This Indenture made and entered into this first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seven years between George fallaway and Mary Eliza his wife of the County of Campbell of the one part and Colvin Buckner of the County of Lynchburg of the other part witnesseth that the said George fallaway and Mary Eliza his wife for and in consideration of the sum of nine thousand seven hundred and eighty two dollars to them in hand paid by the said Colvin Buckner the receipt is hereby acknowledged have bargained, sold, granted, confirmed unto the said Colvin Buckner his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Campbell, containing by survey made in the presence of the parties, which survey is to conclude them one hundred and fifty eight and a quarter acres be the same more or less adjoining the lands of Benjamin Ephraim's range of trees and others and bounded as follows (beginning) at a stake on the river pond below (Bill's old house) running thence through the field North twenty nine East one hundred and sixty two poles to a stake near the gate thence North forty six and a half West twenty nine poles to point no at labels corner, thence North thirty three West ninety two poles to a red oak at Ephraim's corner thence South thirty four West sixty poles to a white oak stump at Ephraim's corner, thence South five and a half West twenty two poles to a double dogwood at Ephraim's corner, thence South forty three West seventy six poles to a red oak at Ephraim's corner, thence South thirty two East fourteen poles to the fork of the branch thence down the said branch as it meanders twenty poles to the mouth of the branch, thence down the river pond as it meanders one hundred and two poles to the beginning. To have hold, possess and enjoy the said lands in fee simple with all its appurtenances to him the said Colvin Buckner his heirs and assigns and the said George fallaway and Mary Eliza his wife for them selves their heirs and assigns will forever warrant and defend unto the said Colvin Buckner his heirs and assigns a good and lawful, right and title to the before granted land, as against the claim or claim
