<snip>Councillor Claxton moved — "That, it being desirable the Council should obtain all necessary information bearing on the system of electric lighting and its applicability to street purposes, the Town Clerk be and is hereby instructed to communicate with C. Todd, Esq., C.M.G., the Government Electrician, with a view to obtain from him a report on the practicability of lighting the streets of the city by means of the electric light, with such details as to the plan upon which such lighting can be effected, and an estimate of the cost, together with any other information in relation to this important subject as he may have time and opportunity to give." Seconded by Councillor Richardson, and carried. <snip>

<snip> Cesspits, General Post-Office. — Hydraulic Engineer be permitted to connect cesspits at these premises with sewer in King William street, on Government paying to City Fund the sum of £25 per year. <snip>
