HELEN CAMERON LETTER TO CARTER GLASS 1918

Letter dated 22 October 1918 from Helen Cameron, of Petersburg, Virginia, residing at the Hotel de Carillon in Paris involved in war relief work, inviting Carter Glass to lunch or dinner to repay him for his assistance in helping her get to France.

HELEN CAMERON, 1870-1951

Helen Cameron was born in Petersburg, Virginia, 8 Feb. 1870, the daughter of George Cameron (1839-1916) and Helen Dunn. George Cameron, 1839-1916, emigrated from Scotland in 1858 and was a tobacconist in Petersburg. In 1917, Helen was residing in New York, N.Y. In July 1917, she went to France for War Relief Work, sailing on the French line, from New York on July 28, 1917. She maintained a temporary residence at the Hotel de Crillon, in Paris, France.

Helen Cameron died 30 Jan. 1951 in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. Her remains were buried Blandford Cemetery, Petersburg, Virginia.
