

# The Future of Transportation in Belfast & Waldo County: Summary from 2/9/23

ABCD and the Belfast Climate Crisis Committee (CCC) hosted the fourth Community Climate Conversation on February 9, 2023. "The Future of Transportation in Belfast & Waldo County" event took place in the Abbott Room at the Belfast Free Library. 37 people attended in person and on Zoom.

We heard updates from two CCC members, and from the Belfast Pedestrian, Biking & Hiking Committee on their vision & priorities for Belfast.



### Some takeaways & ideas from participants:

- It was thought-provoking and energizing to discuss a "culture shift" in the future of transportation re-envisioning our habits and the ways we can provide a "diversity of mobility options" for everyone!
- The City of Belfast is in the process of applying for Maine's Community Resilience Partnership
  program making Belfast eligible for no-match grant monies for projects to reduce carbon
  emissions, transition to clean energy, and become more resilient to climate change. The City will
  complete a self-evaluation and seek public input as part of the process.
- The Pedestrian, Biking & Hiking Committee presented their annual report to the City on February 7. Their key recommendation is that the City hire a professional planner to draft an official comprehensive pedestrian/bike plan. The Committee, with the City's support, is pursuing grants to hire the professional planner to create this master plan.
- A few highlights from the attendee conversation (see full report for more):
- "Slow tourism" & the idea to try closing a city street to car traffic in summer.
- Look back on community layouts of 100 years ago, with clustered "service nodes" meeting people's needs. Modern version could be "mini cities" within 15 minutes walking distance?
- Municipal support for year-round biking, walking (e.g. where snow is plowed)
- Ridesharing community
- "Coordinated transit" with Waldo Community Action Partners
- Idling ordinance
- Rain gardens and curb bump-outs to make intersections safer (Lancaster, PA is an example).
- GO MAINE provides FREE ride matching for carpoolers, and rewards people for taking greener trips.


