




At the end of each year each member of the faculty, I am sure, wonders to himself just how much his students have gained during the past year.




So far we have not done much toward making money, but we did raffle a deep-fat fryer. This was won by Mrs. Ted Knuckey. This provided considerable profit for our class.





The end of this year marks the sixth year of the hot lunch program in the Buena Vista School.

An average of 110 pupils and adults eat in the lunch room daily. The children pay 20 cents and the adults pay 30 cents per meal, which affords a well-balanced meal.


