Edward Tinsley bought from Duncan Graham, Oct. 8, 1766, 740 acres of land on Hartis Creek at the foot of Tobacco Row Mountain in the west end of Amherst County, Deed Book C page 139. This is the place where the Tinsleys made a settlement called the Wilderness. Many Tinsley families have lived there and there is a large graveyard there commemorating the Wilderness. Near this location is New Glasco where Reuben Tinsley and Fanny Tyree lived. After the birth of four of their children they later moved to Franklin County, Va. Not far from the Wilderness is Agricola, the family home of some of the Tinsleys who married into the Martin Parks family. It is now owned by a Mr. Watts of Lynchburg, Va.

No record is shown of Elizabeth who married John Pendleton.

William and his wife died, leaving several orphan children, who were cared for by his brother Isaac and his wife Betty, who were appointed executors of the Estate.

There is no record shown of the next four children, Sarah, Edward, Joshua, Harriott.

Isaac married Betty Jane ? and they had three children, Isaac, Reuben and James. I was unable to find any record of Isaac and Reuben successions.

Mary who married Ambrose Rucker had fourteen children. Ambrose Rucker was a son of Fehar and grandson of Peter Rucker. He was large of stature, weighing over 300 pounds and was very wealthy. He was a leader in his church and headed the first Episcopal Church built in Amherst County, Va. Logs from this church were used at Sweetbrier College, and have the initial "T" carved in the end to commemorate the Tinsley family. He was a leader in public affairs and state and county business. The Tinsleys and Ruckers are closely allied by many marriages.

Believed to be the daughter of Sir John Randolph (Knighted) and a sister of William Randolph who was also an emigrant to Virginia in its earliest history.

Thomas Tinsley arrived in Virginia AP 1633 and built a home on Totopotomoy Creek in New Kent County, twelve miles north of Richmond, Va. This part of Kent County was later changed to Hanover County. His first patent was for 300 acres of land on the west side of the Chickahominy River, Dec. 13, 1650. Bible records show a grant of land to him by the Crown of England dated Oct. 25, 1689. The old home place remains in the Tinsley Family and is now called Totomoi, located near Oakland, Va. Virginia history states that he was a man of high esteem, great influence and courage.

There is a legend in circulation that three Tinsley brothers came together to Virginia as emigrants but in my research I have been unable to find but this one as an emigrant to Virginia.

As customary at that time this Tinsley Family followed the old English custom of naming the first born son after the father, with this son inheriting the full estate and the rest of the children relegated to oblivion. This makes it difficult to trace the earlier line of succession. No doubt many of these early families moved from County to County seeking better homesites but nearly all remained in the Eastern Counties of Virginia.

A copy of his Will dated Oct. 9th, 1700, mentioned all of his children but Alice and we assume that she was not living at that time. With the exception of Thomas II I was unable to locate a record of his children other than that John and Cornelius were living in New Kent County, Va. in 1704. On June 21, 1699, Robert Payne brought suit against his father-in-law for that part of his estate which he claimed was due his wife. See Book 0, 1695-1699, Essex County, Va.

According to my research I am convinced that Thomas Tinsley was twice married. He also moved from Hanover County to Essex County, Va. In 1698 he patented 1 1/2 acres of land. See land grant book #8 page 25, Essex County, Va. He also recorded a Will in Essex County, see will book 12 page 136, in which he named his wife Margaret. Extract from Will "To my wife Margaret, the Planatation on which I live for her life or widowhood, then to my son Joshua, if he dies without heirs to my sons, John, William and Issaac, any that leaves heirs. Household furniture to be divided between my wife and seven children. Witnessed by Thomas Knighton and Thomas Falcomer."

Milly married James Rucker first and following his death married Willaim Franklin. Reference is made to John Tinsley's will recorded at Madison County Court House, Sept. 10, 1797.

In the first census made in 1782 we find these three sons of Thomas III and his wife Margaret mention as household members and Owners. John had ten white persons and eight negroes, Joshua had five white persons and four negroes. and Issac had seven white persons and eight negroes. It appears that Thomas Tinsley III was wealthy, influential and a leading Episcopalian in his day.

WILL of Thomas Tinsley I

In the Name of God ---Amen

I, Thomas Tinsley, being sick and weak in body, but in perfect health and memory, praised be to God, do make, sign and declare this my last Will and Testament in name and form following, revoking and annulling all former Wills by me declared and made, and this only to stand and no other.

FIRST AND PRINCIPALLY I commend my soul to Almighty God, my creator, assuredly believing that I shall receive full pardon and free remission of all my sins and be saved by ye precious death and merits of my Blessed Saviour and Redeemer, Jesus Christ, and my body to ye earth from whence it was taken, to be buried in such decent and Christian manner as ye executives, hereafter mentioned and named, shall be thought convenient, and as for such wordly estate as ye Lord in mercy hath sent me, my Will and meaning is ye same shall be employed and bestowed as is hereafter expressed. Now I desire all my just debts be paid by bill and account.

IMPRIMIS: I give and bequeath to my daughter Sicily Jennings, one shilling sterling. Now I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Tyle one shilling ^{widow} sterling. My will and intention is that my loving Elizabeth have ye of my plantation and housings and orchard and all my personal estate, be it in what nature soever, during her natural life. After her death I dispose of it as followeth: Now I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Tinsley, after the death of my wife as aforesaid, my plantation whereon I now live, with all the housing and orchards and land belonging to it, to him and his heirs forever. Now I give my aforesaid son Thomas, my cart and what belongs to it, and my X-cut saw, file and bitt, and one set of wedges, and my feather bed and all that belongs to ye bed I now lye on, and great table and forms belonging to it, and my chest and one large brass kettle and one brass mortar and pestle, and one great iron pot and pot hooks, and one iron pestle and one iron spitt, and two pewter dishes and looking glass and grindstone, and one young gray stoned Colt, branded TT, and I do give my first son Thomas Tinsley, ye third part of my cattle that is alive after the death of my said wife, and one pair of small stands and one handsome pair of brass candlesticks.

NOW I give and bequeath to my son John Tinsley, my other feather bed and what belongs to it. Now I give and bequeath unto my granddaughter Deborah Payne one gold ring, one iron pot and pott hooks, two pewter dishes, one brass basting ladle and one chest and round table and one brass skellet and frames. Now my will and desire is that all ye rest of my estate, after ye death of my foresaid wife, shall be equally divided between my two sons Cornelius Tinsley and John Tinsley, and last I do appoint, and constitute my son Thomas Tinsley my whole and soul executive, to see that this my Will performed. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 9th Day of October, 1700.

Extraxt from Will of Thomas Tinsley II, Nov. 5th, 1715.

Will probated Feb. 22nd, 1716, Ref. Will and Deed Book 14 : Page 483, Essex County, Virginia. His wife in this Will is mentioned as Sarah.

"To my sons Thomas and Philip each a horse. To my other sons a cow. To each of my daughters a ewe." (He does not take the trouble of even naming his children). On April 26th, 1704, he patented 1400 acres of land in Essex County, Virginia, on the Mattapony River, Land Grant Book 8, Page 593. On Feb. 22, 1716, Sarah Tinsley, his wife, was bonded as Executrix of the Will of Thomas Tinsley, deceased James Coghill and Thomas Jackson security on her bond. On May 14, 1720 Sarah Tinsley purchased from Joseph Berry 250 acres of land in Essex County, Va. There is contention that this Thomas Tinsley of Essex is not the same as the Thomas Tinsley of Hanover County, Va. Since all court records were destroyed during the Civil War it was impossible to trace the two.

Thomas Tinsley III, a son of Thomas II also moved from Hanover County to Essex County and patented 111 1/2 acres of land in Essex County in 1698, land grant book 8 page 25 Essex County, Va. He left a Will naming his wife as Margaret.

Extraxt of Will- To my wife Margaret, the plantation on which I live for her life and widowhood, then to my son Joshua, if he dies without heirs it goes to my sons John, William and Isaac, any that leave heirs. Household furniture to be divided between my wife and seven children. Witnesses Thomas Knighton, Thomas Falconer

Will of Reuben Tinsley: I, Reuben Tinsley, of the County of Franklin and State of Virginia, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner of form following:

It is my will and desire after my death that my Executor, herein after named, shall, out of my estate, pay all my just debts. And whereas some of my children have drawn from my estate more than others, it is my desire they shall be made equal should they require it, and the situation of my estate having regard for my wife admit to it. I give unto my loving wife, Frances Tinsley, during her natural life and widowhood, all the balance of my estate both real and personal; to be sold and after making the children all equal, the money to be divided equally among them or their legal representatives.

Lastly, I do appoint my son Willis Tinsley executor to this Will and Testament; and he is to be permitted to qualify without giving security. In testimony whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal, this the 22nd day of July 1831.

At a court held in Kent County. 28th 1702, Nicholas Mereweather gives upon his Corporal path takes upon ye Holy Evangelists, declared that he saw Thomas Tinsley, late of this County deceased, sign and seal and publish this his last Will and Testament and that he was then in perfect safe and memory. Also John Oakes declared upon his oath in like manner that he saw Thomas Tinsley own this to be his last will.

PREFACE

Information in this preface is copied from the "Genealogical Sketch of the Tinsley and Goode Families of Virginia" as compiled by Mary Tinsley Kindred, dated Roanoke, Virginia, July 14, 1911. At that time Mrs. Kindred was 67 years of age. She died in 1936.

She heads her Sketch- as follows-

Honorable Ancestry has ever been held in veneration by mankind. It inspires self respect and is a potent incentive to virtue. As we contemplate on the worthy lives of our progenitors we can but desire to walk in their footsteps.

More than fifty years ago cousin Mary Tinsley Kindred published a history of the Tinsley Family of Virginia which had its beginning as far back as 390 years B.C. The information concerning this early descendency had been traced by one G. Browne Goode in the British Museum from old books on "Heraldry for seventy generations twenty two centuries." It started with one Ferodach, a prince of Scots in Ireland, and extended to one Isabell Penkerville who had married Richard Goode of Whitby, Cornwall, England, in 1558 AD. Richard Goode and Isabell were the parents of John Goode, an emigrant to Virginia in 1630. The Isabell Penkerville pedigree dated back to one Cerdic, the Saxon, who was crowned Third King of England at Westminster AD 552. This John Goode was the father of Joseph Goode, who in turn was the father of John Daniel Goode, a citizen of Culpeper, Amherst and Bedford Counties in Virginia. John Daniel Goode married Elizabeth Campbell of the Clan Campbell of Scotland. The Campbell Clan, one of the most powerful in Scotland, is sketched by A. A. and A. K. Johnston of Edinburgh, Scotland. This sketch of the Campbell dynasty dates as far back as 1280 AD when one Sir Colin Mor Campbell was knighted by Alexander, Third King of Scotland. Cousin Mollie's book shows quite a trace of the Campbell Clan down through the centuries, a name still revered by Scots. This John Goode who married Elizabeth Campbell was the father of Benjamin Goode, and this Benjamin Goode was the father of Amarilla Goode. Amarilla Goode married Willis Tinsley and Willis Tinsley and Amarilla Goode were the parents of Benjamin Tinsley, father of Mary Tinsley Kindred, author of this history.

Cousin Mary, more familiarly known to the family as Cousin Mollie, appears to have made quite an exhaustive study of the early family history which makes most interesting reading. In this preface there has been covered only a synopsis of her research, which contains war anecdotes as well as romances, especially a romance of Captain Richard Holland of Revolutionary fame, year 1782.

In the old English Feudal System the warriors of each tribe were designated by a Coat of Arms, which he wore or were flown from the flag staff. No effort was made to control the use of these designations until about the Sixteenth Century. At that time such control was deemed to be necessary because many undeserving individuals who had never borne arms in battle usurped the designation under false colors. So there was organized what was known as the Heralds Visitation which sent out Officers of the Heralds College, England, to visit every family seat in England for the purpose of collecting direct family evidence. These pedigrees or Records of Arms, as claimed by each family, were confirmed or disallowed in

accordance with the evidence collected. Records of these expeditions filled many volumes of manuscript and are now preserved in the British Museum, Heralds College and other collective institutions in England. It is from the Yorkshire Visitation by these agents that the root of the Tinsley Family history takes life, as follows:

Roger Magerolles, Lord of Tinsloo, married Eune, daughter of Roger Bushby. Their son William, at the death of his father became Lord of Tinsloo. Roger Magerolles had a daughter who married Richard Brette. Richard Brette had a daughter, Betryce, who married William Londorer. Sir Walter Brette, a later descendant had a daughter named Lucy. Lucy Brette married Sir Henry Tinsley, whose ancestors were called Londoners and of the lineage of Lord of Tinsleom. From the marriage of Sir Henry and Lucy Brette came a son, William Tinsley, who married the daughter of Sir William Wadesly. The next record of the Tinsley family in England is found recorded in the British Herald under "Cabinet of Armorial Bearings of the Nobility and Gentry of Great Britain and Ireland from the Earliest to the Present Time." In Thomas Robsons "Collection of Names of the Nobility from Yorkshire, England" there appears the Tinsley name with a description of the Coat of Arms. In the Coat of Arms the red denotes courage, the argent of silver designates sincerety-purity-innocence-peace, the chevron signifies protection, the helmet was allowed only in the Coat of Arms of those who fought nearest the King and relates to Nobility. The stork is emblematic of piety and gratitude. The stork was held in great veneration by many of the early kings and under law was prohibited from being disturbed. Therefore they were allowed to build their nests atop of castles, and as shown in the Coat of Arms indicate that the family lived in castles. The Latin inscription, Sine-Labe-Fides, is translated "Fidelity without Blemish" or "Faith without Dishonor".

Under orders of the House of Burgesses in 1634 Virginia was divided into eight political sub-divisions or counties-York, Elizabeth City, Isle of Wight, Henrico, Warwick, Charles City, James City and Accomac. In 1720 Henrico was again divided into nine subdivisions, one of which was known as Hanover. It is in this part of Virginia, now known as Hanover County, that Thomas Tinsley I migrated from Yorkshire England with his wife Elizabeth. There follows Thomas Tinsley II who married Martha Ragland, Thomas Tinsley III who married Frances Bickley, Thomas Tinsley IV who married Agnes Garland and whose son John Tinsley married Nancy Washington who was the widow of Henry W. Washington - a nephew of General George Washington, Thomas Tinsley V who married Sussanna Thompson. Thomas Tinsley V was a colonel in the Revolutionary War and had been a member of the House of Burgesses. These ancestors were pretentious and proud, ceremonial in manner and speech, cultured and sympathetic with the highest ideals, kindly, democratic in their dealings with their fellowman, hospitable, devoted to their families, gallant to the fair sex, deeply interested in civil and state affairs, of a sporting nature and devoted defenders of the church and their creed.

Isaac and Jacob Tinsley, brothers of Willis Lewis Tinsley, were two of the original fourteen young men composing the first class of Richmond College, Virginia. Richmond College was established as a Baptist School and these two gentlemen later became Baptist Ministers although they had been reared in the Episcopal Faith. In 1774 Amherst Parish lists three Tinsleys as Vestrymen, Zachariah, Martin and David. Together with the Garlands, the Tinsleys were staunch Episcopalians in establishing the Episcopal Church in Amherst County, Virginia. During the early days of Amherst County there were many intermarriages among the first families, Harrisons, Randolphs, Goodes, Tinsleys and others. Wyatt Tinsley married Elizabeth Harrison, daughter of Benjamin Harrison, a signer of the Declaration of Independence, a member of Congress and Governor of Virginia. Elizabeth Harrison was the sister of William Henry Harrison, ninth President of the United States. Carter Harrison's biography of the Benjamin Harrison family states that they were a prominent family in the patriarchal society of the Old Dominion. The Harrison estate was founded by the acquisition of 200 acres of land on Warrosquivada Creek which was conveyed to Benjamin Harrison by deed dated July 6th in the ninth year of King Charles of England and declared to be in requital of the services of said Harrison as clerk. How long he was clerk to earn this estate is not recorded but in 1641 he was again listed as creditor in the amount of 600 pounds of tobacco due as salary. The House of Burgesses passed an Act to pay him 7L 10S sterling in lieu of the tobacco. The full name of his wife is not recorded - only Mary. He was an intimate friend of Governor Sir William Berkeley. He died in 1712.

Louis Willis Tinsley was named after Colonel Henry Willis, founder of Fredericksburg, Virginia. Catherine Willis, who was an ancestress of Mary Washington, married Achille Murat, ex-prince of Naples and a nephew of Napoleon Bonaparte. The George Washington family and the Willis family were closely knit by intermarriage.

THIS TRADITION is dedicated to my children and grandchildren.

Being the oldest in line of ancestry I have felt it incumbent upon me to leave to my children, and those who follow, some historical background and facts concerning the Tinsley Family of Virginia, as I knew them. The original devise was to commit to record only that part of the name with which I was most familiar, covering approximately one hundred and forty years. But before this plan was consummated a larger and longer scope suggested itself to me as probably being more interesting. The author has spent a number of years, traveled many places, and contacted many people in his effort to offer herewith, to the best of his ability and research, a fair and accurate resume' of the Virginia Clan. That this record is not complete within its own bounds is in itself disappointing. No doubt many past records were not considered worth keeping and so the chain was broken in spots. But even in this treatise there can be errors, for at the age of 87 years one is not infallible. However, I have endeavored to refrain from injecting any records which I thought might be in error.

There is much speculation as to the various number of Tinsley emigrants who came to America, but in all my research I have been unable to find more than one antecedent.

To commemorate the name of Reuben Tinsley, my grandfather, has been the reason for prompting this treatise. I am not positive of the birth place of our venerable sire, but research leads me to believe that he was born in Amherst County, Virginia, near the old Pioneer settlement on Pedlar River where the Tinsley family reserved a cozy colony popularly known at that time as the "WILDERNESS". Many of the old Tinsley families lived, died and were buried there. Reuben Tinsley moved from Amherst County, Virginia to Franklin County, Virginia in 1794 and settled on a farm near Sydnorsville to raise his family. From this home more than three hundred descendents have been born to bless his name. Being of a quiet and reserved nature there are no outstanding records of his virtues but I am persuaded that he was a man of noble character, high aspirations and sterling worth. He was

a truly religious disciple, substantiated by the Bible names he used for his children. Two of his sons were Baptist Ministers but I learn that most of his direct family were Presbyterians. He and his wife are buried in the Tinsley graveyard near Sydnorsville, Franklin County, Virginia.

John Brown Tinsley moved to a location near Big Island, Virginia. The Rev. Peter Tinsley was among the first Rectors of Old St. Johns Episcopal Church, Big Lick(now Roanoke, Va), from about Sept. 1st, 1860 until Nov. 7, 1866. He requested leave of absence from St. Johns in 1862 to become a Chaplain in the Confederate Army, serving in the 28th Reg. Hunter's Brigade, Longstreet Corps, Picket's Division, until 1864, when he returned to Big Lick. He was ordained a Priest by Bishop Johns, Apr. 17, 1862 at Monument Church, Richmond, Va.

He entered the Diocese of Md. in 1867, resigning in 1868 to become Chaplain at the University of Virginia. On June 3rd 1870 he left Charlottesville to become Rector of the Church of the Advent in Cincinnati, Ohio, where he served until 1902. The story has been handed down that while his brother, Peter, was a clerk of the High Court of Richmond, Thomas Tinsley V requested him to take Henry Clay into his office for instruction. Peter replied that he had no place for him, upon which Thomas V told him to make a place for him, which was done and Henry Clay started on his brilliant career in the Congress of the United States. It was in Hanover County, Va. that Henry Clay made his maiden speech which elevated him from obscurity to fame, advocating the Parsons cause - one of the most celebrated cases at law in the history of America.

WILL of Jacob Tyree & his wife Mary:

I, Jacob Tyree, citizen of the County of Amherst, State of Virginia, Parish of Lexington, being at this time in sound mind and sane memory, but calling to mind the frailty of human sense and nature, and uncertainty of life, knowing I shall shortly experience that change which sooner or later will be the fate of every person living, do make and ordain this, revoking all othere heretofore made, my last Will and Testament.

FIRST, I recommend my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the dust from whence it originated, and to what wordly property it has the Almighty in his Providence to bless me with, I desire may be disposed of as follows:

My lawful debts being first paid out of my estate.

- Item I - I give to my beloved wife, Mary Tyree, a negro wench named Sue, four beds and furniture during her life, and her decease to dispose of them at her pleasure.
- Item II- I give to my daughter, Nancy Wood, a negro fellow named Sam and a negro girl named Sarah, to her and her heirs forever.
- Item III- I give to my daughter, Mary Baily, two negro girls, one named Aggy and the other named Sucky, to her and her heirs forever.
- Item IV- I give to my son William Tyree a negro wench named Dorcas, her child Charlotte, also 175 acres of land whereon I now live, lying on the south side of said tract, to be taken off by a line beginning at the mouth of the Saw Pitt branch, running from thence so as to include the above quantity of acres. To him and his heirs forever.
- Item V- I give to my daughter Sarah Rutherford a negro wench named Moll, and her increase during her natural life; at her death I give the aforesaid Moll and her increase to the heirs of her body. To them and their heirs forever.
- Item VI- I give to my daughter Fanny Tinsley, a negro fellow named Tom, and a negro girl named Lucy now in her possession, to her and her heirs forever.
- Item VII- I give to my son Jacob Tyree the balance of the land whereon I now live, after the part willed to my son William is taken off, also a negro wench named Jude and her children, John, Jordon, George and Nelson and her increase hereafter; to him and his heirs forever.
- Item VIII- I give to my daughter Jane Gibson a negro boy named Townson, now in her possession; to her and her heirs forever.
- Item IX- I give to my granddaughter, Betty Turner, a negro girl named Philis; to her and her heirs forever.

The rest of my estate not otherwise disposed of at my decease I desire may be divided equally among my daughters, Nancy, Mary, Sarah, Fanny and Jane, reserving exclusively the part that may be coming to my daughter Jane Gibson for the purpose of indemnifying myself and sons, Jacob and William Tyree being affixed as security for Jacob Gibson, the husband of my daughter Jane. The above legacy is sufficient to satisfy the same. I desire each of my legatees to have a proportion able part in full discharge thereof. I, the Testator, do hereby appoint and nominate William Tyree Jr. Executor to this my last will and testament.

The WILL of Willis Lewis Tinsley

I, Willis L. Tinsley, considering the uncertainty of life, and the necessity of being prepared for death, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament.

First- I WILL and desire that all my just debts be paid by my executor herein named.

Second- I give and devise to my wife, Amarilla Tinsley, my mansion house in the County of Franklin, Va., together with the tract of land annexed thereto; with all my household and kitchen furniture of every description; and the following slaves to wit- Nancy and her two children, Sam and Emaline, to have and to hold during her natural life. I also give and bequeath to her so many horses and cows and hogs with such farming utensils; so much of the provisions laid in for the family, as she may select, to keep also the sum of Two Hundred Dollars in cash.

Thirdly- I give and devise to my executors herein named the tract of land on which Jane M. Tinsley, the wife of Reuben L. Tinsley, now resides, to hold by them for the sole use and benefit of the said Jane M. Tinsley during her natural life, free from the claims of her husband, and also the sum of \$1000.00 to be lent out of my said Executors on good security, and the investment annually to be paid to the said Jane M. Tinsley free from the claims of her husband, but the principal to be returned to my estate after death.

Fourthly- I give and bequeath to my executors the sum of \$1000.00 by to be held by them and the interest thereon annually paid by them to Permelia B. Tinsley during her life, and the principal to be returned to the estate at her death, which sum is to come out of the estate going to her children. That my son James H. Tinsley is to have less by \$600.00 than the rest. Reuben is to have no more than I have given him.

I hereby appoint Benjamin Tinsley and Samuel Fishburne my executors, and my desire is that they shall not be required to give security on their qualifying.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 14th day of August 1862.

Amarilla Goode, daughter of Benjamin Goode and Elizabeth Carlin, married Willis Lewis Tinsley.

Elizabeth Carlin was the daughter of Lt. Douglas Carlin, so of General Carlin, USA. Lt. Douglas Carlin married at the Cheyenne Agency (1735) Maiden Duprest, the wealthiest Indian Heiress of the Sioux Reservation. More than 1000 Indians witnessed the ceremony which lasted over three days. Their son, Benjamin Carlin of Amherst County, Virginia married Elizabeth Camden, daughter of "Old Billy Camden" of Scottish fame, then living in Lincoln County, Kentucky. Old Billy lived to be 114 years old.

Fanny Tyree Tinsley, great, great granddaughter of Thomas Tinsley^{III}, great granddaughter of Wyatt Tinsley, granddaughter of Reuben Tinsley and daughter of Willis Lewis Tinsley and Amarilla Goode, married Samuel W. Fishburne, 1832. She was of the grand type of old Virginia woman. She lived in a large log house, built in pioneer days before nails were made, except in blacksmith shops, and wooden pins were used to hold the sheeting and roof shingles. She had a large family, 12 children, so needed a large house. Since in those days the greatness of a woman was measured by the number of children to whom she gave birth, she was considered among the greatest. More than fifty years ago while on a visit at her home, a party of young folks built a rock monument on the hill above her home, and we placed our names and dates under it. I have never been back to see if the monument still stands. She had the reputation of serving the best food a dining table could furnish, most of it raised on her own farm; even the chestnuts were preserved for summer eating. One wonder if her descendents followed her noble examples. She was Presbyterian by faith and knew how to live a good life. She died in Roanoke, Va. AD 1900, and was buried in the City Cemetery. Her parents and grand parents were buried in Franklin County. Many of the good things for the City of Roanoke, Va. came from her sons and grandsons. See another page for the Fishburne lineage.

Junius Lee Fishburne died in infancy.

Reuben Harvey Fishburne operated a tobacco manufacturing plant in Roanoke for many years and was a pioneer builder of the community.

Joshua Blair Fishburne, a prominent citizen of the city of Roanoke, held many responsible positions in State and City affairs. One time Mayor of Roanoke and a member of the State Legislature. He was influential in business affairs and among the wealthy of the city.

James Addison Fishburne was a leading merchant of the City of Roanoke and a pioneer in its growth.

Junius Blair Fishburne was a leader in the business life of the City of Roanoke and headed many thriving enterprises, being one of its most successful citizens and ranked as one of its richest. He is a living example of what pluck and energy can accomplish, from the bottom to the top. He gave the City of Roanoke several of its most beautiful parks, was very generous and thoughtful. He headed the leading bank of the City, the First National Exchange, for many years. He is worthy of the highest praise for his citizenship.

Tipton T. Fishburne was among the pioneer builders of the City of Roanoke coming to the City when it was known as Big Lick. A real estate dealer, a tobacco manufacturer and a banker, he was widely known and very successful in his enterprises. He was a lay reader and leader in the Methodist Church and frequently performed in the capacity of an itinerant pastor.

John Robert Fishburne was a man of noble character who inherited many of the beautiful traits of his mother. He was one of my closest pals whom I held in the highest esteem and I always considered him the "Flower of the Flock" in his family life. He died in Texas while on a visit to relatives in Texarkana. A beautiful monument marks the spot where he sleeps.

Edward L. Stone, husband of Minnie Tinsley Fishburne, operated one of the largest printing establishments in the South and his wares were widely distributed. He headed many civic organizations and was well known and very successful in business.

Samuel Fishburne Woody headed one of the largest hardware stores in the City of Roanoke, Roanoke Hardware Co., was highly esteemed, popular with his fellowmen and a leader in public affairs. His son Robert follows in his footsteps, was Mayor of the City of Roanoke, and most active in the City life.

Peter Hopkins Fishburne was an ordained Methodist Minister and in his day filled a regular Floyd County circuit. He was loved by all who knew him and had many of his mother's beautiful traits.

Susan Emaline was a teacher in the public schools of Franklin County and did much to educate the young, many of whom have memories of her.

The Fishburne family and the City of Roanoke are indivisible.
