

Lynchburg, Va. November, 23rd. 1892.

We, the undersigned, believing that a new and modern Hotel is very much needed in our City and that the general prosperity of our City would be materially advanced by the erection of such a Hotel, have subscribed the amount opposite our names to the stock of a Hotel Company with the understanding that the Hotel is to be built on the property corner Main and Eighth Streets, occupied at present by the Lynchburg Trust Company. The Capital stock of the Company is to be not less than \$50,000.00 nor more than \$250,000. No subscription to be binding until minimum stock is subscribed for; subscriptions are payable as follows: 5% cash on organization of Company; the balance to be paid in four equal payments due in four, eight, sixteen and twenty-four months from organization of the Company. Said instalments to bear interest from the time the building is completed. On payment of subscription in full, mortgage bonds to the amount of subscription will be issued to each stockholder with his stock.
