CITIES FOR PEOPLE commenced in November 2016 with a conference titled. The Impossibility of Mapping (Urban Asia) which, focusing on Asia as an urban laboratory, centred discussions on multiple ideas of modernity in relation to aschibecture, urban experimentation, planniar and development. Continuing with a 10-day programme in January 2017 that coincides with Singapore Art Week 2017 and Art After Dark at Gillman Barracks, CITIES FOR PEOPLE comprises a bonanza of specifically commissioned performances, public installations, participatory projects and social experiments, unban farming initiatives, public dialogues, and a variety of workshops. These events invite participation from people of different backgrounds. Each project and workshop focus on a specific issue pertinent to contemporary society and offers participants different levels of engagement in the respective topics a common space for interaction. CITIES FOR PEOPLE cumulates in a three-day summit that brings together a prominent group of architects, theorists, researchers, cuartors, and community groups to exchange ideas and discuss about urbanism, modes of exchange, critical spatial practice, and to envision a city as habitat. It offers a platform to contemplate the possibilities of shared space, reformulating our demands accordingly, and projecting solutions and desires to determine the future.

CITIES FOR PEOPLE, borrowing the title from a book by eminent Singapore architect William S. W. Lim published in 1990, expands on some of the ideas Lim developed, particularly in relation to tropical environments and recycling, as well as it is call for a humanistic architecture, paraised on the occasion of the exhibition incomplete Urbanism. Attempts of Critical Spatial Practice, the ideas Fest is an invitation to share and engage in collaborative projects and collective experiences that critically reflect current challenges in urban and social development.

"70 x 7" refers to the notion of infinity since the meal is only a starting point for conversations and exchanges that can continue beyond the event. To facilitate this process, each meal is accompanied by commissioned artworks and objects.

For CITIES FOR PEOPLE, the artists will create the setting for "Act 40", a dinner for up to 200 guests with a menu designed in collaboration with Chef Misso Russell Keith of Open Farm Community, made of locally sourced or sustainable produce only. Each table will be assigned an "island of knowledge" and adorned with elements relating to the artists' visual and textual language. An exchange workshop prior to the meal will bring together Singapore's agricultural, farming, and urban gardening communities, policy makers, artists, and activist groups, to generate a wide range of playful, provocative, and meaningful questions that operate as triggers for the thematic discussions during the evening

After the meal, Lucy + Jorge Orta will transform the photographic documentation and objects collected from Singapore markets into a series of iconic sculptures, prolonging their experience of the food collaborations and discussions beyond Singapore, to generate further processes of exchange in new contexts where the objects are re-presented.
