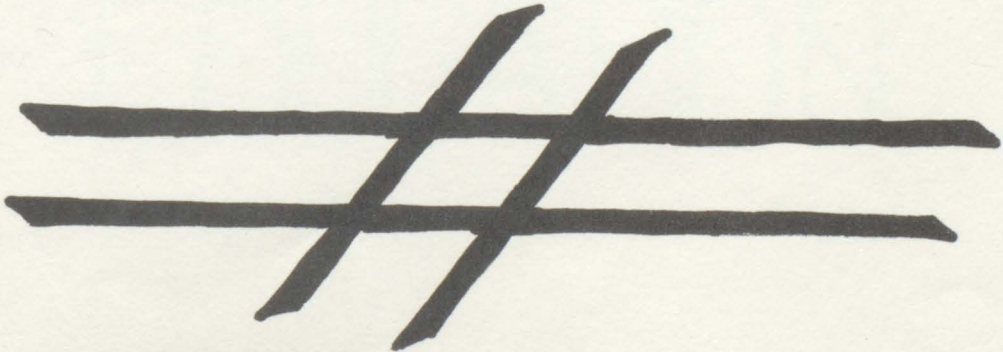


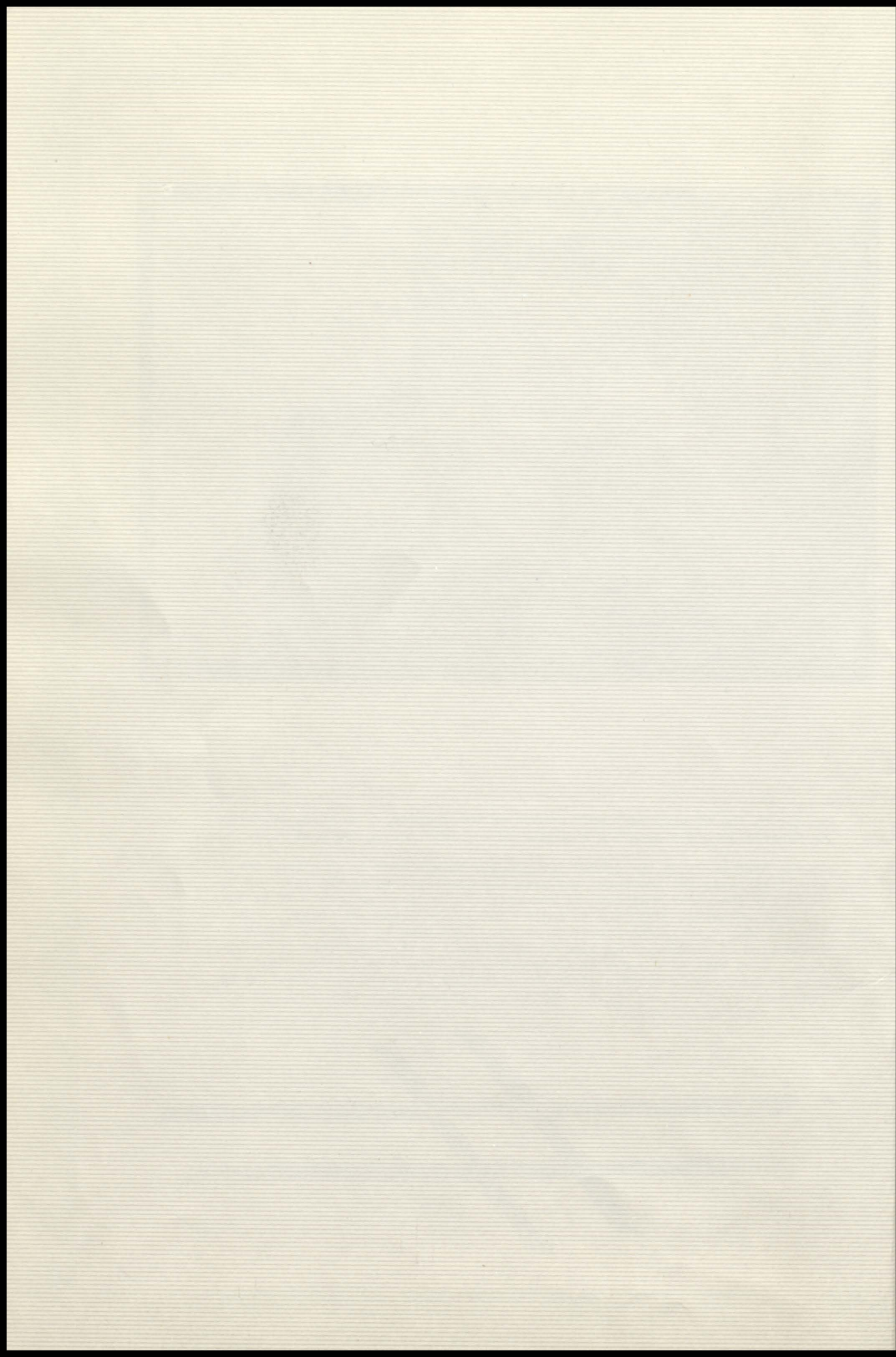


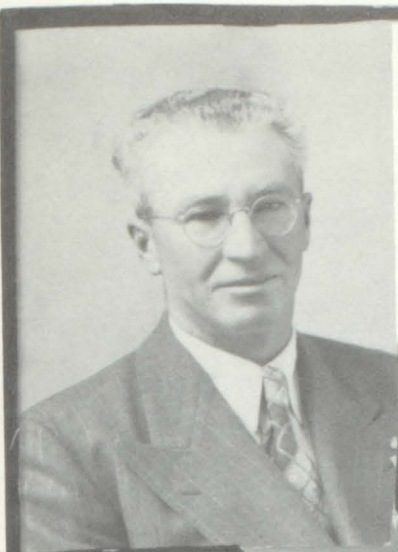


At the end of each year each member of the faculty, I am sure, wonders to himself just how much his students have gained during the past year.

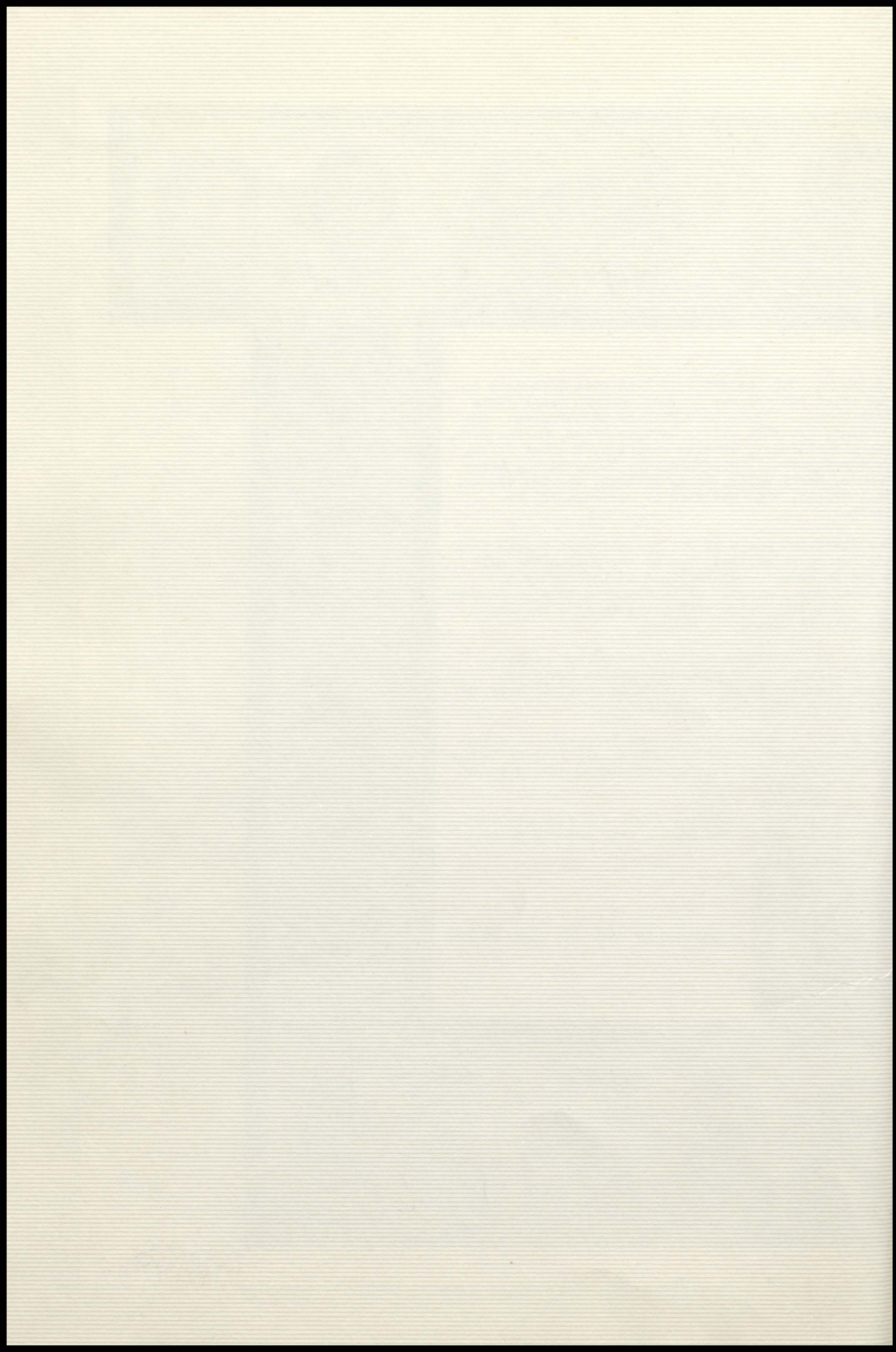
The Junior - Senior Banquet and Prom will be a very important event in our lives and will long be remembered by all of us as the outstanding social event of our journey.

The end of this third year finds all crew members looking forward to the coming year and our journey to Senior Port.

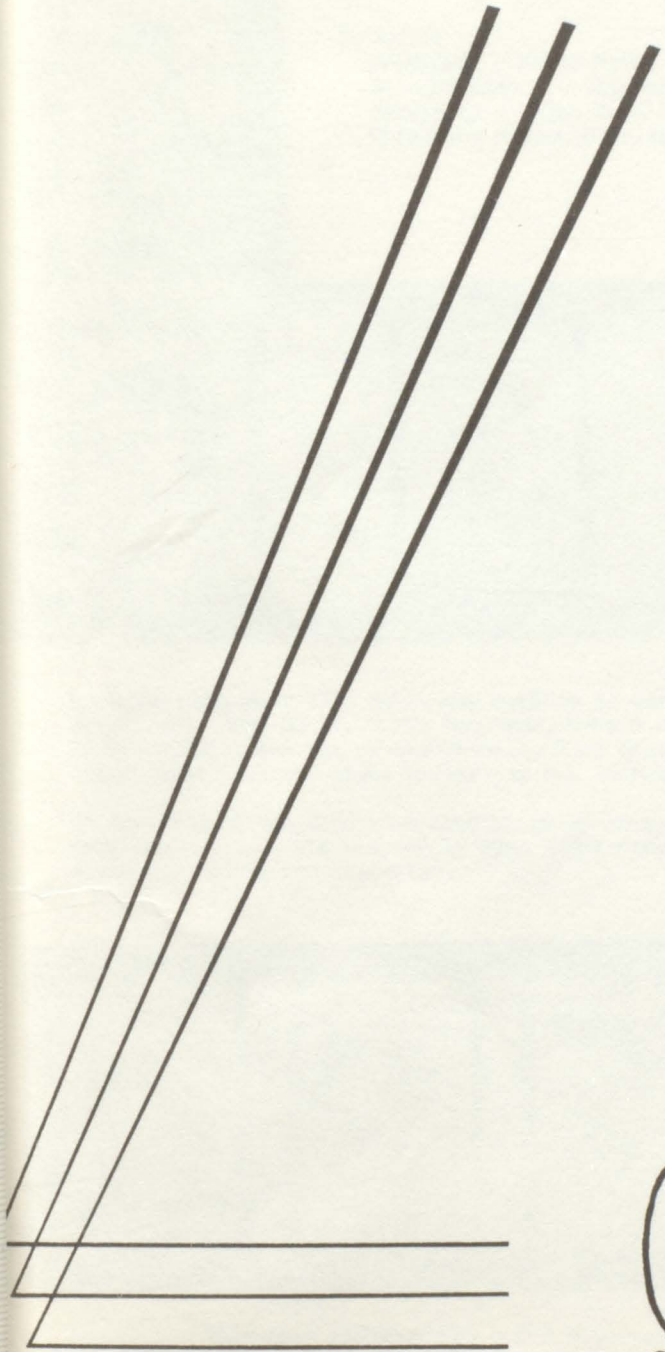


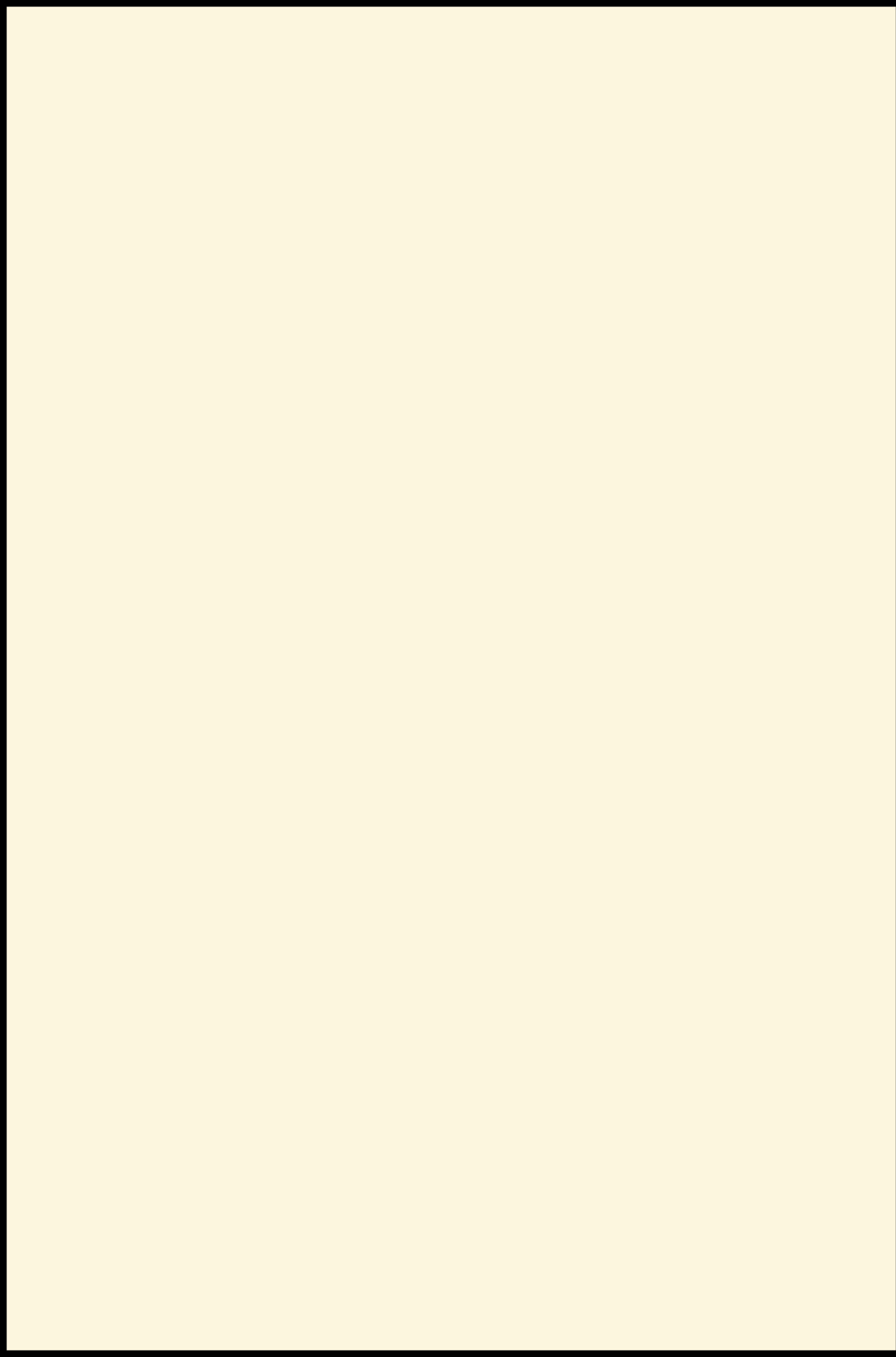

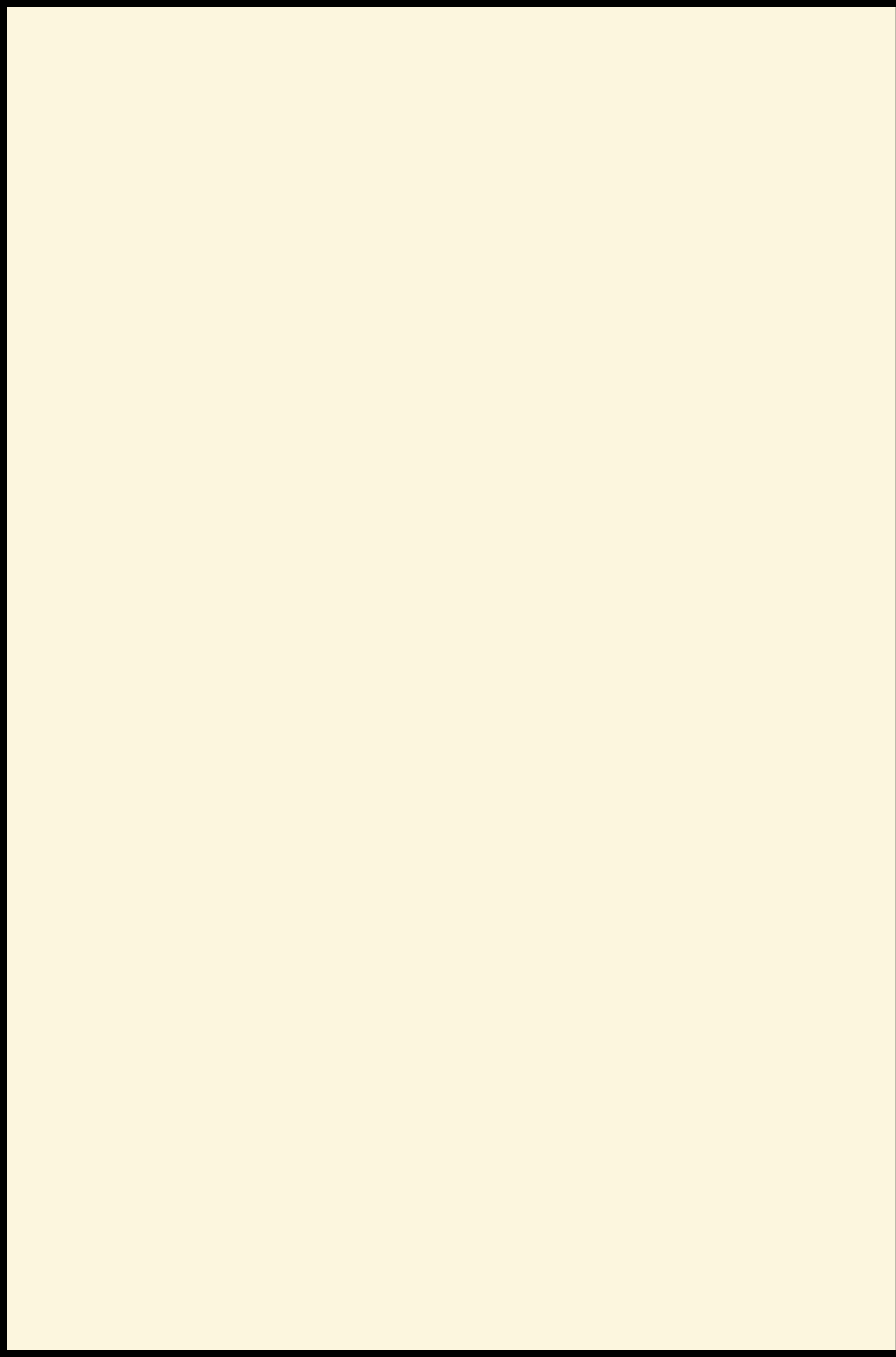
So far we have not done much toward making money, but we did raffle a deep-fat fryer. This was won by Mrs. Ted Knuckey. This provided considerable profit for our class.

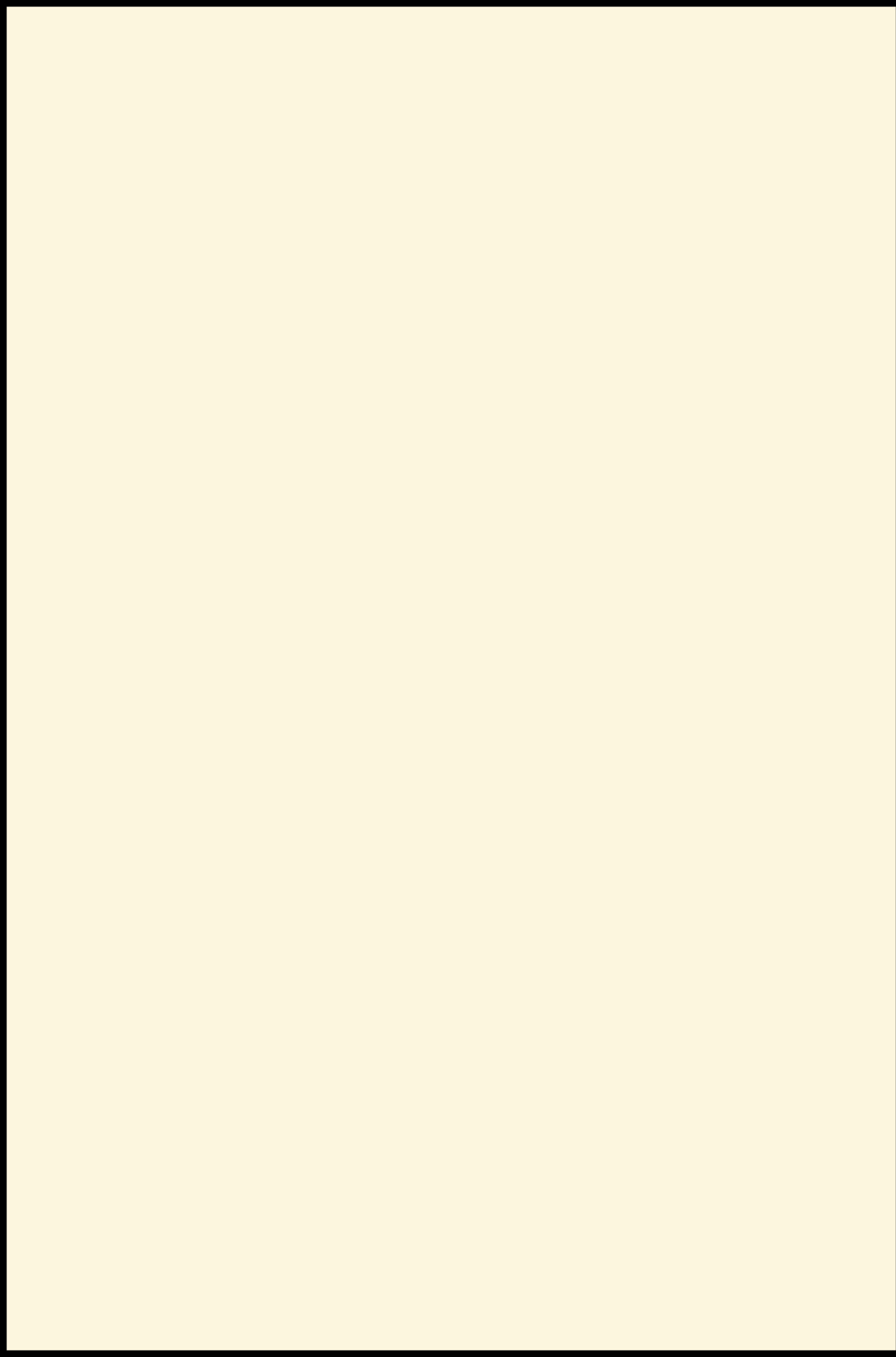
The School paper, the U-Tellum, has a staff of twenty-five this year.

HIGH SCHOOL BAND



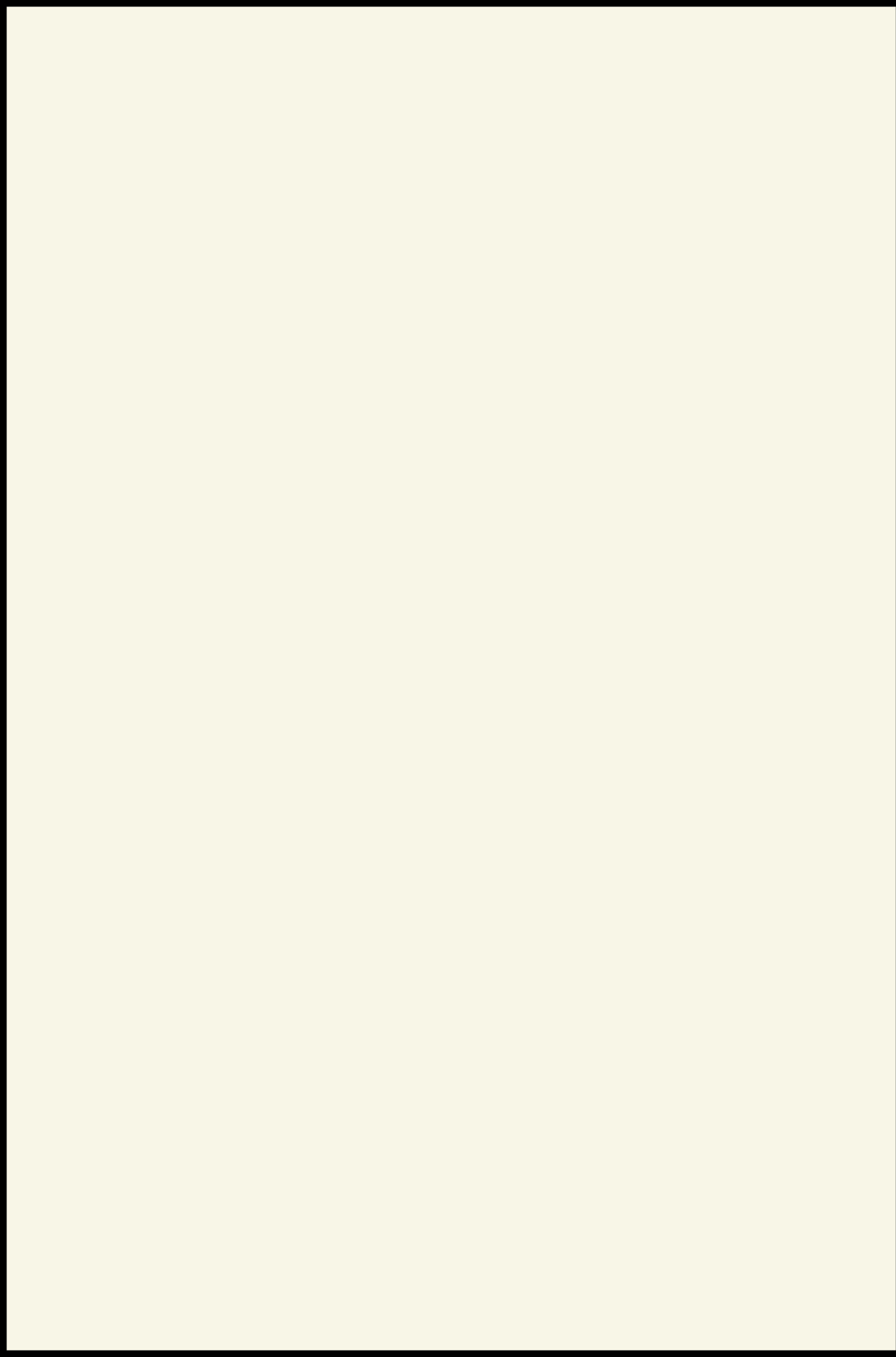

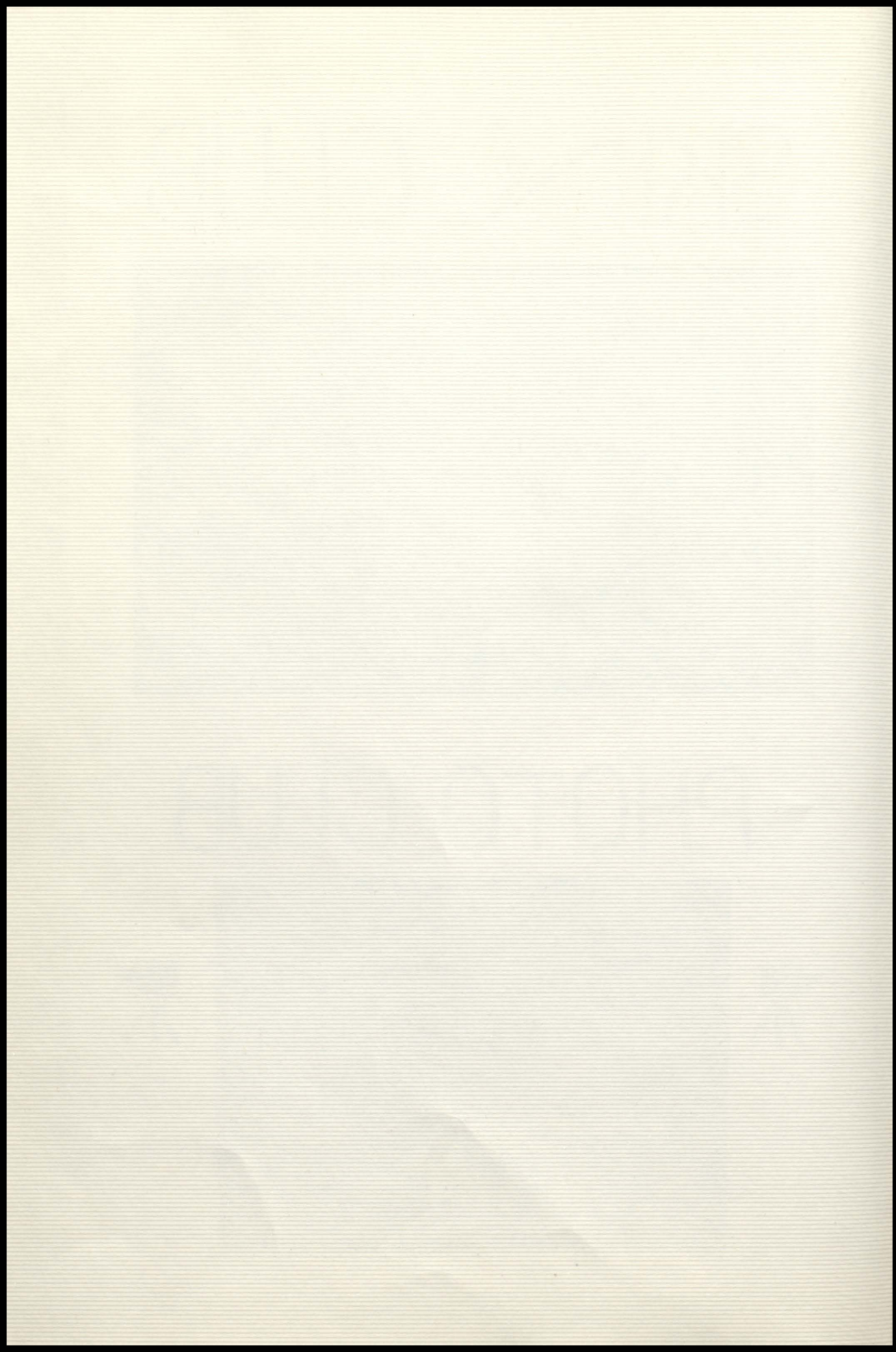

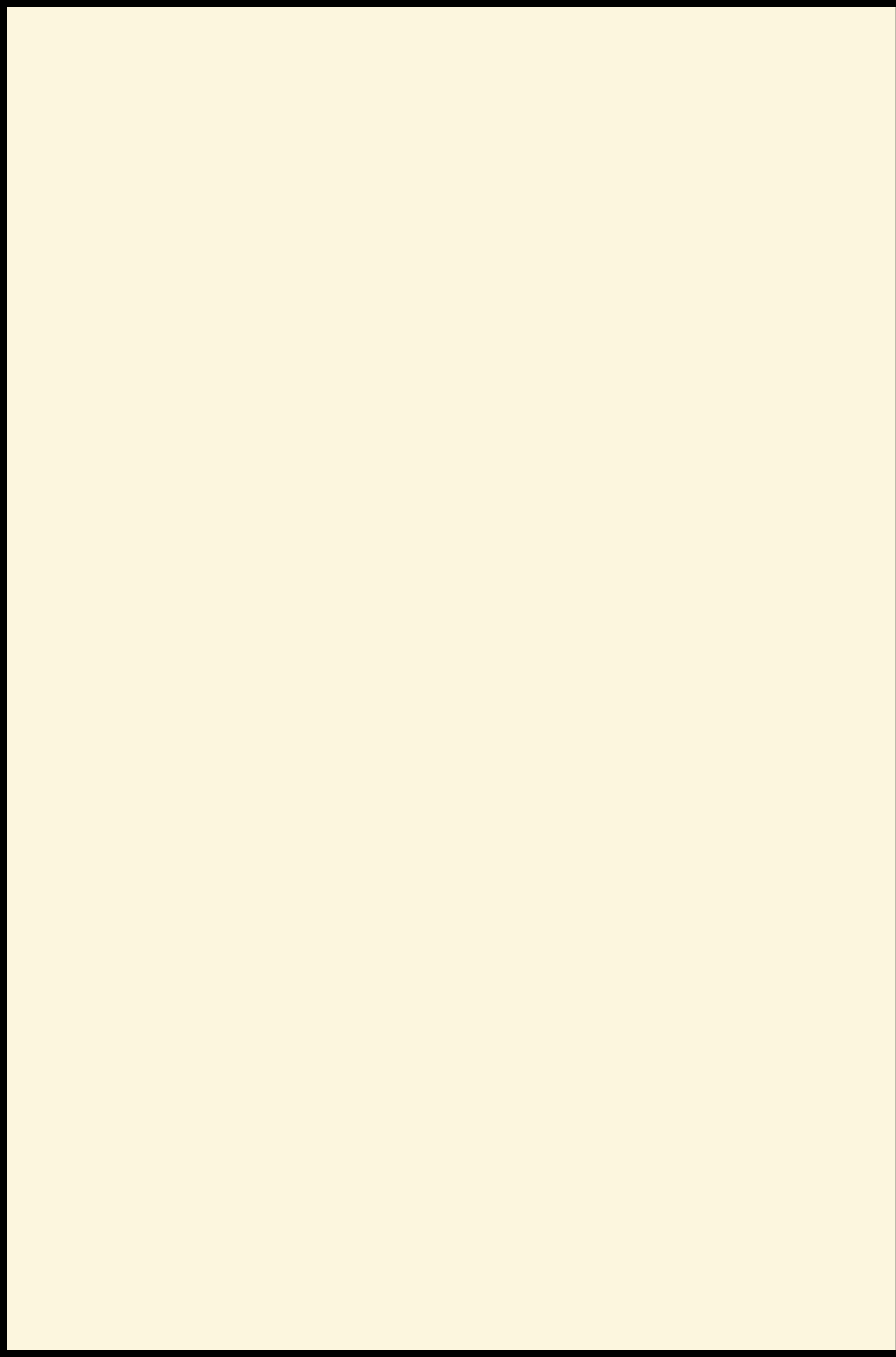


The end of this year marks the sixth year of the hot lunch program in the Buena Vista School.
