

Dear Jay,

I enjoyed an interesting conversation with Jeanne. Her memory isn't any better than mine, but we had a good time reminiscing. I think she remembers it similarly to the way I do. The building that we worshiped in was not your typical mission. I think the man basically held a "church" service and it was in the afternoon, which is why there were children there. Jeanne remembered some of those who often went in – Gordon Hall, Bob Crew, Jay Bergers, Leon Hatch, Paul Zeigler, Emerson Twining. If you'd like to talk to Jeanne, her phone # is _______. Jeanne is very active in her local Nazarene church – still playing the piano for services, weddings and funerals despite her arthritis.

I'm not sure how detailed a report you're looking for. I don't know when they moved to another building because by that time, I was married and had moved away from the area. I looked in a diary I kept, but it only went through 1951 and there was no mention of the Chapel then. I'll be interested to hear how this project turns out.

Trust you're doing ok. How grateful I am for God's eternal, unconditional love and care for His children! May He bless you in ways you can't imagine!

Dear Jav.

You have the correct email address. I'm a poor correspondent. This is my remembrance of the starting of the Boston Chapel and at this point, I can't guarantee my memory.

One Sunday afternoon, as was my custom, I went into a service at a mission in Boston. It was most likely my junior year, 1952 - 1953. I think Jeanne St. Pierre was with me but I don't remember who the others were - I suspect there was a car load of us. This was not a "Nazarene" mission - it was just one of the many where we went to help. As we're waiting for the service to start, I noticed that there were quite a few children. I suggested to Jeanne that someone should be telling the kids a Bible story at their level. The more I thought about it, the better an idea it seemed. I don't remember if we started working with the children that week or if we came back the next week to follow through. Anyhow, from there on, it seemed to snowball and when the man who was running the mission couldn't't continue because of finances, we took over. By now, one of the men (probably Bob Crew, but I don't really remember who it was) had taken over the responsibility of the program and I just went to help with the children.

I'll try to call Jeanne tomorrow to get her remembrance of the situation. She doesn't have a ccomputer so we usually communicate by phone a couple of times a year. I'm sorry to be so long in answering your email. I trust this finds you doing ok. Did you happen to read on the Prayer Mobilization Line that
