## TENNESSEE TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY, COOKEVILLE

Tennessee Technological University was established in 1915 by the Tennessee General Assembly. It was formally called Tennessee Polytechnic Institute and as a junior college on September opened 14, 1916. The buildings and grounds of Dixie College, a private school, were purchased and two new dormitories were built with funds provided by Putnam County and the city of Cookeville.

Additional course work was added in 1924 and 1928, and the first four-year degrees were awarded in 1929. Full accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools was attained on March 31, 1939. In 1948, the instructional program was expanded and organized into five schools: Arts and Sciences, Agriculture and Home Economics, Business Administration, Education, and Engineering. In 1958, the program grew to include the Graduate School offering the master of arts degree, and in 1964 the master of science degree in engineering was added.

On July 1, 1965, by action of the 84th General Assembly, the name of the institution was changed to Tennessee Technological University. This was the same year that African Americans first attended Tennessee Tech.

Presently, there are 7,300 students enrolled, and 1,047 members of the faculty, administration and staff.
