




Imagining Our Climate Future: A Policy Perspective

Tuesday, April 12th at 6:30 pm on Zoom

Presented by the Belfast chapter of the Citizens Climate Lobby. Peter Garrett, PhD will encourage attendees to participate in the En-ROADS interactive Climate Solutions Simulator to explore the impact of a range of climate-related policies, such as electrifying transport, pricing carbon, and improving agricultural practices. We'll see how each would impact energy prices, temperature, and sea level rise. Belfast CCL member Katrina Matheson will share an overview of CCL's keystone policy initiative, the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act (H.R. 2307), and some of the reasons that it is the most aggressive solution to a transition away from fossil fuels, as well as the most compassionate for average Americans.

Your feedback is needed for Belfast's Climate Action Plan

In collaboration with the Belfast Climate Crisis Committee, we are asking for feedback from the community on Belfast's Climate Action Plan. What are your ideas for how Belfast should deal with the effects of climate change? Share your thoughts in our brief survey.



Here's a sampling of responses we've received from citizens so far:

"We have to deal with bay/ocean rising and with changing weather patterns. Given more extreme precipitation events, more consideration needs to be given to where we build and how we build..."

"Helping families afford to make changes to their heat sources would be helpful both to the climate and the local economy."

"We need a Climate Action Plan that is balanced between PROactive and REactive strategies. [...] Also, we are in a crisis and need all hands on deck, working together. We have no time to duplicate efforts or get gridlocked in differences. Let the science tell us what we need to do."
