It's a spirited outlook on things. Everyone involved was tired by the morning but the excitement of the day ahead kept them motivated.

Saturday morning the winds rushed over the grounds while the sun shone

brightly. The turnout was excellent at the field and the piped-in music serenaded the crowds, while students ran about selling programs and cheer pompons. As the parade began, Homecoming Queen, Roz Pabon was chauffeured in on a red convertible escorted by President Frank. The gown she wore, made especially for the event by her mother, Edna Pabon, made her look like a genuine queen. The next vehicle in the procession carried her princesses, Anne Marie Walsh and Margaret Weissler.

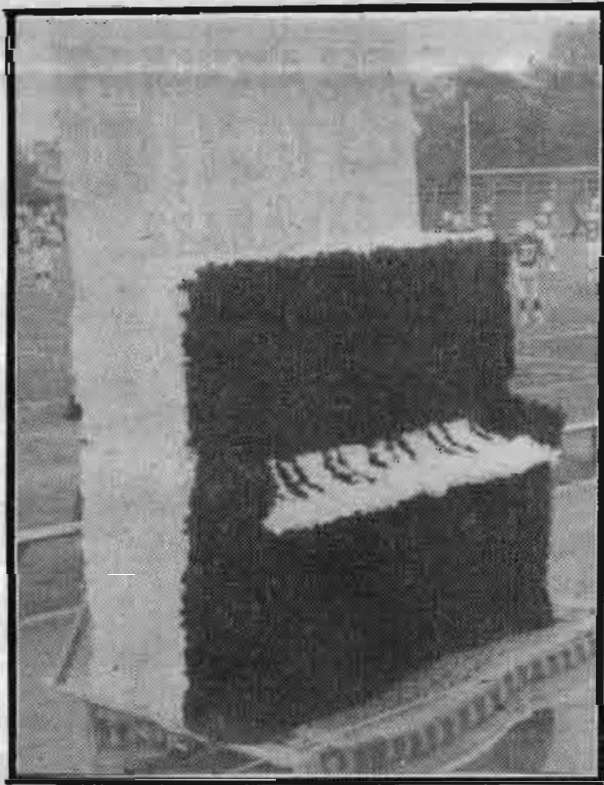


Co-Capt. Bob Mackisy

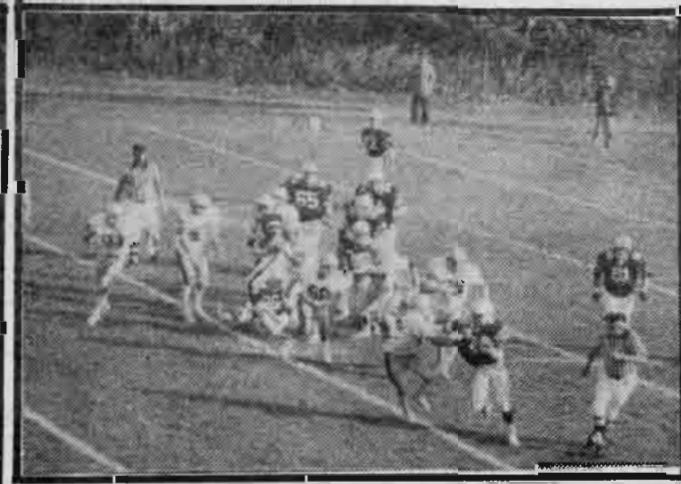
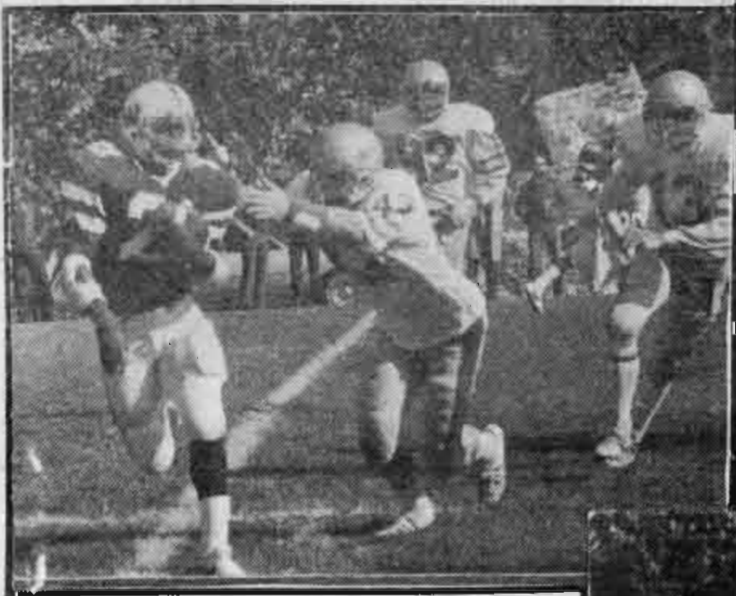

Go-Gos need a Vacation

The Go-Go's, one of the newest all female bands to successfully market themselves in recent years, have a relatively new album on the market. The album "Vacation" is a turn towards their commercial side when compared with their debut album, "Beauty and the Beat." "Vacation" is more sarcastic and sentimental than "Beauty and the Beat," but the peppy melodies still have a good natured fun sound. On "Beauty and the Beat" these girls seemed to be having the time of their lives and this may be what led them on to winning a Grammy award. On "Vacation" they seem to be having fun all the same, but this album shows that they've learned the cost of a good time.

The lyrics are an integral part of this group's statement. The words on "Vacation" are more cynical than most of the groups previous lyrics. The Go-Go's, a five member band, write all of their own words and music. Many of the songs on the band's first album were expressions of simplicity or rudimental ideas, but on "Vacation" the girls go further. They look deeper at themselves and their careers and this deeper search shows in their lyrics. On "Vacation," the song "It's Everything but

Partytime" sums up the general attitude of the entire album. The majority of the songs on "Vacation" show the band's transition from a young unique group to a highly set and patterned commercial group.

"Vacation" is fun and witty at times but it becomes borderline boring and listeners are left waiting for the freshness that once populated their music. Two especially interesting numbers "Cool Jerk" and "Beatnik Beach" almost reach the mark but with hesitation. It's sad that a group as unique and talented as the Go-Go's seem lost in their own ability. The final song on the album, "Worlds Away" expresses the present attitude of the group when it says "thinking with half my mind, found myself wanting to be sleeping, to be dreaming, to be worlds away...." "Vacation" seems to be the product of half of the groups ability and potential. Listeners may have to wait until the groups decides its better to want to be awake instead of sleeping or dreaming before they will hear the freshness and vitality that made the Go-Go's a success.

"Vacation" needs a shot of adrenaline, but even the Go-Go's seem aware of that. What is a vacation anyway? It's a badly needed rest.

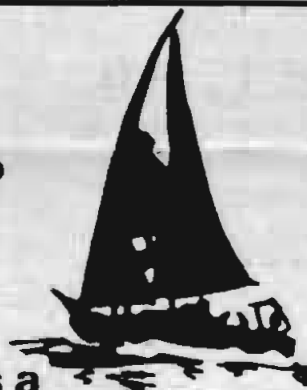

Seahawks Victorious 17 - 0

The Wagner Seahawks continued their winning ways with a 17 to 0 victory over a strong Merchant Marine Academy team on Fischer Field last Saturday before a crowd estimated at 6,000. Their record is now 5-0-1.

The first quarter was spent feeling each other out with no serious scoring threats by either side. In the second quarter the Seahawk offense began to click with passes and was climaxed by Alonzo Patterson taking it in from the 2 yard line. Phil Marak then kicked the extra point. A few minutes later on the kick-off (which was shortened by a 15 yard penalty against the Mariners for roughing the kicker on the extra-point attempt) the Seahawks recovered the ball and turned the error into a Phil Marak field goal. Halftime score was 10-0.

The Seahawks went right to work in the third quarter to score another touchdown and would have had one more except for a costly fumble near the goal

line. A last minute interception by the Mariners also ended a fourth quarter drive. The final score had us in front of them, 17-0, and that's what counts.

Highlights of the game were two pass interceptions by Bob Kitts and one each by Bruce Lange and Bob Mackisey. John VonAhnen made 95 yards as the recipient of 7 of Tim Kelley's 14 complete out of 30 passes. Alonzo Patterson had his seventh 100 yard plus day with 109 yards; he now only needs 44 yards to bring his season total to 1000 and 182 yards to reach the 4000 yard plateau. The James Robb Trophy given by the Alumni Association for the Outstanding Player in the Homecoming Game went to John VonAhnen and the Nick Lia Memorial Trophy for the top defensive player was given to Bob Mackisey.

The remainder of the Seahawk season is played away: Oct. 23 at the Univ. of New Haven; Nov. 6 at Springfield College; and Nov. 13 at Kean College.

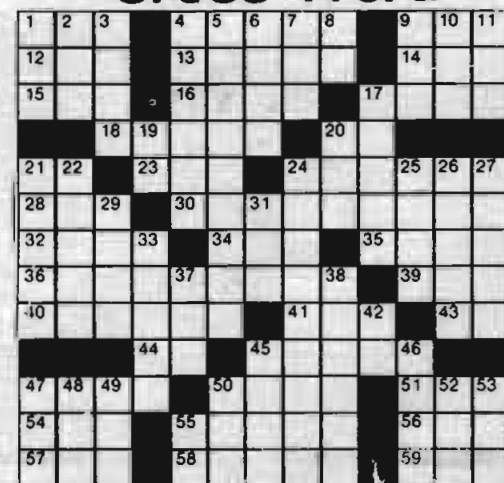
