


FORMAT FOR DISASTER



SUMMER COURSES TO CHALLENGE STUDENTS

March 30--Yesterday the college releaded the 1984 Course Listing. Courses will be much more varied this summer than in the past. Among other revisions, Wagner will now be offering Existential Water-Ballet, Self and Sobriety, Nursing Intervention in Acute Silliness, and Advanced Interplanetary Travel, with corresponding lab to five of Jupiter's moons.

Existential Water-Ballet interdepartmental course offered jointly by the Philosophy and Speech and Theatre Departments. Being the nonconformists that we have always been, we decided to rush North, away from brightly dressed tourists to Greenland, the world's largest island.


We traveled to the big GL via Air Iceland. It only took two days, three if you count the crash.



FROM THE ABSURD TO THE SUBLIME

Friends and fans of Ralph Azzara (lead guitarist for the rock group "Buster" and more recently "Image") will have an opportunity to see and hear another side of this talented performer. Mr. Azzara will perform his senior music recital on Renaissance lute and classical guitar, on Sun-day, April 8, at 7:30 p.m. The concert will be held in the Gatehouse Lounge of Harbor View Hall and will feature music from the 16th through 20th centuries.

The program will get underway with the lute music of Vincenzo Capirola, an Italian nobleman from Brescia. The "Capirola Lute Book", as it is often called, contains not only music of this composer, but also of such notable contemporaries as Obrecht and Fevin. Two selections entitled "Recercar" and "La Vilanella" will be performed.

The recital will continue with music of "Merry England" featuring pieces with such titles as



"The English Huntsuppe" and "Packingtones Pound".

Luis Milan (another nobleman who preferred to be addressed as "El Maestro") will be the featured Spanish composer. Milan did not compose for lute, but rather a similar instrument known as a "vihuela". The vihuela was shaped like

a guitar but tuned like a lute.






