HELEN KELLER LETTER TO MR. GRAVES MARCH 26, 1946

This item is a typed letter from Helen Keller of New York asking for the financial support of the Committee on the Deaf-Blind of America (perhaps later the American Foundation for the Blind) to a "Mr. Graves," perhaps Paul G. Graves of *Rosedale*, the Graves family home in Lynchburg, Virginia.

HELEN ADAMS KELLER (1880-1968)

Helen Adams Keller was born 27 June 1880 in Tuscumbia, Alabama, the daughter of Arthur H. Keller and Kate Adams. In her lifetime, she was an author, a political activist, and lecturer. She was the first deaf-blind person to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree from Radcliffe College. She died 1 June 1968 in Easton, Connecticut and is buried at the Washington National Cathedral in Washington, D.C.
