JOHN KILLINGER (1933-)

John Killinger was born on 12 June 1933, in Germantown, Kentucky, the son of John Raymond and Jessie Frances Ellis Killinger. He was married to Joyce Anne Waddle on 12 June 1952.

Dr. Killinger's degrees include a B.A. from Baylor University, an M.A. and Ph.D. in English from the University of Kentucky. He also received an STB from Harvard Divinity School and a Th.D. from Princeton Theological Seminary.

Before being installed as pastor of the First Presbyterian Church on 5 October 1980, Dr. Killinger had taught at Georgetown College, Kentucky Southern College, Princeton Seminary, the University of Chicago Divinity School, and at Vanderbilt Divinity School for fifteen years. He is the author of more than thirty books and a popular lecturer.

In June of 1986, Dr. Killinger resigned his position with the First Presbyterian Church of Lynchburg to become pastor of the First Congregational Church of Los Angeles, California.
