Why we started this project & what inspires us

The ABCD project was founded on the ideas so well expressed by our recent speaker Sue Inches: that sharing our stories and talking about climate change and its effects and challenges is the best way to come together, feel less alone, and plan action.

In the last year, our team has been inspired and excited by stories of progress and hope, and the growing number of voices bringing attention and calling us to climate action, including:

- Community planning, education & action by the Belfast Climate Crisis Committee, local churches, non-profits & others
- Belfast's leadership in installing 3 tide gauges to monitor sea level rise
- Art and music as a way to communicate about climate change such as the upcoming symphony 'The Warming Sea'
- Increased media focus, including Maine Public's new series, "Climate Driven: A deep dive into Maine's response, one county at a time."
- Maine's progress on our ambitious climate action plan heat pumps, home weatherization, electrifying municipal fleets & school buses, community solar, upgrading the electric grid, and more.

Maine's Climate Future: The Role of Carbon Management in Farms and Forests with Dr. Ivan Fernandez

This winter the Belfast Garden Club Evening Lecture Series, co-sponsored by ABCD, will focus on the effects of the Climate Crisis on our forests and farms.

Tuesday, January 25 at 6:30 PM on Zoom

Dr. Fernandez, from the Climate Change Institute at the University of Maine, will summarize key findings from Maine-focused climate assessments. He will talk about how to enhance soil to capture carbon, to help reduce atmospheric carbon levels. The presentation will also summarize forest management recommendations from the Governor's Task Force on a Forest Carbon Program in Maine.
