JAMES PETER WILLIAMS (1844-1893)

James Peter WILLIAMS, son of Thomas J. WILLIAMS and Mary S. LEIGH, was born 28 January 1844, at Mt. Laurel, Halifax County, Virginia. By 1860, he had moved with his family to Hanover County, where his father was physician and farmer.

At the outbreak of the Civil War, J. Peter WILLIAMS enlisted 21 April 1861, in Richmond, Virginia, as a private in 1st Company, Richmond Howitzers. He was transferred on 30 June 1862 to the Chesapeake Artillery, under the command of Capt. William D. BROWN. He served in that unit until the Battle of Gettysburg, when he was transferred to 2nd Company, Richmond Howitzers. According to his service record, he was captured 14 May 1865 [sic] and was a prisoner of the Sixth Army Corps.

Following the Civil War, J. Peter WILLIAMS worked as an agent for the James River and Kanawha Canal Company in Lynchburg. He married 5 December 1872 Anna Page KINCKLE, daughter of Rev. William H. KINCKLE and Maria Willis PAGE, of Lynchburg.

By 1885, James Peter WILLIAMS had become Secretary-Treasurer of the Virginia Nail and Iron Works Company of Lynchburg.

James Peter WILLIAMS died 22 January 1893 and was buried in the Spring Hill Cemetery in Lynchburg.
