## EDITORIAL

# LOOKING AT THE BOOKSTORE

Students and faculty call it by its name: the Campus bookstore. We could re-name it "The Sportswear Store" or the "Campus Card Shop" since sweatshirts, seasonal sweatsuits and cards occupy two-thirds of the shelf space here. Textbooks, which apparently are the only books offered for sale in the Bookstore, are shelved beyond the students' reach, on the far side of the barricading counter, on the far side of the store. Our Bookstore does not sell magazines or paperbacks for the convenience of students to obtain current, pleasure reading material. Reference books fill a small bookcase in an obscure corner of the store.

The nick-nacks showcased in the front of the store, and candy galore, appear to be the big sellers and this is true according to Jo Manzi, store manager of two years. In the bookstore the bulk of business is done during the first two weeks of the semester, from text and notebook sales. Jo sells art supplies, seasonal sportswear, and the above-mentioned showcased items to show profit from the store during the rest of the semester.

Mrs. Manzi does all the ordering and buying for the bookstore, and was an employee for 12 years before becoming the manager. "Students are interested in these things during the semester," Jo says. Cookies, noteboards, posters, and medicinal items are also popular. Since she has worked

in the store for many years, she feels she knows the tastes and interests of the overall student population, and she is concerned with meeting their needs.

In the past, the bookstore sold best-sellers, magazines, and a large selection of reference books in numerous areas of study. "There is a very simple reason why we don't carry these any longer," Jo stated, "They just don't sell." Just a few years ago the entire back wall was full of paperbacks and popular magazines, but Mrs. Manzi finally had to give the books away to charity because even half-price sales (and even less) didn't sell them on campus. "It's not just the profit we're concerned with here. No one from the administration tells me what to buy, I go by what the bulk of the students want, Mrs. Manzi replied to the idea of risking low profits for the presence of extracurricular reading material on the shelves.

I found it hard to believe that college students are not interested in reading, even if just the best sellers. I am one student who enjoys picking up current popular novels whenever I have the time. One student sarcastically mentioned to me recently, "It's a good thing the bookstore doesn't sell books. I'd spend all my time and money on paperbacks." Clearly this student holds the same feeling as I about the "Campus Card Shop." Determined to prove Mrs. Manzi wrong about her idea of students' lack of interest in reading, I asked

twenty students, as well as a few who work in the bookstore, if they take the time to read outside of their assigned reading. The overall answer was no." Four of them read occasionally, mostly during the summer, seven read the newspaper (four of which read only the sports section). The other nine never read because their assigned reading keeps them too busy. The trend is obvious: students generally are not interested, or have no time to pleasure read.

Some campuses have nation-wide franchise bookstores such as Barnes and Noble, as their campus bookstore, offering novelties as well as current fiction and non-fiction. Mrs. Manzi believes that these stores could only survive on a very large campus, and that this type of college bookstore must also function as the community bookstore, unlike Wagner's. She had me there: the only huge campus bookstores I can think of are at major universities and state colleges.

"I am delighted that I can give you information about why this bookstore is here and how we run it," Jo said, in reference to text sales. "Students are critical without having full knowledge of our operation." Irene Cregin orders texts for the store. Jo speaks for Irene as she explains, "If there was better communication between the teachers and this store, the textbook sales would run smoother. Books would arrive on time for the kids, and the correct editions could be

ordered." She receives incorrect registration data on occasion from the professors. Jo feels obligated to reorder texts when they fall short in number. "We always end up returning plenty of books to the publishers, and we always try to reorder, Jo informed me. In discussing prices, Jo said that "students complain about the high prices of their textbooks, but I've had kids return from Barnes and Noble in Manhattan after buying the same books we sell here for them." She explained the students' report is that the price is considerably higher at Barnes and Noble: at least two or three dollars more, plus the travelling expense.

O.K. Mrs. Manzi, you win. I and other student readers must be denied the pleasure of book browsing in the Bookstore. But she is not the cause of my sadness. The real problem lies in the hands of the majority of my fellow students who are not interested in books. Shouldn't these college years be spent absorbing ideas and experiences of others, so that on a larger level we can apply them to our own experiences in the future? I guess the bottom line is that students assume they absorb enough in the classroom and from daily life to pull them through. I am not suggesting that through Daniel Steel or Sidney Sheldon one gains much wisdom, but there are plenty of current non-fiction books that are entertaining, as well as enlightening.



## Letters

It seems that much has been said by the faculty and the administration about the reasons Wagner College students take drugs. They are pictured as bored, frustrated, rebellious, anxious about their identities, influenced by too much T.V., brainwashed by drug commercials, caught up in thrill seeking and escape. Although these factors undoubtedly contribute to a Wagner College student's decision to take drugs, there is another more important factor that is often overlooked or simply ignored. Wagner College students take drugs because it is fun to take drugs. If drugs weren't fun, They wouldn't use them. This

type of Wagner student would say, "I know all the facts. I know marijuana is fat soluble, and I know it lowers my sex hormones, but it makes you feel good. That's why I smoke it; it makes me feel good."

Pleasure seems to be the primary attraction, but surprisingly enough a number of students seem unwilling to accept this. This unwillingness, or inability, to see the obvious is most often revealed in the anguished question, "Why do Wagner College students need to take drugs?" In my view, marijuana or LSD, on campus, is a compulsive need to be free and independent, but it is abusive and habit causing for them. It is sad that students

who use drugs perceive taking these drugs as a mere enjoyment. The drug user feels no more need to take hallucinogens than another Wagner student feels to drive a brand new sports car.

The drugs that are taken for pleasure are the sensual drugs for what I call them because they alter consciousness. And there are other students who argue that because drug taking is a universal phenomena, stretching back through all of recorded history and touching all cultures, there must be an innate human need to periodically alter consciousness. According to my view, drug use is a substitute drive for a drive of

hunger or sex; and much historical, anthropological, psychological, and even medical evidence can be presented in support of this supposition. But whether a Wagner student accepts this view or not, it seems more helpful to look at drug use the way most drug users look at it, and the vast majority of drug users look to drugs for enjoyment and excitement.

Many Wagner students find this view upsetting. To seek pleasure through drugs seems to go against the American policy of the belief in the work ethic - that a deliberate waste of valuable time and

### THE YEAR IN WAGNER SPORTS

As the 1985-86 year comes to an end, it becomes time to look back on the ups and downs of the past year in Wagner sports.

Fall means football, and this year's Seahawk team surprised many fans. During camp, head coach Walt Hameline wasn't even sure that he could put together an offensive line, but it was the same line that allowed freshman Terry Underwood to rush for over 1200 yards and 15 touchdowns en route to being named ECAC Rookie of the Year. Although the Hawks lost out on a national playoff bid in the season finale, they defeated Kings Point 9-7, to cap a 9-2 season with a ECAC South crown.

Baseball coach Tom Hahne got an opening look at his team during the fall, as the Wagner nine sported a 6-10 record.

While the men did not field a cross-country team this year, the women were impressive via the efforts of seniors Amber Klock, Gloria Bailey and Monica Lucy.

As the fall, thoughts began to turn to basketball. This season, for the first time in years, both the men's and women's teams had winning records.

The story this season for the men was Terrance Bailey. Bailey picked up the scoring slack after Art Redmond went down with a broken leg and led Wagner to a 16-13 record. Bailey led the nation in scoring with a 29.4 pace, and is anticipated to be a potential first round draft pick in the 1987 NBA draft.

For the women, Stephanie Samuels made headlines, leading the Shehawks in scoring and rebounding, while being nominated for All-American. Helping with the

18-10 squad were two other seniors - Lisa Holoman and Gerri McCormick.

The men's wrestling team was undermanned this season, however, the fivesome of Art Bailey, Matt Byrne, Marc Sirockman, Paul Thompson, and Chris Draddy performed well as individual performers.

Spring was slow in reaching Wagner and it showed in the performance of several teams. The baseball team lost its first three, won one, then proceeded to lose 13 straight en route to a 3-27 season.

Two bright spots came from Todd Rutman (.333 batting average) and Rich Melito (2.29 ERA).

energy is spent in the pursuit of pleasure is wrong and very liberal - in destroying the temple of the soul, the body. Nevertheless, to deny that drug users are having fun is to forfeit any chance of understanding a student who uses drugs. If you know a student or friend is using drugs, you must recognize that drug's first appeal is to a sense of fun. Of course, there are other reasons besides pleasure-seeking underlying a student's habitual drug use, but it is the producing aspects of drugs that make their attraction so powerful.

Perhaps, a word of reassurance would be that you can help your friend or

student cope with the seductive, pleasure-producing element of drug use. You can help your friend or student see that he or she can no longer survive in the world if he or she allows the pursuit of pleasurable gratification to render them vulnerable. You can tell your friend or student what you have learned: that life has its highs and lows; that struggle and loss are always there; that everything has a price. You must help he or she learn how to acquire the mental skills and emotional balance that will allow he or she not only to survive but to find and enjoy the best in life - without drugs.

Having fun is one of the

blessings a college student could have and professors and teachers can help by getting involved in campus activities, as well as being a student's source of knowledge. This would make a professor or teacher know when a student is in trouble with drugs and not ignore it. For this problem will not go away, it just seems to get worse at Wagner. Perhaps, the faculty and administration well know that some kinds of fun are too dangerous for the college student. And drug taking is one kind of fun that can have grave consequences to the Wagner student. If a friend or faculty member is concerned, thus, the action is to help the

student develop responsible attitudes toward drugs and fun. They must ask themselves if they truly care why students take drugs. The faculty and concerned students need to understand why. Even if there are many good ways to have fun on campus, there will still be many Wagner students who will choose drugs as their fun. Let's try and help some of the students who don't make it and who do not grow out of it. I know that we cannot save the world.
