TYLENOL LACED WITH POISON

Seven people have died intake of Extra-Strength Tylenol. The Tylenol contained cyanide, which kills its victims within an hour, if an antidote is not administered.

The makers of Tylenol, an asprin substitute, are Johnson and Johnson. Their headquarters, located in New Brunswick N.J., said they were sure the deaths were caused by a sabotage, and as a result have offered a \$10,000 reward for the arrest and conviction of the poisoner.

As a result of the the selling of deaths, Tylenol has been banned nationwide. The first batch of poisoned capsules bore the serial number MC2880. The majority of the deaths have been in the Chicago area, but fear of the lethal medicine in New York is very visible. Here at Wagner, the bookstore, Wagner, the bookstore, which sells the asprin substitue, pulled the capsules off the shelf on

the first report of the news. In the space behind normally counter the reserved for the drug, a sign reading "MC2880" stands. Obviously, it was understood that explaination was necessary.

Anyone with a bottle those sereal bearing numbers is advised to return it of the place of purchase. The recall initially consisted of only extra strength capsules, but as a result of recent events, all Tylenol products are being banned from sale and recalled. The expiration date on the MC2880 batch is April, 1987.

problem became visible after a 12 year old girl and her too brothers died within 11 hours of each other last Wednesday, as a result of taking -the cyanide laced capsules. Thursday night, poisonings were reported. Up to this point, the deaths were being treated seperatly and as individual Once hanicides.

possible connection between the Tylenol and the deaths arose, the company began to recall all of their capsules, in hope preventing further deaths.

The sabotage is believed to have taken place after the pills left the plant, as cyanide is not used in the manufacture of the medication in any way. This theory is being progressed, although a second batch of poisoned pills was found from the Pennsylvania plant, whereas the first had been manufactured in Texas.

In California, what is being called a "copy-cat" crime put a man in the hospital after the Tylenol he took was laced with strychnine. This cases is the first one of its kind outside of the Chicago area. 

Housekeeping Rectified



Black Concern is a nonorganization profitable that has been in existence at Wagner College for 13 years. Practically everyone has heard of Black Concern, but unfortunately very few people know exactly what the organization is about. Black Concern meet every other Thursday at 10 PM, usually in Gatehouse Lounge. B.C. represents the "minorities" on campus and is there to give the "minorities" the same unified identity that the

students fought for in 1969. In reality, Black Concern is just a group of students who come together to discuss problems, interests, goals, and ways to advance themselves, not only as blacks, but as young men and women who just happen to be black.

Black Concern participates in most of the activites at Wagner, such as Homecoming and CCC. Black Weekend which is held in the Spring Semester, is psonsored by Black Concern itself. B.C. gives several parties throughout the year and is expanding its cultural activities.

Black Concern stresses how important it is for the "minorities" to join this organization. In order to progress, you need sever creative minds working together, rather than a few-

carrying the load and when the work is done, everyone comes to share in the glery. History has proven that unification is the key that will open any door. If you don't like the way things are, or would like for things to be better, join the concerned, join Black Concern.

THE ALARMING FACTS OF HERPES PART 2

Part of the pain for patients is herpes conviction of being damaged goods. George Washington University's Elizabeth Herz guilt "intense reports feelings" among women who get the disease, and hears again and again the feeling that they are unclean, dirty. "We are all looking for someone to love," says woman, a New York freelance artist. "In this world our chances seem so slim anyway. Then you add herpes and you think, 'Why should anyone want me now?'" Α doctor in Amityville, N.Y., says the same glum view has invaded the ranks of teenage herpes sufferers, who come into his office, cry and say, "No one will ever want to marry me."

Susan, a Massachusetts housewi fe and part-time secretary, had herpes for eight six years and was months pregnant when she read in a book that her disease was linked cervical cancer and coulc damage babies during birth. "I wanted to take a knife and cut the skin right off "of me," she says. "I .was just so scared about my baby." A healthy girl was born, and for six months "hysterical" Susan was about protecting youngster, now 3 1/2. "She probably the most paranoid kid on the block," says Susan, because of elaborate warnings and precautions. Susan douses caught herpes from her.

Stan, a married man in his 30s who chases women in Manhattan bars, has his own

patented method of checking for herpes. When chitchat has moved enough along that the woman is peering his way with bedroom eyes, he caresses her right hand, presses his thumb sharply down on her wrist and barks: "You have herpes, don't you?" "If her pulse jumps, she has it," he says. "If she doesn't, she just laughs." Sometimes, of course, a woman is offended his personalized lie-detector test. "I lose a few women that way," he says with a shrug, "but at least I don't have herpes."

With visions of herpes sores clouding each new encounter, would-be lovers who used gaze romantically into each other's eyes now look for the telltale blink adverted glance of dissembling herpetic. One skeptic even called the best friend of a woman he wanted to sleep with and asked if his intended had the disease. In the new etiquette of the ailment, a direct question ("You don't have herpes, do you?") is regarded as tacky. Standard openings have evolved. "You would tell me if you had anything I could catch, wouldn't you?" is admired for its implication of and its we're-in-this-together coziness. "Have you ever had a cold sore?" is a bit chatty and oblique but not confrontational The most straight-forward query for a woman is simply "Do you mind wearing a condom?"

When or whether to tell a date that you have herpes is a thorny matter. The only agreement these days is that you don't do the telling in bed. Says a Seattle secretary: "Never in the bedroom. Many herpes sufferers think that it is not necessary to tell early in a relationship, or one-night stands. The idea is to tell only when the relationship reaches stage in which intimate matters come up naturally. Even than one may rejection. One herpes patient who believes in frankness is Paul Morris, 33, a fan-belt salesman in Houston. He caught herpes in 1976. Dr. A, a general practitioner, said it was syphilis or gonorrhea. Dr. B, a dermatologist, thought it unknown skin was an ailment, and Dr. C, a specialist in infectious could not

identify it, but was positive it was not herpes. Only Dr. D, an old friend, had the wit to take culture that showed the problem was herpes. When Morris informed the woman who gave it to him, she brushed it off with "No big deal." Morris felt betrayed, but so vulnerable that he stayed with the woman, although his infection rendered him inactive during sexually all but three weeks of the next twelve months. When he met his wife-to-be, he immediately told her of his herpes, and after some soul searching she decided that honesty was more important than the disease. She and their baby daughter are free of herpes.

Frequently, herpes seems to strike nice, healthy, clean-cut Caucasians of the middle and upper classes. Indeed, one survey says that 95% of sufferers are white. Skeptics point out that blacks and poor, who are not part of the culture, self-help are unlikely to turn up in herpes surveys, and may have more crushing problems to cope with than venereal disease anyway. "Blacks get just aren't it, they obsessed with it," says Tom Moore, who works in a Mississippi VD clinic. Some researchers suggest that middle-class hygenic habits vulnerability: cause who are kept children squeaky clean do not get as many cold sores as poor younsters and thus are generally missing protect antibodies that them against herpes. One national group that encourage to tries talk about constructive herpes is the Herpes Rescource Center in Palo Alto, Calif., an organization with 30,000 members in 45 chapters known as HELP groups. The chapters function as a large group-therapy

session, letting newcomers talk out theri problems and assuring herpes suffers that they are not alone.

The Herpes Rescource Center tries to foster the notion of normal living. It is a difficult task because everything about herpes is conductive to irrational No fears. form of protection is absolute, and there is no sure way to know who has the disease, even after close a inspection. Says Dr. Philip Lake of Georgetown University: "As many as one out of six of the general population may from time to time be asymptomatic shedders of the herpes virus."

Doctors have little advice about how to avoid herpes. Though nothing is foolproof, it is best for the man to use a condom. A spermacice may also be helpful. In addition, sex partners should be known well enough to be trusted, and it should be borne in mind that oral sex is a contributing factor. Dr. specialist Felman recommends getting a good look at the prospective sex partner with all the lights on. Says he: "If there are any sores or discharge, it's time to put your to put your clothes back on and find another partner." That kind of clinical inspection leave little room for mystery and candlelight.

Two UCLA researchers have reported that herpes virus can live on towels for up to 72 hours and on toilets seats for at least four. In one test, a seat used by a woman with thigh lesions showed live herpes viruses 90 minutes later. But most doctors down-play the UCLA study. Dr. Harold Kessler Rush of Presbyterian-St. Luke's, in herpetics Chicago, says should use their own though the towels, chances of passing on the infectionvia a towel are only about 1%. The virus dies so fast on toilet seats, he says, that the risk of infection from that scource is very slight indeed.

The elusive nature of information about herpes of causes much the

frustration among One sufferers. perplexity is why sometimes lying dormant for months or Atlanta man came out "This thing depression even years. seem to have a mind of its contracted herpes in 1978 and complains about its vexing propensity for popping up at inopportune moments: "It knows exactly when you're going away, or when you're really looking forward to something." Says David Baker, a New York obstertrician: "Stress can reactivate the illness. It may just feed upon itself and create a vicious cycle."

For now, those who have herpes can do little but try to control the negative emotions and stress that often triggers attacks. Many herpes paitents use TM, yoga, biofeedback, hyponosis, talk therapy, or "Imaging," simply attempt to conjure up happy images and serene thoughts. One Boston woman reports sucess by envisioning a golden globe . sending off rays that heal herpes. Another woman says that smiling constantly when she felt a cold sore coming on kept the blisters fron appearing. Says Dr. "The Hamilton: placebo effect is so strong that 60% of patients treated with 'any' technique are going to get better."

This balming of the sore by the psyche may be the best palliative. Once anger and aggression are dealt with, says therapist Riccio, a herpes sufferer can develop the kind of psychological calm that makes recurrences milder and rarer. Most manage that within months, six according Fordham to professor Oscar Gillespie, a co-founder of the New York HELP chapter. "Given information," appropriate says Gillespie, "90% of herpes sufferers will adjust after the initial crisis."

is a useful This reminder: herpes is only as devastating as a paitent allows it to be. It is not life-threatening. After the first bout, pain is usually less severe. Indeed, herpes is so dependent on mood and emotion that once sufferer self-confidence, outbreaks can be tamed and managed. "I see an enormous number of people who really do cope," says Seattle's Dr. Lawrence Corey. "They have to live with having thedisease, but it doesn't consuen then."

For now, herpes cannot be defeated, only Cozened into an uneasy, lifelong truce. It is a melancholy fact that it has rekindled old fears. But perhaps not so unhappily, it may be a prime mover in helping to bring to a close an era of mindless promiscuity. The monogamous now have more reason to remain so. For all the distress it has brought, the troublesome little bug my inadvertently be ushering in a period in which sex is linked more to commitment and trust.

JUDAS PRIEST ROCKS NYC

The lights come on and the opening act is over. This time they didn't get booed off the stage like so many other opening acts have. This is because they were "Iron Maiden", usually a headbanging, head lining Frizsbees, beach balls, and tension soon begin to fill the Garden atmosphere. Many of fans have seen Priest before, but most have not, and have no clue to what they're in for.

"Judas Priest" is a five member band with Bobby Halford on vocals, Glen Tipton and K.K. Downing on guitars, Ian Hill on Bass, and David Holland on drums. Their popularity is just beginning to rise (Their new album is currently number 16 on the Billboard charts) although they've

been around for many years. In 1974 they released "Rocka Rolla" and in early 1976 they put out Wings of Destiny." In early they signed with Columbia contract records and recorded "Sin after Sin." In 1978, with the release of "Stained Class," Judas Priest hit number 1 in the British charts. In 1979 "Hell Bent for Leather" hit the charts in the orients and America. A live album followed, "Unleased in the East," but Priest still got little recognition. Then under new producer, Tan Allen, Priest stepped aside from the hard core violent music instead of songs "Tyrant," "Sinner,"

"Genocide," they released songs like "Living after Midnight," "Hot Rocking," and "Don't Go." to say the least, this dissappointed their hard core following, but popularity began to come.

With their new album,
"Screaming for Vengance,"
Priest satisfies their new
fans, the radio stations,
and their old fans. With
songs like, "You've Got
Another Thing Coming,"
"Blood Stone," "Devils
Child" and "Pain and
Pleasure," their new album
smokes on the turntable
like the old classics.

The lights finally went out and every fan in the Garden rose to let the band know they were very welcome and appriciated. From the very first song, "The Hellion/Electric Eye," it was noticable that Priest had sacrificed volume for intracacy in their music. And, as usual, the stage

wasn't show very complicated. The fast rythms, electrifying leads, and piercing vocals spoke for themselves. There was a platform around the satge which the drums were on, some smoke, lights, the leather clothing, and a Harley Davidson lowrider which Hartford rode in on during the third and final encore.

Most of the concert consisted of new songs, though they did go back to some crowd pleasers like, "Ripper," "Vicitm Changes," and "Green Manilishi." The show ended with band the throwing kisses and bowing to the audience from the platform area in front of the drums and the sell-out crowd "Judas Priest, chanting,


