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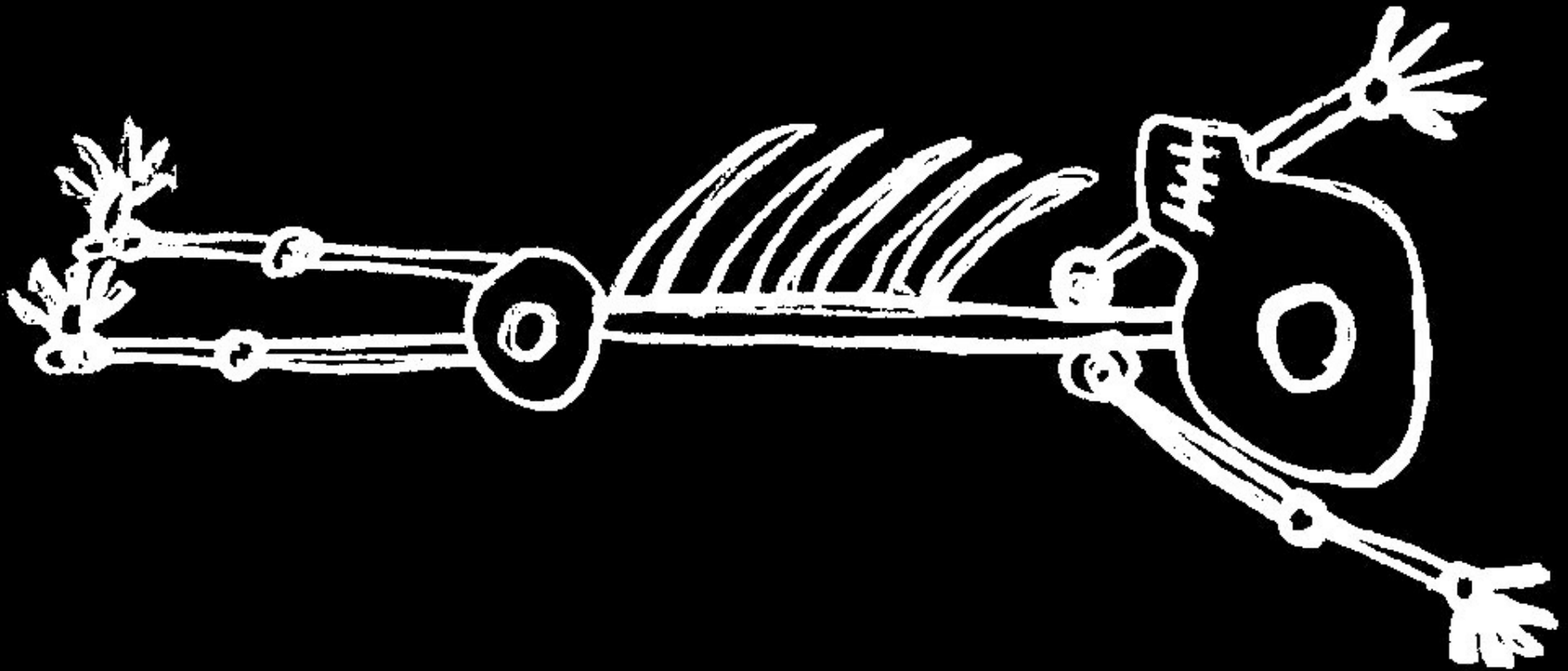

Option 1: We could do nothing.



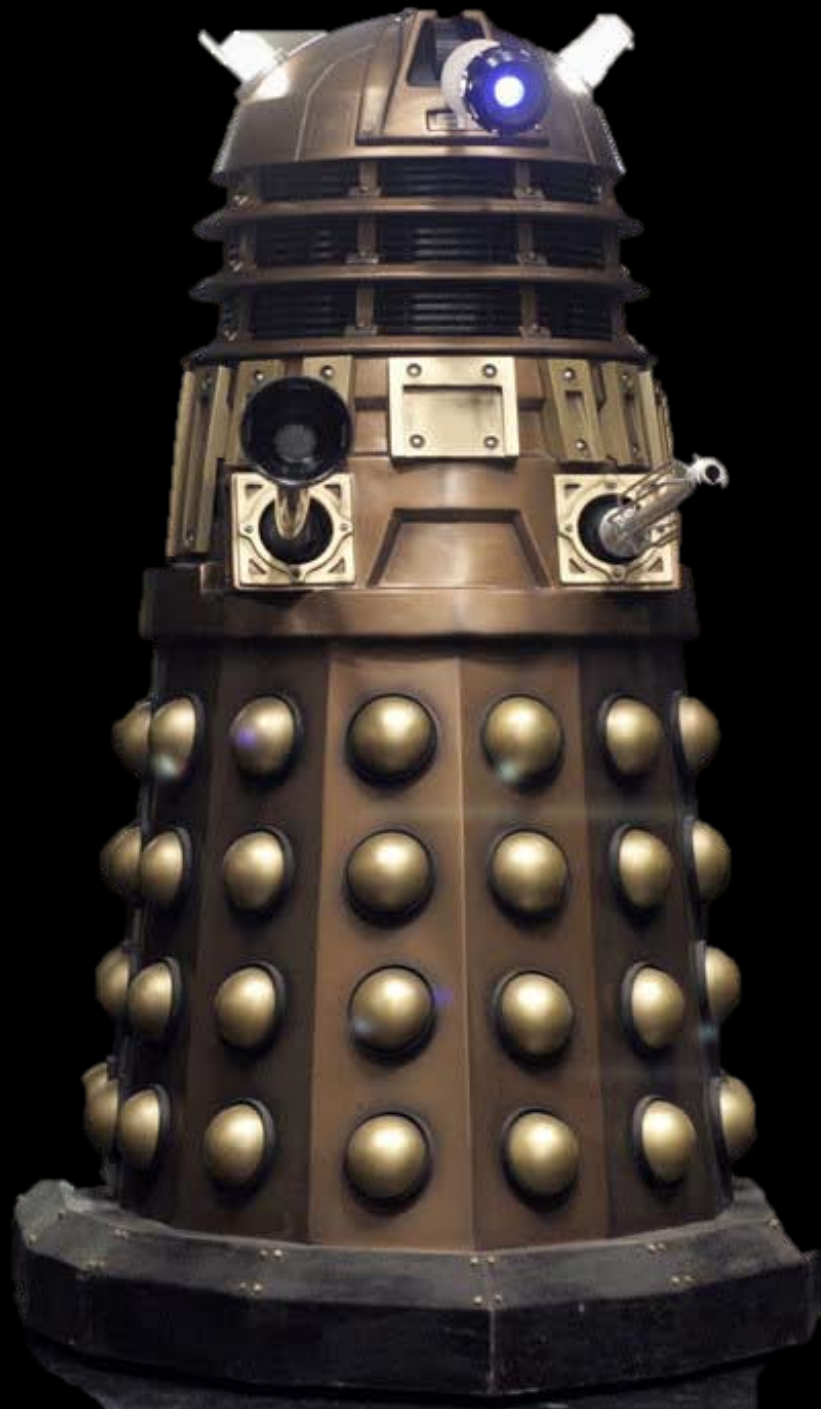
Option 2: We could weep



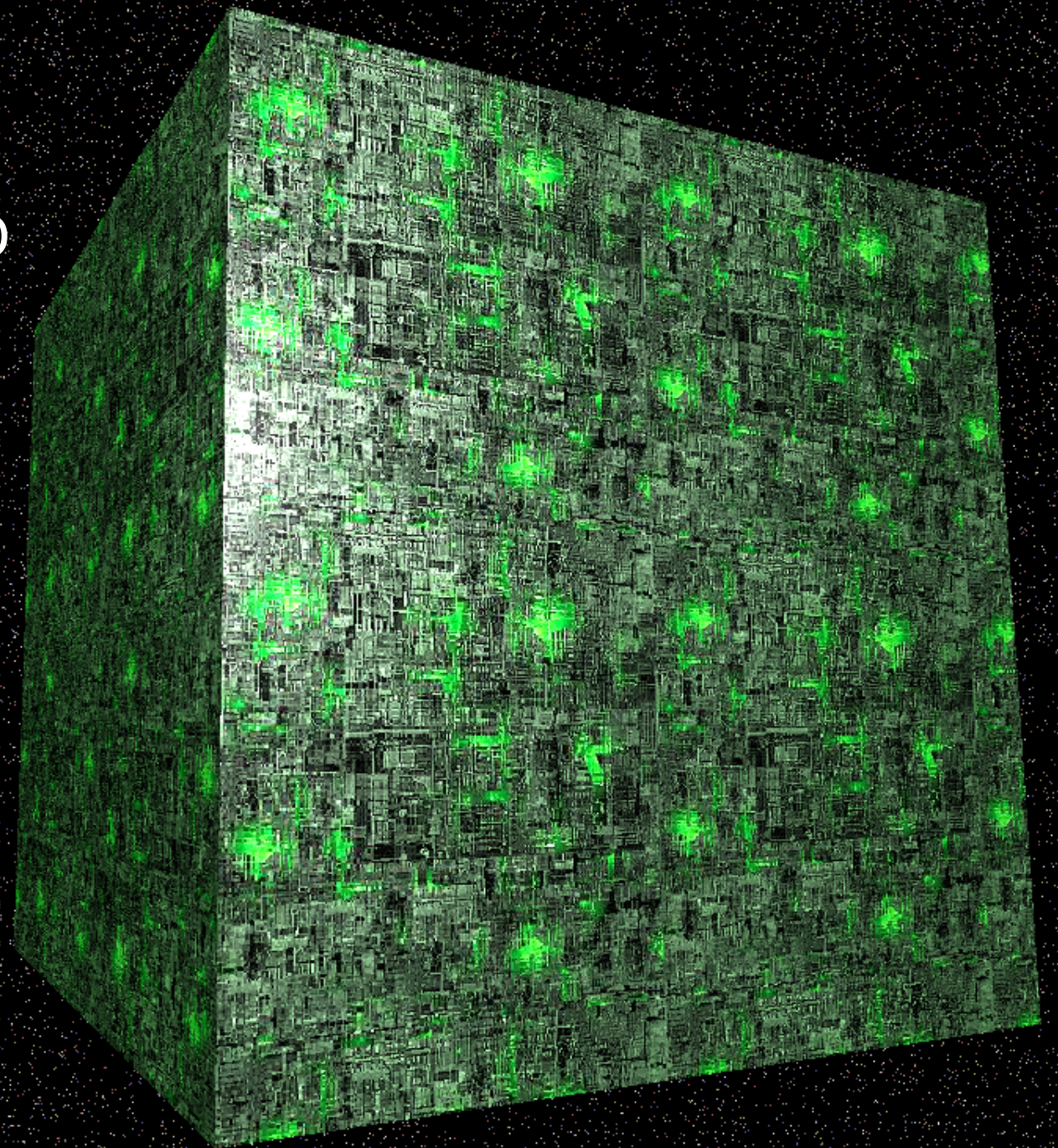
Option 3: We could get mad

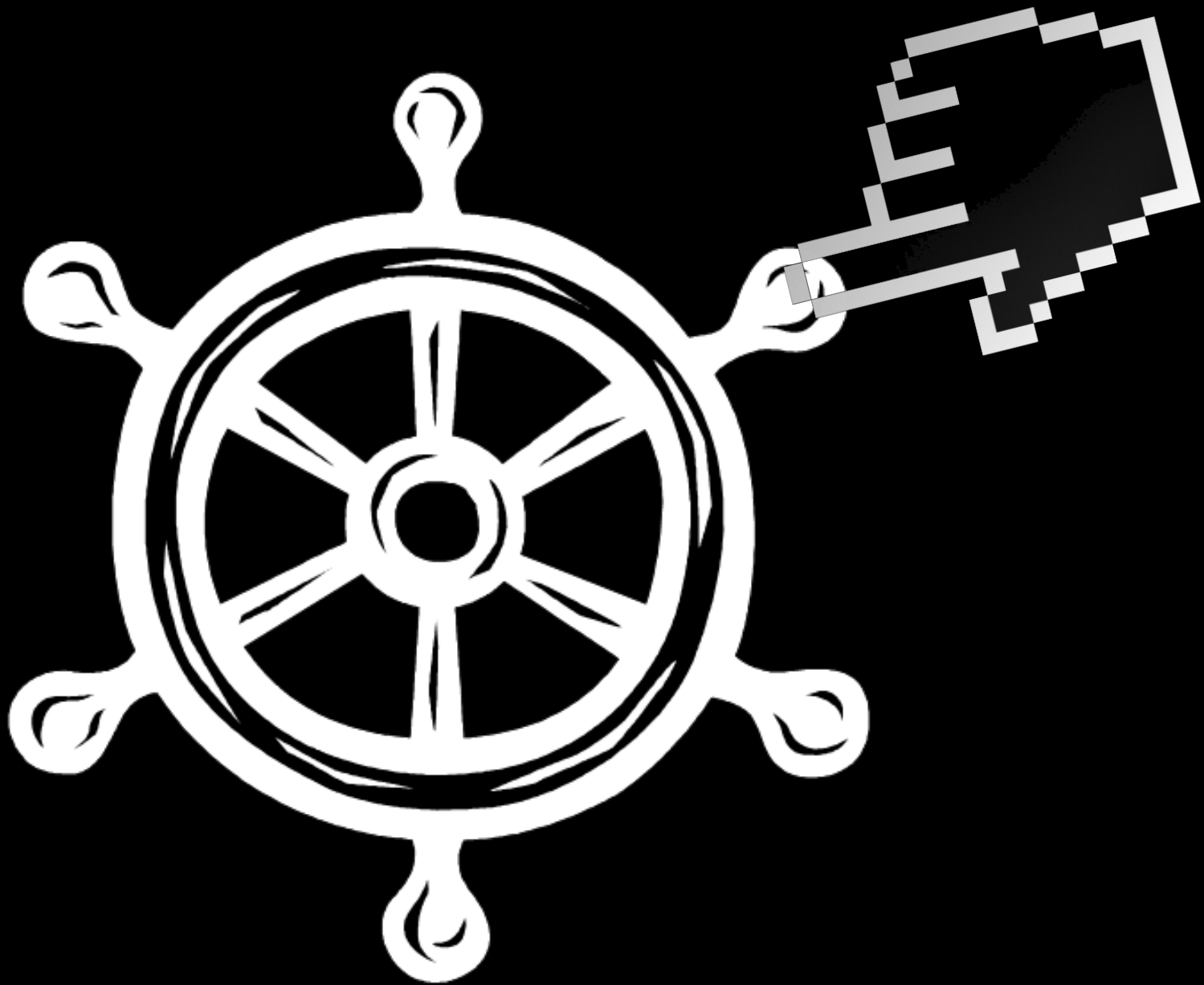
