Maude Spotswood LARKIN, of the Poplar Forest Chapter, was the organizing regent, and Margaret B. STROUD was elected as first regent of the new Chapter. Throughout its history, the chapter has participated in many civic activities, including planting of memorial trees, establishing a library at the hospital in 1932, and offering prizes for essays on historical topics for local schools.
