First presented at the 53rd Venice Biennale in 2009 and now showing for the first time in Asia, *Quadra Medicinale Singapore* presents alternative ways of experiencing and interpreting our surroundings by taking notice of often overlooked street plants – “weeds” – within a specific urban area. Unearthing the medicinal and productive properties of these seemingly useless plants, Geys offers a model for archiving and sharing knowledge that refers to validated systems of classification but also expanded to include vernacular knowledge. Explore the local “biotope” in the newly-produced Singapore section where collaborators from Urban Forest were invited to archive and research 12 street plants selected from within a one to two kilometre square of their neighbourhood.
