Louis Pol joined the College of Business

Administration at UNO in 1984. He became dean of the college in 2003, wherein he provided extraordinary, transformative leadership for the college and made significant contributions to the growth and development of UNO. He connection and reputation amongst the business community is outstanding and much of that is attributed to his "can do" attitude in regard to collaboration. The success of

the Entrepreneurship Program and Collaboration Science initiatives are two of these examples.

Dr. Pol's collaboration extended past a local level, and moved into global partnerships with work in India, China, Germany, Finland, Austria, Belgium and Romania. During his time in Romania, he was awarded an honorary doctorate from Alexandru Ioan Cuza University in Romania. He has documented his exciting work through his personal blog entitled, "Traveling Dean."

During his leadership, the College of Business

Administration was accredited by the Association to

Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, which fewer

than 200 business schools worldwide can boast. It has

also been rated as the number one business school in

the U.S. for military veteran students and is able to distribute over \$900,000 in scholarships to students.

The growth of the College of Business Administration led to a new building in 2010, Mammel Hall, and a new addition to the building began in 2019 to better support the needs of the students and the college. Dr. Pol's years of outstanding service to UNO demonstrates his dedication and service worthy of the UNO Chancellor's Medal.
