Cally Spooner Life Activation

NTU Centre for Contemporary Art Singapore's anniversary programme *Stagings. Soundings. Readings. Free Jazz II* reviews the performative format and celebrates the practice of improvisation.

Within the spirit of free jazz, Spooner sets up in the exhibition space, her video projection, DRAG DRAG SOLO (2016) and Bedtime Beats (2016), a hotel alarm clock catering for soundscapes to match the rhythm of guests' metabolisms, supposedly guaranteeing they fall asleep and, at the touch of a button, wake up as demanded. A new sound installation recorded in Singapore with local vocalists share the space. In addition, a new choreography performed by New Yorkbased dancer, Maggie Segale further activates the installation.

This constellation of visual, sound, and movement questions the socio-engineering of time, embodied pragmatics, and spatial arrangements, upsetting chrono-normative accounts of history.

Trained as a printmaker, Chong's practice explores a language of the senses. Through looking at relationships between digital, organic, and aesthetic metaphors, her experimentation with the effects and methods of reproducing and manipulating images across materials examines questions of being, value structures, and mutability. In Beige Dreams series, make-up is applied to flowering plants to bring out their flesh-like qualities. Through the photographic capture of flowers and fluids reminiscent of Old Master floral still-life, the floral flesh parallels our own and expresses both fullness and fragility balanced by an accompanying memento mori.

Chong received her MFA in Printmaking from the Royal College of Art, London and was a recipient of the National Arts Council Overseas Postgraduate Scholarship. She has exhibited in Singapore, Yogyakarta, Amsterdam, London, Seoul, Vienna, and Paris, among others. She is one of the artists selected for the President's Young Talents 2018.



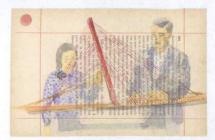
Thão-Nguyên Phan

Through condensing manifold references from literature, philosophy, and daily life, Phan's subtly poetic artworks open up new spaces for reflecting social convention, history, and tradition. In Voyages de Rhodes, her visual interpretation of Rhodes's stories from his 1653 book Rhodes of Viet Nam: The Travels and Missions of Father Alexandre de Rhodes in China and Other Kingdoms of the Orient forms the basis of a series of paintings. Painted directly on particular pages removed from the book, this vast collection of imagery and text is revelatory of cultural differences that can be both humorous and sinister.

Phan holds an MFA in Painting and Drawing from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago (SAIC). She has exhibited widely in Southeast Asia; was a 2016–17 Rolex Protegee, mentored by Internationally acclaimed performance and video artist Joan Jonas; and the recipient of the Grand Prize, APB Foundation Signature Art Prize (2018). Her book, Voyages de Rhodes, commissioned and published by the Centre, will be launched in November 2018.

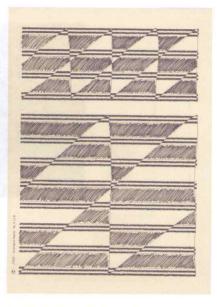

Ang's practice explores how individuals and society relate to music, often sampling material from popular culture and the everyday, as well as examines the situations in which music is produced, shared, and consumed. Music Manuscript (2013–ongoing) is a systematic exploration of music staves as a structure for making visual compositions. Each set of artworks in this series contains an internal logic which in turn determines the end result.

Ang received his MA in Aural & Visual Cultures from Goldsmiths College, London. He has exhibited widely internationally including the 14th Istanbul Biennial (2015); Witte de With Center for Contemporary Art, Rotterdam (2014); Museum of Contemporary Art, Sydney (2014); Haus der Kulturen der Welt, Berlin (2011); and the 3rd Singapore Biennale (2011). In 2019, he will represent Singapore at the 58th Venice Biennale International Art Exhibition.

Thão-Nguyên Phan was Artist-In-Residence at NTU CCA Singapore from January to March 2017.

Starting bid SGD 2,400 Chen's practice deals largely with lived experiences and body politics. Often humorous, his artworks tap into peculiar characteristics of Singapore to reflect on the psyche of a place caught between tradition and modernisation. Waiting for the Bird features a bespoke mahjong table containing a zero-sum-inspired round of the game. Each side shows a legendary winning hand, inspired by gambling films from Hong Kong, that are highly improbable in real life. The title refers the winning tile of "one bamboo" or the bird, which is also the tile that will collapse the zero-sum game.

Chen completed his MA in Fine Arts at LASALLE College of the Arts, Singapore. Most recently, his work 5 Rehearsals of a Wedding was commissioned to be presented at Chapel Gallery as part of Singapore Art Week 2018. In 2017, he was awarded the Young Artist Award by the National Arts Council, Singapore.

Part of a series of artworks created as a resident artist of Platform STPI Projects in 2015, Wiharso's cast paper reliefs convey his ongoing explorations based on universal issues of power, loss, and love, to broader categories of ideology, philosophy, and identity.

Wiharso is a recipient of the Pollock-Krasner grant, a
Copeland Fellowship at Amherst College, and a summer residency
at Robert Wilson's Watermill Center. His artworks have been shown
internationally in Art Stage Singapore (2015, 2014); Prospect.3,
New Orleans (2014–15); the 55th and 51st Venice Biennale
International Art Exhibition (2013, 2005); and Prague Biennale 6 (2013),
amongst others. He is represented in numerous notable collections,

Lim has long been interested in the edges and conditions of visibility. His practice is less about presenting objects than about contemplating absences and shifting mindsets.

For the Inaugural Gala and Auction Dinner, Lim presents a photograph of the Centre's exhibition block, modifying the facade sign to read "NTUC entre for Contemporary Art Singapore." NTUC, the National Trades Union Congress, is the sole national trade union centre in Singapore and the official heart of the labour movement. It is also behind several social enterprises, including the budget NTUC FairPrice supermarkets. This photograph has a precedent in an earlier work by Lim which also played with the framing of the art institution. For the inaugural Singapore Biennale (2006), the artist entered the former City Hall, one of the main venues, and fumigated its interiors with synthesised human pheromones — as if the cold masculinity of the building was begging for an attractor, an injection of "human air" into the space.

Chong's work is located at the intersection between image; performance, situations, and writing. Similar to stories that have been forgotten, erased and/or censored, unwritten, the paintings that constitute *Things That Remain Unwritten* (2013–ongoing) move in a realm that is ambiguous, devoid of contexts, particles in suspended animation. While effortlessly fusing familiar genres in painting, of abstraction, colour fields, expressionism, assemblage, the series evokes a particular autobiographical grapple with the history of art, of painting.

Chong graduated with an MA in Communication Art and Design from the Royal College of Art, London. He has shown extensively in major exhibitions and institutions all over the world. His recent solo exhibitions were held at Swiss Institute, New York (2018); Calle Wright, Manila (2018); 72-13, Singapore (2017); and Rockbund Art Museum, Shanghai (2016).

Core to Sharma's practice is an interest in time, space, voids and materiality. $Untitled\left(Qigolo\right)$, consisting of a series of reflective poured paintings done from 2012–15, is the last of a body of artworks based on painting, before the artist's move towards a more conceptually-based practice. His recent forays and experiments look into scenes and places through the effects of modernity while working with elements of voice, light, atmosphere, film, music, movement, and architecture.

Sharma holds an MFA from LASALLE College of the Arts, Singapore. Over the past decade, he has had several solo and group exhibitions in Asia, Europe, United States, and South America. His work has been the subject of critical discussion in publications which include Asian Art News, ArtAsiaPacific and Wall Street International, and is part of a number of public and private collections.

Prvački is one of Singapore's foremost artists and art educators, having taught at LASALLE College of the Arts since 1994. *Unsent Letters* is a series of paintings and drawings in which the artist "recreate(s) the object, shapes and marks, as 'telegraphic' evidence of human traces that are embodied and hidden in this 'invisible' world of unseen, unspoken words and signs."

Prvacki was awarded Singapore's Cultural Medallion in 2012 and the Chevaller de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres by the French Government in 2011. He has exhibited extensively since 1971 and has participated in major exhibitions, notably the Biennale of Sydney in 2006. His works are part of the collections of Art Gallery of New South Wales; Museum of Contemporary Art, Belgrade; Singapore Art Museum; and National Gallery Singapore; amongst others. Prvački iš currently Senior Fellow, Office of the President at LASALLE College of the Arts and Adjunct Professor at RMIT University, Melbourne.

Starting bid SGD 5,900 Premised on concepts of doubt and uncertainty, the works of Zhao challenge notions of truth and conventional structures for the dissemination of knowledge. Operating under the aegis of the fictive The Institute of Critical Zoologists, his artistic practice addresses the relationship between humans and nature, restructuring accepted parameters of objectivity and scientific modes of classifications. Christmas Island, Naturally gathers a varied collection of research materials on the effects of human presence on Christmas Island, merging factual and fictional elements.

Zhao holds an MA in Photography from London College of Communication. His work has been exhibited in numerous international exhibitions including PhotoEspana Madrid (2018); Yinchuan Biennale (2018); Athens Fast Forward Festival (2018); Jakarta Biennale (2017); 7th Moscow Biennale (2017); and 20th Biennale of Sydney (2016). He was awarded the Young Artist Award by the National Arts Council, Singapore in 2010, and was a finalist for the Hugo Boss Asia Art Award for Emerging Asian Artists 2017.

Starting bid SGD 6,600 For Sareth and others who lived through the Vietnam War and Khmer Rouge eras, black rubber sandals are highly symbolic of corrupted communism, its leaders, and painful personal associations thereof. Stake or Skewer combines the carrying pole used by noodle vendors with 17 rubber sandals. 17 is the number of the many different forms the word "eat" is used in Khmer language that the artist managed to locate. Hierarchies of class, religion, and age determine which of the words one can and cannot use to express this shared and basic need of nourishment. 17 is also the number of years the artist spent in labour and refugee camps along the Thai-Cambodian border. The work's title hints at a false offer of choice around issues of border conflict. (Adapted from text written by Erin Gleeson.)
