An Important Discovery.

AN EIGHT-OUNCE NUGGET FOUND.

[From our Special Reporter,]

Teetulpa, October 19.

A nugget has been found four feet from the surface by McDougall weighing 8 ounces 14 dwt. It has been forwarded by the warden to the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

Nothing further of special interest has occurred.

Diggers are arriving from Silverton and elsewhere.

Great difficulty is experienced in getting from Mannahill to the field, a distance of 23 miles, but more conveyances are promised shortly. Water is now procurable within two miles. (400 men on field.)
