DUNBAR HIGH SCHOOL LIBRARY

Under the direction of J. Maud Campbell, librarian at Jones Memorial Library, Lynchburg, Va., branch libraries were established to provide library access to underserved citizens. One of the first branches established was the library at Dunbar High School, a separate segregated high school in the city. The first librarian selected for the Dunbar library was Anne Scales Spencer. After several years of support by Jones Memorial Library, the library was able to be supported by the City and became a permanent part of Dunbar High School.
