## Dr. Love is Appointed the New Dean of the College

It has been announced that Dr. Anne Love has assumed the role of Dean of the College. Dr. Love is currently serving as the Dean of Advising and Assessment. This new appointment came about partly due to the sabbatical of Deidre Shaffer, Dean of Students.

According to Dr. Love, the goal of this new position is to, "work with student affairs units, to create more collaboration between departments and to bring academic and student affairs into alignment."

She also explained that the college wants to be supporting the overall development of students. The idea is to have all departments more connected so that they promote intellectual, social and emotional development.

Dr. Love gave an example of how this could be achieved. A committee of students and faculty could choose a speaker to come to campus. Prior to the speaker's arrival, a hook they have written could be suggested to the students. Once the speaker has given his or her presentation, faculty members could ask students to reflect on the speaker during classes.

"Having programs like this would create more synergy between parts of the college," according to Dr. Love.

This position of Dean of the College should promote better communication between all departments, students and faculty.

Dr. Love will be taking over some of Dean Shaffer's duties in her absence, but most will fall to Mark Collins, Associate Dean for Campus Life. If a student was to get into trouble, Dean Collins would handle the initial disciplinary action and Dr. Love would handle any appeals the student may have.

"We are not dismantling the old, but moving it around and adding a little bit extra to make it better," said Dr. Love regarding the creation of this new position.

The Dean of the College is going to be a permanent

position, but it will not be replacing the Dean of Students.

Dr. Love lives in New Jersey and has a 45 minute to 50 minute commute to Wagner every day. She lives with her husband, a faculty member at NYU, and her two sons, ages four and six.

She received an undergraduate degree in psychology from St. Lawrence University in Canton, N.Y. She then went on to get a master's degree in counselor education from Penn State. Her doctorate is in higher education administration from Syracuse University, where she served as a Resident Hall Director for two years.

"There are lots of new opportunities, and new ways for students to get involved and shape how this new position evolves," Dr. Love added.

With the growing population of Wagner College and an increasing pool of prospective students visiting each year, the two Admissions buildings were becoming inadequate.

To solve this problem, a new addition currently under construction will serve as a connector between the two current buildings as well as provide a new reception area and two additional interview rooms.

According to Admissions Administrative Assistant Rosemary Anastasio, there were not enough rooms to accommodate the demand for appointments.

Currently rooms in Reynolds House and the Conference Center in Career Development are being used as overflow interview rooms.

The Admissions process and day-to-day business are not being affected by this construction.

The project began in May and is expected to be completed by the end of this month, relieving the Admissions space crunch.

# The Full Monty

*Six actors dare to bare it all in this Broadway smash hit!*

Eight times every week, a group of six men would dare to bare all in front of thousands of strangers. Lines form down the block and around the corner to get into the Prince of Wales Theater. The crowd is certainly a diverse one, college students, mother-daughter teams, families, and a fairly large number of senior citizens. No, this is not a strip club. This is *The Full Monty*.

Through some very well-written music and extraordinarily clever lyrics, we are told a story of six "average guys" with very different lives, but one thing in common - unemployment.

The obvious leader of the pack, Jerry Lukowski (Will Chase) enlists a group of men including an uptight ex-supervisor (Steven Skybell), an elderly man with a bad hip, (Larry Marshall), a suicidal homebody (Jason Opsahl), a cute and quirky former coworker (Chris Diamantopolous), and his overweight best friend Dave (Daniel Stewart Sherman), to put on a strip show as a quick way of making money.

Although it may not seem so at times, *The Full Monty* is a heartwarming show full of emotional subplots. Alongside the main issue in the show - the six men overcoming not only their unemployment, but self esteem issues by putting on this strip show, we see the married couples trying to overcome their own problems.

Dave's wife, Georgie (Annie Golden), is feeling neglected, when her own husband won't go near her. The twist here is that the reason Dave avoids being intimate with Georgie is because he suffers from his own self-esteem issues, as a result of unemployment. We are also introduced to Vicki Nichols (Andrea Burns), wife of "uptight ex-supervisor", Harold Nichols. Vicki certainly seems more like she belongs on Park Avenue, rather than in Buffalo where the story is set. Out of a job and unable to support his wife's expensive ways, Harold masks his unemployment and keeps showering her with the lush gifts she's used to receiving, from Prada outfits to Puerto Rican getaways.

Will Chase provides a charming yet silly Jerry, making his role that much more poignant. Chris Diamantopolous absolutely nails the adorable, however extremely flighty role of Ethan Girard. If nothing else, his charm is what sets him apart from the rest of the group. Larry Marshall is hysterical as Noah "Horse" T. Simmons getting all the big laughs, even if his role is not as touching as others. Steven Skybell as Harold Nichols, is superb to the point where it's difficult to imagine another actor in the role. Jason Opsahl provides for a touching, if not entirely convincing Malcolm McGregor, the suicidal night security guard who is rescued from himself by Dave and Jerry. Daniel Stewart Sherman's Dave is both touching and funny, and has one of the best moments in the show as he tells his best friend Jerry to lay off the fat jokes, which usually results with a wildly cheering audience. Sherman really makes the underdog in all of us want to come out and cheer.

Overall the show has held up very well, making it a huge hit with audiences and critics alike. Those who were lucky enough to see *The Full Monty* live should consider themselves fortunate. Those who did not see it for themselves can take my word when I say that it was nothing if not the perfect piece for an audience to identify with, no matter what your situation.

*The Full Monty* played its final performance on Saturday, September 1, to a sold-out house.

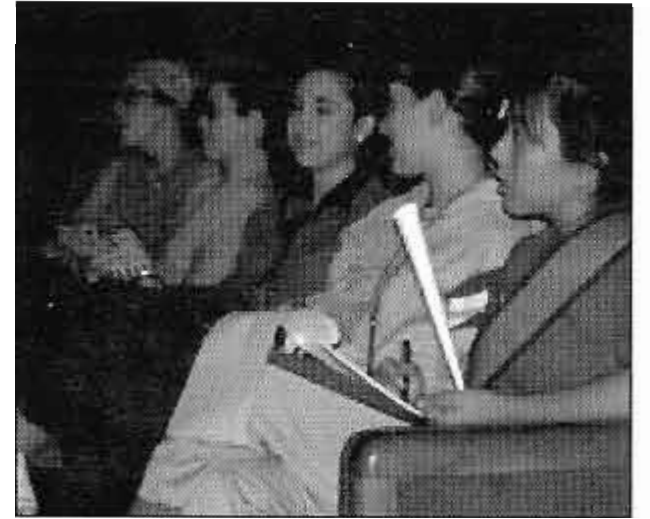

Everyone has complained about it at one time or another, but how many of us have actually gone to one of those food board meetings? I haven't, but there is always that urge that makes me want to talk to the board.

An issue I'd like to address first is the stupidity of serving the exact same food in 10 different places on the schmorgasboard when they could just add more variety. Or perhaps to ask about that disgusting condiment that is supposed to be "BBQ sauce". And to of course to request Bananas Foster a few more nights a month. Man is that good! (For you freshmen, Bananas Foster is bananas in some kind of wine, poured over Vanilla ice cream, this year having pineapple, and cinnamon added to the mix).

Luckily for us, the Wagner Food Board took matters into it's own hands this summer. Although so far this year I haven't seen very much change in the dining hall food, we are promised better meals, and more variety. One of the major changes we've seen is the switch from a Pepsi-Cola school to Coca-Cola (HOORAY!!)

Another major change is in the improved Hawk's Nest. First you may notice a sushi bar. Although I haven't had the pleasure of tasting any of the "fresh" packaged sushi, I have been told by many students that it is delicious.

My favorite change however is the addition of Sandella's!

When I first arrived back at the Wag, and was told of our new improvement to the Hawk's Nest called Sandella's, I immediately gasped and screamed with excitement. After the initial shock and amazement at this wonderful addition I began to think that it couldn't be as good as what I have come to know and love.

However after careful observation, and hours of experimenting with this phenomenon, I have come to the conclusion that these new flatbread pizzas and wraps are scrumdiddiumptious! They are almost every bit as good as the original, and come in the same quantity, and quality as the original.

The wraps include a Chucken Caesar, Chicken Tender with spicy sweet mustard sauce, and my personal favorite Chicken Verona. The flatbread pizzas include the plain Cheese Pizza, the Chicken Parmesan Pizza, and the always wonderful Barbecue Chicken Pizza. Sandella's Pizzas and wraps are now also available as a meal transfer at lunch on it's own, or at dinner with certain drinks. Although the first couple of days there were a few problems in the staff's preparation of the new food, they have caught on and are now creating works of art!

Back in my hometown of Patchogue, on Long Island, my friends and I have become very well acquainted with the deliciousness of Sandella's flatbread pizzas and wraps, and I can honestly say this addition to the Hawk's Nest is a very promising change from last year's policy of serving basically the same food as was being served downstairs.

Other changes in the Hawk's Nest food include 8 oz. burgers instead of the normal 4, and the ability to exchange meals on the weekend.

Although there is always room for improvement in any area, I am quite content, as are most, with the food in the Hawk's Nest. As for the dining hall, as I said we have been promised improvements, and hopefully we will see these changes within the next few weeks.

**ARTO LINDSAY  
INVOKE (Righteous Babe)**

Arto Lindsay's latest release portrays the confidence of a man with over 25 years of musical know-how and experimentation to draw upon. Topped with a rich influence that is deeply rooted in Brazilian rhythms and an Eno-esque feel (from when Lindsay worked with the artist in the late 1970's), Invoke is an amazing success that is truly reminiscent of Lindsay's characteristic style. Similar to his 1999 release Prize, the tracks on Invoke are chock full of rich bossa nova and tropical beats combined with Lindsay's refreshingly tranquil and gentle voice. As an added bonus, that voice expresses itself in English and Portuguese throughout the album.

With a flair for diversification, Lindsay spices up his work with a hip-hop element on "Predigo" (a la Portuguese) while constructing a montage of chilling and hypnotic sounds on "In The City That Reads", with the help of Avey Tare and Panda Bear. Turning in the other direction, "Delegada" and "Beija-me" bring forth the image of Astrud Gilberto and Stan Getz together at the Café Au Go Go, creating a breathtaking combination of bossa nova and jazz with a slight popish edge. With a touch of violin arrangement rounding out the album, Invoke has a little bit of everything for the esteemed listener who gives Lindsay's style a listen.

**DIVISION OF LAURA LEE  
BLACK CITY (Burning Heart-Epiphany)**

Secret meetings are being held behind closed doors in Sweden. One by one, a new band is being let loose like an opiate to the masses. Newcomers like The Hives and Sahara Hot Nights have joined forces with the well-versed likes of Soundurack Of Our Lives and The Helicopters to prepare for the Swedish Invasion. Fueling the craze, Division Of Laura Lee has joined the ranks with their debut album Black City. Tracks like "We've Been Planning This For Years" and "Second Rule Is" evoke a spirited hardcore influence while the album's opener, "Need To Get Some", sounds more like an angst-ridden Strokes.

Amidst all the apprehension, Division Of Laura Lee softens their texture with the dreamy "I Walk On Broken Glass" and the spacey guitar composition behind "Trapped In". Topping off the debut is the most illustri-

**MORCHEEBA  
Charango (Reprise)**

Gone are the days when psychedelic music represented tacky clothing, acid peaks, and free love. The modern age has allowed this genre to expand its boundaries to such an extent that the possibilities are endless.

Morcheeba, with a fourth release now under their belt, approached this album with a flair for creativity and a determination to produce some beautifully compelling tracks.

Charango, with its trip-hop feel, hip-hop beats, and the intoxicatingly mellow vocals of Skye, succeeds in alluring the listener into a world where Morcheeba is the soundtrack to your life.

Don't be afraid, they've invited Pacey from the Outsidaz and Slick Rick along for the journey. The gentleness of string composition is dominant in "Otherwise", "Aqualung", and "Get Along", though all the tracks sneak in a collection of sounds ranging from the bongos, violin, and charango (a guitar made from an armadillo shell) to the subtle scratch from the turntables. So turn on, tune in, and chill out with some more cheeba.

**SHARON JONES AND THE DAP KINGS  
Dap-Dippin' With Sharon Jones And The Dap-Kings (Daptone Records)**

The other day I heard a nine-minute live version of "Sex Machine," courtesy of James Brown and his sensational JBs, and I thought I had experienced the funkiest nine minutes of my life.

After hearing Dap-Dippin' With Sharon Jones And The Dap-Kings, listeners will be barreled over by 30 minutes of bona fide, soul-shaking funk that stands worthy next to that sacred "Sex Machine."

For its debut full-length release, Daptone Records recruited Sharon Jones to provide vocals for its funk-tacular new house band, the Dap-Kings.

The result is an album of authentic soul and funk, a sound many contemporary bands fail to achieve. Fueled by a strong, rhythmic horn section, Sharon Jones pours her heart into every song and lets the band provide the outrageously groovy beats.

Such tracks as "Got To Be The Way It Is," "Cut The Line," and "Give Me A Chance" scream to be played live to a funk-ed-up audience of dancers, while "Make It Good To Me" slows things down and provides a little soul for the listener.

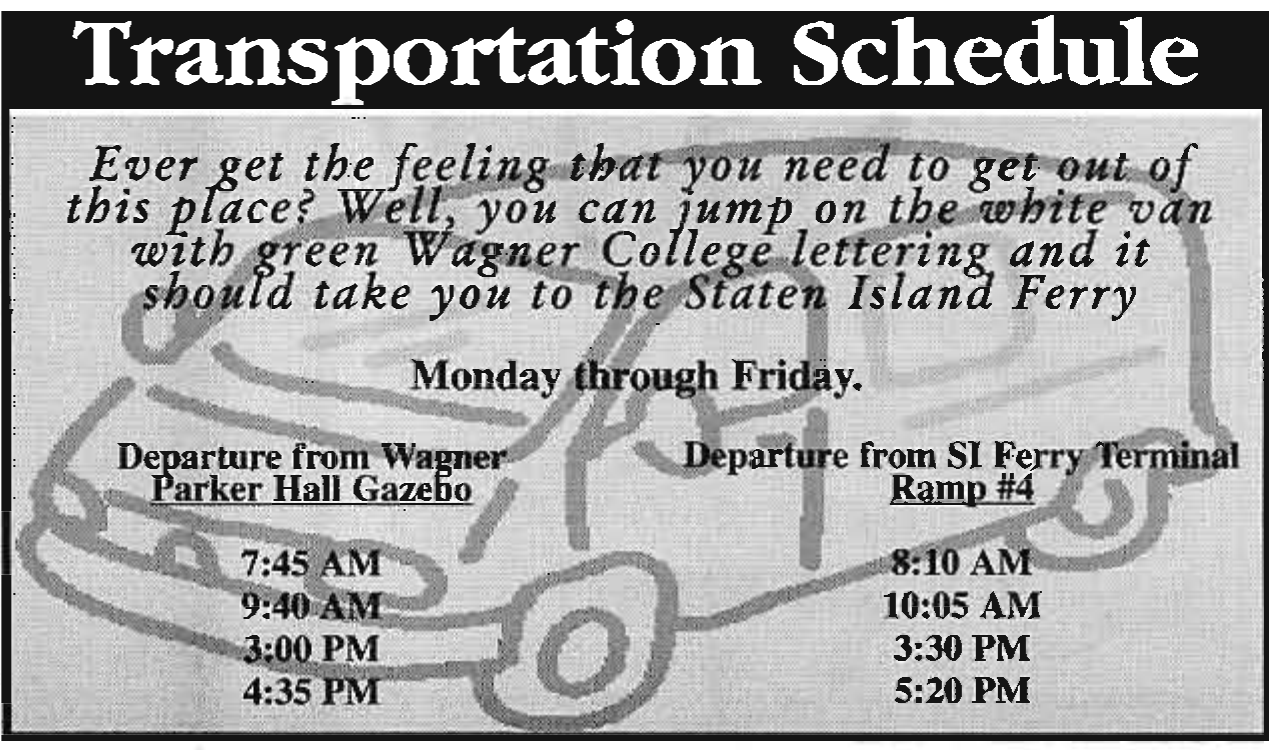

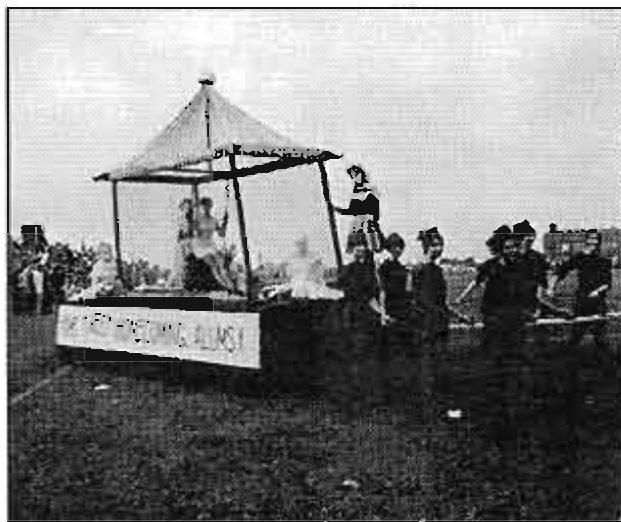

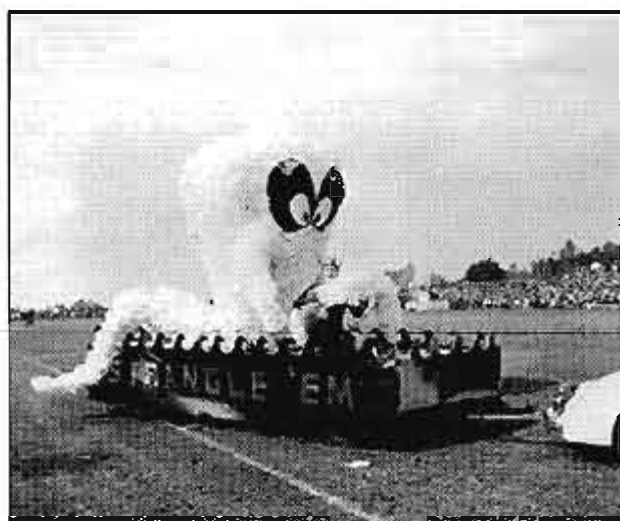
