Library joins OCLC

In August 1982, the Horrmann Library became part of OCLC, a nation-wide computer system used by libraries all over the country. OCLC stands for On-line Computer Library Center, and is a non-profit organization of computer service for libraries, based in Dublin, Ohio.

As its first major step towards library automation, the library is now using OCLC to catalog books and phonograph records. OCLC provides immediate access to over four million bibliographic records and quick access to custom-printed catalog cards. After being in operation in the library's cataloging department for two months, the library staff has found it very efficient and speedy for cataloging materials. While the library has only the

cataloging sub-system of OCLC, it can also be used to identify and locate books in other libraries all over America for interlibrary loan purposes.

The Horrmann Library is also a member of METRO, New York Metropolitan Reference and Research Library Agency, which has a membership of 140 libraries throughout the Metropolitan area. It provides access to over ten million books and other educational materials. As a member, our students and faculty have permission to on-site use of these materials at the different libraries. They are encouraged to make use of this service by obtaining a METRO User's Card which is available through the Reference Department. For further information, please contact the Reference Desk

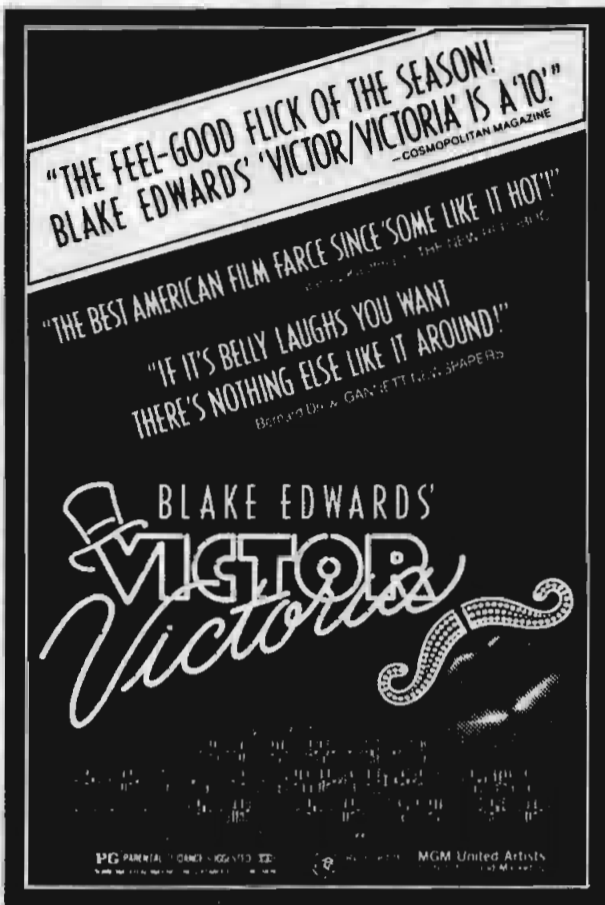

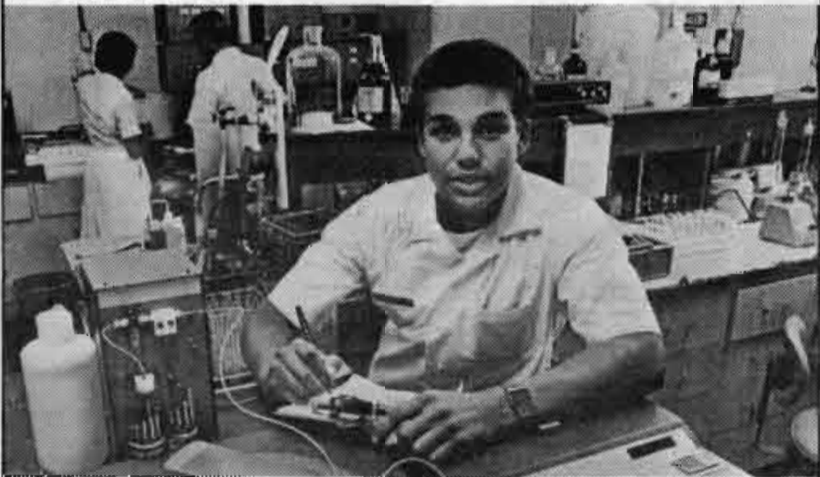

GUITAR & LUTE PERFORM



The Guitar and Lute Ensemble of Wagner College will present another unique program of sounds from the past and present. The concert will be held on Sunday, November 14 at 8:00 pm at the Music Annex building, West Campus, and is free to the public.

The program will commence with two Renaissance lute duets entitled "La Rosignoll" and "DeLa Tromba Pavin." They will be performed by Ralph Azzara (who is presently studying classical music while doubling as lead guitarist for the band Buster) and Ed Brown (director for the Ensemble). In both duets, one can hear the elegant sounds of the lute and the subtle beauty of the music within this rich period.

Two lutes and a treble,

viola da gamba are added to form a quartet for the next piece on the program. Entitled "No More, Good Herdsman, Of Thy Song," this composition will be a "treble" viola da gamba solo (played by Dr. Ronald Cross, chairman of the Wagner Music Dept) Dr. Cross will be accompanied by a lute "consort" (instruments within the same family) The Consort includes Kate Greene (who some may recognize from the musical "Grease"), John Salvaggio, Robert Tucker and Ed Brown. The lute consort will then finish with a piece from Scotland entitled "O Lusty May" which will display some interesting qualities of its own. Both composition were written around the year 1600.

Entering the Baroque segment of the program will be a suite (or grouping of pieces) for guitar and "bass" viola da gamba. The composer is Nathaniel Diesel (d.1744) who although is little known today was one of the most prolific composers of this

median during the period. Diesel was guitarist and lutenist for the Royal Danish Court and teacher of Princess Charlotte Amalie.

"Exquisite Torture" Is Ecstasy

A breath of fresh air has finally arrived to New York City's off Broadway theatres.

Exquisite Torture opened Thursday, October 6, at the Ridiculous Theatrical Company at Sheridan Square is a romantic ecstasy revolving around Count Benito Neroni, excellently played by Charles Ludlam, a true master of comic timing.

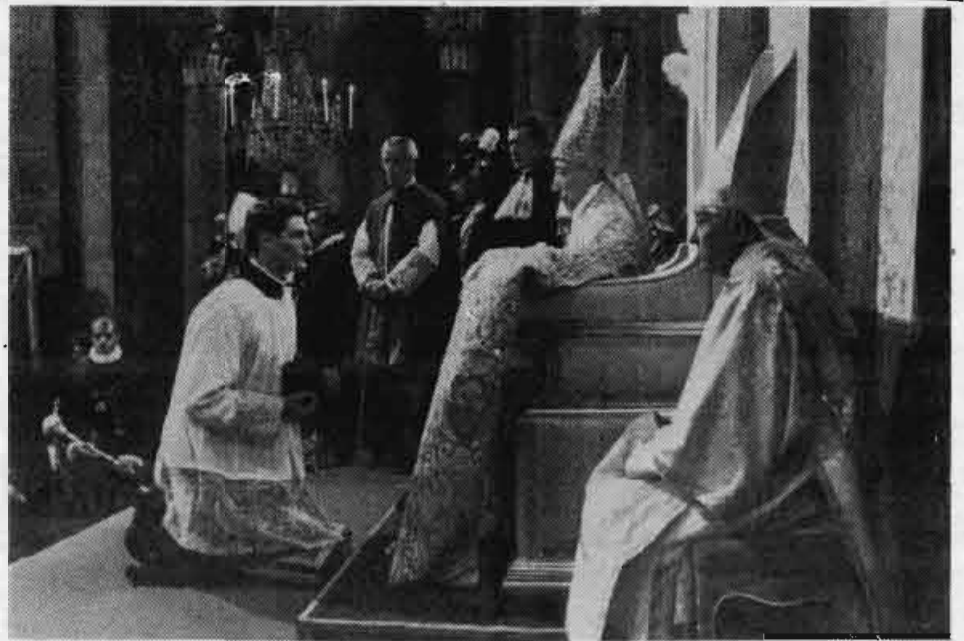
The play, which takes place in Rome, tells of the Counts search for his long lost love, Solange D'Choisy. Solange is miraculously played by a man named Everett Quintan. Quintan is so convincing, that one will tend to forget he's a man. Special commendations to him.

The play draws much humor in its portrayal of stereotypes. Outstanding figures are Eureka who portrayed Toinette, an old Italian woman who fills

perfectly the image that comes to mind. Blackeyed Susan and Deborah Petti playing Barbara and Rhea Bendix, respectively, typical Southern Californians, are superb in their performances and supporting actors, Edward McGown and Steven Samoch deserve much credit for their outstanding abilities.

Exquisite Torture is one of the better plays to hit the stage. The costumes courtesy of Everett Quintan perfectly fit the bill, the sets of Jack Kelly are practical and unobtrusive and I must congratulate once more, Charles Ludlam for not only a great performance but a well written play and phenomenal direction.

Exquisite Torture is bright and witty and so can be the forebear of such a phrase as, "Love is the only fire for which there is no insurance." Congratulations all.



as Father John Flaherty in the 20th Century-Fox's "Monsignor" an epic that spans three decades of political upheaval in the Vatican and the spiritual turmoil for the young priest who will ultimately control the Vatican's financial destiny.

Using his underworld connections to secure sorely needed funds for the fiscally fattening Roman church during the post war years, Flaherty is elevated to Cardinal and named president of the Vatican Bank. Defying tradition and clerical convention in the execution of his duties with only his faith to sustain him he must also attempt to reconcile his priestly vows with his human passions.

Reeve's sums up his character by saying, "Flaherty is seduced by events; the war, the assignment to the Vatican, the opportunity he is given to fix the finances of the church. He is drawn into circumstances rather than acting as a perpetrator. He is not a hustler he is ambitious yet he does not

serve himself."

Shortly after enlisting as an army chaplain, Flaherty violates his vows after giving a dying soldier the last rites, turning the dead man's machine gun against the enemy.

He is uncertain whether his presence in the Vatican immediately there after is a reward or punishment. The answer comes in a meeting with Arch Bishop Walkman (Robert Prosky) a Boston Prelate who advises him of the importance of his business and finance skill in the current power struggle being waged within the Vatican hierarchy.

A reunion with Lodo Varese (Joe Cortese) an old friend, now an army sergeant with a profitable side line in the spoils of war, suggests a answer to the church's cash crisis. Through Varese, Flaherty arranges to sell Vatican commissary supplies to Don Appolini (Jason Miller) an expatriate American mafioso who controls the Roman black market.

The plan requires Flaherty to assume the secular second identity as Lieutenant Finnegan. In that guise, he meets Clara (Genevieve Bujold), a postulant nun whom he finds himself passionately drawn to. He finds it difficult to reconcile his zest for life with the tenets and traditions which have served as absolute codes of behavior for nearly 2000 years.

Eventually Flaherty's political adversaries in the Vatican accuse him and to avert scandal to the

The Wagner College Women's cross country team, owners of an 8-0 regular season record, traveled to Holy Cross College in Massachusetts and continued to demonstrate their outstanding running abilities this past weekend. They competed in the Eastern State Championships and added a remarkable third place finish to their list of accomplishments for this season. Although they finished behind James Madison University (first place) and the University of Massachusetts (second place), the Seahawks defeated such talented teams as the College of William and Mary, Providence College, North Eastern, St. Josephs Univ., and Long Island University.

Freshman Amber Kock, now competing against much tougher competition, persited to display her rankings as one of the top runners in the East. While battling the cold weather, Klock covered the 5000 meter course in a school record time of 18:49 and earned herself a 5th place finish. Freshman Gloria Baily also continued her fine racing spree capturing 12th place in 19:06.

Following Wagner's top

two runners and providing the needed team depth were sophomore Adriane Hogan (23rd in 19:42), greatly improved Teri Naudzunas (31st in 20:07). Rounding out the team effort while strengthening the Lady Seahawk were freshman Lisa Young (32nd in 20:08) and freshman Annie Walsh (42nd in 20:58).

Before running in their first championship meet of the season, the Lady Seahawks along with their coach Jim Grogan, agreed that any team finish between 3rd and 7th place would be a realistic goal for such a young team. Their team determination, hard work and belief in themselves has paid off. The 3rd place finish by the Wagner runners now ranks them amongst the top cross country teams in the east.
