STOLEN BRAINS SET FOR SPIN CYCLE

Someone left a bag full of 22 human brains in the laundry room of a Univ. of Illinois fraternity house, and no one yet knows exactly whose brains they are. Sophomore Paul Gerding opened his laundry bag several weeks ago to find the brains where he thought his dirty clothes would be. In something of an instinctive reaction, he pitched the bag into an alley behind the Acacia Fraternity house, where he live, before calling the police.

University police investigator Charles Moore says the "case has been solved" since then, and charges have been filed against a group of students thought to be responsible for snatching the brains from a research lab and putting them into the laundry room. Moore refused to name the group. Group

members did appear before a disciplinary board last week, but no penalty has been imposed, reports John Scouffas, assistant vice chancellor of student affairs.

Scouffas adds that, in his view, the case isn't fully solved yet. The group, another fraternity, some believe, has taken responsibility for the theft and placement of the brains, but Scouffas says the individual "ring leaders are not known."

Acacia member John Holliday says Acacia has "reason to believe it was another fraternity, but it would be unfair to accuse anyone." Holliday notes the incident occurred during a period when pledges, on their way to a special weekend, often pull pranks on their brothers. Holliday speculates pledges from another house simply chose Acacia this time. "We're

not angry. No harm was done. No one is angry, like, it's a joke." Indeed, Scouffas, Moore and Detective Gary Wright all chuckled when discussing the case.

Scouffas says the most serious aspect of the case is the theft of the brains. Officials are still unsure from which lab they were

stolen. "We think they got them from our medical center." Then, "they probably dropped them in through a window" at Acacia, which Scouffas is confident, won't retaliate for the stunt. Holliday is less confident. Asked if members had plans to try to top the prank, he said they "had thought about it."

Guild Gift

The members of the Wagner College Guild presented a \$2,000 gift to the College at the organization's annual fall luncheon on the Grymes Hill campus recently.

The gift was accepted for Wagner by Dr. Leeseberg, vice president for administration.

Included in the gift was a \$1500 annual Guild Scholarship awarded to Wagner senior Heidi Hayter, a biology and English major who is planning to attend medical school, is a resident of Borough Park in Brooklyn.

The remaining \$500 is earmarked to support activities at Kairos House, the College Chapel, and general operating expenses of the College.

Conducting the students will be Wagner Choir Director Jan Meyel. Accompanist is Richard Signoa, a freshman music

major from Staten Island. Also performing will be sophomore Gail Hepner and music instructor Joseph Shiroky, both on the flute.

Admission is free and the public is invited to attend the concerts.

Lost Brains Again

For the second time in a month, University of Illinois students have happened on some misplaced brains. Most recently, senior Laura McInerney found brains in a plastic bag "hanging on the railing" of a dorm elevator car.

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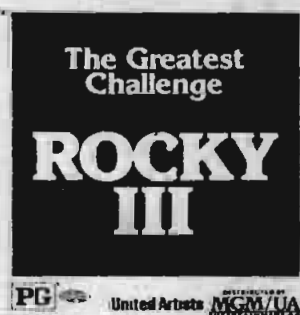

CHAIRPERSON CLARIFIES CHI LOCKOUT

Firstly, when a decision was made to disqualify a group from the float parade, it was not a decision made only by Dean Owgang and John Bonando, but by all four event advisors: Dean Gail Owgang, John Bonando, Darlene LaRosa, and Denise Pedro as well as myself. This decision was not one made in haste, it was discussed

for many hours before we finally concurred. The decision was reinforced by the float chairman, Rich Curtin, and his assistant, Meg Ross.

As to why they were disqualified, it was simply because they broke the rules. The written rules stated that EACH group must have at least two representatives in the gym to set up as well as clean up. The rules were stated at every Homecoming meeting, starting with the very first one. At every Homecoming meeting, I stated emphatically that any group not complying

with this or any other rule, would be disqualified. To remind everyone one last time, at the end of the show, the M.C. announced it again. An alumni of the disqualified group was even told over an hour before the decision was made to have a representative sent to the gym. This was not done. For that reason, they were disqualified. The fact that one group might have had more representatives than the others had no bearing on the matter.

Lastly, the group knew on Friday night that they would not be allowed on the

football field. And yes, the float was "abruptly apprehended at the football field entrance," but only when they tried to pull a grand stand play and spoke of driving through the gates; a rather childish move.

The Homecoming Committee realize that homecoming is one of the biggest events of the school year and that the whole idea is for fun and school spirit, but at some point during college, boys must become men and take responsibility for their actions.

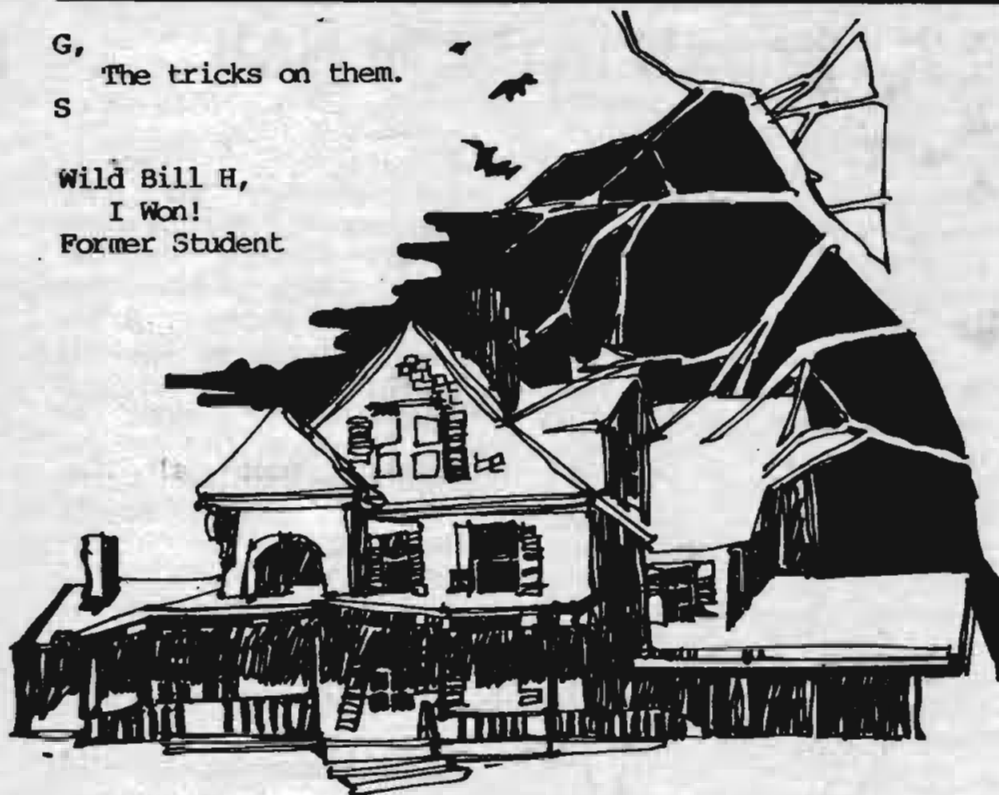

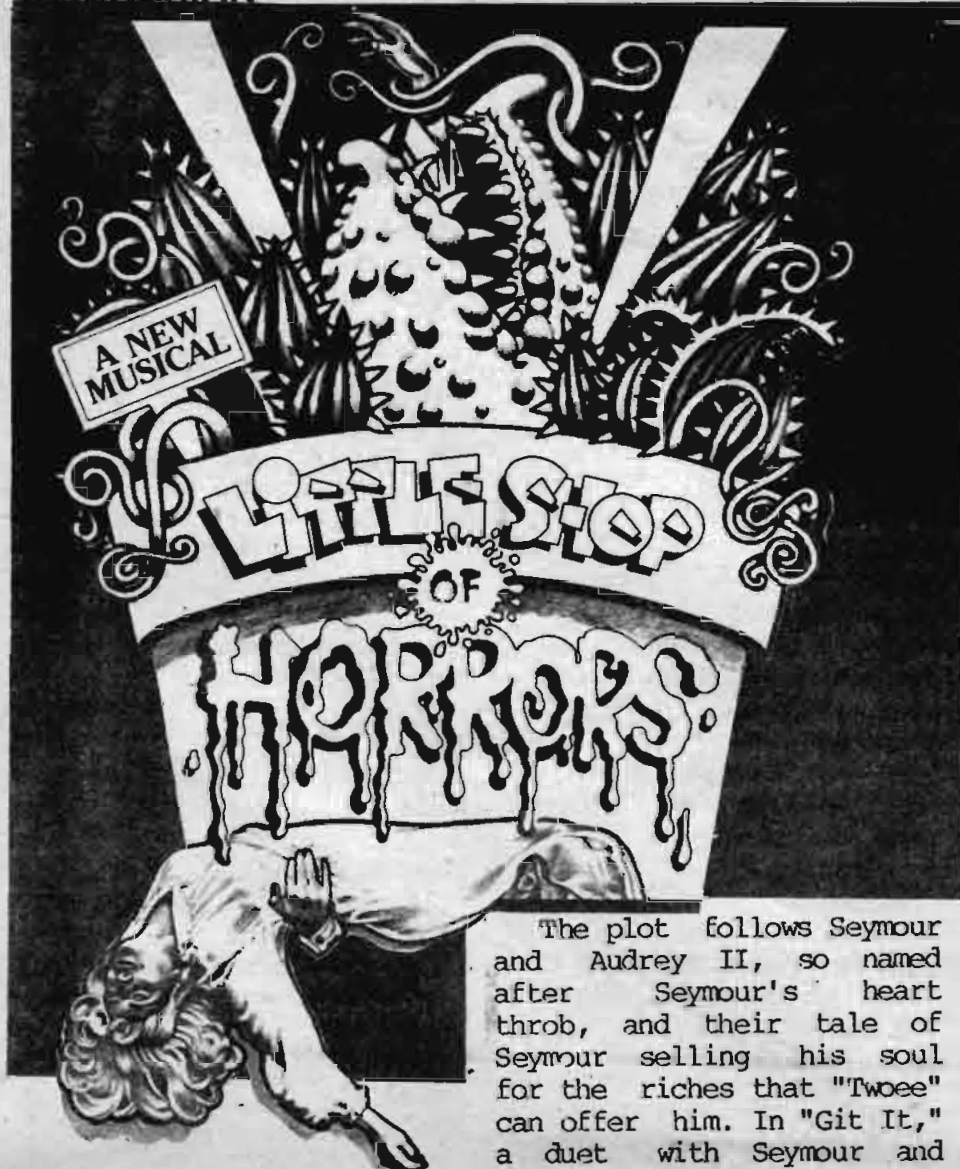

"Little Shop of Horrors" is currently playing at the Orpheum Theatre. This musical is based on the 1960's cult movie by the same name, about a plant that takes over the world. The movie was voted among the 100 worst horror movies ever, although it did achieve cult status among the young. This musical, however, written by Howard Ashman, should be considered among the 100 best musical comedies.

The show takes place on Skid Row in Mushnik's Florist Shop. The shop is a dismal failure until, Seymour, an employee of Mr. Mushnik, begins to grow a very unusual plant. Though odd looking, the plant at first appears normal until we find out that it has a passion for human blood. Although this could be a potentially gruesome subject, it is tastefully done on stage with the use of cloth.

To thicken the plot, add Audrey, a fellow employee of Seymour's and whom he loves from afar, and her weird boyfriend, a dentist who's into pain, and you've got quite a mixture for this herbivorous delight.

The plot follows Seymour and Audrey II, so named after Seymour's heart throb, and their tale of Seymour selling his soul for the riches that "Twoee" can offer him. In "Git It," a duet with Seymour and Audrey II (yes, the plant!), Audrey II proclaims that various people "look like plant food to me," and so it goes in this comic horror.

Composer Alan Menken said, "I decided that I wanted the musical approach to come from some early 1960's music - the girls group sound. It has a very dark, menacing ring." The trio of black girls, named Chiffon, Chrystal, and Ronnette comment musically on the action, of this fast paced comedy, much the same way a Greek chorus would.

Martin Robinson, who many of you may know as Mr. Snuffleupagus on Sesame St., has worked with the Muppets and designed and manipulates "Twoee," it's various forms through out the show. Ron Taylor acts as the voice of Audrey II, and when he bellows, you listen. He says he supplies the plant with "deep New Orleans funky kind of sound."

This show is a hilarious spoof on the horror movies and is one of the better Off-Broadway buys this year. If you should start hearing you plays sing "Supertime," however, beware.

Dracula to rise in NAB

He was a musical aficionado, a 15th century man of culture. He also had a taste for human blood, considerable taste, as legend would have it.

Vlad the Impaler, better known as Dracula, will make his appearance at Wagner on Saturday and Sunday, October 30 and 31, his busiest time of the year. He will be appearing with the College's Collegium Musicum in a concert of music from his court. The concerts will be in the Alumni Hall in the NAB; the "shroud" will be raised at 8:00 PM.

The Collegium will use instruments found in Vlad's own musical court. These include recorders, lutes, brass, krumphorns, shawn, rauschpfeife, viola da gamba, ud and kammence. Members of the Collegium will play those instruments in an attempt to raise Vlad

once again.

The narration for this year's concert was written by Hugh Wilson, of the English Department. The narrative is in two parts, the first focusing on the Rumanian prince as a national hero, and the second depicting the grimmer side of the tale. This year, Dr. Lowell Matson, of the Speech and Theatre Department, will lend his interpretation to the role of Dracula.

Noted performer Rijou will dazzle the audience with an intricate and highly dangerous, Turkish sword dance.

Admission to the performances is free and refreshments (other than those preferred by Vlad) will be provided. More information about this ghoulish delight can be obtained by calling 390-3313.
