

Black Faculty of the Year award given

Margaret C. Lee, assistant professor with the political science department, was awarded the Black Faculty of the Year Award for 1990.

"I think one of the greatest challenges is to deal with student resistance to a different perspective to politics -- namely from an African-American woman and a person in international relations," said Lee.

"But at the same time, it is very rewarding to have students express their great appreciation of the perspective I offer,"

Besides teaching classes in American government, she also teaches two upper division classes dealing with politics of developing nations and U.S. foreign policy toward the third world. She has also lectured on Southern Africa and did field work in Southern Africa during the summers of 1987 and 1988.

"I anticipate this summer to be at the University of Botswana as

a research associate," said Lee.

Lee is also the author of "SADCC, The Political Economy of Development of Southern Africa." This is the only book published in the United States on the Southern African Development Coordination Conference, according to Lee.

Currently, she is working on a manuscript of U.S. policy toward Southern Africa and will be participating in Aspen Institute's Nine-Day Executive Seminar Feb. 23 through March 3, during which she will be discussing political theories with others attending the seminar, according to Lee.
