

Although this part is not strictly proven genealogy, I want to include it here, so I can keep it and remember all the times and fun we had while working on it.

We spent many hours and weekends travelling through Nelson County, looking for anybody who could help us sort out this puzzling mess.

We met a good friend, Zeb Ragland, after we went to see Ray Proffitt. Ray wouldn't or couldn't help us, but did say that Zeb Ragland had visited him asking about Proffitts, also.

I came home and found Zeb in the phone book,

called him, and we got together.

We visited the Pontons and got some information Then we travelled all over Nelson County, on Willie. asking questions, sometimes getting answers and sometimes nothing.

Some people didn't want to see us, and may have been involved in some of what went on, or were kin to some others who were a part of it.

Anyway, we had a great time digging up this information, although we didn't know much about formal genealogy, or how to go about it. sort of played detective and had a lot of fun. Later, we looked in courthouse records, libraries, etc., and went to Richmond to look at records there. It's been fun, but very time=consuming, and sometimes frustrating.

Ivy found out where Robert was sometimes in the 60s and came to visit us on Wright Shop Road when Mrs. Proffitt was staying with us for the weekend. We got to know Ivy quite well, and I will record She is still what she has told us a little later. living in 1998 and is now 87 years, still lives by herself in Deltaville, and we visit her sometimes.

We got Hart's phone from Zeb Ragland and I called him. He invited us up to see him in Alexandria, we went but he left before we got there. Guess he didn't want to see us or talk about the past.

I called him again later, and he talked at lot. Here is some of what he told us he remembered:

July 3, 1983:

Hart remembered Richard & Willie Anna, said Richard was part Indian. He lived with Richard and Willie Anna, along with Rose and Lillian when he was a

little boy. He said Richard had an old trunk with a lot of Confederate money in it, and they liked to play with things in his trunk. Richard is buried at the old Loving place near Phenix/
Ann went to live with Charlie, and is buried at Roseland. (We found out she was buried in Jonesboro Church cemetery.)

He remembered these children of Richard & Willie Anna Proffitt: 4 girls & 2 boys, and said there may have been one more. He remembered Rose (his mother), Ann, Lillian, Lewis, Samuel, Belle who married a Martin.

Samuel was in WWI, finished training and had the flu while at home on furlough, and died.

Jeff Fitzgerald died a natural death when he was very old, and is buried on the place where he lived.

His children were Tom, Clarence, and Maggie. Walter & Eddie Fitzgerald, who live at Tye River, and Willard are Jeff's brother Walter's sons.

Ruth's and Flo's father was a Golladay.

Robert's and George's father was Jeff Fitzgerald.

He remembered when Ivy & Belle (Mattie?) were carried away , said they went to Richmond and were adopted.

Bobby's father was Sambo Martin, and Bobby lived with the Taylor's. (He now goes by the name Bobby Diehr.)

Hart's wife's sister Mabel Clements had 5 or 6 boys who live in Lynchburg and Alexandria, and a girl in Fairfax:

Billy, Clay, Wayne , and Riley were some of their names and their father was Henry Clements.

Hart's son married Mary Hudson from Tye River, and had two children, a boy and a girl. The boy was killed. Ruth was Lillian's oldest child and came to

Once in a while, something really neat happens while we are hunting for genealogical information. This is one of the miracles which happened.

Soon after I got the computer, I went on the Proffit GenForum and found a query from Phillip Clark, who was looking for the family of his birth mother, Mattie Clark.

After much e-mailing back and forth, mostly between Phillip's wife, Maxine, and me, we finally decided that we did have a match, and that Mattie was really Ivy's long-lost sister (or half sister).

Ivy said many times that her greatest wish was to find her baby sister before she died, and I'm glad I was able to help make this wish come true.

Ivy's foster niece, Patsy Mundy, took Ivy to Tioga, PA, shortly after Christmas 1999, and the two sisters had a joyful reunion.

Enclosed is a news clipping which Ivy gave me about their meeting. The article is incorrect, since it states that Pat Mundy was searching the Internet for her aunt's relatives and came across Mattie Clark's name. Not so! I found Mattie, after seeing Phillip's query on GenForum.

Oh, well, the important thing is that Ivy's greatest wish has been fulfilled.

June 2, 1883 Dear anne, Flank you for writing and for the information. I checked through my records and couldn't find anything that would kelp your kusband trace his line. You might Execk in amkerst, that's where I found the David Proffit of my line (1750's). Then back track to Godchland Co. and the archives in Richmond. I traced my line back to its beginning in Loock. It's my belief that all Proffetts in Va, are probably related (originally Prophet). When you've in the library, look for the book The Douglas Register. There are Proffits in it. a woman in Carlysville Contacted me and said she had a book Proffit Family Heritage. I'm going to go look at the book and see if it would lelp us.

I'll add the information about your husband to what I have. Maybe someone in the future can use it,

First to answer your question about why Robert & George have the "Proffitt" name. The person I got my info from, had marriage status as "unknown". We never knew whether or not Lilian and Henry married before or after the boys were born. Would like some insight into that as well. I have not actually gotten any of this familys data from anyone in the direct line. Would love to get all you have on the complete line.

I am not on the internet. I have used it, but not ventured out into setting myself up. Some of the Winch database has some incorrect data on my family. I guess it's a good starting place. I am only spending the \$\$\$ to try and verify my direct line. I have been working on this since 1980 (off & on also) and have already spent hundreds of dollars in birth, marriage, death certs, as well as military records, not to mention postage. The main reason I'm not on the internet yet is because I hate putting out incorrect data. It does happen tho, and is very hard to control. I have found some people just get the info and pass it on, (Myself included if it's not in my direct line) which is how so many errors get out. I guess we all just want to help. I feel it's up to each of us to verify our own direct line and do the best we can. I do have a lot of backup on other lines tho, in relation to census records. (That is free, it just takes a lot of time.) Unfortunately, census takers mispelled, and I have even found a lot of date errors. I don't know if the person giving the data didn't understand, didn't want to be found in later years, or just what. It's so frustrating to us geneologists.

My computer program (Family Tree Maker by Broderbund) allows me to send anyone an outline which will include birth, marriage & death dates & locations (providing I have them). My file is so large, that even with a gedcom, I cannot include notes. Very unfortunate, since my notes tell what backup I have.

Robert lived with Mrs. James Clements, Clint's grandmother. She lived to be 99, and lived near where the Norths live until the house burned down. Robert lived here after leaving Kenneth Lockard until he married Catherine.

Feb. 14, 1981, Mrs. McKenzie, Tye River
Frank McKenzie is her son. She knew
Ivy. Her son Ray worked with Ed,
Ivy's husband. He was the one who
put Ivy in touch with Robert & George.
She couldn't, or wouldn't, tell us
any more.

Jan. 31, 1982: Linwood Jordan called.

He works with Bobby Diehr. Bobby
Diehr is willing to talk to us.

He thinks his mother's name was
Taylor and he has a half=sister,
but doesn't know where she is.

Bobby Diehr works at Frank Yeatts Silk Mill in Charlottesville.

Bobby Diehr Southwood Trailer Court Charlottesville, VA Phone 296-9248 We went to see Bobby Diehr on Feb. 8,1981. This is what he told us:

He lived with his mother at Arrington with a Mrs. Taylor. Then they moved to Schuyler and she married Mr. Diehr when he was five years old. He was 57 when we saw him, He married in 1954, has 6 children and 3 grandchildren. He was never adopted by Mr. Diehr. He was 12 when Diehr died.

He had pictures of his grandchildren on the wall and one looked a lot like our Karen.

His wife gave us a copy of Lillian's obituary.

His wife's name is Nancy.
He remembers being at the Taylor's at
Arrington and came to Schuyler when he was
five years old. He went to school with Zeb
Ragland's brother and has a sister, Imogene,
who married Willard Hall.

He said the Bible with his birth record belonged to Flo and Frank Sarnitz and burned in a house fire.

He wrote for a birth certificate but did not receive one back.

Diehr died when he was 12. He went back to the Taylors until he was 14 years old. Then he went back to His mother, Lillian, at Schuyler. Later he was in the army. Then his mother, Lillian, stayed with him in Charlottesville until she died. He showed us a picture of Lillian when she was older and said she didn't talk much about the past.

Sept. 29,1984: We met Lottie and her husband Edwin Gunter at Zeb Ragland's. She looks like the Proffitts, but didn't remember much. Said she hadn't seen Charlie for years. She did remember that Ann and Rose lived in Richard Proffitt's old homeplace and Lillian lived at the Fitzgerald's. She remembered when Lillian's children were taken away.

Ray Proffitt, Arrington, Jan., 1981:

Said old Proffitt family cemetery is back in the mountains. Graves Back to 1732, latest in 1953. Went to Rose's funeral-no marker- in old cemetery. Said to contact Hart Proffitt. He was very friendly with Hart's sons. Also said to see Charlie Proffitt. Said Lillian was much younger than Ann, Rose, and Lewis. Said Maggie Fitzgerald was married, divorced, and took back her maiden name.

He also told us to see Zeb Ragland and we did.

We called at Charlie Proffitt's house, but his wife wouldn't let us speak to him. Said she was from North Carolina and that they didn't know anything about the Proffitts.

Ed Proffitt, 1-25-1981: Said John Proffitt was a brother of Sadie P. Drumheller, Al Drumheller's wife.

Eugene Proffitt lived in North Carolina.
A Proffitt woman and two children drowned in the 1920 flood.
Ed knew Richard Proffitt. He knew Robert only after he went to live with Kenneth Lockard.
George went to Tandy Jones. Elsie Jones married Hugh Turner and they took George with

He also knew Lewis and said Lewis was a small man.

Flossie Wood (contid.)

She said Mrs. Temple Wood had Ruth living and that Ruth was her husband's relative. Mrs. Temp Wood had two sons, one living at Norwood and one in Richmond. Said she had been away from Phenix for forty years.

Feb. 15, 1981: Mrs. W. L. Coates:

She was the daughter of Flossie Wood, and lived at Phenix until she was 13 years old. The mill closed the year she was born. Her mother lived there until 1931 and was a sister to Herbert Wood. Mr. Coates said the old Proffitt homeplace was near where Phenix school. It was near a creek, 3/4 mile off the road. It was a big two-story house and only the foundation is standing.

Feb. 14, 1981, Mrs. Flossie Wood:

She knew Lewis Proffitt, Rose and Lillian

Jan. 20,1981 Elwood Proffitt, son of Lewis Proffitt:

Remembered his grandfather, Richard Proffitt Remembered Lillian and thinks she married twice. Not clear on the past, didn't know Robert Proffi

Remembered Kenneth Lockard. He had a brother called Sweedy Lockard.

Was raised in Phenix. His father lived into his 80s.

Has been married twice. Has a half-brother, Willie Ponton.

Information from Lawrence Mays:

Told us to see Jeff Fitzgerald, son of Maggie Fitzgerald. Maggie lives near where Robert & George were born. Lillian Proffitt was Jeff Fitzgerald's housekeeper.

Information from Woodrow Lyons:

A blind man, married to Carrie Lee Jones. He said we should see Joe Jones, Carrie Lee's father, who was a friend and drinking buddy of Jeff Fitzgerald. Joe Jones lives at Dorothy Miller's house. She is his daughter=in-law. I worked with Dorothy Miller at Duti-Duds.

He also said:

Jeff Fitzgerald married Annette Martin. She ran around with a foreignor that Jeff threatened to shoot. Jeff sold Annette to the man for \$50.00. Lillian Proffitt was a housekeeper for Jeff, had children by him.:

Ivy-lives in Richmond.
Ruth-lives in Buckingham with
Mrs. Ragland, did live with Mrs.
Wood until she died.

Flo-married Frank Sarnitz.

Robert George

Lillian had two sisters=Ann and Rose and a brother, Lewis. Bully Clements married one of Lewis's daughters. Lillian was her aunt.

Charlie Proffitt is Ann's son. The father of Charlie Proffitt who used to run Lee's restaurant.

George drank bleach for sore throat and died. (This is true-or at least he drank something which killed him, said the coroner.
Lillian later married a Mr. Diehr and
moved to Charlottesville, then to
Schuyler. She died and may be buried
in Charlottesville. (This is right.)

Information from Joe Jones, father of Dorothy
 Miller and Carrie Lee Lyons:

He said he hunted, fished and took bees with Jeff Fitzgerald. Jeff and Annette had children. Two are Maggie and Clarence. Lillian came to be Jeff's housekeeper a year after Annette left. Jeff and Lillian had five children.

Jeff worked at the quarry with Joe. He cut wood and sold apple brandy at 25cents a quart. Jeff had a stroke. Don't know where he is buried.

Information from Maggie Fitzgerald:

She was very sick and couldn't talk much when we visited. She did say that Robert and George were born on the place where she lived. Said to come back later but she died before we could go.

Information from Letha Harris and her son, Liddie Fitzgerald:

Liddie's father was Clarence Fitzgerald. Clarence was Robert's half brother. Clarence's and Robert's father was Jeff Fitzgerald.

Clarence was shot and killed in the yard of a house where Letha Harris lives
He was killed seventeen years ago by Woodrow's son, Bobby Lyons. They were drinking and arguing over a still.

Letha Harris said Jeff was tall, thin, and good looking.

Clarence looked a lot like Robert and George. Robert came here to her house

a lot, to visit and drink.

Annette was bought by a foreigner who came here in a wooden boat with seven people in it, so he was called 7.

Jeff sold Annette to 7 and they lived near Letha's house until 7 died.

Raymond Proffitt, Lewis's son, lives on Coolwell Road.

She thinks Jeff is buried at Arrington.

He died of a stroke when up in age.

She said nearly everybody in Phenix sold bootleg whiskey. Clarence

Fitzgerald sold bootleg until he died.

Information from Zeb Ragland: 1981

Zeb was researching Carroll family history and found our names at Lynchburg Jones Memorial Library, where we were looking up Proffitts.

He is a second cousing to Hart and Lottie Proffitt.

He lived next door to Lillian Proffitt Diehr and Louis Diehr in Schuyler. She came there in the mid 1920's and brought with her Flo and Bobby. She never talked about her past. She married Louis Diehr, whose wife had died and he had seven children left to raise:

George, Edward, Mary Ann (who went to live with some Joneses, and later married Ben Coffey), Louise, Flossie, Bernice, and Elwood

Lillian and Louis Diehr had two children, Imogene and William. William died young. Imogene married Irvin Hall and lived in Charlottesville. After Diehr died, Lillian lived with Imogene until she died of mouth cancer.

Lottie Proffitt Gunter, Rose's daughter, married Edwin Gunter. Zeb married Carro Gunter, Edwin's sister.

Lillian and Rose were called Rose Red and Lily White.

Lillian brought two children with her to Schuyler:
Flo, already married to Frank Sarnitz, and
Bobby. Zeb last saw Bobby about 1938 when he was 17
or 18 years old. Sarnitz died and Flo went to
live with a Mrs. Witt.

Zeb gave us a picture of Lillian. Zeb is also kin to Mrs. Bessie Ragland, who Ruth lived with at Buckingham.

Friends of Bobby: Linwood Jordan, Carwell Beasley

Jan. 17, 1981: Willie & Sadie Ponton, Roseland

Lewis, his father, first married Birdie Bragg. They had two children, Emma and Willie. Emma married a Woody and had two daughters, Inez married Paul Goins and lives at Wingina, and Betty married a Bryant and lives at Appomattox.

Willie's wife, Sadie Ponton, told us Willie was born at Norwood. His mother died when he was two years old and he was given to Sadie's aunt. He know he was a Proffitt and had three aunts: Ann, Rose, and Lillian, but doesn't remember them, as he never saw the Proffitts again after being given out. He does visit a couple of his half=sisters, Lewis's children by his second marriage. Sadie Ponton gave us information on the marriages of some of Lewis's children from his second marriage.

Willie visits Sadie and Irene and they visit him.

Information from James Dolan, by phone:

Said to see Norah Bell, between Phenix and Norwood. He lived at Phenix until about 1930 or 31, then went in service. He remembered Lewis and his children, said Lewis was "a character" and used to talk with him until he died at age 81.

He remembered Lillian but didn't recall her ever being married.

We later met Lottie at Zeb's house, but she didn't remember much about the past.

Proffitt m. Diane Tinnell. Claude Proffitt was Willard's brother and their father was John Proffitt.

Lois said people in Tye River said Lillian's boyfriend was Sambo Martin, but she had children by many others.

Hazel, the aunt of Fred Clements (Bully Clements's youngest boy) lives in Amherst near the cemetery. Hazel has info on Proffitts and Clements.

Lois said people told her Maggie Fitzgerald never married, but had children by Sambo Martin and others. Fact: Maggie m. Morris Martin (Sambo) on 10-29-1919. Sambo's parents were Floyd Martin and Ida Martin.

Marvin Taylor m. Bertha Anderson. He ran a store and lived on the old Taylor place near Norwood.. (Is this where Bobby Diehr was born??)

Information from Homer Martin, Tye River

Homer's father was Willis Martin. He was born at Oak Ridge and lived at Phenix for a while.

He told us that Rose married Lyle Jennings.
They had a son, Trent Jennings.
Said Rose died of cancer of the mouth.
Didn't know Annette Martin, he said.

Roy Fitzgerald was a brother to Thomas and Jeff Fitzgerald.

Two of Thomas's daughters married blacks and had children.

Ann died of cancer.

Rose married a Jennings.

Rose's son lived: Pass Fairmount Church, turn right, go thru the Glades.

(Hart)

Maggie married a Martin. Jeff & Estelle Fitzgerald were from Amherst. Jeff lived with Annette Martin after Estelle died.

Lewis worked for Pearcie Proffitt at Variety Mills, and was kin to Pearcie. Mrs. Bell and her husband bought the Proffitt place from Ann and Rose.

Homer Martin's father was Annette's brother.

Jeff helped when Mrs. Bell's house caught fire.

Maggie married a Martin.

Flossie Banton married Jack Wood.

The Bells moved to Wingina, then to Phenix.

Jeff Fitzgerald was disinherited when he married

Annette Martin.

Betty Lyons is Lawrence Mays's half sister.

Mrs. Bell was a really sweet lady. She gave me her box of tatting.

Pearcie Proffitt was Betty son.

Ann Proffitt had a son, Walter, who died of pneumonia.

Mrs. Bell's father-in-law and some others

Information from Robert Harlow 7-2-83

Robert Harlow was 73 years old.

Proffitt girls worked for
Betty Lyons, Lawrence Mays's
sister
James Proffitt was brother to
Richard and was Pearcie's
uncle.

The road near Jeff Fitzgerald's place leads to an old quarry.

There are cemeteries there.

Bettie Proffitt was Ray's grandmother and Pearcie's mother. Richard was Pearcie's uncle.

Jeff Fitzgerald died about 1920

We went back in the fall and Robert Harlow went with us to where the cemeteries had been, but Westvaco had pretty much torn them up. There were no tombstones, only a few rocks which seemed to mark graves.

We went with Zeb Ragland to see Woodrow Lyons, a blind man. Lyons said all five of Lillian's children were by Jeff Fitzgerald.

carried Jeff Fitzgerald to Arrington on a wagon and then on a train to Charlottesville. He never came back to Phenix.

Hart's brother, Walter, drowned.
Samuel was killed in WWI.
Stetson Golladay was Ruth's father.
Ruth was Lillian's oldest child.

Thomas Fitzgerald's first wife was burned up in a house fire.

Florie stayed with Grandma Wood.

Jeff Fitzgerald sold his wife, Annette Martin, to "7", who paid \$40 for her. He was a foreignor. They called him "7" because he came to Phenix in a boat with six other people.

Oct. 6, 1983:

Hazel Spencer Wood Farrar, wife of Russell Farrar:

Her mother was Eva Proffitt Spencer, kin to Ed, Mary, & Lizzie Proffitt

Said we should see Charlie Wood, next to Harold Thomas, on or near the old Proffitt homeplace at Phenix. His father was Temp Wood.

Russell Farrar: age 73, raised at Phenix, , born in 1908. Left Phenix at age 19, in 1927.

Remembered Lillian , knows a lot about Phenix. Said to see Jack Wood, Aylett's half=brother, over 80.

April 3, 1984 Met Ivy at Howard Johnson's:
Didn't remember Hart or Charlie
Remembered a shooting.
She and two sisters sent to Dr. Maybee's
Home, the name changed later.
One sister, Mattie, she took with her
when she ran away from the orphanage.
She was caught and brought back and put
in the attic for punishment. When she
was let out, both sisters had been
adopted.

Ivy was taken in by Dr. & Mrs. Johnson. Mrs. Johnson thought that Ivy was Johnson's daughter. Ivy was beaten and had to work hard. Her foster father was good to her, but not her foster mother. He died in 1936. She lived to be 84.

Ivy, Robert, and George went to see Flo in 1962 or 64.
