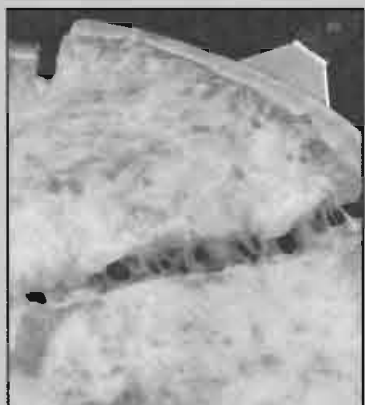

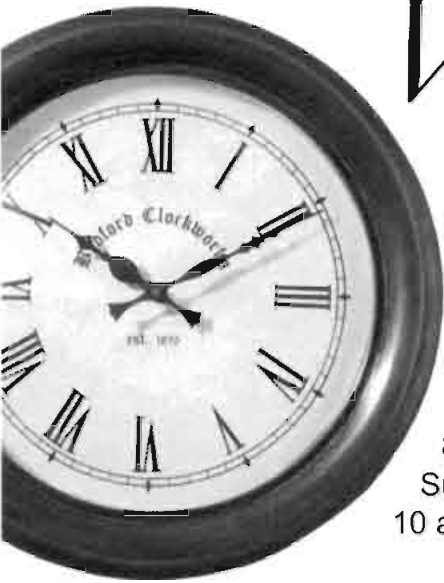

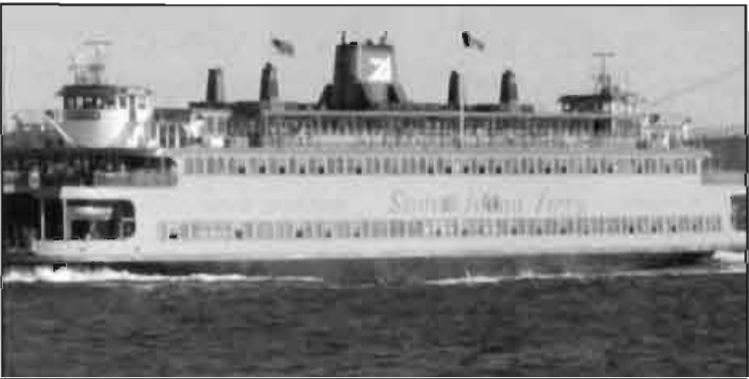

Ferries, trains, buses and cars...

Navigating Staten Island



The Staten Island Ferry

The Staten Island Ferry is a passenger vessel that connects the St. George section of Staten Island to the southern tip of Manhattan, near Battery Park. The ride takes approximately 25 minutes each way.

- Buy your **Metrocard** in the St. George Ferry Terminal. A single subway ride is now **\$2.25**. You can get bonuses for buying bulk rides at one time.
- Parking at the ferry is \$6, **carpool** if you can.
- Snacks and beverages can be purchased on all Ferry rides.
- Hold onto empty Metrocard, you can refill them at the machine.
- Bring **cash**. Many stores in the ferry terminal do not take credit or debit cards. You will be in a rush to make your purchase before the ferry starts to board.
- Bring your own **gum**. Vendors are not allowed to sell chewing gum in the ferry terminals.
- You have 2 hours to make a free transfer between trains and/or buses.
- If you are coming from the city and want to catch the shuttle back to Wagner, catch a ferry leaving on the **half hour** to catch the shuttle leaving on the **10** (ex. 8:30 ferry to catch the 9:10 shuttle).

The Staten Island Ferry Terminal is served by the Staten Island Railway and the S40, S42, S44, S46, S48, S51, S52, S61, S62, S66, S67, S74, S76, S78, S90, S91, S92, S94, S96 and S98 bus routes. Take the Wagner shuttle to the terminal and you can likely find a bus that will take you to where you need to go. A full bus map is available on mta.info

| S78 Hylan Blvd. | Along Hylan Blvd. you will find many of Staten Island's restaurants, and essential stores such as CVS, grocery stores and shopping plazas |
| S79 Verrazano-Narrows Bridge/ Hylan Blvd. | The route begins at 86th St./4 Ave in Brooklyn and follows Hylan Blvd, ending at the Staten Island Mall. If you are coming from the ferry, take the S78 and transfer at a stop along Hylan Blvd. |
| S51 Bay St./ Fr. Capodanno Blvd. | Bay St. is home to many of the Island's hot spots. Take the bus to Fr. Capodanno Blvd. to the South Beach Boardwalk or Midland Beach. |
| S44 Richmond Ave | This bus ends at the Staten Island Mall. |
| S62 Victory Blvd | Along Victory Blvd are more restaurants and bars, as well as grocery and convenience stores. |

Here are the five most accessible subways near the Staten Island Ferry. They were recently ranked by Straphangers Campaign. For the detailed results visit <http://www.straphangers.org/>.

1

Broadway- 7 Avenue Local

Voted the best Subway in New York, the No. 1 train is conveniently located just outside South Ferry terminal. The new station opened last winter, and you no longer have to board in only the first five cars on your return trip. It stops at major transfer points including Times Square.

R

Queens Boulevard / Broadway / 4 Avenue Local

Ranked 15th out of New York's 22 subway lines, the R train is located just across from the Ferry terminal in the same station as the 1. The line has a reputation of being unreliable and scarcely arriving. Good option when the No. 1 train isn't running though.

W

Broadway Local

Also accessible from the 1 and R Station., this was voted the worst subway line in New York. It barely ever comes and doesn't run at night. Unless you are heading to Astoria, Queens, avoid this line.

4

Lexington Avenue Express

Ranked 8 out of the city's 22 lines, the No. 4 train is accessible by walking uptown a few blocks from the ferry station to Bowling Green. Those looking to travel to Yankee Stadium in the Bronx should take this line.

5

Lexington Avenue Express

Tied with the No. 4 train for 8th place, the No. 5 train is also accessible from the Bowling Green station. It is a good option if you are looking to get to Union Square, Grand Central Station or Harlem.

Air travel, airport pickup

From Wagner, you can get to three different airports in a reasonable amount of time. Here are the three options for those without a car:

 Newark International Airport While Newark International Airport is the closest in proximity to Wagner (only a 20 minute drive on the New Jersey Turnpike), the taxi ride is an expensive one. While prices vary for each car service, you can expect to be hit with a bill around \$60... plus tolls.	 John F. Kennedy Airport JFK Airport is New York City's most famous airport. The airport is accessible by subway, however, you'll have to pay an extra \$5 for the AirTrain to reach the airport from the Howard Beach subway station. The station is located on the A line, but make sure the window of the A Train says "Far Rockaway."	 La Guardia Airport LaGuardia airport's reputation may not be as esteemed as it's crosstown adversary, but sometimes plane tickets flying in or out of LaGuardia will be cheaper than tickets for flights through JFK. To reach LaGuardia using mass transit, take a train to a transfer location to board the M60 bus.
