

On the day before Christmas there is great excitement in decorating the Christmas Tree, which is only an imitation of the ones used here. But it is decorated in much the same way. During the day everyone secretly wraps gifts for various members of looking hangs them upon the tree. So during the early part of Christmas Eve the family gathers around the tree, squat on the floor, and sings carols until Midnight.
