CHARLES MINOR BLACKFORD, JR. (1865-1924)

Charles Minor Blackford, Jr., son of Charles Minor Blackford, Sr., and Susah Leigh Colston, was born 5 September 1865, in Lynchburg, Virginia. A graduate of the University of Virginia and of the New York College of Physicians and Surgeons, he also studied medicine in London, Vienna, and Paris. He taught in a medical school in Atlanta, Georgia. He wrote numerous articles for medical magazines, as well as historical articles for newspapers. He also published *Annals of the Lynchburg Home Guard*, a history of a local military unit. He married Julia Winifred Sears, daughter of William Goff Sears and Stella Bigelow, on 22 September 1897 in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. He died 6 November 1924 at his home in Staunton, Virginia.
